HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 6-2 in their last 8 games.
- ♦ The D-backs are 5-3 in their last 8 games at AT&T Park.
- ♦ Among all teams since May 28, the D-backs rank in home runs (1st, 15), slugging pct. (3rd, .498), OPS (4th, .831), runs (6th, 48), walks (T-7th, 29) and on-base pct. (1th, .333).
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** has allowed 1 run in each of his starts as a D-back, May 20 @ Mets (5.0 IP), May 26 @ A's (6.0 IP) and June 1 vs. Marlins (7.0 I P)...his lone start vs. Giants was on June 26, 2010 @ AT&T Park (1.0 IP, 0 ER) [left in the top of the second inning with a left hamstring strain suffered running the bases].
- ♦ **Ketel Marte**, in his last 8 games, is batting .370 (10-for-27)/.393 OBP/1.319 OPS with 5 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 8 RBI, 1 walk.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit safely in 9 of his last 11 games at a .310 clip (13-for-42)/.396 OBP/1.015 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 7 RBI, 1 hit by pitch and 5 walks.
- ♦ **Jarrold Dyson**, in his last 7 games, is hitting .333 (7-for-21)/.462 OBP with 5 walks.
- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has 9 straight scoreless appearances (13.1 IP) vs. Giants with 18 strikeouts (12.15 K/9) [7 H, 7 BB].

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won, 3-2, @ Giants.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** (6-2) outdueled Madison Bumgarner allowing 1 run in 6.1 innings with 7 strikeouts...Corbin escaped a bases-loaded jam with no outs in the fifth inning by striking out the 8-9-1 hitters.
 - Corbin, in 3 career starts vs. Madison Bumgarner (1 @ AT&T Park), is 2-1 with a 1.96 ERA (4 ER in 18.1 IP) [also: May 11, 2012 @ Chase Field & July 19, 2015 @ Chase Field].
- ♦ **Chris Owings** was 2-for-4 with a double and a RBI...**Kristopher Negrón** went 1-for-2 with a RBI.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 3-for-4 with a double.
- ♦ **Andrew Chafin** (0.1 IP), **Yoshihisa Hirano** (0.1) and **Archie Bradley** (1.0) combined to throw 1.2 shutout innings.

- ♦ Arizona has a .500-or-better record for 222 consecutive games since Opening Day 2017 (April 2, 2017), the third-longest streak in team history behind 333 games from April 19, 1999-April 6, 2001 and 305 games from April 21, 2001-Sept. 29, 2002.

BUCHHOLZ FAVORITE NUMBER IS 1

- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** is the first pitcher in team history to have outings of 5.0+ innings pitched and 1 or fewer runs allowed in each of his first 3 starts with the team.
- ♦ Is the first pitcher in D-backs history to allow 1 or fewer runs in each of his first 3 starts with the team...overall, his streak of 3 straight starts with 1 run or less is tied for the 15th longest by a D-back all-time:

- ♦ **Ketel Marte's** last 8 hits have gone for extra bases...starting with May 29, he's had a double, homer, homer, triple, double, triple, double, double.
- ♦ Marte's streak is the longest by a D-back since Chris Herrmann's 8 in a row from May 2-June 11, 2017...the franchise record is 10 extra-base hits in a row: Chris Iannetta (May 12-June 8, 2017), Paul Goldschmidt (May 7-21, 2014), Luis Gonzalez (April 7-20, 2006) and Steve Finley (September 4-9, 1999) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

WHEN LEADING AFTER 8.0 INNINGS

- ♦ The D-backs are 29-0 when leading after 8.0 innings, the NL's best record and Majors' third-best record...9 teams remain undefeated when leading after 8.0 innings: Mariners (34-0), Yankees (32-0), D-backs (29-0), A's (27-0), Giants (27-0), Rangers (20-0), Reds (19-0), Royals (17-0) and Orioles (16-0).

BULLISH-PEN

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 10.2 inning scoreless streak (13 G) since May 6 is tied for the fourth best active streak in the NL...has a .167 (6-for-36) opp. average and 11 strikeouts (6 H, 4 BB-1 IBB).
- ♦ **Brad Boxberger's** 93.3 save percentage (14-of-15) is tied for second in the NL with Brandon Morrow/CHI behind Sean Dolittle/WSH (93.8, 15-of-16)...has held the opposition scoreless in 11 of his last 13 games with a 1.46 ERA (2 ER in 12.1 IP), .156 opponent average (7-for-45) and 17 strikeouts (12.41 K/9).
- ♦ **Andrew Chafin** has not allowed a run in 16 of his last 17 games (1 ER in 10.1 IP).

GOLDY RACKING UP BASES SINCE 2013

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt's** 1,559 total bases since 2013 are second among current NL players behind Nolan Arenado/COL (1,593) and ahead of Evan Longoria/TB-SF (1,516), Anthony Rizzo/CHI (1,516) and Andrew McCutchen/PIT-SF (1,492) [source: STATS].

DOUBLE THE FIRST NAMES, DOUBLE THE POP

- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** has hit safely in 14 of 18 starts, batting .288 (21-for-73) with 4 doubles, 8 homers, 17 RBI and 3 walks.
- ♦ His average of a home run every 11.38 at-bats (8 HR/91 AB) is fourth in the Majors (min. 75 PA) behind Mookie Betts/BOS (10.82), Matt Adams (10.85) and J.D. Martinez (11.15) and ahead of Bryce Harper/WSH (11.50) and Mike Trout/LAA (11.53).

TRIPLE THE FUN

- ♦ The D-backs' 20 triples are tied for the most in the Majors with the Pirates, ahead of the Cubs (19) and White Sox (18).

ON THE REHAB FRONT

- ♦ **Randall Delgado** made his first rehab appearance last night for Single-A Adv. Visalia...he got the win in relief, working 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 hit and 2 strikeouts @ Modesto.
- ♦ **Shelby Miller** will make his third rehab appearance on June 10, second with Double-A Jackson.
 - Rehab 2 - June 4 with Double-A Jackson: in 4.2 innings, allowed 1 run on 4 hits and 4 walks with 6 strikeouts [79 pitches, 52 strikes] vs. Tennessee (Cubs).
 - Rehab 1 - May 29 with Single-A Adv. Visalia: in 5.0 innings, allowed 1 run on 4 hits (0 BB) with 8 strikeouts [65 pitches, 52 strikes] @ San Jose (Giants).

ON DECK: ROCKIES

- ♦ The D-backs took 2 of 3 vs. Rockies during the season-opening series, March 29-31...the D-backs are 4-1 in their last 5 games vs. Rockies, 9-3 in their last 12 games (since July 1, 2017) and 11-4 in their last 15 games (since June 21, 2017).

FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GREINKE (4-4, 3.44)

- ♦ In his last start, got a 6-2 win vs. Marlins, allowing 1 run in 6.2 innings (7 H, 1 BB, 6 K).
- ♦ In his last 7 starts (5 quality) since April 30, is 2-2 with a 2.49 ERA (12 ER in 43.1 IP), .216 opponent average (35-for-162) and 46 strikeouts...has allowed 1 run 4 times, 2 runs twice.
- ♦ In his last 3 starts vs. Rockies, is 1-0 with a 2.29 ERA.

BUCHHOLZ AT A GLANCE

- ◆ In his 12th Major League season...signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4.
- ◆ Is a 2-time AL All-Star (2010, '13).
- ◆ Member of 2 Red Sox World Championship clubs (2007, '13).
- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Finished sixth in the 2010 AL Cy Young voting, going 17-7 with a 2.33 ERA.
- ◆ Selected by Boston in the supplemental first round (42nd overall) in 2005 as compensation for Pedro Martinez leaving as a free agent.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Will be making his fourth start with the D-backs...has allowed 1 run in each of his first 3 starts, the first pitcher in D-backs history to allow 1 or fewer runs in each of his first 3 starts with the team.
- ◆ Has allowed just 12 baserunners over his first 3 starts with the D-backs, tied for the third fewest by a Major League pitcher since 1920

VS. GIANTS

- ◆ Has made 1 career start and appearance vs. Giants on June 26, 2010, leaving after the first inning with a strained left hamstring (0 ER, 1 hit).
- ◆ Is 3-1 with a 3.77 ERA (13 ER in 31.0 IP), 24 strikeouts and 8 walks in 8 games (6 starts) vs. NL West opponents...is 1-0 with a 0.96 ERA (1 ER in 9.1 IP) in 4 games (2 starts) vs. NL West opponents on the road.

BUCH'ING BASERUNNERS

- ◆ He has allowed just 12 baserunners over his first 3 starts with the D-backs, tied for the third fewest by a Major League pitcher since 1920 in his first 3 starts with a team (min. 18 starts) [source: STATS LLC]:

GETTING THE JOB DONE

- ◆ Is the first pitcher in D-backs history to allow 1 or fewer runs in each of his first 3 starts with the team.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Wore No. 11 in Boston because he was given the nickname "Sticks" as a kid for being skinny.
- ◆ Married to Lindsay, who was a former model on the TV show "Deal or No Deal" and featured in *People* magazine's "100 Most Beautiful People."
- ◆ Was introduced to his wife by Donald Trump at a 2008 UFC event in Anaheim, Calif...they were married at Trump National Golf Club in Palos Verdes, Calif. in 2009.
- ◆ Is a distant relative of former Major League pitcher, Taylor Buchholz...he pitched for the Astros (2006), Rockies (2007-08, '10), Blue Jays (2010) and Mets (2011).

ROAD REPORT

- ◆ Owns a career .613 winning pct. (46-29) on the road, compared to .514 at home (36-34).
- ◆ Since 2009, ranks second the Majors with a .682 winning pct. (45-22) on the road, behind only David Price (.688; 75-34).
- ◆ Is 4-1 with a 2.59 ERA (16 ER in 55.2 IP) in his last 12 road games (9 starts).

2018 MINOR LEAGUE REVIEW

- ◆ Was 1-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 ER in 27.2 IP) in 5 starts with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, Triple-A Omaha and Triple-A Reno.
- ◆ Limited opponents to a .216 average.

2017 REVIEW

- ◆ Made just 2 starts with the Phillies before suffering a straight right forearm.
- ◆ Underwent surgery to repair a torn flexor tendon on April 18.

NO-HITTER NOTES

- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
- ◆ Then-GM Theo Epstein spoke by phone with Terry Francona during the no-hitter, concerned about Buchholz's pitch count, who had not exceeded 98 in a game all season...Epstein said Buchholz would have been pulled if he reached 120, no-hitter or not, and finished with 115.
