2018 NOTES

- Opened season in Pittsburgh organization, earning International League All-Star honors for second consecutive season with Indianapolis.
- Hit .291 (76x261) prior to IL All-Star break, with 20 doubles, three triples, four home runs, 28 RBI, and six steals.
- Was batting .324 (12x37) in 11 July games prior to recall by Pirates on July 31.
- Appeared in two games (0x2) for Pittsburgh before being optioned August 4 and designated for assignment Aug. 7.
- Posted a .295 (88x298) at Triple-A prior to being traded, with 32 runs scored, 24 doubles, three triples, four home runs, and 32 RBI.
- Ranked sixth in IL in doubles, eighth in AVG, and 12th in on-base percentage (.351) at time of trade.
- Assigned to Triple-A New Orleans upon acquisition from Pittsburgh, but was recalled before reporting to Baby Cakes to replace Martin Prado (DL, injured in Game 1) between games of a doubleheader on August 13 at Atlanta.
- Made Marlins debut that night with pinch-hit walk; had pinch-hit RBI double next night, also in Atlanta, before being optioned back to New Orleans.
- Hit .281 (18x64) with 6 RBI in 16 G for Baby Cakes before end of PCL season.

2017 SUMMARY

- Spent majority of season with Triple-A Indianapolis in Pittsburgh's system, earning International League All-Star honors as an outfielder.
- Finished season second in IL in hits, was third in doubles, and fourth in batting average.
- Led Indianapolis in average, doubles, and multi-hit games (44) to earn Team MVP honors.
- Appeared in left field (38 games), right field (34), second base (33), center field (13), and third base (6).
- Had 15-game hitting streak from April 15-March 3, batting .375 (24x64) with six doubles, two homers, nine RBI, and eight multi-hit games, including five straight from April 27-May 2.
- Recalled by Pirates on May 8 and made Major League debut that night at Los Angeles-NL as a defensive replacement in left field; played final five innings and went 0x2.
- Optioned back to Indianapolis on May 12; hit safely in first eight games upon return, including seven straight multi-hit efforts from May 13-18 (.531; 17x32).
- Recalled on September 3 and hit .348 (8x23) with six runs scored in 17 games over remainder of month.
- Doubled off Chicago's Felix Pena on Sept. 7 for first Major League hit.
- Had first career RBI on Sept. 28 at Washington.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Split 2016 season between Double-A Harrisburg and Triple-A Syracuse in Washington's system, combining to bat .250 (121x484) with 22 doubles, career-high 10 triples, eight homers, and 51 RBI in 135 games.
- Began season with Harrisburg; made 62 starts at second base and five (six appearances) in left field.
- Batted .324 (36x111) with 13 multi-hit efforts in 29 games during May.
- Was leading the Eastern League with eight triples when he was promoted to Triple-A on June 26...
- For Syracuse, made 47 appearances (46 starts) at second base, 13 starts at third base and two starts in left field.
- Split first season in Washington organization between High-A Potomac and Harrisburg in 2015. Combined to hit .258 (137x530) with 22 doubles, eight triples, 12 home runs and 58 RBI in a career-high 137 games.
- Led Nationals minor league players with a career-high 31 stolen bases and ranked fourth in home runs.
- Made 95 appearances (94 starts) at second base and six appearances (five starts) at shortstop between the two clubs.



- Also made 20 starts in left field with Harrisburg and two appearances (one start) in center field.
- Began season with Potomac.
- Hit .400 (22x55) during a 13-game hitting streak between May 27 and June 9.
- Promoted to Harrisburg on June 15.
- Participated in Arizona Fall League and hit .268 (19x71) with four home runs in 20 games with the Salt River Rafters.
- Spent **2014** season with Single-A Advanced Myrtle Beach in Texas' system.
- Ranked second in Carolina League in runs, fifth in doubles, fifth in triples and sixth in hits.
- Made all 122 defensive appearances at second base.
- Hit safely in 21 of his 27 games in July, batting .330 (35x106).
- Acquired by Texas in offseason and spent **2013** campaign with Single-A Beloit in Midwest League.
- Ranked third in MID in RBI, and led Beloit in triples and steals.
- Made all 125 defensive appearances at second base.
- Named MID Player of the Week for June 10-16 after hitting .458 (11x24) with four homers and 14 RBI in seven games.
- Homered twice on June 15 vs. Clinton.
- Hit .391 (36x92) with six home runs and 25 RBI in 25 games in June.
- Spent final season in Oakland organization with Short-Season A Vermont in New York-Penn League in **2012**.
- Made 53 starts at second base, 10 at shortstop, and one in right field.
- Opened season with six-game hitting streak, batting .308 (8x26) with a double, a home run, and an RBI.
- Batted .260 (50x192) with 31 runs scored, nine doubles, three triples, three home runs, 19 RBI, and nine steals prior to the All-Star break, earning NYPL Midseason All-Star honors.
- Began professional career in **2011** with 14 games for Arizona League Athletics after being selected in 44th round of First-Year Player Draft.
- Made eight appearances (seven starts) at shortstop and five appearances (four starts) at second base.
- Reached base safely in all 14 games; hit safely in each of his first 13 before going 0x1 with a HBP in his final game, on August 27.
- Between **2011** and **2012**, reached base safely in his first 28 professional games.
