### TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** lost to the Mariners today for their first home loss...the Twins are 4-3 in their last seven games against the Mariners...the Twins are now 2-3 in day games this season...the Twins went 4-for-9 with runners in scoring position, leaving nine men on base...the Twins are batting .228 (13-for-57) with RISP this season...allowed 10-plus runs for the first time since allowing 11 on September 20, 2017 at NYY.
- **WEATHER:** Today's first pitch temperature was 27 degrees, the coldest first pitch time in Twins home history...the previous being 31 degrees on April 17, 2014 (Game 1) vs. Toronto at Target Field.
- **JOSÉ BERRÍOS** allowed five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings with seven strikeouts...the five runs allowed are the most since he allowed five on September 4, 2017 at TB, a span of five starts...seven strikeouts are the most since that same start...it was his shortest start at Target Field since pitching 2.2 innings on September 11, 2016 vs. CLE, a span of 10 starts.
- **MIGUEL SANÓ** (1-for-2) walked three times in today's game, tying his career-high (also 4/21/16 and 4/13/17)...was the first time this season with multiple walks and the 28<sup>th</sup> time in his career...doubled in the sixth inning to drive in the Twins first run of the game and his eighth RBI of the season...is hitting .525 (32-for-61) with eight home runs in 18 career games vs. the M's.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (2-for-4) drove in the Twins second run with his second hit of the day, a sixth inning single...has a hit in seven straight games at Target Field, 10 of his last 11 games here and in 22 of his last 25 here, batting .359 (37-for-103) in those 25.
- **JOE MAUER** (2-for-4) doubled in the sixth inning to extend his on-base streak against the Mariners to 18 games...after a single in the seventh inning he is now six hits shy of 2,000 for his career...has a hit in all six of his games to begin the season, the longest season-beginning streak since hitting in eight straight with an at-bat to start 2010.
- **EDUARDO ESCOBAR** (1-for-4) drove in the Twins third run of the game with a sixth inning single...has a hit in all five of his games this season...in 15 career games against Seattle at Target Field is batting .375 (21-for-56) with nine RBI.
- **TYLER KINLEY** made his major league debut allowing one run in 1.0 inning.
- **RYAN LAMARRE** (1-for-1) collected his first career RBI with a run-scoring pinch-hit single in the ninth inning.

### MARINERS NOTES:

- **THE MARINERS** defeated Twins today, improving to 4-3...the Mariners scored five-or-more runs for the fourth time in their seven games this season...the M's are now 2-0 when Leake starts...since the start of 2017, Seattle is 5-4 against the Twins including 3-3 at Target Field...scored 10 runs for the first time since scoring 10 on September 14, 2017 at TEX.

- **MIKE LEAKE** allowed two runs on three hits in 5.0 innings with four walks and no strikeouts...was the shortest outing since going 3.0 innings August 20, 2017 at PIT...three hits allowed are fewest since also allowing three in 6.0 innings on June 20, 2017 at PHI...did not strikeout a batter for the first time since July 19, 2017 at NYM.
- **KYLE SEAGER** (2-for-5) collected his 1,000<sup>th</sup> hit with a single in the eighth inning off Zach Duke.
- **DEE GORDON** (1-for-5) extended his career-long season-beginning hit-streak to seven-games...10 of his 11 hits this season are singles...has a hit in six of his seven career games against the Twins, all coming at Target Field.
- **ROBINSON CANÓ** (1-for-2) has hit safely in each of his first seven games this season, the second longest season-beginning streak of his career behind his 10-game streak in 2010...since 2013 has hit safely in 29 of his last 34 games against the Twins.
- **ICHIRO SUZUKI** (2-for-3) extended his active hit-streak against the Twins to seven games, batting .452 (14-for-31).
- **JEAN SEGURA** (2-for-5) extended his current hit-streak to six games...has multiple hits in four of his last five games...in 16 career games against the Twins is batting .343 (23-for-67) including collecting at least one hit in 13 of the 16.
- **GUILLERMO HEREDIA** (1-for-1) hit his first home run of the season with a two-run shot in the eighth inning...was his eighth career home run and first since July 25, 2017 vs. BOS.
