TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 3 (0-2)** of the Reds' first road trip of the **2018 championship season** that includes 4 games here in Pittsburgh (**0-2**) and 3 games in Philadelphia...the Reds opened the season at Great American Ball Park, playing 4 of their regularly-scheduled 5 games against the Nationals (**0-3**) and Cubs (**1-0**)...the Reds return to GABP next Thursday for a 4-game homestand against the Cardinals (4/12-4/15).

POSTPONED TWICE: The Reds were **rained out twice** during their season-opening homestand, first on **Opening Day vs Wsh** and then on **Tuesday vs Chi**...it marked the first time since **6/11 & 6/12, 1985** at Riverfront Stadium (vs LAD) that the Reds endured **2 weather-related postponements** in the same homestand...Tue's rainout vs the Cubs will be made up as part of a day/night doubleheader at GABP on **5/19 at 1:10**...fans holding tickets for Tue's game may present their same ticket for the rescheduled 1:10 game on 5/19 with no exchange necessary...for more information fans are encouraged to visit **reds.com/rainout**...last Thursday's **postponement** was the first for the Reds on **Opening Day** because of **inclement weather** since the first 3 games of the **1966 season vs the Mets** all were rained out...the 2018 season-opener was rescheduled and played the following day (Wsh beat Cin, 6-5)...there have been a total of **15 postponements** in the **16 seasons** at Great American Ball Park

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs last night allowed **14 runs** to the Pirates for the first time since losing to them **14-10** on **5/27/07** in Cincinnati...Cin went **13-6 vs Pit** last season, including **7-3 at Great American Ball Park** and **6-3 at PNC Park**...was their first **13-win season vs Pit** since **2009** (13-5)...Cin won **8** of last season's **first 9 meetings** and each of the **last 3 games**...the **6-0 loss** on **8/3** snapped the Reds' **8-game winning streak** at **PNC Park**, their longest winning streak here and 1 shy of their longest winning streak ever in **Pittsburgh** (9g, 6/17/80-5/13/82 & 5/23/86-5/31/87)... **Reds vs Pirates** information is on media guide **Page 327**.

YELLOW, BLACK & BLUE: Over the past 6 seasons, including this one, **Reds pitchers** hit **64 Pirates batters** (including **20** in **2016**, **10** in **2017** and **1** in **2018**), the most by any Major League staff against any opponent...in that same span, **Pirates pitchers** hit **52 Reds batters** (including **9** in **2016** and **7** in **2017**), tied for third most vs any opponent (Cubs hit 52 Cardinals batters while the Mariners hit 57 Rangers batters)...from 2013-2017, **Pirates pitchers** led the Major Leagues in number of batters **hit by a pitch** with **359**, followed by the **Reds (348)** and **White Sox (327)**.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: Of the Reds' **18 runs** this season, **10** were scored in innings **8-9**...**Joey Votto** needs just **3 walks** to reach **1,000** in his career...he has agreed to donate his **batting helmet** to the **National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum** in Cooperstown...**RHP Tyler Mahle** on Mon vs Chi at **23 years & 185 days** became the **youngest** pitcher to record a win this season in the Major Leagues...he remains the youngest **starting** pitcher to earn a victory this season but Det's **Joe Jimenez (23 years, 78 days)** earned the win in relief Fri night at CWS.

YOUNGSTERS: The Reds' **Opening Day roster** included **5 rookies:** **RHP Tyler Mahle**, **RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **OF Philp Ervin** and **OF Jesse Winker**...it also included **21 players age 30 and under**, **17 players age 27 and under** and **11 players age 25 & under**...**Weiss**, who was optioned to Class AAA Louisville the day after **Opening Day** to make room on the roster for **RHP Yovani Gallardo**, was the only player on the **Opening Day roster** without a **Major League appearance**...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, the average age for the Reds' **25-man Opening Day roster (27 years, 196 days)** was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the **Phillies (26.334)** and ahead of the **Marlins (27.351)**...in **2017**, the Reds began a season with **7 rookies** on their **Opening Day roster** for the first time in researchable history, per **Elias**...last year's **Opening Day Reds roster** was the youngest in the Major Leagues (**26.355**).

ROOKIE ARMS: The Reds' **Opening Day** pitching staff included rookie starter **RHP Tyler Mahle** along with rookie relievers **RHP Jackson Stephens** and **RHP Zack Weiss**...**Weiss** last Saturday was optioned to Class AAA Louisville to make room on the roster for **RHP Yovani Gallardo**, who was signed to a 1-year contract...**Stephens** was optioned to Louisville on Sunday, when **RHP Raisel Iglesias** came off the 3-day disabled list...over the last 4 seasons, including 2018, **rookie pitchers** started **252** of the Reds' **492 games (51%)**, including a club record **110 games** in 2015, **56 games** in 2016 and **84 games** last season...during **Bryan Price's** 5-year tenure as manager, including 2018, rookie pitchers have started **260** of Cin's **654 games (40%)**.

IRON MAN: Since **Ivan De Jesus Jr.** started at first base on **9/2/2016 vs StL**, **Joey Votto** has started each of the Reds' **last 196 games**...in 2017 **Votto** became only the **fourth player** in franchise history to **start at least 162 games** in a season, joining **Pete Rose (1965, 163gs in 1974, 1975)**, **Leo Cardenas (163gs in 1964)** and **Vada Pinson (1963)**...**Votto's** is the Major Leagues' **second-longest active streak** of starts in his team's games behind Royals **SS Alcides Escobar (337g)**, who was the only other player in 2017 to start all of his team's games (162g).

LOU GEHRIG AWARD: Last week, **Joey Votto** was announced as winner of this year's **Lou Gehrig Memorial Award**, presented annually to a Major League Baseball player who best exemplifies the giving character of Hall of Famer **Lou Gehrig**...the award, sponsored by **Phi Delta Theta** international fraternity, headquartered in Oxford, Ohio, first was presented in 1955 and is permanently maintained at the **National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum** in Cooperstown...**Gehrig** was a member of that fraternity's **Columbia University** chapter...other Reds players to win the award were **Pete Rose (1969)**, **Johnny Bench (1975)**, **Barry Larkin (1994)** and **Danny Graves (2002)**...other past recipients include **Stan Musial, Ernie Banks, Hank Aaron, Harmon Killebrew, Willie Stargell, Lou Brock, George Brett, Ozzie Smith, Cal Ripken Jr., Tony Gwynn, Albert Pujols** and **Derek Jeter**.

THE SKIPPER...: **Bryan Price** is in his fifth season as a Major League manager...the Reds went **76-86** in his inaugural 2014 season, **64-98** in 2015, **68-94** in 2016, **68-94** last year and **1-5** so far in 2018...before he became manager, **Price** spent the previous 4 seasons on **Dusty Baker's** staff as pitching coach.

RED HOTS

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his second start of the season...is his fourth career appearance vs the Pirates...in 2017, in his Major League debut made 16 starts during 3 stints with the Reds...made spot starts in April and in early July before joining the rotation for good after the All-Star break...during the second half led Reds pitchers in innings (79.0) while tying Homer Bailey for the staff lead in starts (14)...in his last 8 starts of the season for the Reds went 3-3, 3.17 with 4 quality starts...overall after the All-Star break went 4-7, 4.44 in his 14 starts...the Reds went 7-9 in his 16 starts.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

RED HOTS

Tyler Mahle's last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow will make his second start of the 2018 season...will be his third career appearance vs the Pirates...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster (RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin, OF Jesse Winker)** and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...in 2017 was a *Baseball America* Minor League All-Star, MLB Pipeline.com's Reds Minor League Pitcher of the Year, the organization's Minor League Pitcher of the year and a mid-season Southern League All-Star...in his Major League debut, from 8/27-9/13 made all his 4 starts for the Reds...spent most of the season at Pensacola and Louisville, where he combined to finish **10-7, 2.06 in 24 starts** (144.1ip, 109h, 30bb, 138k, 9hr)...led the organization in ERA while ranking T3rd in wins and fourth in strikeouts...among all minor league pitchers ranked eighth in ERA and sixth in WHIP (0.96)...when promoted to Louisville on 6/22 led the Southern League in innings pitched and WHIP (0.87) while ranking among the leaders in ERA (2nd), strikeouts (2nd), opponents' BA (.190, 2nd) and wins (3rd)...in a 1-0 win at Mobile on 4/22 threw the **first perfect game** Blue Wahoos history and the **second 9-inning perfect game** in Southern League history (8/14/1970, Montgomery's Charles Swanson vs Savannah).
