TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 6, 1930: The Yankees acquire RHP Red Ruffing from Boston in exchange for OF Cedric Durst and \$50,000. Ruffing went 39-96 with Boston but goes 231-124 with New York, posting seasons of 20, 20, 21 and 21 wins on the World Championship clubs from 1936-39.

May 6, 1922: Carl Mays tosses a two-hit, 2-0 shutout over the Philadelphia Athletics at Shibe Park in a game that takes 1 hour, 11 minutes.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 7, 2006: In an 8-5 win at Texas, Joe Torre becomes the fourth Yankees manager with 1,000 career wins, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460), Casey Stengel (1,149) and Miller Huggins (1,067).

May 7, 1999: Two Japan-born starting pitchers face each other for the first time in Major League history, as Hideki Irabu (NYY) goes up against Mac Suzuki (SEA). Both pitchers carry a shutout into the fifth inning before the Yanks score three times in the frame en route to a 10-1 victory.

May 7, 1959: The Yankees play an exhibition game against the Los Angeles Dodgers before 93,103 fans at the L.A. Coliseum. The game is played to honor paralyzed Dodgers catcher Roy Campanella.

May 7, 1921: Outfielder Bob Meusel hits the first of three career cycles in a 6-5 win at Washington. His three cycles remain the Yankees' franchise record.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 2-0 on their nine-game homestand, winning the first two games of their current 3G series vs. Cleveland (through Sun)...also play 3G vs. Boston (Tues.-Thurs.) and 3G vs. Oakland (5/11-13)...recently completed a 6-1 road trip (3-0 vs. Los Angeles-AL, 3-1 at Houston)...following this homestand, begin an 8G road trip to Washington (5/15-16), Kansas City (5/18-20) and Texas (5/21-23).

- ▶ Have won five straight and are a season high 13G over .500.
- ▶ At 23-10 (.697), **own the second-best record in the Majors** (Boston 24-9, .727)...**trail Boston in the AL East by 1.0G, matching their smallest deficit since the close of play on 4/4.**
- ▶ **Have made their best 33G start since starting 24-9 in 2003...ties for their third-best start over the last 60 seasons since 1959 (also 26-7 in 1998 and 23-10 in 1994).**
- ▶ Are 14-1 in their last 15G, reducing their division deficit from a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston is 7-7 in this span).
- ▶ Have a +59 run differential, third-best in the Majors (Houston, +65; Boston, +62).
- ▶ Are 17G into a season-long stretch of 18 consecutive game days (4/19-5/6)...are 15-2 so far.
- ▶ **Are 14-2 outside the AL East this season** (7-0 vs. AL Central, 6-1 vs. AL West, 1-1 vs. NL East).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their fifth straight game, defeating Cleveland, 5-2, at Yankee Stadium...**Yankees batters** scored 4R in the fifth on just one hit (3BB, 2E, 1 single, 1SF)...marked their most runs on one-or-zero hits in a single inning since 6/1/12 at Detroit—second inn. (5R on 5BB, 1H)...did not homer in a home game for the first time since 4/8 vs. Baltimore, snapping an 11G home HR streak...**RHP Sonny Gray** (6.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR) earned his first win since 4/7 vs. Baltimore and recorded his most strikeouts in a game since his first start of the year on 4/1 at Toronto (8K)...**C Austin Romine** (1-for-2, 2R, 1BB) drove in the Yankees' first run with a bases-loaded walk in the fifth and had the Yankees' only XBH of the game (double in the seventh)...**3B Ronald Torreyes** (0-for-3) drove in a run on a force out in the fifth, with a second run coming across on a Lindor throwing error...**LF Brett Gardner** (1-for-3) had a sac fly in the fifth and an RBI single in the seventh, marking his second multi-RBI game of the season (also 4/7 vs. Baltimore)...**RHP David Robertson** (1.0IP, 1H, 2K) tossed a scoreless ninth, marking his second save since being reacquired by the Yankees on 7/18/17 (also 8/16/17 at the Mets).

HOME COOKING: The Yankees have won eight consecutive games at Yankee Stadium (since 4/21), **matching their longest home winning streak since 8/21-9/4/10...with a win today**, would mark their longest home winning streak since taking nine straight at home from 5/30-6/15/10...have outscored opponents, 59-21, during the current streak.

- ▶ **Are 13-5 (.722) at home in 2018**, the most home wins and second-best home winning pct. in MLB (Boston, 11-4, .733).
- ▶ Have "walk-off" wins in two of their last three home games.
- ▶ Average 6.61 R/G and 1.72 HR/G at home this season (119R/31HR/18G)...did not homer at home in Saturday's win vs. Cleveland, snapping an 11G home HR streak (24HR over the stretch from 4/16-5/4).

OUTSIDE THE BOX: With **RHP Domingo Germán** starting today, the Yankees will use their sixth different starting pitcher this season...prior to today were one of four teams that had used just five starters this year (also Chi.-NL, Colorado, Houston).

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 67-39 (.632) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015, **the highest winning percentage by an AL team against any AL division in that span...are 21-8-3 in 32 series over the stretch** (min. 2G).

- ▶ Are 7-0 vs. the AL Central this season, the best mark by an AL team vs. any AL division this year...**have won their last 11 regular season games vs. AL Central teams** (since 9/18/17), their longest streak over the Central since a 12-game winning streak from 9/15/02-5/30/03.

ROCKIN' AND ROLLIN': The Yankees are 14-1 in their last 15 games (since 4/21), **their best 15-game stretch since going 14-1 from 6/24-7/12/98...matches the best 15-game stretch in the Majors** this season (Boston had four such 15G stretches, topping out with a 17-1 run from 3/30-4/20)...**with a win today, would match their best 16G stretch since 1961 (also 15-1 from 9/1-17/80).**

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.00 ERA (135.0IP, 96H, 33R/30ER, 38BB, 145K, 10HR) over the span.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have averaged 6.07 runs per game over the stretch, hitting .248/.325/.446 as a team with 91R, 34 doubles, 1 triple, 21HR and 59BB.
- ▶ Have gone ahead in their last at-bat in three of their last 5G.

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs** (190) and R/G (5.76)...rank second in XBH (123) and OBP (.335)...are third in HR (47), HR per game (1.42), SLG (.447) and OPS (.782)...are fourth in total bases (505).

FIRST BLOOD: The Yankees are 17-3 (.850) this season when scoring first, including 13-1 in such games since 4/11...their 20 games scoring first are tied for the second most in the Majors this season (Washington-24, Atlanta/Colorado/Milwaukee-20).

KID CAN PLAY: **2B Gleyber Torres** connected on his **first career Major League home run** in Friday's win vs. Cleveland, a three-run shot in the fourth.

- ▶ **At 21 years, 142 days, was the youngest Yankee to hit a home run since John Ellis (20 years, 269 days) hit an inside-the-park HR on 5/17/69 vs. California...was the youngest Yankee born outside the U.S. to ever hit a homer** (prev. Jesús Montero, 21 years, 281 days on 9/5/11 vs. Baltimore)...was the youngest Yankees second baseman ever to hit a homer (prev. Jerry Priddy, 21 years, 178 days on 5/6/41 vs. Detroit).
- ▶ Was the third-youngest player to homer in the Majors this season (Atlanta's 20-year-old Ronald Acuña Jr. and a younger 21-year-old Ozzie Albies)...was the youngest AL player to homer since Boston's Rafael Devers in 2017.
- ▶ The Yankees are a **Major League-best 13-1 since he was recalled on 4/22**, with Torres starting all 14 games...**is the first Major League position player in the Modern Era (since 1900) to start and be on the winning side in 13 of his first 14 big league games.**
- ▶ Has reached safely in 12 of his 14 Major League games.

THE SÁNCHEZ: In Friday's win vs. Cleveland, **C Gary Sánchez** hit a solo HR in the fifth, estimated at 461 ft. by Statcast as the longest by a Yankee this season.

- ▶ **Was the 62nd homer of his career in his 206th career game...is tied with Mark McGwire and Rudy York for the second-most HRs through 206 career games in Baseball history behind Aaron Judge (63).**
- ▶ Leads MLB catchers and is tied for sixth among AL hitters with 9HR...is tied for third in the AL with 28RBI.
- ▶ Of his last 11H, 10 have been XBHs (4 doubles, 6HR).

ALL RISE: **RF Aaron Judge** failed to reach base safely in Saturday's win vs. Cleveland, snapping a streak of reaching safely in 31 consecutive home games (since 9/3/17)...was the second-longest on-base streak at the current Yankee Stadium (Mark Teixeira, 33G, 6/3-8/16/10)...hit .346/.493/.860 (37-for-107) with 34R, 7 doubles, 16HR, 39RBI and 33BB over the stretch.

- ▶ Hit a solo HR on Friday vs. Cleveland, his 64th HR in his 214th career game, becoming the fastest player ever to 64HR in terms of games played (prev. Rudy York, 215th game).

DOUBLE DOWN: **Yankees batters** have hit a double in 27 consecutive games (4/5-present), tied for their fifth-longest streak since 1908...is their longest streak since a 28-game streak from 7/21-8/18/09.

ON THE MEND: **INF Brandon Drury** (blurred vision) went 0-for-4 in Double-A Trenton's 10-inning win vs. Harrisburg on Saturday...is hitting .333 (11-for-33) over 10 rehab games between Triple-A Scranton/WB and Trenton.

YANKEES vs. CLEVELAND INDIANS

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 2-0 vs. the Indians in 2018...will meet seven times in 2018: their current series in the Bronx this weekend and a four-game set in Cleveland leading into the All-Star break (7/12-15)...are 25-18 since the start of 2012 and 49-30 since 2007...have won 11 of their last 20 series since 2009 (11-5-4)...**IN 2017:** Went 2-5 against the Tribe in 2017, splitting a four-game set in Cleveland and getting swept in 3G at home...was their first time being swept at home by the Indians (min. 2G) since a three-game sweep from 4/7-9/89...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost three of the last four season series vs. Cleveland but have won six of the last nine...are 19-4-2 over the last 25 season series against the Indians since 1993 (losses in 2017, '15, '14, '08)...**AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 2-0 at Yankee Stadium this year...are 5-9 in the last 14 home games vs. Cleveland (since 8/9/14) but are still 20-13 against the Indians at the current Yankee Stadium...have won 6-of-10 series at the venue, going 6-3-1...faced Cleveland in the first regular season game ever played at the current venue, a 10-2 loss on 4/16/09...**IN POSTSEASON:** Rallied from a 2-0 deficit to eliminate the Indians, 3-2, in last year's ALDS...are 2-2 all-time in postseason series (2017 ALDS, 3-2; 2007 ALDS, 1-3; 1998 ALCS, 4-2; 1997 ALDS, 2-3)...are 10-10 all-time vs. Cleveland in the postseason.
