**BETTER LATE THAN NEVER:** Down a run last night with one out in the ninth, Albert Almora Jr. and Addison Russell delivered back-to-back doubles to tie the game at 2-2 before Ben Zobrist knocked in Russell with a game-winning two-out single to help Chicago to a 3-2 win over the Braves at SunTrust Park.

Ⓞ Last night was the Cubs second road victory this season when trailing entering the ninth inning ... April 7 in Milwaukee, the Cubs were down 2-1 before plating four ninth-inning runs en route to a 5-2 win.

Ⓞ Zobrist's game-winning knock last night was his second in the ninth inning or later this season ... he delivered a game-winning RBI single in the 10th inning of an eventual 10-6 win at the Marlins on March 31 ... all told, last night marked his 10th career go-ahead RBI in the ninth inning or later.

Ⓞ Including last night's victory, Chicago's last three road games have all been decided in the last at-bat ... the Cubs suffered consecutive walk-off defeats in St. Louis, May 5-6.

**IT'S ALWAYS SUNNY:** The Cubs are now 4-0 at SunTrust Park since the ballpark opened last season ... it's the first time Chicago has won its first four regular season games at a major league ballpark since doing so at San Diego's Petco Park over the 2004-05 campaigns.

Ⓞ The Cubs aim to win their first five games at a major league park for the first time since 1977, when the team started out 6-0 at the Montreal Expos Olympic Stadium ... all told, the Cubs have won their first five games at two home parks (West Side Park and Wrigley Field) and nine away parks, with Olympic Stadium being the only one since 1900 ... thanks to Ed Hartig.

Ⓞ SunTrust Park is the 10th road ballpark that the Cubs have played against the Braves franchise since their first season in Boston in 1876, the third ballpark in Atlanta ... the Cubs and Braves played in six different parks in Boston and one in Milwaukee.

**THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP:** The Braves and Cubs sit first and second among N.L. clubs in run differential (Atlanta, +56 and Chicago, +54), and the Braves lead the Senior Circuit with 221 runs scored while the Cubs sit tied for second with 208 (also Pittsburgh).

**QUALITY OVER QUANTITY:** Last night's victory was Chicago's seventh when plating three or fewer runs this season ... that's tied for third-most in the majors with Arizona and Oakland, trailing only Colorado (9) and Washington (8).

Ⓞ On the other end of the spectrum, Chicago has recorded eight games with at least 10 runs scored this season, the most such contests in the majors (Atlanta is second with six).

**A DISCERNING EYE:** Chicago has drawn 45 walks in its last nine games since May 6, good for an average of five free passes per game ... prior to this stretch, the Cubs averaged 1.6 walks per game in 11 contests from April 24-May 5 (18 walks total).

Ⓞ Anthony Rizzo has walked in five-straight games (seven total) after going 16-straight games without a walk from April 21-May 8.

**TWO FROM 14,000:** Since the franchise's inception in 1876, the Cubs have hit 13,998 home runs and are now just two away from exactly 14,000 blasts ... Ed Hartig notes that Brett Jackson hit the franchise's 13,000th homer on August 25, 2012 in Cubs regular season game number 20,375.

Ⓞ The only two franchises with more regular season home runs than the Cubs are the Yankees (15,700) and the Giants (14,425).

**CURRENT EVENTS:** Tonight is the second of three games against the Atlanta Braves to continue this seven-game six-day trip to Atlanta (1-0) and Cincinnati (4 games starting Friday, including a split doubleheader on Saturday to make-up April 3's rain out).

Ⓞ Tonight is the second in a stretch of 14 of 19 games on the road with all 14 road contests in the Eastern Time Zone (following trip is at Pittsburgh and New York).

Ⓞ Thanks to Monday's make-up game against Atlanta and Saturday's make-up game in Cincinnati, tonight is the sixth of 11 games in 10 days for the Cubs ... the team's next off day is May 21 and that's the first of three resites in just over two weeks for Chicago (off days also May 24 and June 4).

**BETTER AND BETTER:** In his first 35 games this season, Kris Bryant has a .421 on-base percentage and a .583 slugging percentage, good for a 1.004 OPS ... those are ahead of the numbers he put up in his first 35 games of 2017 (.407 OBP, .553 SLG, .960 OPS) and well ahead of the numbers he posted in the first 35 games of his N.L. MVP 2016 season (.356 OBP, .472 SLG, .828 OPS).

Ⓞ Bryant has homered in three of his last six games, in five of his last nine and in six of his last 12 overall ... on May 9, he hit his 100th career homer which is already a franchise mark for any player in his first four seasons as a Cub, surpassing Ernie Banks' 93 home runs from 1953-56.

Ⓞ Bryant is the 22nd player in franchise history to reach 100 career homers ... just two other Cubs third basemen have reached triple digits in home runs: Ron Santo (337 homers) and Aramis Ramirez (239).

**BÁEZ AT THE DISH:** Javier Báez leads the N.L. and is tied for second in the majors with 36 RBI ... he ranks third in the N.L. in extra-base hits (23), tied for third in total bases (87), fourth in slugging percentage (.580) and tied for fifth in home runs (10).

**STARTING STUFF:** After beginning the season with just seven quality starts and a 5.27 ERA (57 ER/97.1 IP) in the club's first 19 games, Cubs starting pitchers have gone 7-6 with nine quality starts and a 2.96 ERA (35 ER/106.1 IP) in the last 19 games ... Cubs starters have held the opponent to a .219 average (85-for-389) in the last 19 contests.

**WILLY AT-BAT:** Willson Contreras, who on Sunday turned 26, collected 26 total bases in a three-game stretch, May 9-12, going 10-for-15 with three doubles, two triples, three homers, 11 RBI and five runs scored.

Ⓞ Contreras on Friday set a career mark with seven RBI, going 4-for-5 with two homers (including a first-inning grand slam), two doubles and two runs scored in an 11-2 win over the White Sox ... he's just the fifth Cubs catcher since the RBI became an official stat in 1920 with at least seven RBI in a game, joining Ed Bailey (8 RBI, 7/22/65 vs. PHI), George Mitterwald (8 RBI, 4/17/74 vs. PIT), Barry Foote (8 RBI, 4/22/80 vs. STL) and Geovany Soto (7 RBI, 8/26/08 at PIT).

**A FINE QUINTET:** Five regular Cubs relievers have an ERA at 2.41 or better: Brian Duensing (0.68), Brandon Morrow (1.20), Pedro Strop (1.50), Steve Cishek (1.93) and Carl Edwards Jr. (2.41) ... the Cubs join Arizona as the only big league teams to boast that distinction, as no other club has more than four such relievers ... Arizona's qualifying relievers are: Archie Bradley, Brad Boxberger, Andrew Chafin, T.J. McFarland and Yoshihisa Hirano.

Ⓞ Dating to last season, Brandon Morrow's 65.2-straight innings without allowing a homer is the longest active streak in the majors, while Steve Cishek ranks third with a streak of 45.2-straight homerless innings.

Ⓞ Pedro Strop has 10.2 scoreless innings since April 21, holding the opponent to a .114 (4-for-35) average and a .276 OPS ... he's averaged 12 pitches per inning.

Tyler makes his eighth start of the season, and fourth on the road ... has only surrendered one home run this season, the fewest among all Cubs starters ... has allowed more walks than hits in all but one of his starts this season ... has walked at least five batters in five of his seven starts, yet has only allowed at least five hits in one of his starts.

- ⊙ Tossed 7.0-scoreless innings, April 29 vs. Milwaukee ... was his second-straight quality start after allowing one run in 6.0 innings, April 24 at Cleveland.
- ⊙ Made his Cubs debut April 2 at Cincinnati ... allowed six walks and four hits, but just one run in 6.0 innings ... took the tough loss in the Cubs' 1-0 setback.
- ⊙ Has allowed two or fewer runs in five of his seven starts ... is allowing just 6.2 hits per nine innings ... has surrendered more walks (32) than hits (26).

### 2017 Season

Made 25 starts and eight relief outings with the Rockies, going a combined 8-15 with a complete game shutout and a 4.69 ERA (77 ER/147.2 IP) ... posted a 3.49 ERA (30 ER/77.1 IP) on the road compared to a 6.01 ERA (47 ER/70.1 IP) at home.

- ⊙ Went 8-14 with a 4.75 ERA (72 ER/136.1 IP) as a starter ... was 0-1 with one save and a 3.97 ERA (5 ER/11.1 IP) as a reliever.
- ⊙ His 15 losses were tied for the most in the National League, while his 77 walks were third-most in the N.L. ... recorded a career-high 120 strikeouts.
- ⊙ Made 19 starts to begin the season, going 6-11 with a 4.74 ERA (56 ER/106.1 IP) ... had seven relief outings and one start from July 26-September 2 ... moved back to the rotation on September 5 and went 2-2 with a 2.92 ERA (8 ER/24.2 IP) in five starts ... made his final appearance of the season out of the bullpen, September 30.
- ⊙ Named his first-career complete game shutout, April 15 at San Francisco, allowing two hits and one walk with four strikeouts ... retired the first 17 batters in the club's 5-0 victory.
- ⊙ Named recipient of the Wilson Defensive Player of the Year as the best defensive pitcher in MLB.

Tyler signed a three-year major league contract with the Cubs, December 7, 2017 ... has pitched in seven seasons with the Los Angeles Angels (2011), Colorado Rockies (2012-14, 2016-17) and Cubs.

- ⊙ Ranks fourth among qualified National League starting pitchers in road ERA since the start of 2016 with a 2.60 mark (50 ER/173.1 IP), trailing Clayton Kershaw (2.18 ERA), Max Scherzer (2.53 ERA) and Stephen Strasburg (2.53 ERA).
- ⊙ Missed most of the 2014 season and the entire 2015 campaign due to his second Tommy John surgery.
- ⊙ Made his major league debut with the Angels in April of 2011.
- ⊙ Originally selected by the Angels in the second round of the 2008 Draft ... signed out of Redlands East Valley (Calif.) High School where he was twice named San Bernardino Player of the Year (2005, 2007).

### Thursday's Starter at Atlanta — LHP Jon Lester (3-1, 2.66)

Jon makes his ninth start of the season, and fifth on the road, tomorrow against Atlanta ... is 2-1 with a 1.82 ERA (6 ER/29.2 IP) in his last five outings ... last pitched May 12 vs. the White Sox, allowing one run on four hits in 5.2 innings ... the Cubs have gone 6-2 in his first eight starts.

- ⊙ In 2017, Jon went 13-8 with a 4.33 ERA (87 ER/180.2 IP) and 180 strikeouts ... made 32 starts for the third-straight season since joining the Cubs.
- ⊙ A four-time All-Star and three-time World Series Champion, Jon is in his fourth season with Chicago after he signed with the Cubs on December 15, 2014 ... is one of four Cubs lefties all-time with at least three seasons of 32 games started.
- ⊙ Has gone 6-2 with a 2.47 ERA (16 ER/58.1 IP) in nine-career starts against the Braves, including eight quality starts ... is 5-1 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP) in six-career starts on the road against the Braves, tossing quality starts in each outing ... is 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA (1 ER/21.1 IP) in three starts at Atlanta as a Cub.

Tommy last night was 0-for-1 as a pinch-hitter to snap a five-game hitting streak (5-for-11) ... is 8-for-18 with three walks and six RBI as a pinch-hitter, the most hits as a PH in the majors and tied for the most RBI ... Monday, hit leadoff and was 1-for-4 with a run ... Friday, delivered a ninth-inning RBI pinch-single ... hit a two-run pinch-hit single April 28 ... went 2-for-3 with two runs and a RBI April 22 ... on Opening Day hit a two-run pinch-double with two outs in the seventh ... was on the Cubs Opening Day roster for the fourth-straight season, one of only two Cubs position players to accomplish that feat (also, Rizzo) ... posted a .288 average (36-for-125) and .389 OBP in 73 games with the Cubs last season ... had a .488 OBP as a pinch-hitter in 2017, reaching base in 21-of-44 pinch-hit plate appearances ... was an eighth round selection of the Braves in the 2011 MLB Draft.
