**THE TWINS:** The Twins have gone 3-1 through four games on their 11-day homestand...today they will begin a four-game series with the White Sox with a traditional doubleheader this afternoon...they will complete the homestand with three vs. Los Angeles-AL this weekend...13 of the Twins last 15 games have been decided by three runs-or-less with the Twins going 5-8 in those games.

**THE EDDIE ROSARIO GAME:** The Twins beat the Indians Sunday afternoon at Target Field by a score of 7-5 in walk-off fashion...Kyle Gibson was the starter but did not factor into the decision for the eighth time in 12 starts; he allowed two runs on two hits in 5.2 innings pitched...the Twins recorded 11 hits, three from Eddie Rosario and three from Ryan LaMarre...Rosario homered three times, including the walk-off two-run shot in the ninth inning...below are Twins all-time three-homer games:

**BASEBALL BOGO:** The Twins are playing their first doubleheader of the season today...this marks the second "traditional doubleheader" in Target Field's history, the other being May 21, 2017 vs. KC...below are the results from the 2017 doubleheaders, four at home and two on the road:

**FEELING A DRAFT:** Last night the Twins selected outfielder **Trevor Larnach** (LAR-nick) from Oregon State University with the 20th overall selection in the first round of the 2018 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft...in addition, the Twins also selected catcher **Ryan Jeffers** from UNC Wilmington with the 59th overall pick in the second round...Larnach, 21, is currently playing his junior season at Oregon State University...the 6-foot-4, 210-pounder has hit .327 (70-for-214) with 13 doubles, 17 home runs and 65 RBI in 58 games for the Beavers this season...in three seasons at OSU has combined to hit .298 (138-for-463) with 30 doubles, 20 home runs and 116 RBI in 146 games...Jeffers, 21, hit .327 (69-for-211) with 22 doubles, 16 home runs and 59 RBI in 60 games for UNC Wilmington as a junior in 2018...in three seasons with the Seahawks he hit .327 (138-for-422) with 44 doubles, 27 home runs and 96 RBI in 125 games...Twins continue the 2018 First-Year Player Draft today with rounds 4-10 beginning at 12:00 pm CT.

**TWINS AND SOX:** The Twins and White Sox are playing the fifth of 19 games this season...the last time these two met at Target Field, they played one game of a scheduled four-game series, postponing the entire weekend's slate of games due to cold temps and approximately 16 inches of snow accumulation over the 3-4 day period...the Twins have won seven of their last eight over the Sox and 13 of their last 18.

- ☞ Brian Dozier is hitting .324 (44-for-136) with 11 doubles, 12 home runs, 24 RBI and a .399 on-base percentage in his last 34 games vs. the White Sox.
- ☞ Eduardo Escobar is hitting .311 (23-for-74) with six doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI and a .416 on-base percentage in his last 21 games vs. his former club.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario has hit safely in each of his last eight games vs. the White Sox, hitting .389 (14-for-36) with five doubles, four home runs and 13 RBI in that span.

**WHITE HOT ROSIE:** Since the start of May, Eddie Rosario is hitting .378 (48-for-127) with 11 doubles, 10 home runs, 28 RBI, 24 runs scored, a .415 on-base percentage, .701 slugging percentage and a 1.116 OPS in 31 games...among AL players since the start of May, he ranks first in batting average, tied for second in RBI, tied for fourth in homers, fifth in slugging and OPS, and tied for fifth in runs.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** The Twins hit .196 (55-for-280) with 2.9 runs-per-game and a .270 on-base percentage in nine games from May 18-27...since May 28, the Twins have recorded 10-plus hits in four of seven games and have averaged 10.0 hits-per-game, 6.6 runs-per-game with a .357 on-base percentage in those seven.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1994, in Detroit, Chuck Knoblauch led off the game with a homer off Mike Moore, then added a second homer in the seventh...Tigers lead-off hitter, Tony Phillips went deep off Scott Erickson in his first at-bat, and added a homer, in the eighth...it marked the first time in MLB history for this to happen, then August 13, 2013, Tampa Bay's Ben Zobrist and Seattle's Brad Miller did it...in 2014, the Twins selected infielder Nick Gordon with the fifth overall pick in the MLB First-Year Player Draft.

**HBD ROYCE!** Twins minor leaguer Royce Lewis turns 19-years-old today...Lewis was the first overall selection in last season's draft on June 12.

**LAST START:** In his sixth big league start, Romero lasted a season and career-low 1.2 innings, allowing eight runs on nine hits, walking and striking out one...the eight earned runs was more than the combination of all his outings so far with the Twins...allowed just his second home run of the season...one strikeout was the fewest of any start this season, minor or major league level.

**AGAINST THE WHITE SOX:** Romero has never faced Chicago-AL...this will be his second start against the American League Central and second consecutively...his record against the division is 0-1 with a 43.20 ERA.

**DOMINANT DEBUT:** Romero shutout the Blue Jays over 5.2 innings in his major league debut on May 2, allowing four hits and three walks with five strikeouts, earning his first win...Romero retired the first three batters of the game, striking out the first batter he faced (Curtis Granderson)...he retired the first two batters he faced in the sixth inning but walked Kevin Pillar on a full count, ending his day...one of two pitchers to hold their opponent scoreless in their ML debut in 2018 (Nick Kingham, PIT)...he became the first Twins pitcher to win in his debut since Felix Jorge on July 1, 2017 at Kansas City.

**TAKING OVER THE BIGS:** Romero allowed his first earned of his big league career in his start against Los Angeles-AL in the fifth inning, ending his scoreless streak at 15.2 innings...this was the second longest scoreless innings streak to start a career in Twins history since 1974, following only Andrew Albers (17.1 IP)...Romero has notched wins in his first two outings, one of two Twins over the last 30 years to win their first two career starts: Albers (2013) and Eric Milton (1998).

**JOIN THE CAROUSEL:** By making his first career start on May 2, Romero became the sixth different starting pitcher and the 19th different pitcher the Twins have used in 2018 (including outfielder Ryan LaMarre).

**ELITE ENTRANCES:** Romero was the 63rd player and 40th pitcher to make his big league debut in 2018...he is also the seventh player on MLB.com's top-100 prospect's list to make his debut in 2018...Romero is one of five players in the Twins organization listed on the top-100 prospect list (Royce Lewis, 20; Stephen Gonsalves, 77; Nick Gordon, 79; Wander Javier, 100).

**SEVENS UP:** Romero is the second player in club history to ever appear in uniform number 77, joining third baseman Tony Batista, who wore it for 50 games in 2006...33 players in baseball history have ever worn 77, including current players: Toronto's John Axford, San Diego's Buddy Bauman, Miami's Merandy Gonzalez and Detroit's Joe Jimenez.

**TWINS DEBUTS:** Romero was the second Twins pitcher to make his major league debut and the 12th Twins pitcher to make his debut since the beginning of 2017 (Tyler Kinley debuted April 7 vs. SEA)...he is now one of 16 different Twins to make his major league debut since 2017, joining pitchers John Curtiss, Dietrich Enns, Trevor Hildenberger, Justin Haley, Gabriel Moya, Alan Busenitz, Nik Turley, Aaron Slegers, Felix Jorge, Randy Rosario and Jason Wheeler, catcher Mitch Garver, infielder Niko Goodrum, and outfielder Zack Granite.

- Optioned from Twins spring training to Double-A Chattanooga March 13 where he spent the entire season.
- Named Southern League Midseason All-Star.
- Named Twins minor league Player of the Week July 29, going 2-0, 0.90 ERA (10.0 IP, 1 ER) with four walks and 15 strikeouts in two starts for the Lookouts.
- Placed on 7-day disabled list with right shoulder impingement August 24, ending his season.
- Held right-handed hitters to a .239 average and left-handed hitters to a .276 average.
- Tied for seventh in all of Double-A in wins (11).
- Named sixth best prospect in Twins system by *Baseball America*, entering 2018.

**TOP PROSPECT:** Since being signed in 2011, Romero has been touted as one of the top prospects in the Twins system...*Baseball America* named him the Twins 12th ranked prospect in 2013 and has been rated as a top-30 prospect in the Twins organization since...entered 2018 as the number 66 prospect in all of baseball and the second best prospect in the Twins system according to MLB.com, while *Baseball America* rated him as the sixth best prospect in the Twins organization.
