FISH BITES

The Marlins continue their only 10-game homestand with the second of three against the Tampa Bay Rays tonight at 7:10 p.m. RHP **Trevor Richards**, making his 11th start of the season, is making his third career Interleague start and first against the Rays. Tampa Bay is starting LHP Ryan Yarbrough, who is making his fifth career start and 20th appearance of the season, his first against the Marlins. Miami recently completed a 10-day, nine-game road trip to Baltimore (2-1), San Francisco (1-2), and Colorado (2-1). The current homestand began with Arizona (1-3) and the Mets (2-1). Miami will take a four-game leave from Marlins Park beginning Thursday to visit the Washington Nationals, before returning home on July 9 to finish off the first half with a six-game homestand against Milwaukee and Philadelphia.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

Miami knocked off the Rays, 3-2, with its fourth walk-off win of the season. **Miguel Rojas** doubled home **Starlin Castro** with two outs in the second inning. The Rays evened the score at 1-1 in the fourth, before the Marlins regained the lead in the fifth on **J.T. Realmuto's** 11th home run. Tampa Bay got to Marlins closer **Kyle Barraclough** in the ninth for a run to send the game into extras. In the 10th, **Yadiel Rivera** singled to third, driving in **Brian Anderson**, for his second walk-off hit of the year. Castro led the offense with a career high-tying four hits (19th time), while Rojas added three hits. **Wei-Yin Chen** allowed just three hits and one unearned run, with no walks and five strikeouts, in 6.0 innings. **Drew Rucinski** tossed a scoreless 10th for his third win.

VS. THE RAYS

The season series will wrap up after the All-Star Break, as the intra-state rivals open the unofficial second half with three games at Tropicana Field from July 20-22. The Marlins dropped the 2017 Citrus Series, 1-3, with the only win coming on May 3 at the Trop. Miami is 30-26 against Tampa Bay in South Florida, including a 5-10 mark at Marlins Park, and trail the all-time series 53-55.

BOOK IT

J.T. Realmuto hit his 11th home run of the season last night; Miami is 9-0 when he homers (two multi-homer games) this year. According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, that is tied for the longest winning streak to open a season when an individual homers in Club history. The Marlins also won the first nine games when Josh Willingham homered in 2007, and when Mike Lowell went deep in 2004.

HE'S DOING ONE STECK OF A JOB

Drew Steckenrider entered last night's game and provided a scoreless seventh inning, allowing just one hit while striking out one. He is on a career-best 16.2 inning scoreless streak over his last 19 appearances, a run that has seen him become the first pitcher in Club history to make 14-or-more appearances in a calendar month (June) without allowing a run; he last allowed a run (2) on May 20 at Atlanta. His scoreless streak is now the second-longest active streak in the Majors this season, behind Yoshihisa Hirano (22.1), and is the second-longest by a Marlins reliever this season (Barraclough 20.2).

#KEEPINTREALMUTO

J.T. Realmuto has risen to the top of the class since coming off the DL on April 17. He is currently the owner of a 10-game hitting streak, one that has seen him post a .357 average (15x42) with six doubles, two home runs and 10 RBI. For the season, he leads all primary Major League catchers (min. 55 G) in average (.311), runs (40), doubles (19), and slugging percentage (.552). He is tied for second in hits (75) and triples (3), ranks third in on-base percentage (.366), and is tied for fifth in home runs (11) and RBI (36).

INTERLEAGUE NOTABLES

The Marlins have the second-most wins (188) all-time in Interleague Play among National League clubs, behind Washington (195), and they have the fourth-best winning percentage (.497; 188-190), behind St. Louis (.507; 176-171), the Mets (.507; 187-182), and the Cubs (.501; 173-172). Miami's offense is the all-time leader among NL clubs in Interleague runs (1,740), hits (3,429), doubles (684), and RBI (1,651).

WHAT A RELIEF

Since May 28, Miami's bullpen has limited opponents to a National League-leading .209 average against, ahead of Washington (.214) and San Francisco (.222). The 'pen also leads the NL in innings pitched (136.2) and ranks third in ERA at 3.16 (136.2 ip/48 er), behind only Arizona (2.39) and the Giants (2.87).

PUSHING THE LIMITS

The Marlins are 11 games into a stretch of 20 consecutive games between off-days. During the stretch, Miami will have faced off against two first-place teams (Arizona and Milwaukee), as well as the Washington Nationals. Prior to this homestand, Miami finished a run that saw them play 25 of 35 games on the road, and continuing today, 14 of the next 21 will be at Marlins Park.

THESE KIDS HAVE SKILLS

Major League Baseball announced yesterday the finalists of its national youth skills competitions – Scott's® MLB Pitch, Hit & Run and the MLB Jr. Home Run Derby. Three athletes from the state of Florida will take part in the competition: Joshua Agriesti of Hollywood (12u HR Derby Finalist), Madelyn Parker of Tampa (9-10 Softball PHR), and Joel Cabrera of Miami (9-10 Baseball PHR).

INDEPENDENCE DAY ACTIVITIES

Marlins players **Dan Straily** and **Brett Graves**, along with Marlins alumnus **Gaby Sanchez**, visited the Miami Veterans Affairs Medical Center earlier today from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., delivering lunch and spending time with our Nation's heroes. Tomorrow, the Marlins will host approximately 35 World War II, Vietnam, and Korean War veterans at Marlins Park for an Honor Flight reception. The veterans and their families will enjoy brunch in the DEX Diamond Club Lounge, during which Marlins pitcher **Brad Ziegler** and other Marlins players will stop by to show their appreciation and spend time with the veterans. The group will then be escorted out to the field for a pregame parade and ceremony. South Florida Honor Flight is an organization whose mission is to transport veterans to Washington, DC, to visit the memorials dedicated to honor their service and sacrifices. Also on Wednesday, the Marlins will donate \$10,000 to Honor Flight during an in-game check presentation, to help transport America's veterans to Washington, DC. The Marlins will also host the re-enlistment ceremony of Army Sergeant Ashley Mitchell prior to the game.

YEAR OF THE FAN SWEEPSTAKES

The Marlins, in partnership with AutoNation, America's largest automotive retailer, will be awarding a prize of a 24-month car lease to a select fan tonight, the eighth of 25 dates this season where a fan will drive off with a new car. The "Marlins Year of the Fan Sweepstakes, Driven by AutoNation" is open to any eligible fan in attendance at each select home date. Fans will be eligible for that date's drawing by scanning their valid, digital game ticket, stored on a mobile device, upon entry to Marlins Park prior to the end of the third inning. The 24-month car lease awarded to the winner of each game date's random drawing among all eligible entries will drive away with either a 2018 Ford Focus or 2018 Chevy Cruze. The next Sweepstakes game after today will be Tuesday, July 10 vs. Milwaukee.

SERIES NOTES

- The Marlins and Rays are squaring off in the Citrus Series for the 21st time. Miami dropped three of four in 2017 after taking three of four in 2016. The Marlins are 53-55 (.491) in the intrastate Interleague traditional rivalry. The Marlins are looking to even the all-time series record between the teams, which is currently in the Rays favor at 10-9-1.
- The Miami-Tampa Bay rivalry is one of seven active intrastate Interleague traditional rivalries, and one of the most closely contested, as the .509 winning percentage for the Rays is the narrowest by a series leader. The White Sox .513 winning percentage (59-56) over the Cubs ranks second. The most dominant intrastate rivals are the Yankees with a 68-47 (.591) record against the Mets, followed by the Cardinals, who have a 56-41 (.577) advantage over Kansas City. The Angels are third with a 63-51 (.553) lead on the Dodgers. Cleveland is fourth, as they hold a 56-47 (.544) mark against Cincinnati, and Oakland owns a 59-55 (.518) margin over San Francisco to rank fifth.

THIS DAY IN MARLINS HISTORY

JULY 3

The Marlins and Mets were in a scoreless showdown in **2000** as neither team could score a run through the first eight innings of play in Miami. In the bottom of the ninth, Derrek Lee followed a Mike Lowell single with a two-run walk-off home run. Jesus Sanchez pitched 8.0 scoreless innings but did not receive a decision.

- Trevor Richards will make his 11th start of the season for Miami tonight - the first of his career against Tampa Bay - as the clubs play game two of this three-game set.
- Went 2-0 with 0.75 ERA (12.0 ip/1 er) in four Spring appearances (two starts) with Miami. He contract selected on April 2 and made his Major League debut that night against Boston.
- He went 0-2 with a 4.94 ERA (23.2/13) across five starts in his first stint with the Marlins. Tossed 7.0 shutout innings with just two hits allowed on April 14 vs. Pittsburgh, and tossed 4.2 shutout innings, with a career-high 10 strikeouts, on April 25 at the Dodgers, his final start before being optioned back to NOLA.
- In the Pittsburgh start, became the first Marlins rookie starter to work at least 7.0 innings and allow two or fewer hits since Justin Nicolino on September 26, 2015 vs. Atlanta (7.0 ip, 2 h). He became just the 15th pitcher in Club history to do so (22nd time).
- Allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in each of his six starts after returning to New Orleans. Tossed a career-high 7.1 innings against Round Rock in his first game back, on May 1. Struck out nine batters in that game, a Minor League season-high that he tied on May 26 at Iowa. Posted 37 strikeouts against just four walks with the Baby Cakes.
- Recalled from New Orleans prior to his start on June 7 at St. Louis. Is 2-3, 5.18 (24.1/14) in five starts since his return, with 19 strikeouts to eight walks. Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in four of those outings, but exception was a six-run outing over 3.1 innings on June 17 at Baltimore.
- Is 0-2, 12.91 (7.2/11) in two Interleague starts this season.
- In his start on June 23 at Colorado, picked up a win after tossing 6.0 innings, allowing just one run on three hits and two walks, with eight strikeouts (tied for third-most strikeouts at Coors Field by a starter in Club history).
- Road ERA stands at 6.08 (26.2/18), while home ERA is 3.80 (21.1/9). Allowed career-high six runs in road start at Milwaukee on April 20; tied that mark, and set a new high with six earned runs, on June 17 at Baltimore.
- On April 8 at Philadelphia, surrendered three runs, six hits, and three walks, with two strikeouts, over 4.0 innings.
- Took loss in debut MLB debut vs. Boston, allowing five runs on eight hits and a walk, while striking out five, over 4.1 innings. Surrendered just two hits over first three innings, but was touched for three runs in fourth and two in fifth, leaving with one out and a runner on first.
- In 2017, split second affiliated and third professional season between Single-A Jupiter (13 games, 11 starts) and Double-A Jacksonville (14 starts). Combined to go 12-11 with a 2.53 ERA (146.0 ip/41 er) overall and earned Marlins' Minor League Pitcher of the Year honors.
- Led all Marlins farmhands in strikeouts (158), ranked second in wins, ERA and WHIP (1.03), and fifth in innings pitched.
- Opened campaign at Jupiter, going 7-4, 2.17 (70.2/17) to earn Florida State League Midseason All-Star honors.
- Set career high with 11 strikeouts on June 2 at Dunedin, when he allowed just one hit and no walks over 6.0 shutout innings, earning FSL Pitcher of the Week honors for May 29-June 4.
- Did not appear in FSL All-Star Game due to starting three days prior (June 14) at St. Lucie, his final start with Jupiter before June 21 promotion to Jumbo Shrimp.
- Tossed at least 6.0 innings in seven of last nine starts for Hammerheads, including 6.1 on May 27 vs. Bradenton, his season-high with Jupiter.
- Posted 3-0 record with 0.53 ERA (17.0/1) over final three starts with Jupiter.
- Won first start with Jacksonville, on June 23 at Jackson (5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, hr, 3 bb, 3 so).

- José Ureña will return from the disabled list tomorrow afternoon to make Miami's Fourth of July start against the Rays, closing out a 10-day, 10-game homestand for the Marlins.
- Was placed on 10-day DL on June 21 with right shoulder impingement, following his start at San Francisco the previous day (L, 5.2 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 5 so).
- In his start prior to that outing in SF, he fired off 8.0 shutout innings on June 15 at Baltimore to pick up his second win of the season (3 h, bb, 4 so, hb). It was his fourth career game tossing at least 8.0 innings, and fell 0.2 inning shy of his career-long outing. Also threw a career-high 112 pitches.
- This will be his first career start against the Rays; has made six career relief appearances against them, posting a 1.59 ERA (5.2 ip/1 er). They are the last team he faced out of the 'pen (on May 4) before moving to the rotation full-time on May 7 last season.
- Is 5-2 with a 3.14 ERA (57.1/20) in 15 appearances (eight starts) in Interleague Play in his career. He is 5-2, 3.40 (47.2/18) in the starts.
- Has a five-decision winning streak over his last six IL starts, with a 3.75 ERA (36.0/15) in that time.
