The Mariners and Astros meet for the 9th (3-5) of 19 games this season... following this series, these two teams will play 3 more head-to-head series: Aug. 9-12 & Sept. 17-19 at Minute Maid Park and Aug. 20-22 at Safeco Field... since 2013, the Mariners are 32-15 (.681) when scoring at least 4 runs vs. the Astros.

**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 2-team, 7-day, 7-game homestand with the finale (1-1) of three games against Houston...will face Toronto for 4 games, beginning tomorrow...just concluded a brief 3-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners have won 16 of their last 29 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have also won 23 of their last 43 games, 30 of their last 52, 34 of their last 58, 39 of their last 64 and 41 of their last 68...Seattle is 49-33 in its last 82 games, 54-36 over its last 90 games and 59-40 in its last 99 games...Seattle is 20-17 during the day and 43-27 at night...Seattle is 35-20 at Safeco Field, 28-24 on the road.

- **Whiff - Edwin Díaz** has struck out his first batter faced 24 times this season, tied with Adam Ottavino-COL for most in the Majors...Díaz has struck out his first batter in 45.3% (24x53) of his appearances this season.
- **As Easy as 1-2-3 - Edwin Díaz** retired the Astros in order in the 9th inning Monday for his 40th save of the season...in 24 of his 40 saves, he has faced the minimum 3 batters in an outing of exactly 1.0 inning, the most such saves in the Majors...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 17 saves of 1.0 inning and 3 batters faced.
- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .356 (32x90) with 21 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 walk and 2 HBP when leading off a game this season...his 32 hits to lead off a game are the most in the Majors.
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 41-17 (.707) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 27-14 (.659) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 14-3 (.824) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 44-13 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 19-31 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 3 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (56-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining New York-AL (58-0) and Oakland (51-0).
- **Bullpen Bullies - Edwin Díaz** has not allowed an earned run over his last 14.0 innings spanning 14 appearances (6/25-c), while **Alex Colomé** has an active 12.2 scoreless innings streak over 13 games (6/30-c).

**LEFTIES ON PARADE**...Mariners left-handed starting pitchers have combined to go 27-10 with a 3.44 ERA (139 ER, 363.1 IP) in 60 starts this season...**James Paxton** (9-4, 3.49) and **Marco Gonzales** (12-5, 3.37) lead Mariners southpaws with 21 starts apiece, followed by **Wade LeBlanc** (6-1, 3.51 in 16 GS), **Roenis Elías** (0-0, 4.91 in 1 GS) and **Ariel Miranda** (0-0, 1.80 in 1 GS)...Seattle southpaws have combined for 31 quality starts this season, 2nd-most among any club's left-handers behind only Boston (38); Paxton leads Mariners lefties with 13 quality starts, followed by Gonzales (12) and LeBlanc (6)...the Mariners are 39-21 in games started by left-handers this season; only the Red Sox have won more such games (53).

**SOUTHPAW SLUGGERS**...**Jean Segura** ranks 10th in the American League with a .319 (36x113) average vs. left-handed pitchers...**Nelson Cruz** has hit 8 home runs off lefties, tied with 5 other players for 4th-most in the AL...**Dee Gordon** (4th/39) and **Segura** (T8th/36) each rank among the AL leaders in hits vs. LHP.

**NEW FACES**...with the additions of OF **Cameron Maybin** and RHP **Adam Warren** to the 25-man roster today, the Mariners have 7 players on the active roster who were not with the organization on Opening Day...Maybin (7/31 trade with MIA) and Warren (7/30 trade with NYY) are joined by RHP **Alex Colomé** (5/25 trade with TB), LHP **Zach Duke** (7/30 trade with MIN), C **Chris Herrmann** (signed as MiLB free agent on 4/5), OF **Denard Span** (5/25 trade with TB) and RHP **Sam Tuivailala** (7/27 trade with STL).

**THE EDWIN DÍAZ FILE**...**Edwin Díaz** recorded his Major League-leading 40th save of the season on Monday...he becomes the 4th pitcher in single-season club history to notch at least 40 saves, joining Fernando Rodney (48, 2014), Kazuhiro Sasaki (45, 2001) and J.J. Putz (40, 2007)...Díaz has 87 strikeouts this season, 3 shy of setting a single-season career-high; he had 89 strikeouts last season after recording 88 punchouts in his rookie campaign of 2016 (appeared in 49 games after being called up to the Majors in June)...with his next strikeout, Díaz will join Dick Radatz (1962-64 w/BOS) as the only primary relievers in Major League history to record at least 88 strikeouts in each of their first 3 seasons.

**SPAN-TASTIC**...since joining the Mariners on May 28, **Denard Span** is batting .301 (47x156) with 19 runs, 8 doubles, 3 triples, 4 home runs, 18 RBI, 12 walks, a .343 on-base percentage and a .468 slugging percentage (.811 OPS)...among Mariners with at least 150 plate appearances over that span, he ranks 2nd in slugging, 2nd in OPS and 3rd in batting...in 7 games batting 3rd in the order this season, Span is batting .414 (12x29) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 1 walk...in 19 career games hitting 3rd, he is batting .354 (23x65) with 11 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 8 RBI and 6 walks.

**WHAT A RELIEF**...the Mariners lead the Major Leagues in saves (42) and holds (78)...since 1973, only 6 clubs have led the Majors in saves and holds in the same season, most recently the 1992 Oakland Athletics...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 40 saves, while **Juan Nicasio** is T9th in MLB with 19 holds, and **Alex Colomé** is T11th with 18 holds.

**HOME SWEET HOME**...the Mariners have the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...Seattle is 35-20 (.636) at Safeco Field...only Boston (.717/38-15), New York-AL (.717/38-15) and Philadelphia (.654/34-18) have a higher winning percentage at their home ballparks...since May 18, the Mariners are 26-10 (.722) at Safeco Field, the 2nd-best home winning percentage in the Majors in that span (Boston, .735/25-9).

**ELECTRIC EDDIE**...**Edwin Díaz** leads the Majors with 40 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 87 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 99)...of Díaz's 40 saves, 21 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 12)...his 21 1-run saves are only 2 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 48-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 23-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 21-for-23 in 1-run save opportunities (91.3%) with a 0.77 ERA (2 ER, 23.1 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 5 walks.

**AS YOU KNOW**...the Mariners have a .636 (35-20) winning percentage at Safeco Field this season, the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners .636 home winning percentage is currently 2nd-best in club history?...the 2018 Mariners trail only the 2001 Mariners, who posted a .704 (57-24) winning percentage at home on their way to winning 116 games.

**ABOUT LEBLANC...**

- 33-year-old left-hander is making his 22nd appearance and 17th start of the season, his 198th career appearance, 96th career start and 4th start (7th appearance) vs. the Astros today.
- Signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.
- Previously played with Seattle in 2016...acquired on June 22, 2016 from Toronto in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...was traded to Pittsburgh on Sept. 13, 2016 in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
- Selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Lake Charles, LA...attended Alfred M. Barbe High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Padres on Sept. 3, 2008 at Los Angeles-NL (L, 4.0, 8.5, 5.3, 1, HR-2).
- Pitched for the University of Alabama, 2004-06...was 24-9 with a 2.81 ERA (100 ER, 320.1 IP) and 334 strikeouts in 46 career G/45 GS...holds Alabama's all-time record for strikeouts with 334...National Freshman of the Year (*Baseball America*) and SEC Freshman of the Year in 2004 after going 8-4 with a 2.08 ERA (26 ER, 112.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts in 16 G/15 GS while posting 8 complete games, including 2 shutouts.
- Went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League in 2015.
- Is 8-8 with a 5.31 ERA (80 ER, 135.2 IP) in 34 career games/22 starts in August.

**LAST OUTING**...no decision despite a quality start in his last outing, a 3-4 10-inning Mariners loss at Los Angeles-AL on July 27...allowed 3 runs on 5 hits and 3 walks while striking out 6 batters across 6.0 innings pitched...all 3 runs scored in the 2nd inning; LeBlanc retired 12 of the last 15 batters he faced.

**FOR STARTERS**...since moving into the Mariners rotation on May 3, is 6-1 with a 3.34 ERA (33 ER, 89.0 IP) with 70 strikeouts and 19 walks in 16 starts...the Mariners are 11-6 in those 16 starts...among American League leaders during that span, ranks 8th in BB/9.0 IP (1.92/19 BB, 89.0 IP), 9th in WHIP (1.10/19 BB, 79 H, 89.0 IP), 10th in K/BB (3.68/70 K, 19 BB) and 10th in ERA (3.34).

**START IT UP**...in 24 career starts with the Mariners, is 9-1 with a 3.70 ERA (55 ER, 133.2 IP) with 104 strikeouts and 28 walks...the Mariners are 18-6 in his 24 starts with the club...made 8 starts with Seattle in 2016, going 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 9 walks.

**HE'S A WINNER**...made 21 career starts with the Mariners before suffering a loss...only 1 American League pitcher in the live-ball era had a longer such streak to begin a tenure with a single club (Whitey Ford-NYY, 22, 7/6/50-6/12/53)...among all pitchers in the live-ball era, LeBlanc's streak trailed only Ford and Kirk Ruetter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94)(STATS).

**MAKE YOURSELF AT HOME**...signed to a contract extension through the 2019 season with annual club options through 2022 on July 3.

**THAT'S NEAT!**...turned in one of the best starts of his career June 16 vs. Boston, allowing just 2 hits and striking out 9 across 7.2 scoreless innings...faced just 1 over the minimum, thanks to a 1st inning double play...retired 22 consecutive batters after allowing a leadoff single to Mookie Betts in the 1st inning, ending with Eduardo Nunez's two-out single in the 8th...his 7.2 innings and 9 strikeouts were both his most since 2011 with San Diego.

**MAY TO REMEMBER**...in 6 starts in the month of May, went 1-0 with a 1.72 ERA (6 ER, 31.1 IP) with 23 strikeouts and 6 walks...among American League leaders for the month of May, ranked 4th in ERA and 9th in WHIP (0.99/6 BB, 25 H, 31.1 IP)...the Mariners went 5-1 in those 6 starts.

**WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE**...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

**2017 SEASON**...went 5-2 with 1 save and 4 holds in 50 relief appearances with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP), 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...held right-handed batters to a .217 (38x175) batting average against with a .270 OBP and a .389 slugging percentage (.658 OPS against).

**IT HAD BEEN A WHILE**...in his Mariners debut on June 24, 2016, LeBlanc made his first Major League appearance since Sept. 28, 2014 at Seattle with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 634 days between appearances...LeBlanc made his first ML start since Sept. 23, 2014 at Oakland with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 639 days between starts...earned his first win with Seattle on July 1, 2016, vs. Baltimore (6.0, 3.2, 2.1, 5, HR-1), his first Major League win since Sept. 23, 2014, with the Angels at the A's, a span of 646 days between Major League wins.

**CAREER**...10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...overall, is 36-36-3 with a 4.27 ERA (322 ER, 679.1 IP) in 197 career appearances/95 starts...in 95 career starts, is 28-32 with a 4.34 ERA (250 ER, 518.0 IP) with 364 strikeouts and 166 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP).
