HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 21-11 record is tied for the second-best 32-game start in club history (also: 2008)...their best 33-game starts are 23-10 in 2000 and 22-11 in 2008.
- ♦ The D-backs boast the best record in the NL (21-11, .656) and third best in the Majors behind the Red Sox (23-9; .719) and Yankees (22-10, .688).
 - HOME: Red Sox (11-4, .733), Yankees (12-5, .706), Phillies (11-5, .688), Pirates (10-5, .667), Cardinals (10-5, .667), **D-backs (11-6, .647)**
 - ROAD: Angels (12-2, .857), Astros (11-4, .733), Red Sox (12-5, .706), **D-backs (10-5, .667)**, Mets (10-5, .667), Yankees (10-5, .667)
- ♦ **Zack Greinke**, in 3 home starts, is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (4 ER in 18.2 IP), a .179 opponent average, 2 walks and 21 strikeouts.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost, 8-0, vs. Astros.
- ♦ **Kris Medlen** took the loss (7 ER in 4.0 innings) in his first start since May 20, 2016.
- ♦ **T.J. McFarland** worked 4.1 frames (1 ER), his third game of 4.0+ innings.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** threw 0.2 of an inning and recorded his first career strikeout (Gerrit Cole in the ninth inning).
- ♦ **Chris Owings'** fifth-inning double was the D-backs lone hit.

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ The D-backs recalled RHP **Braden Shipley** today after optioning RHP **Kris Medlen** following last night's game.
- ♦ Shipley, 26, will be available for tonight's game in relief...in 6 starts for the Aces, he was 2-3 with a 6.40 ERA (23 ER in 32.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts...in his first 3 starts to open the season, he went 2-0 with a 1.56 ERA (3 ER in 17.1 IP) and 14 strikeouts.

- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** has 4 career pitching appearances, allowing 0 runs in 3.0 innings with 1 strikeout (May 12, 2014 vs. Cubs; August 1, 2017 @ Cubs; August 20, 2017 @ Twins; May 4, 2018 vs. Astros).
- ♦ Courtesy STATS, LLC, Descalso is the first position player...
 - In the live-ball era (since 1920) with 4 straight pitching appearances without allowing a baserunner.
 - With 4 straight scoreless appearances since Doug Dascenzo/CHI had 4 straight from 1990-91 (June 12, 1990 vs. Mets; June 10, 1991 vs. Dodgers; June 28, 1991 vs. Cardinals; July 2, 1991 vs. Pirates).
 - To retire 9+ straight batters at any point in his career since Dave McCarty/BOS retired nine straight in 2004, the lone players to do it since 1974.

GREINKE VS. THE 'STROS...AND INTERLEAGUE

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has held the Astros scoreless in his last 2 starts, tossing 6.0 scoreless frames last August 14 (5 H, 2 BB, 9 K) and 7.0 shutout innings on June 2, 2016 in Houston (4 H, 0 B, 11 K).
- ♦ Has won all 5 home Interleague starts as a D-back, since 2016, posting a 1.18 ERA (5 ER in 38.0 IP), .168 opponent average, 5 walks and 36 strikeouts...his 5-game home winning streak in Interleague is a D-backs record.
- ♦ Has won his last 6 home decisions in Interleague, dating back to July 31, 2015, posting a 1.37 ERA (7 ER in 46.0 IP), a .170 opponent average, 6 walks and 44 strikeouts...his 6-game home winning streak is the longest active streak by a starter and tied for the seventh-longest streak since 1998 (Justin Verlander, 11 straight wins from June 21, 2009-August 1, 2014).
- ♦ His team has won his last 7 home games in Interleague, dating back to June 18, 2015, as he is 6-0 with a 1.19 ERA (7 ER in 53.0 IP), a .169 opponent average, 6 walks and 52 strikeouts.

ASTROS & INTERLEAGUE

- ♦ The D-backs split the 4-game home-and-road series vs. Astros last season.
- ♦ The D-backs went 12-8 (.600) in Interleague in 2017, tied with the Cubs for second in the NL behind the Dodgers (16-4; .800).
- ♦ The D-backs had a club-record 12 Interleague wins last season, besting their 11 wins in 2002, '03, '13, '15.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .323 (31-for-96) hitter with 9 doubles, 6 home runs and 16 RBI in 28 games vs. Astros.
- ♦ **David Peralta**, in his last 11 Interleague games, is hitting .308 (12-for-39), 3 doubles, 2 homers, 5 RBI and 2 walks.

EL POLLO LOCO

- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** was named NL Player of the Month for April (his first monthly honors) after ranking among NL leaders in March/April in home runs (T-1st, 9), slugging pct. (2nd, .670), OPS (2nd, 1.021) extra-base hits (2nd, 19) and RBI (3rd, 24).
- ♦ In his last 15 games, is hitting .339 (20-for-59)/1.153 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 7 homers, 13 RBI, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases.
- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders in slugging pct. (1st, .667), home runs (T-3rd, 10), extra-base hits (2nd, 21), total bases (2nd, 78), OPS (3rd, 1.023), RBI (4th, 25) and stolen bases (T-4th, 8).

BOXBERGER LOCKING DOWN THE BACK END

- ♦ **Brad Boxberger** is a perfect 10-for-10 in save opportunities as his 10 saves are third in the Majors behind Edwin Diaz/SEA (13) and Wade Davis/CHI (12).
- ♦ Boxberger and Diaz are the lone relievers with 10+ save opps who have been perfect in save opps.
- ♦ Has held the Astros scoreless in 9 of 12 career games, going 1-1 with 3 saves, a 1.59 ERA (2 ER in 11.1 IP), .179 opponent average with 16 strikeouts.

#BRINGINTHEBEARD

- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has held opponents scoreless in 7 straight games (6.2 IP) with a .091 opponent average and 9 strikeouts.
- ♦ Has held opponents scoreless in 8 of 9 home games with 0.90 ERA (1 ER in 10.0 IP), .147 opponent average and 13 strikeouts.
- ♦ Among NL relievers at home since 2017 (min. 25 G), ranks sixth with 49.0 innings, ninth with a 1.47 ERA, tied for 12th with 52 strikeouts.

FOUR SCORE AND MANY WINS AGO

- ♦ The D-backs are 16-1 (.941) this season when scoring 4+ runs, tied for the best mark in the Majors with the Angels (16-1), ahead of the Yankees (21-3, .875), Giants (15-3, .833) and Cubs (10-2, .833).
- ♦ The D-backs have won 11 straight games when scoring 4+ runs, 19 of its last 20 games (since Sept. 26, 2017), 23 of its last 25 (since Sept. 13, 2017) and 33 of its last 38 (since Aug. 22, 2017).

GOLDY A FAN OF INTERLEAGUE

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, over his last 24 Interleague games, is hitting .329 (28-for-85)/.406 OBP/.541 SLG with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 13 RBI and 11 walks.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING

- ♦ The D-backs were the first team in the Majors to win their first 9 series since the 2001 Mariners (won 9) and the 1978 Tigers before that as well as the first NL club to do so since the 1907 Cubs (won a Major League-record 11 series) [Source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- ♦ The 9 straight series wins tied a club record for the third time (also: Sept. 3-Oct. 3, 1999 and July 20-Aug. 19, 2007).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MATT KOCH (1-0, 2.37)

- ♦ In 3 starts (team is 2-1), he is 1-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER in 17.0 IP), .200 opponent average, 7 walks and 11 strikeouts.

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

DID YOU KNOW?

- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.

- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

INTERLEAGUE CONTINUED

- ◆ His team has won his last 7 home games in Interleague, dating back to June 18, 2015, as he is 6-0 with a 1.19 ERA (7 ER in 53.0 IP), a .169 opponent average, 6 walks and 52 strikeouts.

FREE PASSES AT A MINIMUM

- ◆ His 4 walks are tied for fourth fewest by a starter (min. 3 GS) with 2 others behind Miles Mikolas/STL (2) and Andrew Kittredge/TB (2).
- ◆ Since 2017, his 48 walks are tied for fourth fewest by a starter (min. 35 GS), with Masahiro Tanaka, behind behind Ivan Nova (42), Jeff Samardzija (42) and Corey Kluber (45).
- ◆ When he issues 2 walks or less, he is 154-80 with a 3.25 ERA, .244 opponent average, 358 walks and 1,949 strikeouts.

MORE STRIKEOUTS + LESS WALKS = GOOD PLAN

- ◆ Has 42 strikeouts and 4 walks in 6 starts, the Major's second-best strikeout-to-walk ratio (10.50; 42 SO:4 BB), behind Miles Mikolas/STL (15.50, 31:2).
