### IN THE WINK OF AN EYE

In yesterday's 13-inning, 7-5 win vs Col, **Jesse Winker** became the first player to come off the bench and finish a game 3-for-3 with a walkoff HR (off **Chris Rusin**) since NYY's **Hector Lopez** did it on 5/29/60 at Wsh...was Winker's first career walkoff HR...he has produced a hit in each of his last 4 plate apps and reached base safely in each of his last 5 plate apps (walk, single, single, single, 2-run walkoff HR).

The Reds selected University of Florida junior **3B Jonathan India** with the fifth overall pick of Major League Baseball's first-year player draft...beginning tomorrow the Gators are hosting an **NCAA Super Regional vs Auburn**...the lists of Cin's 2017 draft picks and historical No. 1 draft picks are on media guide pages 216-217.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Red Schoendienst's Cardinals and Game 4 (1-2) of a 6-game homestand that included a 2-1 series loss to the Rockies...following this series and Monday's off day, beginning Tuesday night the Reds return to the road for a 5-game trip to KC (2g) and Pit (off day, 3g).**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds have 998 wins vs StL since 1900...since a 4-game sweep from 6/5-6/8, 2017 at Great American Ball Park, the Reds have lost each of the last 5 series vs StL (1-2 at Cin, 1-2 at StL, 0-3 vs StL, 0-4 vs StL, 0-3 at StL)...the Cardinals have won the last 11 games overall dating back to a 6-0 Reds win on 9/13/17 at Busch Stadium, their longest winning streak vs Cin since they won 11 straight in 1949...StL hasn't won 12 straight games vs Cin since 6/1/1931-4/25/1932 and haven't won more than 12 straight wins since an 18-game winning streak vs Cin from 7/4/1930-5/23/1931...is the Reds' longest active losing streak vs any team and their longest vs any team since a 14-game losing streak to the Mets from 9/7/2014-9/7/2016...earlier this season, from 4/12-4/15 at GABP the Cardinals earned their fourth 4-game series sweep in Cincinnati (1914 & 1930 at Redland Field, July 1949 at Crosley Field)...they have been visiting the Queen City since 1892...the Cardinals have won the last 9 games at GABP dating back to a 3-2 Reds home win here on 8/4/17...StL's 9-game road winning streak is its longest in Cincinnati since they won 10 straight games at Crosley Field over the 1930 and 1931 seasons...Reds vs Cardinals information is on media guide Page 328.**ROYALS UP NEXT:** Beginning Tue at KC the Reds and Royals will play for the first time since 2015...the Reds are 8-13 all-time vs KC, including a pair of 2-game sweep losses in 2015...Cin has lost 5 straight games to the Royals, dating back to an 11-5 Reds win on 6/12/10 at Great American Ball Park, and 9 of the last 10g vs KC...the Reds' first appearance at Kauffman Stadium, a 3-game sweep there in June 1999, was their first appearance in Kansas City since the Red Stockings and Cowboys of the American Association met in 1889...the first game of that June 1999 series was postponed because of a power failure...the Reds swept the next day's doubleheader, 9-4 and 7-4 in 10 innings, before winning the series finale, 14-3...was the first doubleheader in interleague history...Reds vs Royals information is on media guide Page 334.**INTERLEAGUE NOTES:** This season the Reds are 2-1 vs the American League (2-1 at Min)...their 2-1 series win at Min's Target Field in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a 3-0 series sweep at Hou's Minute Maid Park in September 2013...between those series wins the Reds went 0-9 in interleague road series of at least 3 games and 4-23 in games in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the Tigers (2g, 5/19-5/20), White Sox (3g, 7/2-7/4), Indians (3g, 8/13-8/15) and Royals (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at KC's Kauffman Stadium (2g, Tue-Wed), at Cle's Jacobs Field (3g, 7/9-7/11) and at Det's Comerica Park (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in 1997 the Reds are 140-198 all-time vs the AL, at .414 the lowest interleague winning percentage of any Major League team...Cin hasn't produced a winning record vs the American League since 2013 (11-9)...in 5 seasons since then are 25-58 vs AL (.301)...Reds vs AL opponents information is on media guide Page 332.**PLAYER OF THE MONTH:** Scooter Gennett in May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...is Gennett's first career monthly award...twice in a 3-week span that month he was named Player of the Week (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985...Gennett finished May ranked first in the NL in slugging (.720), second in hitting (.398), third in RBI (24), T3rd in HR (8), fourth in hits (37) and on-base percentage (.418) and T7th in extra-base hits (14).**DYNAMIC DUO:** In May, Scooter Gennett (8hr, 24rbi) and Eugenio Suárez (8hr, 29rbi) became the first Reds teammates to produce at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in the same month since Adam Dunn (12hr, 27rbi) and Ken Griffey Jr. (11hr, 29rbi) did it in August 2001...Dunn and Griffey was the first Reds duo to do it since Johnny Bench (9hr, 32rbi) and George Foster (9hr, 38rbi) in June 1977...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, Gennett is the only Reds second baseman to produce at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month (June 2017, May 2018) and Suárez is the only Reds third baseman to produce at least 8 HR and 29 RBI in a calendar month (May 2018).**APRIL 19:** The Reds are 19-26 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.**7-YEAR ITCH:** The 10-4 Reds victory on 4/23 vs Atl was the first for Jim Riggleman as his team's full-time manager since a 1-0 Nationals win vs the Mariners on 6/23/11...the Reds' 4-1 win on 5/4 vs Mia was his 1,500th game as a Major League manager...since 1900, Riggleman is 1 of 14 managers to work for at least 5 Major League teams (SD, Chg, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...Jimmy Dykes, John McNamara and Dick Williams each managed 6 teams...the others who managed 5 teams are Chuck Dressen, Bucky Harris, Rogers Hornsby, Davey Johnson, Billy Martin, Bill McKechnie, Jack McKeon, Lou Piniella, Jeff Torborg and Joe Torre.**FRONT OFFICE NEWS:** Reds President of Baseball Operations Dick Williams on 5/10 announced the promotion of Nick Krall to General Manager...Krall had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...Williams will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

**Matt Harvey** tonight is making his sixth appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **fifth career** appearance and fourth start vs the Cardinals, his second appearance and first start of this season...the Reds won **3 of his 5 starts (1-2, 4.44)**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00 in 4 starts and 4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment on 5/5...** on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash...** from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66 in 104 starts and 5 relief apps...** in **3 career starts at Great American Ball Park** is **3-0, 1.77 (20.1ip, 16h, 4er, 3bb, 19k, 1hr)**.

**Luis Castillo** at just **25 years old** is in his second **Major League** season...tomorrow will make his 14th start of the season and his **29th Major League** appearance and start...will be his third career appearance and start vs the **Cardinals**, his second of the season...in Sun's 6-3 loss at SD took a 2-hitter and a 2-0 lead into the bottom of the fifth inning before allowing a 1-out grand slam to pinch-hitter **Hunter Renfro**...his **3-game winning streak** from **5/8-5/24** (4gs, 3-0, 2.78) was the **first winning streak** of his career and the longest winning streak by a Reds pitcher this season...the Reds won **4 of his last 5 starts**...with **4 quality starts** is tied with **Tyler Mahle** for the staff lead...in his 7-2 win on **5/8 vs NYM**, retired his **first 14 batters** before **Amed Rosario** singled with 2 outs in the fifth inning...in the **10-4 win on 4/16 at Mil**, took a 2-hitter and a 9-0 lead into the bottom of the seventh inning before allowing 2 runs on 3 hits and a walk...in 2017 led National League rookies in ERA and opponents' batting average (.202) while ranking eighth among rookies in strikeouts...the Reds went 7-8 in his 15 starts...with 8 quality starts ranked second on the staff behind **Scott Feldman**'s 9 QS...produced all 8 quality starts in his last 12 apps beginning 7/8 (3-6, 2.84), including 6 QS in his last 8 apps beginning 7/30 (2-3, 2.37)...beginning 7/8 and among pitchers with at least 12 starts, his 2.84 ERA ranked seventh in the Major Leagues behind **Corey Kluber** (1.79), **Justin Verlander** (1.92), **Kyle Hendricks** (2.19), **Luis Severino** (2.40), **Jake Arrieta** (2.48) and **Marcus Stroman** (2.73)...during spring training, from 3/13-3/17 spent time in New York with wife **Delores** while celebrating the birth of their first child, **Brittany**.

# REDS BATTERS

## REDS BATTERS

**Homestand: 3g, .314 (38-121), 2hr, 16r (5.3 r/g)**

- The Reds' infield leads the Major Leagues in combined hits (287), batting average (.288) and on-base percentage (.358).
- Pitcher Michael Lorenzen on 6/7 vs Col pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off Tyler Anderson, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any Reds batter or by any Major League pitcher...in his career as a pinch hitter Lorenzen is 2-for-9 with a home run (4/6/17 off Pit's Adam Morgan), including 1-for-2 this season.

## 16 TUCKER BARNHART, c

**Homestand: 4-11 (.364), 2rbi**

- In the 10th inning of yesterday's 13-inning, 7-5 win vs Col pinch hit and grounded out, snapping his 5-game hitting streak (7-23, .304, 4rbi).
- In his last 24 apps beginning 5/6 is hitting .302, raising his BA from .224 and including 8 multi-hit games (29-96, 5 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 10rbi).
- Made each of his last 11 starts batting second, his first career starts at that position in the order (15-51, .294, 1 2b, 4rbi)...his 11 starts batting second are the most by a Reds catcher in that spot in the order since Smoky Burgess made 56 starts there in 1955.
- From 5/7-5/14 produced at least 1 extra-base hit in 6 consecutive apps (11-23, .478, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 6rbi, .870slg, .520obp)...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and the longest extra-base hit streak by a Reds batter since Jay Bruce's 7-game streak from 6/20-6/26, 2014.
- In 2017 became only the third catcher in Reds history to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award for defensive excellence, joining Johnny Edwards (1963, 1964) and 10-time winner Johnny Bench (1968-1977).

## 2 ALEX BLANDINO, inf

**Homestand: 3g, 1gs at SS, 0-5, 1bb**

- Is hitless in his last 14 at bats, a season high.
- Has made 22 starts (10gs at 3B, 8gs at 2B, 4gs at SS)...last played Thu vs Col, started at SS in the 13-inning, 7-5 win (0-3).
- On 4/10 at Phi made his Major League debut with a start at 3B (0-3).
- Began the season at Class AAA Louisville, where he made 3 starts at 3B before he was promoted (0-8, 3r, 2bb, 2hbp, 1sb)...along with RHP Zack Weiss was recalled from Louisville on 4/9, when OF Scott Schebler and 3B Eugenio Suárez went on the 10-day disabled list.
- In March 2016 played for Team Nicaragua in the World Baseball Classic qualifier in Mexicali, Mexico...his father was born in Nicaragua.

## 38 CURT CASALI, c

**Homestand: 3g, 1gs, 2-5 (.400), 2 2b, 1rbi, 2r, 1hbp**

- His media guide bio is available on the home page at [www.redspressbox.com](http://www.redspressbox.com).
- In his first 4 apps for the Reds has reached base safely in 6 of his 11 plate apps (4-8, .600, 2 2b, solo HR, 2rbi, 1bb, 1hbp, 1sh)...last played Thu vs Col, started the 13-inning, 7-5 win (1-3, RBI-double, sac bunt, 1hbp).
- Sat at SD started in his first Major League appearance of the season...in the second inning homered off Eric Lauer to become the first player to homer in his first Reds plate appearance since Adam Duvall did it on 8/31/15 at Cubs (off Justin Grimm).
- On 5/31 was acquired from the Rays for cash considerations...the next day was promoted to the 25-man roster, replacing C Tony Cruz (optioned to Louisville).
- Prior to this season had made 161 Major League apps, all for the Rays (30g in 2014, 38g in 2015, 84g in 2016, 9g in 2017)...including this season, in his career has thrown out 31% (27-88) of attempted base stealers.
- On 1/18 was signed by the Rangers to a minor league contract...on 3/21 was released...on 3/22 was signed by the Rays to a minor league contract...prior to his trade to the Reds spent the season at Class AAA Durham (28g, .274, 5 2b, 4hr, 20rbi).

## 4 BRANDON DIXON, inf/of

**Homestand: 1gs at 2B, 1g as PH, 0-5, 1bb**

- Has made 3 starts at 3 different positions...played 1B on 5/24 vs Pit, RF on 5/26 at Col and 2B on Thu vs Col.
- On 5/22 was promoted from Louisville to fill the roster spot vacated by IF/OF Rosell Herrera, who was optioned to Louisville...that night vs Pit pinch hit in his Major League debut (P9 off Jameson Taillon).
- Was the fifth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera).
- In the 5-4 win on 5/24 vs Pit made his first start, played 1B and produced the first 3 hits of his Major League career (2 singles, 1 double).
- Began the season at Louisville (37g, .326, 12 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 14tbi, 8st)...played 1B (11g), 2B (6g), 3B (4g), LF (10g) and RF (2g).
- When promoted on 5/22, among the International League leaders ranked fifth in both hitting and slugging percentage (.527) and T5th in stolen bases.
- During spring training hit .326 in 27 apps and 7 starts (1 2b, 4hr, 10rbi, 4sb).

## 23 ADAM DUVALL, if

**Homestand: 3-9 (.333), 1rbi, 2 assists**

- Hit safely in 3 of his last 4 apps (4-13, .308, 1rbi).
- Beginning with the 2016 season is 1 of only 5 Major League players to produce at least 77 doubles, 74 HR and 235 RBI (Nolan Arenado, Manny Machado, Anthony Rizzo, Justin Upton).
- Has 19 extra-base hits...is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 extra-base hits in 3 straight seasons.
- Has made 5 apps this season and 38 apps in his career at 1B...has made 24 career starts at that position, including 2 starts at 1B this season (4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

## 4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b

**Homestand: 3-8 (.375), 1 2b, 3rbi**

- Has a 5-game hitting streak (7-20, .350, 2 2b, 2hr, 6rbi), a streak kept intact yesterday with a pinch-hit walk.
- In 202 career apps for the Reds is hitting .311 (37 2b, 3 3b, 39hr, 141rbi, .899ops).
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.
- Since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month...has done it twice (8hr, 24rbi in May 2018 & 9hr, 24rbi in June 1017).
- Ranks second in the National League in hitting, just .005 behind LAD's Matt Kemp...no Reds batter has led the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Also ranks among the National League leaders in HR (T7th), RBI (3rd), multi-hit games (23, T4th), hits (3rd), total bases (3rd), OBP (8th) and slugging (3rd).
- In his last 27 apps beginning 5/7 is hitting .417, including 14 multi-hit games and raising BA from .282 (43-103, 7 2b, 10hr, 30rbi, .777slg, .441obp).
- Beginning 5/7 leads the Major Leagues in RBI, batting average and slugging percentage while leading the National League in hits and HR...ranks third in the majors and NL in on-base percentage.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

## 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf

**Homestand: 0-7, 2bb, 2r**

- Is hitless in his last 11 at bats, tying his season high (5/15-5/19)...in his last 6 apps is 1-for-21 (4bb, 9k) following a 5-game hitting streak during which he hit .333 to raise his BA from .199 to .213 (6-18, 1 3b, 1rbi).
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and a team-high 43 starts batting ninth...has made 32 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 253, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- On 5/26 at Coors Field was timed at 10.39 seconds from home plate to third base, the quickest triple since Statcast started tracking in 2015.

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

**Homestand: 3-10 (.300), 1rbi, 1r**

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Has a 10-game hitting streak, raising BA from .243 and including 4 multi-hit games (15-39, .385, 2 2b, 5rbi, 1sb, .400obp)...is the longest hitting streak by a Reds batter this season and the longest active hitting streak in the Major Leagues...the longest hitting streak of his career is 13 games (5/13-5/28, 2017).
- Among National League shortstops ranks second in both hits (64, Brandon Crawford 68) and stolen bases (9, Trea Turner 17).
- Twice this season made at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa).
- In the batting order hit first (13gs), second (29gs), seventh (13gs) and eighth (3gs, 4/1 vs Wsh, 4/7 at Pit, 6/5 vs Col).

## 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

**Homestand: 7-16 (.438), 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi, 3r**

- Has a career-high 7-game hitting streak for the second time this season (4/25-5/1), including 5 multi-hit games (13-28, .464, 1 2b, 3hr, 5rbi, 6r, .821slg, .500obp)...produced at least 2 hits in each of his 3 apps on this homestand.
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .458 so far in June (11-24, 1 2b, 2hr, 3rbi, .750slg, .480obp).
- Has made a team-high 30 starts in RF, 9 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- Has made 7 career starts batting leadoff, including twice this year (4/23 vs Atl, 6/7 vs Col)...in his 7 career starts batting leadoff has hit .364 (12-33), including .379 (11-29) in his 6 starts batting leadoff for the Reds.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

**Homestand: 4-15 (.267), 1rbi, 1bb**

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- In his last 15 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .333, raising BA from .274 and including 6 multi-hit games (20-60, 3 2b, 4hr, 13rbi, .583slg, .406obp).
- Missed 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb but still ranks second in the National League in RBI, just 1 behind Javier Baez of the Cubs...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the league in RBI is on media guide page 397.
- Leads the Major Leagues in fewest at bats per RBI (3.8)...also ranks among the NL leaders in hitting with RISP (.353, 8th).
- In May led the Major Leagues in RBI (29) while ranking T3rd in both extra-base hits (15) and HR (8)...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds third baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 29 RBI in a calendar month.
- Tied the franchise record for most RBI by a Reds player in his first 20 games of a season (25)...played in his 20th game on 5/8 vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of those respective seasons.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

**Homestand: 5-13 (.385), 1 2b, 1rbi, 2bb, 3r**

- Leads the National League in batting average vs RHP (.366) and ranks among the leaders in on-base percentage (3rd), walks (T3rd), hitting with RISP (.352, 10th) and hits (T10th).
- Was hitting .311 through his third plate appearance on Wed (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- Hit safely in 4 of his last 5 apps (9-22, .409, 1 2b, 1 3b, 1rbi), including 3 hits Sun at SD, 3 hits Tue vs Col and 2 hits Wed vs Col.
- In the eighth inning yesterday vs Col produced his first RBI since 5/16 at SF, snapping a career-high 18-game streak without an RBI (previous, 13g, 6/14-6/28, 2015)...during those 18 apps hit .348 (24-69, 5 2b, 1 3b), including .214 with RISP (3-14).
- Hasn't homered in 22 games since a 2-run HR off Pat Venditte on 5/13 at LAD but in that span is hitting .333 (26-78, 5 2b, 1 3b, 2rbi)...his single-season career high for consecutive homerless games is 40 (6/25-10/3, 2012).
- Reached base safely in 54 of his 64 apps, including each of his last 16 apps beginning 5/20 (23-62, .371, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1rbi, 9bb, .458obp).
- In the Reds' 63 games has made 62 apps and 60 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,492)...if he plays every day will reach that milestone on Sun, 6/17 at Pit.

## 33 JESSE WINKER, of

**Homestand: 6-11 (.545), 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, 2bb, 2r**

- Leads National League rookies in walks and outfield assists (3, tied) while ranking second in on-base percentage.
- Has a 4-game hitting streak (8-16, .500, 1 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, .750slg, .556obp) following a career-high 0-for-14 skid.
- Produced a hit in each of his last 4 plate apps and reached base in each of his last 5 plate apps (walk, single, single, single, 2-run walkoff HR).
- In Thu's 13-inning, 7-5 win vs Col became the first player to come off the bench and finish 3-for-3 with a walkoff HR since NYY's Hector Lopez on 5/29/60 at Wsh...was Winker's first career walkoff HR (off Chris Rusin).
- Has made 25 starts in RF, second on the team to Scott Schebler's 30 starts, 16 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- From 4/18-4/27 produced a career-high 9-game hitting streak.
