- Tied a career high with five RBI on 6/2 vs. TB, going 3-for-3 with three runs, a double, a home run, and five RBI)
- Had four, four-hit games last season, tied for sixth-most in the American League
- · Collected a career-high three triples, bringing his career total to 11
- Played in 130 games, tied for the second-most in his career (career-high 154 in 2011)
- · Appeared in 118 games at first base, 10 games in right field, and one at first base

PROFESSIONAL CAREER

2016: Hit .287 (135-for-471) with 72 runs, 22 doubles, one triple, 17 home runs, 51 RBI, and 41 walks in 130 games with Oakland...Hit .318 (41-for-129) with seven home runs, 19 RBI, and a .924 OPS against left-handed pitchers...Batted .317 (70for-221) with 12 doubles, one triple, 13 home runs, and 33 RBI in 59 road games...Hit three home runs on 5/15 at TB for his first career three-home run game; was the 15th three-home run game in Oakland history, 27th in Athletics history...Batted .359 (28-for-78) with eight home runs in the month of May; his eight home runs were a single month career-high...Hit five home runs in a three-game series at TB from 5/13-15.

2015: Started the season with Toronto...Designated for assignment by Toronto on 8/1 and claimed off waivers by Oakland on 8/3...Combined for a career-high 18 home runs...Appeared in 55 games at third base, 32 games in left field, five games at first base, and five games in right field...Collected his fifth career walk-off hit (single) on 8/9 vs. HOU...Collected his 100th career double on 8/31 vs. LAA...Reached base safely in a career-high 16-straight games from 9/11-29.

2014: Began the season with Kansas City...Acquired by Toronto in exhange for RHP Liam Hendriks and C Erik Kratz on 7/28... In 36 games with Kansas City, he hit .282 (31-for-110)...In 50 games with Toronto, he hit .240 (37-for-154)...Batted .312 (36-for-112) with an .835 OPS...Hit .389 (14-for-36) in 11 Interleague games, tied for fourth-best in the majors (min. 30 at-bats)...Hit his first career pinch-hit home run on 8/27 vs. BOS...Made his first Major League appearances at first and second base.

2013: Batted .304 (49-for-161) with 20 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, eight home runs, 23 RBI, and eight walks in 52 games over four stints with Baltimore...Led the American League in batting average vs. left-handed pitching (min. 150 AB), hitting .371 (36for-97)...Led the majors in hitting when leading off an inning (min. 150 AB) with an average of .472 (17-for-36)...Recorded nine multi-hit games in an 11-game stretch from 8/4-9/11...Homered in back-to-back games from 5/24-25 at Toronto.

2012: Started the season with Minnesota and was traded to Boston on 8/5 in exchange for OF Jeremia Pineda...Appeared in 10 games with the Red Sox, hitting .143 (4-for-28)...Appeared in 69 games with Triple-A Rochester, batting .250 (67-for-268) with 30 runs, seven home runs, and 37 RBI...In 13 games with Triple-A Pawtucket, he hit .306 (15-for-49) with three runs, one home run and eight RBI.

2011: Spent the season with the Twins, his first full season in the Majors...Made an Opening Day roster for the first time in his career...Recorded career-highs in games (154), hits (139), doubles (28), triples (2), RBI (72), and total bases (216)...His 134 hits were tied for second-most in baseball among third baseman (Aramis Ramirez, 169)...Recorded walk-off singles on 4/12 vs. KC, 5/28 vs. LAA, and 7/19 vs. CLE.

2010: Made his Major League debut on 6/3 at Seattle and singled off Felix Hernandez in his first career plate appearance...Hit a grand slam on 7/26 at Kansas City off of Zack Greinke for his first career home run; first player in Twins history to hit a grand slam for his first career home run...Finished third in American League Rookie of the Year voting behind Texas' Neftali Feliz and Detroit's Austin Jackson...Named to Topps Major League Rookie All-Star Team and Baseball America's All-Rookie Team...Recipient of Bill Boni Award for the Twins Most Outstanding Rookie, voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA...Began the season in Triple-A Rochester, appearing in 49 games for the Red Wings.

2009: Batted .284 (62-for-218) with 44 runs, 14 doubles, four triples, seven home runs, and 29 RBI in 57 games for Double-A New Britain...Named Eastern League Player of the Week on 5/18...Promoted to Triple-A Rochester on 6/23...Hit .286 (77-for-269) with 35 runs, 24 doubles, seven home runs, and 41 RBI in 71 games...Led Twins minor leaguers in doubles (38) and total bases (227).

2008: Began the season with Class A-Advanced Fort Myers, hitting .336 (74-for-220) with 35 runs, 19 doubles, triples, five home runs, 44 RBI, and 27 walks in 60 games for the Miracle...Named a Florida State League All-Star...Promoted to Double-A New Britain on 6/16...Played for Phoenix in the Arizona Fall League...Ranked as the No. 5 prospect in the Twins organization by Baseball America following the season.

2007: Split the season between Short-Season A Beloit and Class A-Advanced Fort Myers...Hit .302 (73-for-242) with 44 runs, 15 doubles, 11 home runs, 35 RBI, and 28 walks in 66 games...Promoted to Fort Myers on 6/22 and hit .291 (67-for-230) with 28 runs, eight doubles, two triples, six home runs, and 31 RBI in 61 games for the Miracle.

2006: Made his professional debut with Rookie League Elizabethton...Ranked fifth in the Appalachian League in home runs (8) and 10th in batting average (.311)...Recorded a season-high 13-game hitting streak from 8/7-20, hitting .333 (20-for-60) during this stretch.
