MARINERS NOTES:

- The Mariners improve to 10-8 against Oakland this season, clinching the season series for the 6th straight season.
- The Mariners picked up their 38th comeback win of the season.
- The Mariners improved to 14-1 in extra innings this season...extends their club record for extra-inning wins in a season (previous: 12, 1984).
- The Mariners recorded their 8th walk-off win of the season (last: 8/18 vs. LAD).
- The Mariners used 26 players, including 10 pitchers, tonight...marks the 2nd time in club history to use at least 10 pitchers in a game; the Mariners used 11 pitchers exactly 26 years ago today, Sept. 25, 1992 at Texas (16 inn.).
- **Chris Herrmann** (1x1, R, HR, 2 RBI) recorded his 4th career walk-off hit (last: 6/27/17 vs. STL w/ARI)...was his 2nd career walk-off home run (also: 5/17/17 vs. NYM w/ARI).
 - Is the 1st Mariner to record a pinch-hit, walk-off home run since Adam Lind on July 18, 2016 vs. Chicago-AL.
- **Mike Zunino** (2x5, R, 2 2B) is batting .333 (11x33) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, and 4 walks in his last 10 games (9/13-c).
 - Has hit safely in 4 consecutive games, tying his season-high (also: 5/30 – 6/2).
 - Picked up 2 doubles for the 4th time in his career (last: 5/30/18).
- **Denard Span** (2x3, 2 2B, 2 RBI) is only the 4th Mariners player in club history to record 2 doubles off the bench (last: Darren Bragg, 7/18/96 at LAA).
- **Nelson Cruz** (2x5, R, HR, 3 RBI) hit a home run in the 1st inning to bring his season total to 21 home runs at Safeco Field... ranks tied for 1st all-time by a Mariners player at Safeco Field in a single season (also: Richie Sexon, 2005)... the home run was his 37th overall this season, ranks 6th in the American League and is the 5th highest home run total of his career (most: 44, 2015).
- **Robinson Canó** (1x6) has hit safely in 7 straight games, batting .517 (15x29) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, and 5 multi-hit games during that span.
- **Mitch Haniger** (2x6, R) has reached base safely via hit or walk in 31 of his last 33 games, dating back to August 18... is batting .319 (44x138) with 27 runs scored, 10 doubles, 2 triples, 7 home runs, and 13 RBI during that span.
 - Has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 games, batting .381 (21x55) with 13 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, and 4 walks during that span.
- **Jean Segura** (2x6, 2 R, HR, RBI) hit his 10th home run of the season, becoming the 7th Mariners hitter this season with 10+ home runs...marks the 14th time in club history to have at least 7 players with 10+ home runs (last: 2017, 8).
 - Recorded his team-leading 51st multi-hit game of the season.

ATHLETICS NOTES:

- Oakland falls to 68-1 when leading after 7 innings this season and 77-1 when leading after 8 innings this season...Seattle (74-0) is the only team in the Majors this season with a perfect record when leading after 8 innings.
- Every player in the A's starting lineup recorded a hit in tonight's game, including 5 players with at least 2 hits.
- **Blake Treinen** recorded his 5th blown save of the season, first since July 21 vs. San Francisco...entered tonight's game having converted 13 consecutive save opportunities, spanning July 24 – Sept. 24.
 - Snapped a streak of 15.1 consecutive scoreless innings, which spanned Aug. 25 – Sept. 25.
- **Jed Lowrie** (2x6, R, RBI) is batting .333 (24x72) with 5 home runs and 17 RBI against the Mariners this season.
 - Recorded his team-leading 47th multi-hit game of the season.
- **Nick Martini** (3x6, 2 R, 3B, 2 RBI) recorded his 3rd triple of the season in the top of the 2nd inning.
 - Recorded 3+ hits for the 5th time in his career (last: 9/13 vs. BAL).
- **Matt Chapman** (2x5, BB) is batting .316 (79x250) with 14 home runs and 39 RBI since the All-Star Break after hitting .250 with 10 home runs and 29 RBI prior to the break.
- **Marcus Semien** (1x5, R, HR, RBI) snapped a 0x11 stretch with a solo home run in the 5th inning.

OAKLAND MANAGER BOB MELVIN:

On if he was shocked to see the team lose their first game when leading after 7 innings:

"Yes, because of the way things have gone for us this year, but I don't know how many times that happened. Not in many seasons I've managed. If it happened once, it happened once. It's certainly a pretty good track record up to this point."

On what was going on with Brett Anderson:

"It just seemed like he didn't locate real well, and there wasn't as much movement his ball. They got him on the run early and kept some pressure on him. You know, obviously had to go get him at that point."

On what he saw from Matt Chapman on the error in the 9th inning:

"He just bobbled it. It came out of his glove a little bit early, and he couldn't get a handle on it. It's not what lost the game for us. We left 10 on base, and we had some opportunities to score a little bit more. It never comes down to one play. As good as he has been, we need to pick him up too."
