AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 4-3 on their nine-game, 10-day road trip...are 1-0 in their three-game series at Minnesota...won 2-of-3 at Seattle after losing 2-of-3 at Oakland...following an off day Thursday, return to the Bronx for their final homestand of the season, incl. 3G vs. Toronto (Fri.-Sun.), 3G vs. Boston (9/18-20) and 3G vs. Baltimore (9/21-23).

- Are 6-6 in their last 12G, but are 15-8 in their last 23G and 22-12 in 34G since 8/6...are 81-45 since 4/21.
- At 90-54 (.625), are tied with Houston (90-54, .625) for the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (98-46, .681)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records for 117 of the last 131 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- Are 36G over .500, tying their season-high watermark (fifth time, first since they were 89-53 at the end of play on Saturday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10...have not reached 37G over .500 since they finished the 2009 season with a 103-59 record (44G over .500).
- Are 8.0G behind Boston in the AL East...lead Oakland by 3.0G for the first AL Wild Card spot.
- Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road (are 4-3 so far).
- Have lost just 9-of-43 series since 4/19 (26-9-8).
- Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (57-9, .864)...have the second-best record when scoring first (63-13, .829) behind Boston (65-13, .833).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won the opener of their three-game series at Minnesota on Monday, 7-2...scored 6R and sent 12 men to the plate in the seventh...**LHP J.A. Happ** threw 6.0 scoreless innings (6H, 0BB, 3K, 1WP) to earn his 16th win...**C Gary Sánchez** (3-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 1RBI) had his first multi-hit game since 6/20 vs. Seattle and his first game with at least 3H since going 4-for-5 on 5/19 at Kansas City...has homered in two of his last 4G...**RF Andrew McCutchen** (1-for-2, 1R, 1RBI, 3BB, 1SF) reached base four times...**3B Miguel Andújar** (1-for-6, 1R) hit a two-run double in the sixth, his 40th double of the season.
Went 5-for-17 with RISP, their most ABs with RISP since 7/11 at Baltimore (4-for-17)...tied a season high with 14LOB.

WALK THIS WAY: Yankees batters tied a season high with 10BB on Mon. at Minnesota (also had 10BB on 7/7 at Toronto)...have an AL-high 181BB in 49G since the All-Star break, second in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL, 201BB).
OF Aaron Hicks leads the Majors with 41BB since the All-Star break...**OF Andrew McCutchen** has 8BB in his last 6G...the two combined to draw 5BB on Monday.

EARNING HIS PINSTRIPES: **LHP J.A. Happ** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in Monday's win at Minnesota...is 6-0 with a 2.70 ERA (46.2IP, 14ER) in his first eight starts as a Yankee...is tied with Tampa Bay's Blake Snell for the Majors' best record since he joined the team on 7/29.
Is the first pitcher to win his first six decisions as a Yankee since Dellin Betances started his career 9-0 from 2011-15...is the first starter to do so since Masahiro Tanaka began his Major League career 6-0 in 2014.
At 16-6, is tied for fifth in the Majors in wins.
The Yankees are 12-3 in the 15G started by either Happ or fellow trade deadline acquisition **RHP Lance Lynn**.

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 23-9 (.719) vs. the AL Central this season...are 27-9 in their last 36G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 56-28 (.667) outside the AL East and 34-26 (.567) vs. the AL East.
Are 83-48 (.634) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015.

TWIN KILLING: The Yankees have won eight consecutive games against the Twins (since 9/18/17)...is tied for their longest winning streak over one opponent since the start of 2014 (also 8-0 vs. Minnesota from 7/25/15-6/18/16)...their last longer winning streak by one team was a 10-game streak vs. Toronto from 4/25-8/22/13.
Are 19-4 vs. Minnesota since 7/25/15.
Are 5-0 vs. Minnesota in 2018...have not swept a season series against an AL opponent since going 7-0 vs. Minnesota in 2009.

BEAN COUNTING: Any combination of 11 Boston wins or Yankees losses will eliminate the possibility of the Yankees winning the AL East...in the AL Wild Card race, the Yankees have magic numbers (Yankees wins or opp. losses) to clinch better records than the following teams: Houston (19), Oakland (16), Seattle (9) and Tampa Bay (9)...will secure a postseason berth by clinching a better record than two of these teams.

I LOVE THE 90's: With their 90th win on Monday at Minnesota, the Yankees have secured their second consecutive 90-win season after winning fewer than 90 games in each season from 2013-16.
Reached 90 wins in their 144th game, their quickest to the mark since they started 90-50 in 2009.
With their next win, will match their 2017 win total (91-71)...are on pace to finish 101-61, which would be their best record since going 103-59 in 2009.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 233HR...is the sixth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 262HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
Have homered in 16-of-18 games since 8/24 (31HR total)...have hit 58HR in the last 34G (since 8/6).

JUST DÚIT: **3B Miguel Andújar** hit a two-run double on Mon. at Minnesota, his 40th double of the season...is tied for sixth-most in the Majors...is tied with Bob Meusel (1920) for third-most by a Yankee rookie in a season, trailing only Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936) and Hideki Matsui (42 in 2003)...is the first 40-double season by a Yankee since Robinson Canó had 41 in 2013.
Joins Joe DiMaggio (1936) as the only rookies in Yankees history to hit at least 40 doubles and 20HR in a season...joins the Dodgers' Corey Seager (2016) as the only rookies to accomplish the feat in the last 12 seasons (since 2007).
Has 42 doubles through 137 career games, tied for 10th-most in Major League history through 137G...his 67XBH through 137G are third-most in Yankees history (DiMaggio-88, Meusel-70).
Leads Major League rookies in BA (.298), hits (151), doubles, RBI (79), XBH (65) and OPS (.852)...is tied with **Gleyber Torres** for the AL rookie lead with 23HR.

GLEYSER DAY: **INF Gleyber Torres** has reached safely multiple times in 15 of his last 22G (since 8/18), batting .359/.440/.551 (28-for-78) with 10R, 5HR, 17RBI, 12BB and 2SB...has nine multi-hit games in that span.

PITCHING IN: Yankees pitchers had just 6K on Mon. at Minnesota, snapping their Major League-record streak of 24 consecutive games with at least 8K (8/15-9/9).
Did not issue a walk on Monday for the first time since 7/25 at Tampa Bay.
Have a 1.80 ERA (35.0IP, 7ER) in their last 4G...have permitted just 1HR in their last 5G.
Have allowed a total of 6R in their last five wins.

SONNY DAYS: Since moving to the bullpen after his 8/1 start, **RHP Sonny Gray** is 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA (19.2IP, 19H, 4ER, 7BB, 17K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP) in six appearances (one start).

CARDINAL RULE: **RHP Chad Green's** next appearance will mark his 100th career relief outing...has a 1.94 ERA (143.2IP, 31ER) in his first 99 games out of the bullpen...only three active pitchers with at least 100 relief appearances have a career relief ERA under 2.00: **Zach Britton** (1.84), Craig Kimbrel (1.86) and Richard Bleier (1.97).

ROAD TRIPPIN': The Yankees are 4-3 on their nine-game road trip...are 12-4 in their last 16 road games (since 8/6)...are 42-30 (.583) this season, the fifth-best road record in the Majors.
Have clinched a winning road record for the first time since 2015 (42-39)...are tied for their most road wins since going 44-37 in 2012.
Of their 16 road games this month, 13 are against teams with winning records...are 4-3 so far (3-3 vs. teams above .500).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 11, 2009: Derek Jeter breaks Lou Gehrig's all-time franchise mark of 2,721 hits with a leadoff single off Baltimore's Chris Tillman in the third inning at Yankee Stadium. Gehrig had held the mark since 9/6/37.

Sept. 11, 1995: In a 4-0 win at Cleveland's Jacobs Field, the Yankees record zero assists in a game of at least nine innings for the only time in franchise history. The Indians ground out twice, with 1B Don Mattingly recording an unassisted putout each time.

Sept. 11, 1988: The Yankees defeat the Tigers in 18 innings, 5-4. After neither team scores from innings 8-17, the Tigers take a 4-3 lead in the top of the 18th, only to have Claudell Washington follow with a two-run, "walk-off" homer for the Yankees.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 12, 1996: Bernie Williams hits a home run from both sides of the plate and drives in eight runs in the Yankees' 12-3 win at Tiger Stadium. Of the 14 Yankees to homer from both sides of the plate, Williams is the only one to record at least 8RBI in such a game.

YANKEES at MINNESOTA TWINS

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 5-0 through the first five of 7G vs. the Twins in 2018...are 19-4 in the last 23G since 7/25/15...have won seven of their last eight series (since 7/3/14)...are 55-21 (.724) against the Twins since 2008, their best record vs. any AL club over the last 11 seasons...are 83-31 since 2002...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have won 12 consecutive season series (2007-18)...have won or split 17 consecutive season series vs. the Twins, going 15-0-2 since 2002 (went 3-3 in 2005 and 2006)...marks their longest active streak of non-losing season series vs. any AL opponent...**AT TARGET FIELD:** Are 1-0 at Target Field this year...went 1-2 at Target Field in 2017, snapping a streak of eight consecutive road series wins in Minnesota (2009-16)...are 21-8 (.724) since it opened in 2010, their best record at any current AL ballpark and the best mark at Target Field by a visiting AL club (second: Tampa Bay, .667, 22-11)...are 39-19 at Minnesota since 2002.

AS A STARTER: Tonight will be his first start since earning the win on 8/25-G2 at Baltimore (6.1IP, 3H, 0R, 1BB, 7K, 1WP)...is 9-8 with a 5.24 ERA (110.0IP, 64ER) in 22 starts this season...is the 10th-highest ERA as a starter among Major League pitchers with at least 20 starts in 2018.

- ✦ Won three straight starts for the first time as a Yankee from 7/11-26, posting a 1.10 ERA (16.1IP, 2ER).
- ✦ Has scoreless starts in three-of-five starts (since 7/11).
