LEADING OFF: *Happy 24th Birthday to Shohei Ohtani...* Angels play the final contest of a four-city, 10-game trip (3-6) to **Kansas City** (makeup; 0-1), **Boston** (0-3), **Baltimore** (2-1) & **Seattle** (1-1)... Despite winning three of last five affairs, Halos have dropped eight of 11 overall... Club is in fourth place, 12.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (11.0 games behind second Wild Card spot)... **Angels are 31-40 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 6-15 when a left-hander starts (38-28 vs. RHS)...Halos are 13-21 on road since a club-record 11-1 start... Tomorrow the team opens a six-game homestand against the **Dodgers** (July 6-8) & **Mariners** (July 10-12) and then head up to **Dodger Stadium** (July 13-15) before reaching the All-Star Break.....**16 of next 19 games are at home.****

RANDOM NOTE: Yesterday marked the first time the Angels have won 7-4 on July 4th (7/4). Get it?

ALBERT & AROD: **Albert Pujols'** double yesterday (4th inn) marked his 1,275th career extra-base hit, tying **Alex Rodriguez** for sixth-most all-time...Next up at the fifth spot is **Willie Mays** at 1,323.

EMERALD MIKE: **Mike Trout** has hit safely in seven of eight games at SAFECO this season (six multi-hit games, four 3-hit efforts)...**In the eight contests, he is batting .548 (17/31) with nine runs, five doubles, one triple, five HRs & nine RBI (1.258) slugging pct....Has four HRs his last five games here.**

DOUBLE DUTY: With his double yesterday, **Pujols** passed **David Ortiz** for sole possession of 10th on the all-time doubles list with 633...**He is the only MLB player in all-time top 10 in HRs (626) and doubles.**

HOT KOLE: A look at **Kole Calhoun** in the 15 games since his return from the D.L and 15 games prior...
Last 15 G: .306 (15/49); 10 R, 3 2B, 4 HR, 8 RBI (.352 OBP/.612 SLG)
Previous 15 G: .100 (4/40); 2 R, 1 2B (.217 OBP/.125 SLG)

SIMBA SIZZLIN' **Andrelton Simmons** has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 overall games (.364; 16/44)...**His .351 (53/151) road clip is third-best in MLB.**

SCIOSCIA 3K: June 30th marked the 3,000th career game for **Mike Scioscia** as manager of the Angels...He's the 21st manager to reach the plateau and the sixth to have at least 3,000 games with one team (**Connie Mack, John McGraw, Bobby Cox, Walter Alston** and **Tommy Lasorda**).

HALL PASS: On July 29th, **Vladimir Guerrero** will become the first player in Angels' history inducted into the Hall of Fame in **Cooperstown**...He played six seasons with the Angels (2004-09) batting .319 (1034/3237) with 194 doubles, 173 HRs and 616 RBI in 846 games. His .319 average is the highest mark in franchise history (min. 250 PA)...**Named 2004 A.L. MVP after batting .337, with 39 HRs and 126 RBI with a league-leading 124 runs and a franchise record 366 total bases.**

OHTANI UPDATE: **Shohei Ohtani** (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7th. **On June 28th, an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. Yesterday, he was reinstated from the 10-day DL in a return to the team as a designated hitter. In approximately three weeks (from 6/28), he will be re-assessed to see if he can pitch this season.**

FROM THE START: Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 47 of last 59 games...**Starters have fashioned a 3.33 ERA (322 IP – 119 ER) since May 1, second in A.L. in span (3rd in MLB).**

MAKE WAR: **Trout's 6.6 WAR** this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **Jose Ramirez** (CLE) at 5.7...**On pace for a 12.3 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his 60.7 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,012 games.**

SHELVED: Angels have 13 players currently on the disabled list...The average D.L. stint for an **Angel** player this season is **31 games**...**On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...49 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (club record is 55 in 2017)...28 pitchers have played for LAA (12 starters), most in team history thru 87 games (LAA used club-record 31 pitchers last season).**

ALWAYS ON: *Since his call-up in 2012, Mike Trout has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...His 77 walks are most in Angels' history through 87 games.*

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP **Mike Trout** ranks in **Top 3 in MLB in several offensive categories**, including HRs (T2nd; 24), runs (2nd; 67), times on base (1st; 175), walks (1st; 77), IBB (1st; 14), OBP (1st; .456), SLG (3rd; .627), OPS (2nd; 1.082) & OPS+ (1st; 200.0)...**Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (12).**

GLOVE STORY: LAA has gone errorless in 55 of 87 games...**Club has 40 errors thru 87 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .987 fielding pct...Catchers own a 47.2 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...Mike Trout and Charlie Blackmon are only CF's in MLB with 1.000 fielding pct.**

PITCHING POINTS: LAA pitchers have 40 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 87 affairs (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 788 Ks)...**297 walks are third-most in A.L.** Angels' bullpen has logged 323 IP, second in A.L. to **TB**...**15 blown saves are third-most in A.L.** Halos have allowed 116 HRs, third-most in MLB (2nd in A.L.)

HOT HALOS: Rookie **David Fletcher** has hit safely in six straight (.318; 7/22) and in nine of his first 11 MLB starts (4 multi-hit games)...**Jose Briceño** has opened his big league career batting .300 (9/30) in 10 games with an AB...**Luis Valbuena** has three home runs and nine RBI his nine starts...**Martin Maldonado** has 12 RBI his last 13 games...**Tyler Skaggs** went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP – 3 ER) in June (5 GS)...**His 0.84 ERA led all MLB starters last month...Has allowed two earned runs or less in 13 of his 16 starts...His 2.64 ERA ranks eighth in A.L....Andrew Heaney matched a career best with 10 Ks Tuesday night (2nd time).**

A BIT ON ALBERT: **Albert Pujols** is 36 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – **Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez.**

NOT A FAN: **Andrelton Simmons** has struck out just seven times since May 1 (208 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning (May 18-June 22)...He leads MLB in PA per SO with 20.87 (313 PA/15 K) while teammate **Ian Kinsler** ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (10.47)...**Simmons also leads MLB batting .344 (33/96) with two strikes.**

TRIPLE THREATS at 1K: June 21st marked the 1,000th career game for **Trout**...He joined **Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez** as only players in MLB history with at least a **300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases** at the 1K milestone.

ALBERT ALERT: **Albert Pujols** is 27th all-time with 3,048 hits...**Rod Carew** is 26th at 3,053...His 3,000th hit came May 4th at **Seattle** to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (**Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez**)...**AP is seventh all-time with 1,964 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

AT SEATTLE: Angels have dropped four of last five to M's...Mariners lead 2018 series 5-3, sweeping Angels in last trip to SAFECO (June 11-13)...Halos took two of three here in first meeting (May 4-6)...**LAA is 11-9 in last 20 games at SAFECO...Angels are 101-78 over M's since 2009...Trout's 20 HRs at SAFECO are his most in career at any road ballpark, and most ever by a visiting player at SAFECO...A. Simmons is batting .400 (10/25) vs. M's this season.**

DODGERS ON DECK: Clubs split 2017 season series 2-2...Angels have won six of last nine games vs. LAD...**Since 2005, Angels are 40-29 vs. LAD (23-12 at Angel Stadium)**...All-time, Halos are 36-21 at home, 27-30 on road and 63-51 overall against LAD...**Under Mike Scioscia, LAA is 58-42 vs. LAD.**

(1997) The Angels turned the sixth triple play in club history in a 5-4 victory vs. Seattle...A deep fly hit by **Rich Amaral** with runners doubled off second (**Russ Davis**) and first (**Dan Wilson**) bases; **Garret Anderson** (CF) to **Gary DiSarcina** (SS) to **Darin Erstad** (1B).

July 6
(1983) **Fred Lynn** connects for a grand slam off **Atlee Hammaker** in the third inning of the Mid-Summer Classic at Comiskey Park...Lynn was named as the game's MVP as the American League won 13-3...The HR remains the only grand slam in All-Star history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

5-4, 3.40 ERA

Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in four of last five starts

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Making 12th start of the season for Angels and sixth on the road...Second start of 2018 vs. Seattle...Is in fifth stint of season with Angels, after being recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake prior to start on June 12.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in last start on Thursday at Boston after tossing 5.1 innings and allowing two earned runs on four hits with two walks and four strikeouts...Has walked six batters across last two starts, after walking six combined across previous seven starts.
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Ranks fourth among American League rookies (min. 40 IP) in ERA (3.40), and wins (5) and ranks fifth in batting average against (.243).
- **STREAKING:** Won four straight decisions between May 3 – June 1, which is the longest streak by any Angels pitcher in 2018.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **VS. SEATTLE:** Is 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA (5 IP – 2 ER)...Charged with loss in only previous start vs. Mariners on June 12 at Safeco Field after allowing three runs (two earned) on eight hits with no walks and two strikeouts...All three runs allowed came on a pair of home runs from **Mitch Haniger**.
- **AT SAFECO FIELD:** Tonight marks second career appearance at Safeco Field...Took loss in first start on June 12 (5 IP, 8 H, 3 R, 2 ER, 0 BB, 2 SO).
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **GENERATION GAP:** When they faced off on June 1, the 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between **Bartolo Colon** (45 years, 8 days) and **Jaime Barria** (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history.
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 185 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In four starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP – 6 ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and is the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** is ranked #1)...He is also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.
