LEADING OFF: Halos open a six-game home stand vs. Detroit (Aug. 6-8) and Oakland (Aug. 10-12)...Angels are off Thursday...LAA went 1-5 on six-game trip to Tampa Bay (0-3) & Cleveland (1-2)...Angels are 16-12 vs. A.L. Central foes...Halos have dropped six of last seven to fall a season-high three games under .500...Club looking to avoid falling four games under .500 for first time since July, 30, 2017 (51-55)...LAA is 1-4 this month, 6-10 since the break, 12-17 since July 1st & 14-18 across last 32 games...Angels are in fourth place, -16.0 in A.L. West (-12.0 for 2nd wild card)...Halos have spent last 39 days in 4th place...LAA is 10-21 when lefty starts (45-37 vs. RHS).

BY THE TAIL: Halos are 21-7 at home against Detroit since 2010 (haven't lost a home series to Tigers since Aug. 24-26, 2009).

GET THIS: In the Angels' last victory over Tigers (5/29 at Comerica Park) Luis Valbuena, Ian Kinsler & Martin Maldonado drove in three runs apiece in the 9-2 win. All three are no longer on Halos' roster.

#27 TURNS 27: Mike Trout turns 27 on tomorrow...He and Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history)...Trout is one of four players with 1,100 hits & 600 walks before turning 27, joining Jimmie Foxx, Mel Ott, & Mickey Mantle...Also joins Mantle, Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior to 27th birthday...Of the 15 other players with 200+ HR at 26-or-younger, none had more stolen bases than Trout (186) and only three had a higher OBP (.415) at that point in their career (ELIAS).

HEANEY TOMORROW: Andrew Heaney is 6-1 with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP - 11 ER) across his last nine home starts...The 1.60 ERA at home since April 27 leads A.L. (2nd in MLB to J. deGrom - 1.52)...Has limited opponents to a .186 clip (41/220) during the stretch (14 BB/50 K).

TROUT OUT: Mike Trout has missed last four games with a right wrist contusion (day-to-day)...Thursday marked first time he did not appear in a game since Sept. 28, 2017 at White Sox...He suffered the injury on a head-first slide into third Wednesday at Tampa Bay.

KNOW THIS: Albert Pujols is four hits shy of becoming one of nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league (2,073 hits with St. Louis; 996 with LAA)...Ironically, four former Angels are on the list - Dave Winfield, Frank Robinson, Vladimir Guerrero & Orlando Cabrera.

TWO FOR THE SHO: On Friday, Shohei Ohtani had best offensive performance of his career (4/5; 3 R, 2 HR, 3 RBI)...Marked first career four-hit game, multi-HR game and first two career HR on the road.

SAY WHAT? Ohtani is the first player in MLB history to hit 10+ HR & tally 50+ pitching strikeouts in same season (STATS)...He is just the second player since 1900 with 10+ HR & 4+ wins in a season - Babe Ruth is only other (1918-19).

DAILY DISH OF TROUT: With his next walk, Trout will reach 100 BB, 25 HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016)...No other American Leaguer has ever accomplished the feat more than once: Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be his third campaign doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB to accomplish).

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has four HRs his last 10 games & nine HRs last 21 affairs...In those 21 games, hitting .325 (26/80) with 19 runs, six doubles, one triple, nine HR & 22 RBI...In 40 games since returning from D.L., batting .285 (41/144) with 29 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 13 HR & 31 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .210 (1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G)...His 13 HR since June 18th lead A.L.

LOOKING AHEAD: 36 of 48 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 at home, 7 on road), 10 against Houston (3 at home, 7 on road), nine against Oakland (6 at home, 3 on road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games this month are on road...LAA plays seven interleague games in August (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI and 8/27-28 vs. COL).

SHELVED: 22 players were placed on the disabled list in the first half (most in MLB)...Angels have 12 players currently on DL...Average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 33 games...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...52 players used for LAA this season, most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played (12 starters), most in team history thru 113 games (LAA record 31 pitchers in '17).

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 5 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HR (4th; 30), runs (T3rd; 82), runs created (1st; 119), times on base (1st; 221), walks (1st; 99), IBB (1st; 20), OBP (1st; .459), SLG (4th; .624), OPS (1st; 1.083), OPS+ (1st; 196.0) and offensive WAR (7.3; 1st).

WALK TALK: Trout's 99 walks are most in club history through 113 games (club record is 116 walks in 2016 by Trout)...First MLB player with at least 99 walks thru 111 games since Barry Bonds (145) in 2004...First Angel with three 4+ walk games in a season...4th player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...Since 2012, he leads A.L. in multi-walk games (143) and has 25 such games in 2018...On pace for 143 walks which would be the most since Bonds' 232 BB in 2004 and most in A.L. since Eddie Yost's 151 in 1956.

GLOVE STORY: Club ranks tied for fourth in A.L. with .986 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 122 double plays...Catchers own a 40.4 caught stealing pct. (21 of 52), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...A. Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 161 putouts and is T3rd for fewest errors (8; min. 90 GS)...Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.7 % to score (40 of 193)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 113 affairs (5th in A.L. with 981 K)...Bullpen has logged 423 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Halos have allowed 147 HRs, fourth-most in A.L...Since 2017, Jose Alvarez and Blake Parker have each pitched in 121 games, each tied for most in A.L. in span.

THIS N' THAT: After toiling for 12 years in the minors, Catcher Francisco Arcia posted 10 RBI thru his first two career games (4 RBI in MLB debut, 6 RBI in 2nd game) to set an MLB record, passing Joe Cunningham (9 in 1954 with St. Louis)...Also tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games...A. Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 19.05 (419 PA/22 K)...He also leads MLB batting .308 (40/130) with two strikes...Angels' 151 HRs hit rank fourth in A.L...Trout's 7.8 WAR leads MLB...Justin Upton is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...Milke Scioscia (1,625 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Shohei Ohtani is first Angel with first nine career HRs came at home (all against RHP)...Just second rookie in A.L. history with each of first nine HR at home (Bill Akers, 1930 w/ Det.)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Albert Pujols is batting .308 (20/65) his last 15 games (9 R, 5 2B, 5 HR, 9 RBI)...David Fletcher has hit in 11 of 15 (five multi-hit games) batting .310 (18/58) with 11 runs, seven doubles & five RBI...Trout has four HR his last seven games & five HR his last 10 affairs...Cam Bedrosian has a 2.08 ERA (26 IP - 6 ER) since June 1.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,069 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 631 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,973 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,285 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is 5th w/1,323 XBH)...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 27 RBI shy).

Vs. TIGERS: Detroit leads 2018 season series 3-1 (clubs met May 28-31 at Comerica Park)...Angels are 19-5 in last 24 home games vs. Tigers (26-9 in last 35 overall meetings at Big A)...Albert Pujols owns a .333 (67/205) career clip against the Tigers with 13 home runs & 38 RBI in 56 games...His .327 average is second highest (Toronto, .337) against any A.L. opponent...Justin Upton hit .260 (268/1029) with 59 HR & 181 RBI in 278 games as a Tiger (2016-17).

OAKLAND ON DECK: When these teams last met on June 17th, Angels were 38-34 and A's were 36-36...Since then, Halos have gone 17-24 while Oakland is 31-10...Angels are 11-5 in last 16 games vs. Oakland...Halos lead 2018 series 6-4 and are 18-11 vs. A's since 2017...March 29th marked the sixth Opening Day meeting between these clubs...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .331 (121/366) with 25 HR & 62 RBI in 96 games vs. Oakland

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 6

(1961) In a pinch-hit role, Tom Satriano recorded his first MLB hit, a HR at Baltimore, only to see the feat washed away with rain...Satriano had to wait six more days before he was able to record his first big league hit, a home run vs. Minnesota; (1989) Chili Davis earned A.L. Player of the Week honors after hitting .448 (13/29) with three doubles, three home runs and nine RBI from July 31-Aug. 6...Davis collected 25 total bases in the span; (2012) Jered Weaver earns his major league-leading 15th win with a four-hit shutout (4-0 win vs. OAK)...Win was his 10th straight (10 starts), tying a club record.

August 7

(1973) Nolan Ryan struck out eight consecutive batters to equal his own club record in a 6-5 win at Milwaukee (10 innings); (2015) Mike Trout hit his third career birthday home run, becoming the first player in Major League history to homer on three different birthdays before turning 25.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP NICK TROPEANO

4-6, 4.94 ERA

Since 2015, is holding opponents to a .130 batting average with two outs and RISP

- **BACK ON THE MOUND:** Making 14th start of the season for Angels and eighth at home...Fourth start since being reinstated from second stint of season on disabled list (right shoulder inflammation) on July 21 (missed 31 games)...Also missed nine games during first stint on DL (May 2-12) and returned to make six starts before returning to the DL on June 15 (retro to June 12).
- **CAREER HIGHS:** Sets new career high making 14th start of the season tonight (previous was 13 starts in 2016)...Has already set new career high in innings pitched (previous was 68.1 in 2016) and is eight strikeouts shy of matching single-season best mark of 68 in 2016.
- **HOME AND ROAD:** This season, is 3-3 with a 4.15 ERA (34.2 IP – 16 ER) on the road, compared with a 1-3 record and 5.70 ERA (36.1 IP – 23 ER) at Angel Stadium.
- **THAT'S RIGHT:** Owns a .215 (28/130) opponent batting average against right-handed hitters this season.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Wednesday at Tampa Bay after tossing 5.2 innings and allowing four earned runs on seven hits with four walks and four strikeouts
- **HURT BY THE HOMER:** In start on July 26 vs. White Sox, all five hits allowed were solo HR...Five home runs allowed matched the Angels single-game record (**Willie Fraser** – 5 HR on Aug. 16, 1988 at NYY)...Both Fraser and Tropeano were Angels winning pitcher in those games.
- **AT HIS BEST vs. THE WEST:** Against A.L. West foes, is 6-4 with a 3.42 ERA (79 IP – 30 ER)...Against all other teams, is 5-9 with a 4.74 ERA (119.2 IP – 63 ER).
- **RISP-Y BUSINESS:** Since 2016, has held opponents to a .224 (22/98) batting average with runners in scoring position...Opponents are also 7-for-54 (.130) with two outs and runners in scoring position against him since 2015.
- **TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Is 7-6 with a 3.70 ERA (126.1 IP – 52 ER) and 115 strikeouts in his career in the first half of the season compared with a 4-7 record and 5.10 ERA (72.1 IP – 41 ER) after the All-Star Break.
- **VS. DETROIT:** Earned win in only previous start of career against Detroit on May 29 at Comerica Park after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on seven hits with no walks and five strikeouts.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 18 career games at Angel Stadium, is 4-6 with a 5.70 ERA (93.2 IP – 53 ER)...In seven starts at home this season, is 1-3 with a 5.70 (36.1 IP – 23 ER)...In last start at home on July 26 vs. CWS, picked up first winning decision at Angel Stadium since May 18, 2016...Set career-high with 11 strikeouts in final start of 2015 season on Sept. 29, 2015 vs. Oakland at The Big A.
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made two rehab starts with Adv.-A Inland Empire, going 1-1 with a 2.00 ERA (9 IP – 2 ER) and nine strikeouts.
- **BACK WITH THE HALOS:** Made season debut with Angels on April 12 at Kansas City, marking first Major League appearance since July 18, 2016 (vs. Texas).
- **THE INJURY:** Missed entire 2017 season recovering from Tommy John surgery, performed in August 2016.
- **WITH THE BEES:** Made one start for Triple-A Salt Lake on April 6 vs. Albuquerque and tossed 3.2 innings scoreless innings allowing three hits and three walks with seven strikeouts.
- **HALOS STARTERS:** With first start on April 12, became eighth different starting pitcher used by Angels through the first 14 games of a season, which set a new franchise record...Halos have now used nine different starters this year.
- **CAREER NOTES:** In 37 career games (36 starts), is 11-12 with a 4.15 ERA (193 IP – 89 ER)...In 33 games (32 starts) for Angels, is 10-9 with a 4.10 ERA (171.1 IP – 78 ER)...Native of West Islip, NY...Originally drafted by Houston in fifth round of 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Stony Brook University...Acquired by Angels on Nov. 5, 2014 with **C Carlos Perez** in exchange for **C Hank Conger**.

LHP ANDREW HEANEY (6-7, 3.75 ERA)

Making 21st start of the season and 11th at home...Second start of 2018 vs. Detroit...Charged with loss in last start on Thursday at Tampa Bay after tossing six innings and allowing four earned runs on six hits with no walks and five strikeouts...In last six starts, is 2-2 with a 3.35 ERA (40.1 IP – 15 ER); Angels have won four of his last six starts...Charged with loss in first start of the year (and only previous outing in career) against the Tigers on May 31 at Comerica Park (5 IP, 8 H, 5 ER, 1 BB, 3 SO)...Has set career highs this season in games (20), starts (20), innings pitched (122.1) and strikeouts (116)...With next victory will break previous career-high total (also had six wins in 2015).

IN THE 'PEN

#48 JOSÉ ÁLVAREZ (LHP)

AGE: 29

- Pitched 1.1 scoreless innings yesterday in third appearance of last road trip...Pitched in six of 10 games on last homestand.
- 57 appearances lead the Majors this season.
- Has stranded 37 of 43 inherited runners this season...43 IR are the most in the Majors...86% stranded rate is seventh best in Majors.
- Retired first batter faced in 43 of 57 outings the year.
