2017:

- **The Totals** – Combined to hit .228 (90x395) with 63 runs, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 10 home runs, 35 RBI and 33 stolen bases in 114 games with Los Angeles-AL and Houston.
- **Off to the Races** – Ranked 2nd in the American League with 33 stolen bases...went 33-for-41 (80.5%) in steal attempts, 10th-best in the AL.
- **Career Year** – Equaled his career-high with 10 home runs...his 33 stolen bases were 2nd-most in his career (40, 2011 w/SD).
- **DL Stint** – Had 2 separate stints on the 10-day disabled list for separate injuries...side-lined with a left oblique contusion from June 1-9...out from July 19 – Aug. 7, 2017, with a sprained right knee; appeared in 2 games on a rehab assignment with AAA Salt Lake.
- **Speedy** – Recorded a career-high 4 stolen bases on June 9 at Houston with the Angels... finished the game going 3-for-4 with 4 runs, 1 walk and 4 steals, one of 11 players in Major League history to match that line...marked the first 4-steal game in the American League since Rajai Davis swiped 4 bags on July 28, 2013 vs. Houston with Toronto.
- **High Five** – Set a career-high with 5 hits on May 16 vs. Chicago-AL with the Angels...3 of his 5 hits were doubles, also a career-best.
- **Walk Before You Run** – Drew 3 walks and had 3 stolen bases on May 14 vs. Detroit with the Angels...was the only player in the Majors in 2017 with 3 walks and 3 steals in a game.
- **First Things First** – Hit 3 leadoff home runs: May 23 at Tampa Bay, June 17 vs. Kansas City and June 22 at New York-AL...his homer in June 17 vs. the Royals marked his 50th career home run.
- **Halos Recap** – Began the season with the Angels, batting .235 (79x336) with 57 runs, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 22 RBI and 29 steals in 93 games.
- **On the Move** – Claimed off waivers by Houston from Los Angeles-AL on Aug. 31.
- **Astros Report** – Over 21 games with Houston, hit .186 (11x59) with 6 runs, 1 double, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 13 RBI and 4 steals.
- **Postseason Run** – In 6 postseason games with Houston, went 2-for-7 (.286) with 2 runs, 1 walk and 1 stolen base.

2005: Selected by the Tigers with the 10th overall pick in the MLB First-Year Player Draft out of T.C. Roberson HS (Asheville, NC) and signed with Detroit on Sept. 23...did not play that season...named the No. 3 prospect in the Tigers organization by *Baseball America* after the season.

2006: Named the Tigers Minor League Player of the Year after ranking 5th in the Midwest League in batting for Low-A West Michigan...hit .304 (117x385) with 59 runs, 20 doubles, 6 triples, 9 home runs, 69 RBI, 27 stolen bases, 50 walks, a .387 on-base percentage and a .457 slugging percentage (.844 OPS) in 101 games with West Michigan...in 9 postseason games in the Midwest League playoffs, hit .343 (12x35) with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run and 6 RBI...named to the Midwest League Postseason All-Star team, in addition to being named the league's top prospect...selected to *Baseball America's* Low-A All-Star Team...following the season, tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Tigers top prospect and the No. 2 prospect in the Midwest League...selected to participate in the All-Star Futures Game.

- 2007:** Broke into the Major Leagues at the age of 20...made his Big League debut on Aug. 17 at New York-AL after being selected from AA Erie prior to the game; became the youngest player to debut for the Tigers since Alan Trammell (19) in 1977...collected both his first career Major League hit and first home run on Aug. 18 against Roger Clemens; singled in the 3rd inning and belted a solo home run in 5th inning...appeared in 24 games with the Tigers, batting .143 (7x49) with 8 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 2 RBI...made stops with 3 minor league clubs, hitting a combined .316 (102x323) in 91 games...began the season with High-A Lakeland, where he hit .304 (90x296) with 58 runs, 14 doubles, 5 triples, 10 home runs, 44 RBI, 43 walks, 25 stolen bases, a .393 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging percentage (.879 OPS) in 83 games...sidelined from July 12-30 with a right shoulder subluxation and appeared in 2 games on a rehab assignment with the GCL Tigers, where he went 4-for-7 (.571)...promoted to AA Erie on Aug. 9 and went on to hit .400 (8x20) with 9 runs, 1 double, 4 home runs, 8 RBI and 6 walks in 6 games...selected to Florida State League's Midseason and Postseason All-Star squads with Lakeland... named the No. 2 prospect in the Florida State League by Baseball America following the season...appeared in 9 games with Peoria in the Arizona Fall League... ..selected to participate in the All-Star Futures Game for the 2nd year in a row.
- 2008:** Acquired by Miami on Dec. 4, 2007 in a blockbuster, 8-player trade that saw Maybin and Andrew Miller go from the Tigers to the Marlins, along with 4 others, in exchange for Miguel Cabrera and Dontrelle Willis going to the Tigers...spent most of the season with AA Carolina, where he was named to the Southern League Midseason All-Star Team...in 108 games with Carolina, hit .277 (108x390) with 73 runs, 15 doubles, 8 triples, 13 home runs, 49 RBI, 60 walks, 21 stolen bases, a .375 on-base percentage and a .456 slugging percentage (.831 OPS)...among Southern League leaders, ranked T2nd in home runs, 3rd in runs and 5th in triples...appeared in 8 Southern League postseason games, batting .273 (9x33) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 11 RBI...recalled by the Marlins on Sept. 16 and went on to bat .500 (16x32) with 9 runs, 2 doubles, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 4 stolen bases in 8 games...had 4 hits in back-to-back games, Sept. 18-19, becoming the 2nd rookie in the previous 20 seasons with consecutive 4-hit games (also: Todd Helton, 1998)...reached base safely in 10 consecutive plate appearances, Sept. 17-19, equaling the club record.
- 2009:** Named to his first career Opening Day roster, appearing in 54 games with the Marlins...hit .250 (44x176) with 30 runs, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 4 home runs and 13 RBI in his 3rd Major League season...optioned to AAA New Orleans on May 10, where he hit .319 (95x298) with 44 runs, 18 doubles, 8 triples, 3 home runs, 39 RBI, 38 walks, 8 stolen bases, a .399 on-base percentage and a .463 slugging mark (.862 OPS) in 82 games... recalled by the Marlins on August 31 and went on to bat .293 (27x92) with 19 runs, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs and 10 RBI in 28 games over the final month of the season.
- 2010:** After earning a spot on his 2nd consecutive Opening Day roster, hit .234 (68x291) with 46 runs, 7 doubles, 3 triples, 8 home runs, 28 RBI, 24 walks and 9 stolen bases in 82 games with the Marlins...hit his first career inside-the-park home run on May 31 vs. Milwaukee...optioned to AAA New Orleans on June 17, where he hit .338 (44x130) with 21 runs, 6 doubles, 2 triples, 4 home runs and 23 RBI in 33 games...sidelined from July 2-27 with a left shoulder strain...appeared in 3 games on a rehab assignment with GCL Marlins, batting .364 (4x11) with 1 double, 1 home run and 5 RBI...recalled by the Marlins on August 24 and went on to hit safely in 6 straight games and 12 of his first 15 games.
- 2011:** Acquired by San Diego in an offseason trade that sent Edward Mujica (rhp) and Ryan Webb (rhp) to the Marlins...unanimously selected as the Padres MVP by the San Diego chapter of the BBWAA...recorded a career-high 40 stolen bases, tied for 2nd-most in the National League...had 37 infield hits, 3rd-most in the NL...in 137 games with the Padres, hit .264 (136x516) with 82 runs, 24 doubles, 8 triple, 9 home runs, 40 RBI, 44 walks and 40 steals...on Opening Day (3/31) at St. Louis, hit a game-tying solo home run in the top of the 9th inning as the Padres went on to win, 5-3 in 11 innings...had back-to-back 4-hit games on May 11 (at MIL) and May 13 (at COL), joining Tony Gwynn and Reggie Sanders as the only Padres at the time to match that feat...belted 2 home runs on May 13 at Colorado, his first career multi-homer game...on the 15-day disabled list, June 1-13, with patellar tendinitis in his right knee; appeared in 3 games on a rehab assignment with AAA Tucson...was successful in 21 consecutive stolen base attempts, May 19 - Aug. 8...had a stolen base in a Padres club record 6 consecutive games, July 19-24...Named NL Player

of the Week for July 18-24 after batting .538 (14x26) with 8 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 8 stolen bases...in 26 games in the month of July, hit .315 (34x108) with 18 runs, 5 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 9 RBI and 14 stolen bases...established a career-high with a 10-game hitting streak, July 14-24, batting .422 (19x45) with 11 runs, 1 double, 1 home run and 6 RBI; has since recorded two 10-game hitting streaks and one 17-game hitting streak spanning two seasons.

2012: Appeared in a career-high 147 games with the Padres, batting .243 (123x507) with 67 runs, 20 doubles, 5 triples, 8 home runs, 45 RBI, 44 walks and 26 stolen bases...finished 4th in NL Rawlings Gold Glove voting among center fielders...on July 2 at Arizona, belted a 485-foot home run...had a pair of 4-hit games: Aug. 19 vs. San Francisco and Aug. 21 vs. Pittsburgh...from Aug. 19 - Sept. 25, hit safely in 25 of 30 games at a .387 (43x111) clip.

2013: Made the start in center field on Opening Day (4/1) at New York-NL, his 5th consecutive Opening Day start...totaled only 29 games between the Padres and AAA Tucson due to injuries...in 14 games with the Padres, hit .157 (8x51) with 7 runs, 1 double, 1 home run and 5 RBI...had 2 stints on the 15-day disabled list: April 17 - June 6 (right wrist impingement) and June 12 - Sept. 30 (strained left knee)...appeared in 15 games over 2 rehab assignments with AAA Tucson, where he hit .261 (12x46) with 7 runs, 1 double, 4 home runs and 5 RBI...underwent arthroscopic on his right wrist on Sept. 6.

2014: Hit .235 (59x251) with 24 runs, 13 doubles, 4 triples, 1 home run, 15 RBI and 19 walks in 95 games with the Padres...committed just 2 errors, with his first error coming on Sept. 8 at Los Angeles-NL...it marked his first error since May 18, 2012 vs. Los Angeles-AL, snapping a streak of 189 games and 1,499.2 innings without an error...on the 15-day disabled list, March 29 - April 27, with a ruptured left biceps tendon...recorded his first career walk-off hit, an RBI-single in the bottom of the 11th inning on June 7 vs. Washington...on the restricted list, July 23 - Aug. 20, for a violation of Joint Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...in 15 games over two rehab assignments with AAA El Paso, hit .264 (14x53) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 6 RBI and 6 walks...played in 9 games with the Toros of the Dominican Winter League, batting .324 (11x34) with 5 runs, 3 doubles and 2 RBI.

2015: Acquired by the Braves along with 3 other players in a trade that sent Craig Kimbrel (rhp) and Melvin Upton Jr. (of) to the Padres on April 5...in 141 games with the Braves, hit .267 (135x505) with 65 runs, 18 doubles, 2 triples, 10 home runs, 59 RBI, 45 walks and 23 stolen bases...marked his first double-digit home run season...his 59 RBI were a career-high...with runners in scoring position, hit .356 (42x118), 7th-best in the Major Leagues...in 25 games in the month of June, hit .314 (32x102) with 12 runs, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 14 RBI...hit his first career walk-off home run on Aug. 16 vs. Arizona...equaled a single-season career-high by hitting safely in 10 straight games, July 1-10, batting .375 (15x40) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs and 8 RBI...recorded at least 2 hits in a career-high 5 consecutive games on 2 occasions: June 3-8 and Aug. 12-17.

2016: Joined his 3rd Major League club in 3 years as he was acquired by Detroit on Nov. 20, 2015 in a trade that sent Ian Krol (rhp) and Gabe Speier (lhp) to the Braves...posted a career-best .315 (110x349) average in 94 games with the Tigers...tallied 65 runs, 14 doubles, 5 triples, 4 home runs, 43 RBI, 36 walks and 15 stolen bases...was 1 of 6 players in the Major Leagues to bat at least .315 and record at least 15 stolen bases, joining Jose Altuve, Mookie Betts, Charlie Blackmon, Jean Segura and Mike Trout...missed the first 38 games of the season while on the 15-day disabled list, April 3 - May 16, with a fractured left wrist...his .315 average from May 16 through the end of the season was 7th-best in the American League (min. .350 PA)...named AL Co-Player of the Week, May 16-22, after batting .600 (12x20) with 5 runs, 1 home run and 5 RBI...in 53 home games, hit .374 (73x195)...with runners in scoring position, hit 380 (27x72), 2nd-best in the Majors (min. 75 PA)...on the 15-day disabled list, Aug. 10-21, with a sprained left thumb...combined for 27 games on rehab assignments with high-A Lakeland (4 G) and AAA Toledo (23 G)...acquired by Los Angeles-AL in exchange for Victor Alcantara (rhp) on Nov. 3, 2016.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Made his postseason debut in 2017, appearing in 6 games with the Astros...in 2 games against the Red Sox in the ALDS, scored 1 run...started Game 3 of the ALCS at New York-AL and went 1-for-3 with 1 walk...made 3 appearances in the World Series against the Dodgers...entered Game 2 as a defensive replacement before singling, stealing 2nd base and scoring on George Springer's go-ahead home run in the 11th inning.
