THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-2 through three games on their current homestand, going 1-1 vs. Seattle (postponed Sunday) and 0-1 vs. Houston...tonight and tomorrow afternoon they will play the second and third of three with the Astros, before hosting the White Sox for four Thursdays through Sunday...they will travel to Puerto Rico on Sunday afternoon/evening, enjoy an off-day on the island on Monday, followed with two "home games" in Puerto Rico against the Indians on April 17th and 18th at Hiram Bithorn Stadium.

TWINS LOSE OPENER WITH 'STROS: The Twins lost to the Astros last night by a score of 2-0, suffering their first shutout of the season and making them 1-3 in series openers this season...Lance Lynn pitched 5.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, four walks and nine strikeouts, throwing 105 pitches...Justin Verlander allowed four of the Twins six hits... Jason Castro reached twice on two hits and Joe Mauer reached three times on two hits and a walk...the offense went 1-for-11 with runners in scoring position and left eight men on base.

TWINS AND ASTROS: The Twins are playing the second of six games against the Astros this season...they will travel to Houston for three games from September 3-5...the Twins are 25-27 all-time against the Astros, including a record of 14-18 since the Astros joined the American League in 2013...they have won just once in their last 10 games against Houston...a win today and tomorrow and they will avoid losing a series to Houston for the sixth straight time; their last series win coming August 28-30, 2015.

☞ Brian Dozier has hit safely in five straight against the Astros, including three home runs and six RBI in that span...in his last 14 games, he is hitting .310 (18-for-58) with a .355 on-base percentage vs. Houston.

MINNESOTA'S GREATEST HITS: With another hit last night Joe Mauer now needs five hits to reach 2,000 for his career, which would join Kirby Puckett and Rod Carew as the only players in club history to reach the mark...11 active players have reached the 2,000 hit plateau, most recently Adrian Gonzalez in August of 2017.

TWO AT THE TOP: Brian Dozier has hit safely in all eight Twins games this season, one of three players in baseball to hit in each of their team's games (min. 8 games), joining Howie Kendrick and Dee Gordon...it marks Dozier's longest streak to start a season, previous high being three to start 2017...Joe Mauer has hit safely in seven straight to start the season, one short of his career-high to start any season, hitting safely in his first eight of 2010.

THE LEFTORIUM: The Twins have faced one left-handed starter this season, that being James Paxton on April 5 in a 4-2 win over Seattle...through eight games this season, Twins batters are hitting .283 (13-for-46) with one home run and a .353 on-base percentage vs. lefties, compared to a .226 (53-for-234) average with 11 home runs and a .292 OBP vs. right-handed pitching.

☞ Joe Mauer is hitting .424 (25-for-59) with a .462 on-base percentage vs. left-handed pitching dating back to August 17.
☞ Brian Dozier is hitting .327 (49-for-150) with a .416 on-base percentage vs. lefties since the start of 2017.
☞ Lifetime vs. Dallas Keuchel: Brian Dozier is 5-for-11 (.455) with a double and a homer, Logan Morrison is 4-for-11 (.364) with a double and a homer and Eduardo Escobar is 3-for-7 (.429).

HOMER HAPPY: The Twins have hit 12 home runs in their first eight games, tied with their 2002 total for the third most in club history through the first eight games...the only two seasons with more came in 2001 and 2004, hitting 13 in each of the first eight.
☞ Brian Dozier (80) and Miguel Sanó (56) have combined for 136 home runs since 2016, third-most in baseball for two teammates, trailing Nelson Cruz and Robinson Canó (146) of Seattle and Manny Machado and Mark Trumbo (143) of Baltimore.

THE STARTING LINE: Twins starters have posted a 2.91 ERA (43.1 IP, 14 ER) through eight games, the fourth best in the AL and fifth best in baseball, trailing Houston (1.64), Boston (1.70), Los Angeles-NL (2.26) and Kansas City (2.70)...their opponent batting average is .181 (29-for-160), the best in baseball.

THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1982, the Twins acquired reliever Ron Davis and minor leaguers Greg Gagne and Paul Boris from New York-AL, in exchange for infielder Roy Smalley and pitcher Gary Serum...Davis ranks fifth on Twins all-time saves list with 108 while Gagne was inducted into the Twins Hall of Fame in 2010.

ODO COMES HOME: Today marks Odorizzi's first start at Target Field as a member of the Twins...he has made two starts previously this season, both on the road...his last start on April 4 in Pittsburgh he went 4.1 innings and allowed three runs and one home run on five hits and issued three walks... Odorizzi has made three career-starts at Target Field as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays...he has gone 0-1 with a 3.57 ERA (17.2 IP, 7 ER) with two home runs, seven walks and 15 strikeouts.

A BRIGHT START: Odorizzi pitched in his first career Opening Day start and first career start for the Twins...he went 6.0 innings and allowed just two hits, while not allowing a run and striking out seven... only five other times in his career has he notched seven or more strikeouts while not allowing a run in six or more innings and this marked the first such instance since April 8, 2015 vs. Baltimore... he became the eighth different pitcher to start Opening Day for the Twins in the last 12 seasons.

SPRING FLING: After being acquired on February 17, Odorizzi was able to make three spring training starts for the Twins...in his first outing of the spring, recording a win after going 2.2 innings, striking out three with no hits allowed...Odorizzi improved to 2-0 on the spring after his second start where he went 3.2 innings, allowed one run on three hits...his final start of the spring yielded no decision after 4.0 innings, five hits, one run and one strikeout...he made a start against minor leaguers March 24...overall Odorizzi went 2-0, 0.87 ERA (10.1 IP, 1 ER), 5 H, 4 BB, and 4 SO.

2017 RECAP:

- In his fourth full professional season, Odorizzi started 28 games and tossed 143.1 innings...with a 10-8 record, this marked his third season of a .500 or better record
- His 7.97 K/9 ranked T-2nd best in his career (other, 2015 and best, 2014 with 9.32).
- On September 23, Odorizzi recorded nine strikeouts, a season high, while allowing just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings
- Odorizzi held right-handed batters to a .228 average and lefties to a .210 average against

PROBLEMS WITH THE LONG BALL: Last season Odorizzi gave up 30 homers in 143.1 IP...in his 28 starts he had only five outings where he did not give up at least one home run...his 1.88 HR/9 ranked fourth highest in the AL and sixth in MLB...of the 30 HR, 15 were solo shots, eight were two-run shot five three-run homers, and two grand-slams...Odorizzi had five multi-homer games, four of which were at home (Tropicana Field)...he was slightly better on the road than at home last season, giving up 11 homers on the road as compared to 19 at home.

STAY HEALTHY: Last season Odorizzi had two separate stints on the disabled list...his first stint was due to a strained left hamstring sidelining him from April 16-May 1 and the second was due to a lower back strain from July 25- August 9...his only rehab assignment was to Single-A Charlotte for one game...Odorizzi looks to bounce back from 2017 and contribute over 160.0 IP, which he has done in every other full-professional season (2014-2016).

FLY AWAY: In 2017 Odorizzi ranked fourth among all major league pitchers in Fly Ball Percentage (min. 140.0 IP) with a rate of 47.3%...he trailed Ariel Miranda of Seattle (52.2%), Marco Estrada of Toronto (50.3%), and Ian Kennedy of Kansas City (47.7%)...since 2014 Odorizzi has ranked in the top-10 in fly ball percentage every season: 2014 (2nd, 48.7%), 2015 (10th, 40.6%), and 2016 (9th, 44.4%).

HELP! I NEED SOMEBODY: In 2017 Odorizzi gave up 14 unearned runs, ranking him third in the American League behind Rick Porcello (20) and Sonny Gray (15)...in fact, Odorizzi himself only committed two errors in all of 2017.

HARD TO HIT IN 2017: Odorizzi started 12 games in 2017 where he allowed three-or-fewer hits, including a span of five games from September 5-29 where he allowed three-or-fewer hits in each game...this streak ties for the longest of any starter in baseball, last season...since the start of 2016, he has made 19 starts allowing three-or-fewer hits, most in the AL over that span.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTER - KYLE GIBSON (SEASON: 1-0, 0.87 ERA ; CAREER: 45-48, 4.64 ERA)

Gibson is 3-1, 2.76 ERA (29.1 IP, 9 ER) with 13 walks and 21 strikeouts in five career starts against Houston...his last start vs. the Astros came July 16, 2017 at Minute Maid Park and was dealt the loss, allowing four runs on six hits in 6.0 innings pitched...he is 20-26, 4.80 ERA (367.2 IP, 196 ER) in 65 career starts at Target Field, the most starts in the park's history (since 2010)...overall career record of 45-48, 4.64 ERA (740.2 IP, 382 ER) in 129 games (all starts).
