JACKIE ROBINSON DAY #Jackie42

- ♦ MLB celebrates the 71st anniversary of Jackie Robinson's 1947 debut with all field staff wearing No. 42.
- ♦ Robinson's No. 42 was retired on April 15, 1997, the 50th Anniversary of him breaking Baseball's color barrier...in March 2004, then-Commissioner Allan H. (Bud) Selig designated April 15th "Jackie Robinson Day" to honor the enduring impact of his legacy on Baseball and society.
- ♦ The D-backs will recognize 13 recipients of the 2018 Youth of the Year Award from various Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Phoenix on Tuesday, April 17...The Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation will contribute \$4,200 to Boys & Girls Club of Metro Phoenix to support scholarships for the D-backs Boys and Girls Club...a special pre-game recognition will be made of the Arizona State University Black Alumni Chapter teaming up with the JW Robinson Society.
- ♦ Game-worn jerseys from today will be available for purchase at D-backs Authentics at section 134 with net proceeds benefiting the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.



HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 11-3 start is the best 14-game start in team history.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 11 consecutive games vs. Dodgers, the second longest winning streak vs. a single opponent in franchise history (see chart below).
- ♦ With a win today, Arizona would sweep Los Angeles for the fourth consecutive time...the only other time the D-backs have swept an opponent in 4 consecutive series was the Reds from May 15, 2001-June 22, 2003.
- ♦ Arizona has won five consecutive regular season series vs. Los Angeles for the first time in team history.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 5 consecutive series victories to open the season for the first time in franchise history...prior to this season, the D-backs had never won more than their first 2 series of a season in a row.
- ♦ The D-backs are 29-10 (.744) vs. NL West opponents since Aug. 25 of last season.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs extended their regular season winning streak over the Dodgers to 11 games with a 9-1 victory.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 3-for-4 with a 2-run home run (3)...**A.J. Pollock** was 2-for-4 with 2 homers, **Alex Avila** went 1-for-3 with a solo home run, and **Deven Marrero** was 1-for-3 with 2 RBI.
- ♦ **Taijuan Walker** left the game after the second inning due to forearm tightness (1 R, 2 K)...**T.J. McFarland** earned the win with 4.0 shutout innings...**Fernando Salas**, **Andrew Chafin** and **Jorge De La Rosa** each tossed a shutout frame.

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

- ♦ Prior to today's game, the D-backs recalled RHP **Silvino Bracho** from Triple-A Reno, and placed RHP **Taijuan Walker** on the 10-day disabled list with right forearm inflammation.

#SWEPLA

- ♦ With a win today, Arizona would secure its fourth consecutive series sweep vs. Los Angeles...the only other time the D-backs swept an opponent 4 times in a row was against the Reds from May 15, 2001-June 22, 2003.

GOING STREAKING

- ♦ The D-backs' 11-game regular season winning streak vs. Dodgers is the second-longest winning streak against a single opponent in franchise history:

- ♦ During the streak, Arizona has outscored Los Angeles 74-29.

LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ♦ The D-backs have won each of their 9 games when their opponent starts a left-handed pitcher since Sept. 26, 2017, with the opposing lefties posting a 9.30 ERA (41 ER in 39.2 IP).
- ♦ Since Aug. 12, 2017, Arizona is 20-3 when its opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

ARCHIE BRADLEY BOBBLEHEAD: The first 20,000 fans to Chase Field on April 21 vs. Padres will receive an Archie Bradley audio bobblehead, courtesy of Gila River Hotels and Casinos...the bobblehead will commemorate Bradley's triple in the 2017 National League Wild Card Game and will feature audio clips from D-backs radio broadcasters Greg Schulte and Tom Candiotti.

CY-CHED UP

- ♦ In 5 career starts vs. former Cy Young Award winning pitchers, **Zack Godley** has gone 2-2 with a 3.26 ERA (11 ER in 30.1 IP), 33 strikeouts and 11 walks...over his last 3 starts vs. Cy Young Award winners (since Aug. 13, 2017), he has gone 2-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 ER in 18.2 IP).

GOOD GODLEY

- ♦ **Zack Godley** leads the NL in ERA (0.64) and WHIP (0.64).
- ♦ Is looking to match his best start in his career (3-0 in 2015).
- ♦ Owns a 2.61 ERA (12 ER in 41.1 IP) over his last 7 road starts.
- ♦ Is the first D-back pitcher with 7.0+ innings with 1 or fewer run and no more than 1 walk in back-to-back starts since Wade Miley's club record 4 such starts in a row from June 6-24, 2012.

- ♦ The D-backs' +31 run differential is the best in the NL and ranks third in the Majors:

- ♦ Arizona has won 11 of its last 12 games when scoring 4 or more runs since Sept. 26, 2017, as well as 15 of its last 17 since Sept 13, and 25 of its last 30 since Aug. 22.

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .309/.380 OBP/.568 SLG hitter with 29 home runs and 94 RBI in 116 career games vs. Dodgers.

- ♦ Is a career .330 (70-for-212)/.398 OBP/.580 SLG hitter with 15 home runs and 40 RBI in 54 games @ Dodger Stadium...his career .978 OPS @ Chavez Ravine is second best in ballpark history, behind only Ryan Braun (.982) [min. 120 PA].

ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 27 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 19-8 (.703), the best record in the NL and third best in baseball behind the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).

- ♦ D-backs relievers have posted a 1.89 ERA (11 ER in 52.1 IP), the second-best mark in the Majors behind the Mets (1.62).
- ♦ Arizona relief pitchers have held the opposition to a .191 average, the fourth-best mark in the Majors, behind San Diego (.186), Cleveland (.187) and Atlanta (.190).

TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP PATRICK CORBIN (2-0, 2.45)

- ♦ Did not factor into the decision in his last outing on April 10 @ Giants, allowing 3 runs on 5 hits and 9 strikeouts in 5.1 innings.
- ♦ Is 5-7 with a 3.42 ERA (42 ER in 110.2 IP) in 20 career games (18 starts) vs. Giants...has a 2.78 ERA (21 ER in 68.0 IP) in his last 13 games (11 starts) vs. San Francisco.

- ◆ Won his second straight start on April 9 @ Giants, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with 4 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts (all on curveballs).

- ◆ Leads the NL in ERA (0.64) and WHIP (0.64).
- ◆ Is looking to match his best start in his career (3-0 in 2015).
- ◆ Didn't record his third win in 2017 until June 22 @ Rockies (ninth start).
- ◆ Owns a 2.61 ERA (12 ER in 41.1 IP) over his last 7 road starts.
- ◆ Is the first D-back pitcher with 7.0+ innings with 1 or fewer run and no more than 1 walk in back-to-back starts since Wade Miley's club record 4 such starts in a row from June 6-24, 2012.

- ◆ Is 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (12 ER in 36.1 IP) in 9 games (5 starts).
- ◆ In 3 games (2 starts) @ Dodger Stadium, is 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA (4 ER in 13.2 IP).
- ◆ Threw 5.0 innings (2 ER) with 5 strikeouts out of the bullpen in his lone appearance in NLDS Game 1 @ Dodgers.

LIKING THE NL WEST ROAD LIFE

- ◆ Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in 7 of his 8 career road starts vs. NL West opponents.

2018 CURVEBALL INFO

- ◆ Opponents are batting .079 (3-for-38) with no extra-base hits and 20 strikeouts on his curveball this season.
- ◆ Leads the Majors by throwing a curveball 41.3 pct. of the time.

2017 CURVEBALL INFO

- ◆ Finished second in the Majors by throwing 852 curveballs in 2017, behind Rich Hill/LAD (871) and ahead of Gio Gonzalez/WSH (829) and Aaron Nola/PHI (820) [source: Baseball Prospectus].
- ◆ Opponents hit .151 with a .229 slugging pct. on the curve in 2017...threw a career-high 51 curve balls on Aug. 13, 2017 vs. Cubs.
- ◆ Changed how he threw his curveball after conversations with then teammate Jeremy Hellickson in 2015.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ As a senior at University of Tennessee, in 2013, he led the SEC in complete games (6) and innings (108.1) and has second in strikeouts (98).
- ◆ Nickname is the "Bull" because his teammates at Tennessee called him that due to his demeanor on the mound and his sprints on and off the field.
- ◆ Is an avid bass fisherman...has accidently sunk 2 boats.
- ◆ Roomed the majority of the 2017 with Andrew Chafin in his 42-foot RV.
- ◆ Was an alternate on the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, appearing in 4 games.
- ◆ Married to Autumn.

WHO WANTS MORE CURVEBALL INFO?

- ◆ Ranked third in the NL on "whiff rates" on curveballs in 2017 (45.74)...only Jon Lester/CHC (50.32) and Robbie Ray/ARI (47.27) were better.
- ◆ His average velocity on his curveball (83.44) in 2017 was fourth hardest in the NL, trailing Jimmy Nelson/MIL (84.87), Luis Perdomo/SD (84.80) and Alex Wood/LAD (83.78).

2017 REVIEW

- ◆ Set career highs in starts (25), wins (8), innings (155.0) and strikeouts (165) in his third season with the D-backs, going 8-9 with a 3.37 ERA, 53 walks and a .221 opponent average.
- ◆ Among NL starters (min. 20 GS), ranked ninth with a 1.14 WHIP and .657 opponent OPS and 10th with a .221 opponent average.
- ◆ Recorded 4 strikeouts in the first inning on Aug. 13, 2017 vs. Cubs, the second pitcher in team history to record 4 strikeouts in a single inning, joining Oliver Perez on Sept. 20, 2014 @ Rockies.

POSTSEASON: Threw 5.0 innings of 2-run baseball with 5 strikeouts out of the bullpen in his lone appearance in NLDS Game 1 @ Dodgers.

- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).

LAD Series: -

- ◆ Recalled from Triple-A Reno today...was 1-0 with a 7.94 ERA (5 ER in 5.2 IP) in 3 appearances for the Aces.
- ◆ Appeared in 21 games for the D-backs in 2017, posting a 5.68 ERA (13 ER in 20.2 IP) with 25 strikeouts and 7 walks.
- ◆ Limited right-handed hitters to a .204 average (10-for-49) last season.

#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R

LAD Series: HLD, 2 ER/1.1 IP

- ◆ 7 of his 9 games have been scoreless.
- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
- ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

- ◆ His 9-game scoreless streak (5.1 IP) dating back to 2017 ended on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average.
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in 2017 in inherited runners (4th, 49) and groundball/flyball ratio (T-6th, 3.08).

#29 • JORGE DE LA ROSA • L/L

LAD Series: 0 ER/1.0 IP

- ◆ Is the first D-backs pitcher to appear in the club's first 4 games of a season.
- ◆ Went 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA in a career-high 65 games in 2017.
- ◆ Led the Majors with a 3.0 inherited runners scored pct. (1 IRS/33 IR) in 2017, tied for the lowest pct. since 1974 (also: Wilton Lopez/HOU in 2010).
