SHOW BAT

Scouter Gennett leads the National League in hitting (.322), hits (165), multi-hit games (50) and 3-hit games (17)...in the first half hit **.326** to become the first Reds batter to lead the NL in hitting at the All-Star break since **George Foster** in 1979...listed below on the right are the only Reds players ever to finish the season **leading the National League in batting average**.

YELLOW, BLACK & BLUE: Beginning in 2013, **Reds pitchers hit 65 Pirates batters** (including **20 in 2016, 10 in 2017** and **2 in 2018**), second-most by any Major League staff against any opponent...in that same span, **Pirates pitchers hit 59 Reds batters** (including **9 in 2016, 7 in 2017** and **7 in 2018**), sixth-most vs any opponent (**Mariners hit 68 Rangers batters**, the most vs any opponent)...over the past 6 seasons, including 2018, **Pirates pitchers** lead the Major Leagues in number of batters **hit by a pitch with 421**, followed by the **White Sox (400)** and **Reds (390)**.

POSTSEASON: Last night at **Clearwater**, Class A **Daytona** began its **Florida State League's** best-of-3 playoffs with a 7-6 loss...the series continues tonight at **Daytona**...Class AA **Pensacola** will begin its **Southern League** title defense tonight at **Biloxi** in a best-of-5 series...on Friday, rookie **Billings** will host **Great Falls** in Game 1 of the **Pioneer League's** best-of-3 series.

TRIPLE CROWN

Eugenio Suárez, hitting **.293**, is the only player in the National League with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...**Bos' J.D. Martinez** (.335, 39 HR, 115 RBI) is the only other player in the Major Leagues to match those numbers in the **Triple Crown** categories...**Oak's Khris Davis**, hitting **.245**, is the only other player in the majors with at least **31 HR** (40) and **100 RBI** (106).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **56-65** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

HURLING: The Reds have used **32 pitchers**, tying the **2016 franchise record** for pitchers in a season and including **4 position players** (**Cliff Pennington** on 4/12 vs StL; **Alex Blandino** on 7/11 at Cle; **Dilson Herrera** on 8/8 at NYM; **Brandon Dixon** on 8/13 vs Cle & 8/31 at StL) and **7 rookies** (**RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Tanner Rainey**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **RHP Kevin Shackelford**, **RHP Keury Mella**, **RHP Jesús Reyes**).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES: The Reds went **16-25-2 in their 43 completed series**, including **11-9-1 in the last 21 completed series** beginning **6/19**...beginning **6/21**, the Reds have gone **5-1-2 in their last 8 series vs first-place teams** (15-13, .536, **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil**, **2-1 vs Cle**, **3-1 vs Phi**, **2-1 vs Ari**, **0-3 vs Cle** and **0-4 at Chi**)...the Reds' **2-1 series loss at Cubs** completed on **7/8** snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak**, their longest since **2016**.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits, batting average** (.285) and **on-base percentage** (.359)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the NL in OBP...**All-Star 2B Scouter Gennett** leads the league in hitting, hits, multi-hit games and 3-hit games...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** is the only player in the NL with at least **31 HR** and **100 RBI**...**SS José Peraza** ranks among the leaders in several statistical categories.

HOTTEST CORNER

Eugenio Suárez (.293, 31 HR, 100 RBI) is the fourth player in franchise history to hit **30 HR** in a season while playing primarily third base (list below)...is the 18th Reds player to produce at least **30 HR** and **100 RBI** in a season...is trying to become the ninth Reds player to produce **30 HR** and **100 RBI** while hitting at least **.300**.

SILVER SLUGGER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** is trying to become the **first relief pitcher** ever to win a **Louisville Silver Slugger Award** and the first player in the **live ball era** to produce at least 4 HR in a season **without starting a game**...he has **4 HR**, including 2 HR as a pitcher and 2 HR as a pinch-hitter (including a pinch-hit grand slam on 6/30 vs Mil off **Jacob Barnes**)...according to our friends @EliasSports, the franchise record for **HR as a pitcher** is **4** by converted outfielder **Hal Jeffcoat**, who hit 4 HR in **1957**, all as a pitcher...**Tom Parrott** hit 4 HR in **1894**, including 2 as pitcher, 1 as a left fielder and 1 as a second baseman...**as a pinch hitter**, **Lorenzen is 3-for-11** (2hr, 5rbi) this season and **4-for-18** (3hr, 6rbi) in his career, with **home runs on 4/6/17** off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, **6/24/18** off Chi's **Mike Montgomery** and **6/30/18** off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** (grand slam).

ELIMINATION NUMBERS

The Reds' **Central Division** elimination number is **2**...their **Wild Card** elimination number is **6**...last season were eliminated on **9/12** (Wild Card) and **9/14** (NL Central).

SLAMMING: The Reds, Red Sox and Indians are tied for the Major League lead with **9 grand slams**, tying Cin's **2002 franchise single-season record**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duval** (2), **Scouter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the WSox on **5/16/1953 at NYY**.

RED HOTS

Homer Bailey tonight is making his **20th start of the season** and **212th appearance** and **start of his career**...will be his 24th career appearance and start vs the **Pirates**, his third of the season, and his 12th career start at **PNC Park**...has **997 career strikeouts** (1,225.1 IP)...the Reds went **1-18** in his **19 starts**, including **0-6** in his **6 quality starts**...in the 2-1 loss on **7/31 at Det** threw the **seventh complete game** of his career and reached **1,200 career innings pitched** (1,200.2)...is the only complete game by a Reds pitcher this season...from **6/2-7/23** was disabled with **right knee inflammation**...following a 12-5 loss on **5/28 at Ari** was scheduled to make his next appearance out of the bullpen, but before he pitched went on the 10-day disabled list...on rehab at Louisville from **6/11-7/18** made 6 starts and 1 relief appearance (2-2, 4.78)...on **5/7 vs NYM** made the **200th appearance** and **start** of his career...in the 3-2 loss on **4/15 vs StL**, following a rain delay of 2 hours, 36 minutes, threw the **100th quality start** of his career (196th appearance)...in the 2-0 loss on **3/30 vs Wsh** made the first **Opening Day start** of his Major League career...has the **third-longest tenure** of any Major League pitcher with his current team (June 2007), trailing only Sea's **Felix Hernandez** (August 2005) and StL's **Adam Wainwright** (September 2005)...was on the Reds' **Opening Day roster** for the first time since **2014**.

- In his last 83 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .307 (103-335, 18 2b, 4 3b, 7hr, 33rbi, 12sb), raising his season BA from .243.
- Leads the team in starts at 2 spots in the batting order, including leadoff (48gs) and second (52gs), and ranks second batting seventh (22gs, Barnhart 27gs)...also has batted eighth (8gs)...from 7/15-8/15 made a season-high 26 consecutive starts batting first and since then has made his last 16 starts batting second while Billy Hamilton has led off.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

Road Trip: 6-16, 2 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 3bb, 2hbp

- In 10 apps since he came off the disabled list last Saturday is hitting .222 (8-36, 2 2b, 1hr, 3rbi)...had been on the DL since 7/18 with a sprained AC joint in his right shoulder suffered on 7/14 at StL when he hit the outfield walk while making a catch.
- Has made a team-high 59 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.
- Has made 31 career starts batting leadoff, including 26 times this year (33-111, .297)...in his 31 career starts batting leadoff hit .301 (40-133), including .302 (39-129) in his 30 starts batting leadoff for the Reds.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Road Trip: 5-20, 1 2b, 1hr, 5rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- His 31 HR, 100 RBI and .930 OPS are career highs...is 1 of 11 players born in Venezuela to produce at least 30 HR in a season.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb is tied for the National League lead in RBI...Dave Parker in 1985 was the last Reds batter to lead the NL in RBI (125)...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Hit safely in 6 of his last 7 apps (8-28, .286, 2 2b, 2hr, 7rbi)...in his last 15 apps produced 5 HR and 12 RBI...has an RBI in 4 of his last 6 apps (7rbi).
- Is 1 of only 6 players in the Major Leagues with three 10-game hitting streaks (13g, 13g, 10g), joining Atl's Nick Markakis (12g, 11g, 11g) and Freddie Freeman (16g, 10g, 14g), Hou's Yuli Gurriel (11g, 12g, 13g) and Alex Bregman (12g, 10g, 11g) and KC's Whit Merrifield (12g, 12g, 12g)...Suárez' career-high 13-game hitting streaks (6/8-6/23, 6/27-7/10) are the longest by any Reds batter this season
- From 7/23-7/27 homered in 5 straight apps to tie the club record for consecutive games with a HR.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

51 BLAKE TRAHAN, inf

Road Trip: 1gs at SS, 1-3

- The Louisiana native's last name is pronounced TRUH-haw...bio is on page 253.
- In Mon's 5-1 loss at Pit started at SS in his Major League debut...in the seventh inning singled off Trevor Williams for his first career hit.
- Is 1 of 9 Reds players to make Major League debuts this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera, IF/OF Brandon Dixon, RHP Jesús Reyes, OF Aristides Aquino, Gabriel Guerrero).
- Was promoted on Saturday from Louisville (129g, .245, 17 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 31rbi, 6sb)...for the Bats made all 127 defensive apps at SS.
- When promoted was tied for the International League lead in apps (129) and sacrifice bunts (12)...finished the season ranked sixth in the IL in apps and T1st in sac bunts.
- Never has been invited to Major League spring training camp, but for the Reds over the last 3 Cactus League seasons appeared in 13 games (429 in 2016), 8 games (.333 in 2017) and 5 games (0-for-6 in 2018).

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Road Trip: 5-17, 1 2b, 2rbi, 4bb, 4r

- Is 5-for-22 (.227, 1 2b, 2rbi, 4bb, 4r, .333obp) in 6 apps since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on Thursday...had been on the 10-day disabled list since 8/17 with a right lower leg contusion suffered when he was hit by a Ryan Madson pitch on 8/4 at Wsh...in the Reds' 10 games after that HBP missed 4 starts and 2 games until he was disabled...on 8/7 & 8/8 at NYM missed consecutive starts for the first time since June 2016.
- Prior to his disabling had missed only 8 starts and 3 of the Reds' 121 games.
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and ranks second in walks...is the only batter in the NL and 1 of only 5 Major League players with an OBP of at least .400.
- Is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...in the 10th inning, became the first player born in Canada to homer in the All-Star Game (off Tor's J.A. Happ).
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

46 MASON WILLIAMS, of

Road Trip: 5g, 1gs in LF, 1-8, 1bb

- In his last 14 apps is hitting .300 (9-30, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1rbi), raising BA from .267.
- Has made 16 starts in RF (last, 8/24 at Cubs), 3 starts in CF (last, Thu vs Mil) and 1 start in LF (Sun at StL)...in Sun's 10-inning, 6-4 win at StL made his second appearance and first start of the season in LF (0-4, 1bb).
- During Scott Schebler's most recent stint on the disabled list started 18 of the Reds' 26 games (17gs in RF, 1gs in CF) and hit safely in 13 of those 18 starts (19-68, .279, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 5rbi, 6r).
- Was promoted from Louisville on 7/26, when OF Jesse Winker was disabled with a season-ending right shoulder injury.
