AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin an eight-game road trip tonight in Washington (2G, tonight-Wed.)...after Thursday's off day, will play 3G at Kansas City (Fri.-Sun.) and 3G at Texas (5/21-23)...completed a nine-game homestand at 7-2 (3-0 vs. Cleveland, 2-1 vs. Boston, 2-1 vs. Oakland).

- ▶ At 28-12 (.700), **are a half-game ahead of Boston (28-13) for the Majors' best record**...is the latest in a season they have had sole possession of the Majors' best record since the end of play on 7/27/12 (60-39).
- ▶ Trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 11-11, the Yankees are 19-3).
- ▶ Are 16G over .500, tying their season high watermark (also 16G over at the end of play on 5/9)...with a win tonight, would mark the earliest in a season to get to 17G over .500 since they were 23-6 at the end of play on 5/2/03.
- ▶ **At 28-12, have matched the 1994 season as their second-best 40-game start** over the last 60 seasons since 1959 (went 31-9 to start 1998)...with a win tonight, would join the 1998 team (31-10) as the only Yankees teams in that span to start 29-12 or better through 41 games.
- ▶ Their +65 run diff. is third in MLB (Houston, +90; Boston, +66).
- ▶ **Are 11-9 vs. the AL East and 17-3 vs. all other divisions.**

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees won the rubber game of a three-game home series vs. Oakland on Sunday, 6-2...led, 3-0, after the first inning...**RHP Luis Severino** (6.0IP, 5H, 1ER, 2BB, 7K) started and earned his sixth win...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (4-for-4, 1R, 1 double) matched a season high with 4H, including a two-run single in the first and solo HR in the fifth...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 1RBI, 1BB) extended his RBI streak to seven games...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-4, 2RBI) collected multiple RBI for the second time since 4/17...**Yankees relievers** extended their hitless, scoreless streak to 8.0 innings before **LHP Chasen Shreve** allowed a solo HR in the ninth.

STANTON ISLAND: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** went 4-for-4 with a two-run single, a single, a solo HR and a double in Sunday's win vs. Oakland...was his second 4-for-4 game this season, becoming the seventh Yankee since 1908 to go 4-for-4 or better twice in the team's first 40 games of a season, the first since Alfonso Soriano in 2001.

- ▶ Is hitting .342/.444/.842 (13-for-38) with 8R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 11RBI and 6BB in his last 11 games (since 5/2)...has raised his season BA to .252, his highest mark since the end of play on 4/12 (.259).
- ▶ Overall, is hitting .252/.339/.516 with 10HR and 26RBI in 40G this season...through 40G in 2017, hit .263/.339/.533 with 11HR and 27RBI.
- ▶ **Has 999 career hits, including 499 extra-base hits** (211 doubles, 11 triples, 277HR)...according to *Elias*, **has the third-most XBHs through 1,000 career hits in Major League history** (Babe Ruth-517, Adam Dunn-507)...has hit double-digit HRs in all nine seasons of his career (2010-18)...in that span, his 277HR are second-most in the Majors to Edwin Encarnacion (278HR).
- ▶ Is 28 years, 188 days old today...with his first XBH on this trip, will be the fourth-youngest player to debut since 2000 to reach 500 extra-base hits (Albert Pujols, 26.208 at the time of his 500th XBH; Miguel Cabrera, 27.040; Prince Fielder, 28.141).
- ▶ **Is 10-for-13 (.769) with 1 double, 5HR and 2BB vs. left-handed pitching in his last 16G**...overall, is hitting .457/.487/1.171 (16-for-35) with 10XBH vs. LHP this season (2 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR)...**leads the Majors in slugging vs. lefties** and is second in home runs.
- ▶ Is 6-for-31 (.194) with 0HR lifetime vs. Gio Gonzalez, his seventh-most ABs vs. any pitcher in his career, and his most vs. any pitcher off whom he has not hit a HR.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Yankees **have won seven consecutive series** (since 4/19) for the first time since 6/10-7/3/11...their last winning streak of at least eight straight series was a nine-series winning streak from 7/20-8/20/98 (note: they also won eight straight "series" from 6/10-29/03, however, this counts the 4G Subway Series with the Mets that included a two-stadium doubleheader as three series).

FOUR SCORE: OF Aaron Judge (11HR), **INF Didi Gregorius** (10HR), **C Gary Sánchez** (10HR) and **OF Giancarlo Stanton** (10HR) **are the first quartet of teammates in Yankees history to hit at least 10HR in the team's first 40 games of a season**...prior to 2018, no more than two Yankees had even done it in the same year.

- ▶ Are the first team with four players with at least 10HR through 40 games since Texas in 2003 (Juan González-13, Carl Everett-13, Alex Rodriguez-11, Rafael Palmeiro-10).

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge has 14RBI during his seven-game RBI streak, tied for the longest RBI streak of his career (7G, 9/24-30/17)...is tied with Atlanta's Nick Markakis, Oakland's Jed Lowrie and Los Angeles-AL's Justin Upton (current) for the longest RBI streak in the Majors this season.

- ▶ Is fifth in the Majors with 35RBI this season, trailing Baltimore's Manny Machado (38RBI), Chicago-NL's Javier Baez (36RBI) and Oakland's Khris Davis (36RBI) and Jed Lowrie (36RBI).
- ▶ Hit .353/.488/.794 (12-for-34) with 8R, 3 doubles, 4HR, 16RBI and 9BB in 9G on the homestand.
- ▶ Is second in the Majors with a .440 OBP, trailing only Mike Trout (.448).
- ▶ Is third in the Majors with 34BB this season, trailing Bryce Harper (41) and Mike Trout (35)...is the third Yankee since 1990 to draw at least 34BB through the team's first 40G, joining Jason Giambi (41BB in 2006) and Kevin Maas (40BB in 1991).

ROAD WARRIORS: Tonight marks the start of a stretch where the Yankees will play 19-of-25 games on the road.

- ▶ Are 7-1 in their last eight road games...are 10-5 (.667) on the road in 2018, tied for the fourth-best mark in the Majors...are 19-11 in 30 road games since 8/22/17.
- ▶ Are 3-1-1 in their first five road series, winning their last three...are 7-2-1 in 10 road series since 8/22/17.

NATIONAL PASTIME: The Yankees play their second Interleague series of the season tonight and tomorrow in Washington...split a 2G set vs. Miami from 4/16-17.

- ▶ Went 15-5 vs. the National League in 2017, **setting a club record for most Interleague wins in a single season**.
- ▶ Went 7-3 in NL parks in 2017, winning six of their final 7G.
- ▶ At 227-157 (.591), have the second-best record and second-most wins all-time in Interleague play (Boston, 229-156, .595).

BACK IN BUSINESS: The Yankees are 19-3 since 4/21, 4.5G better than any other team in the Majors over the stretch (next best: Atlanta, 14-7)...no other team has gone 19-3 over a 22-game stretch this season...prior to 2018, had not compiled such a 22-game stretch since going 19-3 from 4/17-5/13/98.

- ▶ Have outscored opponents, 132-68, and out-homered opponents, 31-21.
- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.88 ERA (200.0IP, 158H, 68R/64ER, 62BB, 221K, 21HR) over the span.
- ▶ **Yankees starters** have a 2.98 ERA (126.2IP, 42ER) during the stretch...allowed three-or-more runs just seven times while permitting 1R-or-fewer in 11-of-22 starts.
- ▶ **Yankees batters** have averaged 6.00 runs per game over the stretch, hitting .249/.336/.442 as a team with 132R, 45 doubles, 2 triples, 31HR and 98BB.

SUPER CY'S MATCHUP: **LHP CC Sabathia's** start opposite Washington's **Max Scherzer** on Wednesday marks the seventh game in the Majors this season pitting two former Cy Young Award-winning starting pitchers against each other: Corey Kluber (CLE) vs. Felix Hernandez (SEA) on 3/29; Bartolo Colón (TEX) vs. Justin Verlander (HOU) on 4/15; Max Scherzer (WAS) vs. Clayton Kershaw (LAD) on 4/20; Zack Greinke (ARI) vs. Jake Arrieta (PHI) on 4/25; Colón vs. Rick Porcello (BOS) on 5/4; Scherzer vs. Arrieta on 5/6.

- ▶ **In two starts vs. former Cy Young Award winners in 2017, Sabathia went 2-0 and tossed 14.0 shutout innings**, defeating Boston's Rick Porcello on 6/7 at Yankee Stadium (8.0IP, 5H, 0BB, 5K) and on 7/16-G1 at Fenway Park (6.0IP, 2H, 5BB, 3K).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 15, 1941: Joe DiMaggio's 56-game hitting streak begins with a single off Eddie Smith in a 13-1 loss vs. Chicago at Yankee Stadium.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 16, 2006: The Yankees tie a franchise record by overcoming a nine-run deficit vs. Texas to win, 14-13, in nine innings. Jorge Posada hits a two-run, "walk-off" home run off Akinori Otsuka.

May 16, 1957: The Yankees celebrate Billy Martin's 29th birthday in a raucous fashion. An ensuing fight at Manhattan's Copacabana Club leads to \$5,500 in fines and the eventual trade of Martin to Kansas City.

May 16, 1932: The Yankees shut out their opponent for the fourth consecutive game, defeating Cleveland, 8-0, at Yankee Stadium.

THURSDAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 17, 2010: Trailing 9-7 heading into the bottom of the ninth, Alex Rodriguez ties the game with a two-run homer off Red Sox closer Jonathan Papelbon before Marcus Thames wins it with a two-out, two-run, "walk-off" homer for an 11-9 Yankees win.

May 17, 2002: Jason Giambi hits a "walk-off" grand slam, giving the Yankees a 13-12 victory over Minnesota. The clubs combine for 40 hits (20 each) in a game that lasts 5 hours and 45 minutes, as Bernie Williams homers from both sides of the plate.

YANKEE DOODLES

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 28-12

- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
- According to *Elias*, joins his father, Bob, as the third father-son duo to both serve as Major League managers, joining George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner... Bob Boone spent parts of six seasons as a Major League skipper.
- With his grandfather (Ray), father (Bob) and older brother (Bret), is part of the first family in Baseball history to produce three generations of Major League players.

#41 MIGUEL ANDÚJAR—INF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 6G/7G

- Leads all Major League rookies in extra-base hits (16) and multi-hit games (13) and ranks second in hits (37).
- In last 26 games (since 4/13), is hitting .330 (34-for-103) with 17R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR and 11RBI.
- Was 2-for-4 with 1R and 1SB in Sunday's win vs. Oakland and has hit safely in six straight games...has 6H in last 15AB...**on homestand** was 10-for-36 (.278) with 7R, 2RBI, 1BB and 1SB in 9GS (8-3B/1-DH)...hit "walk-off" RBI single in the ninth and was 2-for-5 with 2R in 5/4 win vs. Cleveland...was his first career "walk-off" hit...at 23 years, 63 days old, became the second-youngest Yankee with a "walk-off" hit since 2010 (Clint Frazier, 22y, 305d on 7/8/17 v. Milwaukee)...Gleyber Torres (21 years, 144 days) hit a "walk-off" HR on 5/6.
- Hit solo HR—the first of his Major League career—in the ninth and was 2-for-4 with 1 double in 4/17 loss vs. Miami...was 4-for-4 with 1R, 2 doubles and 1RBI in 4/22 win vs. Toronto, setting a career high in hits...at 23 years, 51 days old, was the youngest Yankee to have at least 4H in a game since Melky Cabrera (21y, 292d) on 5/30/06 at Detroit.
- Had at least one extra-base hit in seven straight games from 4/13-23 (8 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR), collecting multiple XBH in five of those games...was the second-youngest Yankee in franchise history with at least 1XBH in seven straight games (DiMaggio, 7G, 6/4-11/37, ending at age 22y, 198d according to *Elias*).
- Is in his first stint with the Yankees this season (4/1-present).
- Saw his first Major League action in 2017, hitting .571 (4-for-7) with 2 doubles and 4RBI in 5G with the Yankees...won the 2017 Kevin Lawn Award, presented annually to the organization's minor league "Player of the Year" after leading all Yankees farmhands in BA (.315) and doubles (36), ranking third in RBI (82) and tying for fourth with a career-high 16HR in 125G w/ Double-A Trenton and Triple-A Scranton/WB.
- Is the Yankees' No. 5 prospect (No. 59 in Baseball) according to *Baseball America*.
- Was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 2, 2011.

#26 TYLER AUSTIN—1B Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/5G

- Is tied for the lead among AL rookies with 5HR and 16RBI, ranks second with 11XBH and is third with 13R.
 - Was 0-for-4 in Sunday's win vs. Oakland and is hitless in last 23AB...**on homestand** was 0-for-12 with 1R and 1BB in 3GS (2-1B/1-DH).
 - Was ejected in the top of the seventh inning of 4/11 win at Boston after being hit by pitch (by Kelly) and charging the mound (first career ejection)...served a four-game suspension for the incident from 4/27-30.
 - Of his 12 career HR, 10 have tied the game (3) or given the Yankees the lead (7).
 - Played in 20G with the Yankees in 2017...spent more than three months on the D.L. (3/30-6/5, fractured left ankle and 6/29-8/11, right hamstring strain).
 - Was selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft.
- Career Bests:** 3H (1x); 2HR (1x); 4RBI (1x); 2R (3x); 1SB (2x); 5G hitting streak (2x)

#11 BRETT GARDNER—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 3G/4G

- Has at least 1R in a season-high five straight games (scored just 1R in previous 8G).
- Was 2-for-5 with 1R in Sunday's win vs. Oakland and has reached base safely in 10 of his last 15PA (5H, 5BB)...**on homestand** was 11-for-37 (.297) with 8R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 6RBI, 8BB, 2SB, 1SF and 1HP in 9GS in LF...was 3-for-5 with 3R, 2 doubles, 1 triple and 2RBI in Wednesday's win vs. Boston, tying his career high with 3XBH (fifth time, first since 5/2/17 vs. Toronto: 1 double, 2HR)...was his first 3H game since 9/19/17 vs. Minnesota and his first game with multiple extra-base hits since 9/27/17 vs. Tampa Bay (2 doubles)...was his first multi-hit game since 4/16 vs. Miami.
- Set career highs with 21HR and a .428 slugging pct. in 2017, becoming the fifth Yankee to hit 20HR from the leadoff spot in a single season (seventh time).
- Has seven seasons with at least 20SB (2009-11, '13-15, '17), the third-most 20SB seasons in Yankees history behind Derek Jeter and Hal Chase (eight each).
- Is the Yankees' longest-tenured player...was selected by the club in the third round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut in 2008...is one of five players drafted by the Yankees to collect at least 1,000 hits with the club (also Thurman Munson, Don Mattingly, Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada).

#18 DIDI GREGORIUS—SS Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/9G

- Was 0-for-4 with 1R and 1BB in Sunday's win vs. Oakland...snapped an 0-for-30 stretch with a fifth-inning single on Saturday vs. Oakland...was the longest hitless stretch by a Yankee since Russell Martin went 0-for-30 in 2012...**on homestand** was 1-for-35 with 2R, 1RBI, 3BB and 1SB in 8GS at SS.
- Hit game-winning solo HR (#10) in the 10th and was 3-for-5 with 2R and 1 double on 4/27 at Los Angeles-AL...was his first career extra-inning homer.
- Was named the April AL "Player of the Month," his first career monthly award...hit 10HR with 30RBI in April, both marking single-month career highs...were the third-most RBI in April in franchise history (since RBI became official in 1920), trailing only Tino Martinez (34 in 1997) and Alex Rodriguez (34 in 2007)...was the fourth Yankee with at least 10HR in April (Rodriguez-14HR in April 2007, Graig Nettles-11HR in April 1974 and Aaron Judge-10HR in April 2017)...during the month, led the Majors in home runs and RBI, ranked second in slugging pct. (.739) and tied for fifth in runs scored (22)...was also named AL "Player of the Week" for 4/23-29, his first career weekly award.
- Became the first Yankees SS to homer in four straight games from 4/22-25.
- Has two multi-HR games as a shortstop this season, tied for the single-season franchise record (Jeter-2004, Smalley-1982, Kubek-1960, Crosetti-1936).
- Had career highs with 73R, 25HR and 87RBI (in 534AB) in 2017 and set a single-season HR record by a Yankees SS (Jeter, 24HR in 1999)...with 20HR in 2016, is the first Yankees SS ever with consecutive 20HR seasons.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Arizona in a three-team trade on 12/5/14 in which Detroit acquired RHP Shane Greene from the Yankees and Arizona acquired LHP Robbie Ray and INF Domingo Leyba from Detroit.

#31 AARON HICKS—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 2G/3G

- Was 1-for-4 with 2RBI and 1SB in Sunday's win vs. Oakland...has 8H in last 38AB...**on homestand** was 5-for-31 (.161) with 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 4RBI, 3BB, 2SB and 1SF in 8GS in CF.
- Hit two-run inside-the-park HR (#1) and solo HR (#2) in 4/13 win at Detroit...was his first career inside-the-park HR...was his fourth career multi-HR game.
- Was placed on the 10-day D.L. from 3/30-4/12 with a right intercostal muscle strain (missed 11G)...went 2-for-6 in two rehab starts in CF with Triple-A Scranton/WB.
- Set single-season career highs with 54R, 18 doubles, 15HR, 52RBI and 51BB in 88 games with the Yankees in 2017...missed two months of the season on the disabled list with a right oblique strain (6/26-8/10) and left oblique strain (9/3-25).
- Of his 25HR since joining the Yankees in 2016, 19 have been hit at Yankee Stadium.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Minnesota for C John Ryan Murphy on 11/11/15.

#99 AARON JUDGE—OF Current/Season-High Hitting Streak: 7G/12G

- Hit his 67th career home run in his 221st career game (Saturday vs. Oakland), tied with Rudy York for the most homers through 221G in Baseball history.
- Is fifth in the Majors with 35RBI...has at least 1RBI in each of his last 7G (14 total RBI), tying the longest RBI streak of his career (also 7G: 9/24-30/17).
