BAGS PACKED

- The Rockies are 6-3 in this season-long 10-game homestand ... Colorado has a 1.5-game edge over the Los Angeles Dodgers and lead Arizona by 3.5.
- The Rockies will begin a nine-game, 10-day trip tomorrow ... play three in San Francisco, three at Los Angeles-NL and three at Arizona ... finish the season at home with four against Philadelphia and three vs. Washington.
- This is the latest the Rockies have been alone in first place in the division since the 1995 Rockies held first place as late as Sept. 26 (139th game) ... it is the latest in franchise history by games the Rockies have been in first as the strike-shortened 1995 season consisted of only 144 games.

LODO MAGIC

- DJ LeMahieu recorded his first career walk-off RBI last night, a one-out, two-run home run.
- It was the Rockies' eighth walk-off win of the season, their fifth via home run which is second-most in franchise history (most: seven, 2010) ... all five walk-off home runs have been by different players, all since July 15.
- The Rockies bullpen pitched a franchise-record five perfect innings ... the prior mark for most innings pitched by Rockies relievers without allowing a baserunner was 4.2 on Sept. 6, 2012 at Atlanta.

DIVISIVE

- With 10 divisional games remaining, the Rockies are 36-30 vs. the National League West ... last year the Rockies were 42-34 against their division rivals ... the 2007 team was the best in franchise history vs. the NL West, going 43-30.

WHO'S THE TORTOISE?

- The Rockies' .552 winning percentage through 145 games (79-65) is tied with the 2017 team for the second-highest mark in franchise history, behind the 2009 club (.566, 82-63).
- The Rockies were eight games back after play on June 27 at 38-42 ... since June 28, are 42-23 (.646), the highest winning percentage in the National League and the third-best clip in the Majors.

BETTER HOMES AND ROOFTOPS

- Since an eight-game home losing streak ended June 19, the Rockies are 29-13 at Coors Field (.690), the best home winning percentage in the NL and fourth-highest figure in MLB that span.

LEAVE THE SNAKES ON THE PLANE

- Colorado is 7-8 vs. Arizona, 4-5 in Denver and 3-3 at Chase Field ... Colorado is 6-2 the past eight games vs. Arizona after a 1-6 mark the first seven.
- The Rockies have won four of the past five games at home vs. Arizona after losing nine straight in Denver from June 21, 2017 to July 10, 2018.
- The Rockies have not won a season series vs. Arizona since going 10-9 in 2014.

PITCHING MATTERS

- The Rockies' 3.81 ERA since June 28 ranks fourth in the National League ... the team's overall 3.42 home ERA (325.0 IP, 124 ER) since June 28 is third in the league.

GO LONG

- The 831.1 innings by Colorado's starters rank third in the NL ... the Rockies' 463.2 relief innings are last in the NL and 28th in MLB.

TUFF ENUFF

- Colorado is 49-38 against clubs with winning records, tied for the most wins among NL clubs, tied for second-most in MLB.

AT THE TOP

- Since 2015, Nolan Arenado leads the Majors with 492 RBI and tops the NL (tied for second in MLB) with 153 home runs.
- Among NL leaders this year, he is first in slugging percentage (.563), tied for second in home runs (33), is third in multi-hit games (51), fourth in RBI (99), is fifth in runs (94) and extra-base hits (68), and is ninth in batting average (.300).

IT'S A LONELY CLUB

- Trevor Story tallied his 40th double in the first inning Tuesday to become the first shortstop in Major League history to record at least 40 doubles, at least 30 home runs and at least 25 stolen bases in a single season ... he is the 16th player all-time (19th time) to reach those numbers, the third Rockies player to do so (Larry Walker, 1997 and Ellis Burks, 1996).
- Additionally, Story is the second shortstop since 1920 (when RBI became an official statistic) to have a season with 30 home runs, 100 RBI, 25 stolen bases (also: Alex Rodriguez, 1998).

THE STORY CONTINUES

- Trevor Story leads the Majors this month with six home runs and 15 RBI ... hitting .295 (13-for-44) in 11 games in September.

NO CLICHÉ

- Trevor Story ranks first in the NL in total bases (307) and extra-base hits (77), is tied for first in doubles (40), tied for second in RBI (100), tied for fifth in home runs (32), is seventh in hits (161), and tied for fifth in stolen bases (25) ... tied for sixth with 47 multi hit games.

BABY COME BACK

- The Rockies' 43 come-from-behind wins are second in the NL (third in the Majors) and the fourth-most in franchise history.

HEAT WAVE

- Since June 28, the Rockies have gone a combined 32-6 when Kyle Freeland (12-1), Jon Gray (9-2) and German Márquez (10-3) start on the mound.

BACK IN BLACK

- Charlie Blackmon's .391 batting average (18-for-46) leads the Majors in September (min. 50 PA), hitting safely in nine of 11 games ... has also hit safely in 16 of his past 20 games (.357; 30-for-84) ... since Aug. 31, he is batting .400 (20-for-50).

MINOR FEATS

- Taking two of three from Ogden to win the South Division title, Grand Junction advanced to the Pioneer League Championship against Great Falls ... GJ lost the first game Tuesday, 12-9 ... the best-of-three series resumes in Great Falls tonight.

FREE RIDE

- Denver native graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School.
- Selected in the first round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft (eighth overall), the third player in University of Evansville history to be drafted in the first round.
- A member of the Opening Day roster for the second consecutive season after making his debut in 2017 ... earned his first win and recorded his first hit in his debut in the Rockies Home Opener on April 7, 2017 vs. Los Angeles-NL.

HOME OF THE FREE

- Is 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA (29.1 IP, 15 ER) in six career games vs. Arizona ... 0-1 with a 4.96 ERA (16.1 IP, 9 ER) in three starts against the Diamondbacks this year.
- Has made two starts vs. Arizona at Coors Field this season, going 0-1 with a 3.97 ERA (11.1 IP, 5 ER) ... last start came on July 12, a 5-1 Rockies win ... allowed one run on six hits across 5.1 innings in the no-decision.

AUGUST

- Went 4-1 (Rockies 6-1) with a 2.47 ERA (43.2 IP, 12 ER) in seven starts in August.
- German Márquez (2.14) and Freeland's ERA in August were the lowest marks for the month by a Rockies pitcher (min. 25 IP) since Jhoulys Chacin in 2013 (1.91 ERA).

NOT WEIRD

- Fifth in the National League with a 2.91 ERA (176.1 IP, 57 ER) ... the ERA is the lowest in the NL, third-lowest in MLB, among left-handed starting pitchers.
- His ERA would be the lowest ERA by a left-handed starter in franchise history (De La Rosa, 2013, 3.49) min 25 starts ... only one starting pitcher in franchise history has recorded a sub-3.00 ERA (Ubaldo Jimenez, 2.88, 2010).

BORN LEADER

- Ranks among NL leaders in quality starts (20-4th), wins (14-T5), innings pitched (176.1-7th) and *Baseball Reference* Wins Above Replacement (7.0-4th).
- He is the fourth pitcher (fifth time) in Rockies history with 20 or more quality starts in a single season (also: Jason Jennings, 20 in 2006; Jason Marquis, 21 in 2009; Ubaldo Jimenez, 24 in 2009 and 25 in 2010).

FREEEEE

- Since July 2, Colorado has won 12 of his past 13 starts (7-1, 2.42 ERA, 78.0 IP, 21 ER) ... opponents have hit .231 (67-for-290) ... allowed five homers that span.
- Is 8-1 with the Rockies 13-2 his last 15 starts since June 21, posting a 2.27 ERA (91.0 IP, 23 ER) and a .227 opponents' batting average (76-for-335) ... ranks among NL leaders that span in wins (T3) and ERA (5th).

FIYAH

- Riding a five game winning streak, going 5-0 with a 2.03 ERA (44.1 IP, 10 ER) over seven starts since Aug. 6 with the Rockies 7-0.

DON'T STOP

- Is 6-1 with a 2.52 ERA (60.2 IP, 17 ER) with Colorado winning nine of the ten starts the second half this year ... second-half ERA is the second-lowest in franchise history, the lowest by a starter and one of four 2018 Rockies among the club's top 10 along with Scott Oberg (1.59-1st) German Márquez (2.63, 3rd) and Adam Ottavino (3.04, 4th).

SUB 303

- His 2.99 career ERA in Denver (168.1 IP, 56 ER) is the lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 100 IP) ... is 14-10 in 32 games, 29 starts at home ... opponents' batting average against at Coors Field (.245) ranks fifth.
- Is 8-2 with a 2.21 ERA (81.1 IP, 20 ER) in Denver this year ... ranks third in the NL in home wins (eight) and second in home ERA (2.21).
- Is 5-0 over his last eight starts at home (Rockies 8-0) with a 1.78 ERA (50.2 IP, 10 ER) ... 3-0 with a 1.39 ERA (32.1 IP, 5 ER) over his last five starts in Denver.
- His 3.42 ERA in Denver last year was the 11th-lowest home mark in Colorado history among all pitchers ... lowest mark at Coors Field since Jorge De La Rosa had an ERA of 2.76 in 2013 and 3.08 in 2014 ... second-lowest ERA by a Rockies rookie (Denny Stark, 3.21, 2002).

ROADIES

- Made 16 starts on the road this season, going 6-5 with a 3.51 ERA (95.0 IP, 37 ER) ... he is 11-8 with a 3.95 ERA (164.0 IP, 72 ER) in 30 road games, 28 starts, over his career.
- Over his past nine road starts since June 5, has gone 4-1 with a 3.00 ERA (54.0 IP, 18 ER) with six quality starts and the Rockies 6-3.

FREEEEEE

- Career 3.47 ERA (332.1 IP, 135 ER) ranks seventh all-time among Rockies pitchers with 100.0 or more innings ... his 3.48 (326.0 IP, 126 ER) clip first among starting pitchers.

OVERALL

- Is 25-18 with a 3.48 ERA (326.0 IP, 126 ER) in 57 career starts with the Rockies going 36-21 in those games ... Colorado is 18-11 in his 29 home starts (14-10, 2.99, 165.1 IP, 55 ER) ... is 11-8 on the road in 28 road starts with Colorado 18-10 (3.98, 160.2 IP, 71 ER).
- Has no decisions with a 2.70 ERA (3.1 IP, 1 ER) in two road relief outings ... has a 3.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 1 ER) in three relief appearances at home.

BUC OFF

- On Aug. 6 vs. Pittsburgh, pitched seven shutout innings for the third time this season, the second time at home (also: April 24 vs. San Diego) ... it was his fourth career game of seven or more shutout innings at Coors Field, the most of any pitcher since his debut in 2017 and the most for a Rockies pitcher through 51 career starts in franchise history ... it was his second career game in which he went at least seven innings with two or fewer hits (also: July 9, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, one hit over 8.1 innings pitched).

WINLAND

- Earned his 20th career win on July 27 in his 49th career start to become the fourth pitcher in Rockies history to reach 20 or more wins within his first 50 career starts, all with Colorado (also: Jason Jennings, 23; Jhoulys Chacin, 20; Jeff Francis, 20).
