Since May 8, Mariners starters are 26-9 (.743)...their .743 winning percentage is the best in the Majors in that span, ranking ahead of Houston (.694/25-11)...over this stretch, Mariners starters have earned the victory in 26 of the club's 37 wins (70.3%).

The Mariners have the 2nd-best ERA in Interleague history with a mark of 3.79 (1,445 ER, 3,434.0 IP)...they trail only New York-AL (3.76/1,491 ER, 3,564.2 IP).

Edwin Díaz has 7 three-out saves in which he has struck out the side this season, most in the Majors...Aroldis Chapman-NYY has 6 such outings...Díaz's 7 such saves are already most in single-season club history, surpassing his 4 such saves in 2016.

The Mariners and Rockies meet for the 1st of 6 games this season...the Mariners will travel to Colorado for a 3-game series July 13-15...since 2012, Seattle is 9-4 against the Rockies:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the first of 3 games vs. Colorado...began the homestand by sweeping a 3-game series from Kansas City and taking 2-of-3 from Los Angeles-AL...following this series, will embark on a 7-day, 6-game, 2-city road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3 G) and Colorado (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 9 of their last 10 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners are 10-7 over their last 17 contests...they have also won 16 of their last 24 games, 23 of their last 33, 27 of their last 39, 32 of their last 45 and 34 of their last 49...Seattle is 42-21 in its last 63 games, 47-24 over its last 71 games and 52-28 in its last 80 games...Seattle is 16-15 during the day and 40-17 at night...Seattle is 30-15 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Corner of Edgar & Dave** - the Mariners are 30-15 (.667) at Safeco Field this season, the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...they trail New York-AL (.717/33-13), Boston (.700/28-12) and Cleveland (.675/27-13), while ranking ahead of Philadelphia (.652/30-16)...the Mariners have won 14 of their last 17 home games (5/31-c) and are 21-5 (.808) at home since May 18.
- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .329 (24x73) when leading off a game this season.
- **Herrmann's Hits - Chris Herrmann** has reached base safely via hit or walk in 4 of his 6 starts this season...he has reached base twice via hit or walk in 3 of those 6 starts...the Mariners are 5-1 in Herrmann's 6 starts.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 41-11 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-21 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.

GOING NATIONAL...tonight is the 3rd of 20 Interleague match-ups for the Mariners this season...Seattle opened Interleague play by going 1-1 at San Francisco on April 3-4...the Mariners are 204-182 all-time in Interleague play, including going 108-87 at home...the Mariners have gone .500 or better vs. the National League in 14 of the last 18 seasons since 2000...8 of the Mariners next 14 games will be vs. National League opponents, beginning with this 3-game series vs. the Rockies...Seattle will also travel to Colorado, July 13-15 and host San Francisco for a 2-game series at Safeco Field, July 24-25.

JEAN, JEAN THE HIT COLLECTOR...Jean Segura recorded his 36th multi-hit game of the season last night...his 36 multi-hit games are tied with Nick Markakis-ATL for the Major League lead...Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of at least 3 hits...Segura has more multi-hit games (36) than games without a hit this season (21)...among Major League leaders, Segura ranks 2nd in hits with 112, trailing only Houston's Jose Altuve-HOU (116)...he also ranks 3rd in the Majors with a .332 (112x337) batting average, behind Mookie Betts-BOS (.338/88x260) and Altuve (.332/116x349).

NATIONAL TREASURE...in 43 career Interleague starts, Félix Hernández is 23-10 with a 3.12 ERA (104 ER, 300.0 IP) with 290 strikeouts and 71 walks...his 23 wins rank T9th-most all-time (also: Jamie Moyer and Jake Peavy)...with a win tonight, Félix would tie Zack Greinke and John Lackey for 7th-most Interleague wins...his 3.12 career ERA in Interleague play is 9th-best all-time.

HOLD IT RIGHT THERE...the Mariners lead the Major Leagues with 68 holds...they rank ahead of Arizona (63), Philadelphia (60), Colorado (59) and Tampa Bay (57)...three Mariners rank among the American League's top-10 individual leaders in holds: Juan Nicasio ranks T2nd (also: José Alvarado-TB, Matt Barnes-BOS and Joe Kelly-BOS) with 17 holds, while James Pazos is 7th with 14 holds and Alex Colomé ranks T10th (also: Dellin Betances-NYY and Trevor Hildenberger-MIN) with 12 holds...the Mariners are the only team in the Majors with 4 relievers with at least 10 holds apiece this season: Nicasio (17), Pazos (14), Colomé (12) and Nick Vincent (10).

ELECTRIC EDDIE...Edwin Díaz leads the Majors with 34 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 75 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 83)...Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)...Díaz's 34 saves rank T2nd-most all-time prior to the All-Star Break (also: John Smoltz-ATL, 2003), behind Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 with the Angels (38)...of Díaz's 34 saves, 20 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 1-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 42-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

AMONG THE BEST...since May 8, the Mariners have a .673 (37-18) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail Houston (.692/36-16), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.640/32-18), Boston (.630/34-20), Chicago-NL (.615/32-20), Los Angeles-NL (.615/32-20) and Milwaukee (.615/32-20)...the Mariners 37 wins are the most in the Majors since May 8, ranking ahead of the Astros (36-16).

BACK TO THE FUTURE...Mariners minor league outfielder Kyle Lewis (Snellville, GA) has been named to the U.S. Team roster for the 2018 SiriusXM All-Star Futures Games...the game is slated for 1:00 pm PT on Sunday, July 15 at National Park in Washington, D.C. and will be broadcast live on MLB Network...Lewis, who was the 11th overall selection in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft, is batting .262 (43x164) with 18 runs, 14 doubles, 5 home runs and 27 RBI in 41 games with high-A Modesto this season.

BULLPEN BULLY...James Pazos is 2-1 with 14 holds and a 1.78 ERA (6 ER, 30.1 IP) in 35 relief appearances this season, including allowing only 4 earned runs over his last 28.1 innings in relief (33 games), dating back to April 10...among American League relievers, Pazos ranks 6th in ERA, 10th in walks per 9.0 innings (1.48/5 BB, 30.1 IP) and 13th in strikeouts/walks (5.40/27 K, 5 BB)...his 1.84 ERA is the 2nd-lowest among left-hander relievers in the AL, trailing only Aroldis Chapman-NYY (1.43/6 ER, 37.2 IP)...Pazos is 0-1 with a 0.71 ERA (1 ER, 12.2 IP) in 17 relief appearances at Safeco Field, including tossing 7.2 scoreless innings over his last 11 games, dating back to May 20.

AS YOU KNOW...Edwin Díaz leads the Major Leagues with 34 saves...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Díaz's 34 saves are already tied for 10th-most in a single season in club history?...he is tied with his own career-high of 34 saves in 2017...his next save will set his single-season career-high...Fernando Rodney holds the club record for saves in a season with 48 in 2014.

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 394th career start and his 2nd career start vs. Colorado tonight.
• Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts...
• Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
• In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...
• Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.

LAST OUTING...

W#8 in his last start, a 6-4 Mariners win vs. the Royals on June 30...allowed 3 runs on 6 hits and 1 walk while striking out 5 batters across 5.0 innings pitched...all 3 runs scored before Félix recorded an out in the 1st inning...

NATIONAL TREASURE...

is 23-10 with a 3.12 ERA (104 ER, 300.0 IP) in 43 career Interleague starts (28 quality starts, 2 CG, 1 ShO)...he is one of 11 pitchers all-time to win at least 23 games in Interleague play...

TURNING A CORNER...

despite a 3.0-inning, 6-run outing on June 9 at Tampa Bay, Félix posted a 3.71 ERA (14 ER, 34.0) with 3 quality starts in the month of June, going 5.0+ innings and allowing just 1 earned run in 3 of his 6 starts...

THIS IS HIS HOUSE...

is 4-3 with a 3.81 ERA (23 ER, 54.1 IP) in 9 starts in Safeco Field this season while holding opponents to a .230 average (47x204) and .392 slugging percentage, compared to 4-3, 6.65 in 9 road starts with opponents batting .288 (53x184) and slugging .473...

OUT OF THE GATE...

in the 1st inning, Félix has posted a 10.00 ERA (20 ER, 18.0 IP), while earning a 4.05 ERA (37 ER, 82.1 IP) in the 2nd inning and later...Félix has allowed 3-or-more runs in the 1st inning in 4 of his 18 starts...

IMPRESSIVE START...

since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...the next closest pitchers are Justin Verlander with 51 and Jon Lester (51)...

HE'S OUR LEADER...

became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...

Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...

CAREER...

has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner...is 168-120 with a 3.27 ERA (947 ER, 2602.2 IP) in 393 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...
