TODAY'S FREEBIE—Upon entry to today's game, kids 14 years and under will receive a **Chris Archer & Kevin Kiermaier** Emoji T-Shirt, presented by Tampa General Hospital, while supplies last.

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY—Today is the annual league-wide celebration of **Jackie Robinson**...the Rays will commemorate the 71st anniversary of Robinson breaking baseball's color barrier in 1947 with on-field ceremonies...for the 10th consecutive year, Major League Baseball and the Rays will celebrate Jackie Robinson Day with all players and on-field personnel wearing Robinson's iconic uniform "No. 42" on their jerseys.

- + There will be additional on-field uniform elements, including a commemorative patch on all team caps and jersey sleeves, socks emblazoned with "42" and a brand new lightweight hooded fleece for batting practice and dugout wear, also featuring the "42" logo.
- + The game-worn No. 42 jerseys and caps will be available for auction at raysbaseball.com/auctions, with proceeds benefiting the Rays Baseball Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization, which focuses on youth and educational programming that make a measurable difference in the Tampa Bay region.

AUTOGRAPH SUNDAY—From 12:00-12:30 p.m. down the right field line, all fans have a chance to receive autographs from former Negro League players **Dennis Biddle** and **James Cobbin**...they will be joined by right-handed pitcher **Chris Archer** and first base coach **Ozzie Timmons**.

SCORING CHANGE—Official scorer **Jeff Lantz** has informed the Elias Sports Bureau of the following scoring change in last night's game...in the top of the 5th inning, catcher **Wilson Ramos** dropped a foul pop off the bat of **Rhys Hoskins**...Lantz has now given Ramos an error on the play, extending the at-bat...the run scored by Hoskins is now unearned.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost three consecutive games and are 3-11 (.214) this season, worst record in the AL and 2nd-worst in the majors, ahead of the 2-12 Reds (.143)...it is the worst 14-game start in franchise history, and the worst 14-game stretch at any point in the season since Aug 5-19, 2017 (3-11)...today the Rays continue a 3-team, 9-game home-stand against the Phillies (0-2), Rangers and Twins...the Rays are 1-5 at home, with their only win coming on Opening Day vs. BOS...the 5-game home losing streak is their longest since Aug 11-19, 2017 vs. CLE/SEA (5).

- + Yesterday's 9-4 loss marked the third time the Rays yielded 9 runs or more, tied with the Reds for the most in the majors...the 13 hits allowed were their most since Sep 24, 2017 at BAL (13)...the 6 runs allowed in the 2nd inning matched a season high for a frame.

NO BROOMS ALLOWED—The Rays need a win to avoid being swept for the third time this season (0-2 from April 3-4 at NYY and 0-3 from April 5-8 at BOS)...the Rays haven't been swept in a series of 3 games or more at home since July 21-23, 2017 vs. TEX (0-3)...they haven't been swept in an interleague series (home or away) since June 17-19, 2016 vs. SF (0-3).

RAYS vs. PHILLIES—This is the first series between the clubs since July 20-22, 2015 at PHI and first at home since June 23-25, 2009...this is the Rays ninth series all-time against them, and they have never been swept...the Rays are 15-11 all-time, including 6-5 at home...the Rays also played the Phillies in their only World Series app, losing 4-1 in 2008.

- + Only three uniformed personnel from when the Rays played the Phillies in the 2008 World Series remain with the club in some capacity...**Rocco Baldelli**, who homered in the decisive Game 5 loss, is now the major league field coordinator...assistant pitching coach **Brian Anderson** is now the TV color analyst on FOX Sports Sun...bullpen catcher **Scott Cursi** is now part of the clubhouse staff.

COMMON BOND—Five former Rays players have gone on to manage major league teams and three of those were hired this past offseason...among them are Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** (played for Rays in 2005) and Phillies skipper **Gabe Kapler** (2009-10)...the others are former White Sox/Marlins Manager **Ozzie Guillén** (2000), Mets skipper **Mickey Callaway** (1999, 2001) and Nationals Manager **Dave Martinez** (1998-2000).

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE—Today is the Rays third of 20 interleague games this season...they went 11-9 in interleague play last season and have only one losing interleague record in 10 seasons of the "Rays" era (7-

11 in 2010)...they are 110-82 (.573) since 2008—5th-best in the majors behind the Red Sox (.646), Rangers (.600), Yankees (.595) and Angels (.579)—and 184-186 all-time...the NL is 9-7 in interleague play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

ROTATION TRANSLATION—Prior to the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**, the Rays planned to open the season with four regular members of the starting rotation and a bullpen day as needed in place of a fifth starter...the Rays pitching staff currently has three starters and a 9-man bullpen, which includes today's starter **Ryan Yarbrough** and four other long relievers...this will be the fifth "bullpen day" of the season, and the previous four have resulted in a 0-1 record and 1.15 ERA (15.2-IP, 2-ER) for the starters...meanwhile, **Chris Archer** (4 starts), **Blake Snell** (3) and **Jake Faria** (3) have combined to go 2-3 with a 6.56 ERA (46.2-IP, 34-ER).

- + Yarbrough will be the 33rd different starting pitcher used by the Rays since 2008, fewest in the majors over that span...it will also extend the Rays streak of games started by a pitcher under the age of 30 to 575 straight, the longest current streak in the majors.

REDEFINING RELIEF—So far this season, Rays relievers have made:

- + 7 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors and passing their total from last season (6)...the other 29 teams have combined to do it 20 times, and the Tigers are next with 3 apps of this type;
- + 3 apps of at least 70 pitches, matching the combined total of the other 29 teams...prior to this season, no Rays reliever threw at least 70 pitches since **Chris Archer** on Sep 13, 2012 at BAL (79);
- + 5 apps of 4 IP or more, one shy of the combined total of the other 29 teams (6)...last season, only the Mariners (13), Tigers (6), Athletics (5) and Cubs (5) made as many relief apps of 4 IP or more;
- + 10 apps of 2 IP or more, 5th-most in the majors and 3rd in the AL

SEEKING LENGTH—Only twice this season has a Rays starter gone 6 IP or more...the Rays and Athletics are tied for the fewest number of starts of 6 IP, while the Rays are one of six teams without a start of at least 7 IP...last season, Rays starters went at least 6 IP in 88 of 162 games (54.3 pct.), tied for the 3rd-highest rate in the AL...there's been one "quality start" (6 IP or more, 3 ER or fewer) by the Rays this season, fewest in the majors.

- + **Chris Archer's** start of 4 IP last night was the sixth time this season a Rays starter went 4 IP or fewer, most in the majors...he yielded 6 runs on 6 hits in the 2nd inning...the 6 runs were a career high for a single frame and the most by a Ray in an inning since **Jake Odorizzi** on Sep 6, 2016 vs. BAL (6-run 4th).

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays offense is averaging 3.14 runs per game, 3rd-lowest in the majors and ahead of only the Reds (3.00) and Royals (3.00)...so far this season, the Rays offense has recorded:

- + 4 runs or fewer in 10 games, and they are 0-10...only the Rangers (11) and Royals (11) have scored 4 runs or fewer more often;
- + 3 runs or fewer in 9 games, tied for 3rd-most in the majors;
- + 2 runs or fewer in 8 games, most in the majors;
- + 4 hits or fewer in 4 games, tied for 3rd-most in the majors;
- + A season high of 7 runs (in a 10-7 loss on April 8 at BOS)...they are one of four teams in the majors without a game of at least 8 runs;
- + Through the first 14 games of the season, opposing starting pitchers have a 2.39 ERA (83-IP, 22-ER) against the Rays, including 10 starts yielding 2 ER or fewer

DOES NOT COMPUTE—The Rays are 2-6 (.250) when scoring first, tied with the Reds (1-3) for the lowest winning pct. in the majors when doing so...last season, the Rays went 52-30 (.634) when scoring first.

- + The Rays have held a lead in 10 of their 14 games...they have 7 losses after holding a lead, most in the majors...three times they have led in the 8th inning or later and gone on to lose.
- + The Rays have played a major-league-most 9 games decided by 1 run and have a major-league-most 7 losses in 1-run games.
- + The Rays are 0-6 when yielding 3 runs or fewer and 0-4 when yielding 2 runs or fewer, the only winless team in the majors when doing either...last season, the Rays were 53-16 (.768) and 40-6 (.870) when doing so, respectively...the 6 losses when yielding 3 runs or fewer are most in the majors, and 4 losses when yielding 2 runs or fewer are tied for most in the majors.

ROTATION TRANSLATION—Will be making his first career start...prior to the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**, the Rays planned to open the season with four regular members of the starting rotation and a bullpen day as needed in place of a fifth starter...the Rays pitching staff currently has three starters and a 9-man bullpen, which includes Yarbrough and four other long relievers...this will be the fifth "bullpen day" of the season, and the previous four have resulted in a 0-1 record and 1.15 ERA (15.2-IP, 2-ER) for the starters...he will become the 33rd different starting pitcher used by the Rays since 2008, fewest in the majors over that span...it will also extend the Rays streak of games started by a pitcher under the age of 30 to 575 straight, the longest current streak in the majors.

OVERVIEW—Has faced the Red Sox in all 3 apps this season, going 0-0 with a 2.25 ERA (8-IP, 2-ER)...was in line for the first win of his career on April 8 at BOS, before the Red Sox scored 6 runs in the 8th inning to win, 8-7...his only run allowed in 4 IP was a 5th-inning, 2-out RBI single to **Hanley Ramírez**...among his 3 apps this season are 2 apps of 4 IP—both ending at 73 pitches...prior to this season, no Rays reliever threw that many pitches since **Chris Archer** (79) did it on Sep 13, 2012 at BAL.

- + He became the first player since pitch count data is available (1999) to throw at least 70 pitches in relief twice within his team's first 9 games.
- + On April 5 at BOS, inherited 2-on, 1-out in the 12th inning and allowed a stolen base, **Andrew Benintendi** walk and **Hanley Ramírez** walk-off single in the 3-2 loss...it marked the first time in franchise history a pitcher was on the mound for a walk-off loss within the first 2 apps of his career.
- + Made his first career app on March 31 vs. BOS, and his 73 pitches were the 2nd-most in club history for a reliever making his major league debut, behind **David Price** (87) on Sep 14, 2008 at NYY...his app of 4 IP is tied for the 2nd-longest in club history for a reliever in his major league debut behind Price (87).

LAST SEASON—Spent his first season in the Rays organization with Triple-A Durham after being acquired from the Mariners in a trade involving **Drew Smyly**...his 13 wins, 26 starts, 157.1 IP and 159 SO were all career highs...ranked 2nd among Rays minor leaguers in strikeouts, behind **Brent Honeywell** (172)...tied for 2nd in wins, one shy of **José Mujica** (14)...ranked 3rd in innings and 8th with a 3.43 ERA.

- + Increased his strikeout total from 99 SO (6.94 SO/9 IP) with Double-A Jackson in 2016 to 159 SO (9.10 SO/9 IP) with the Bulls...according to FanGraphs, generated swings-and-misses on 14.0 pct. of his pitches, 2nd-highest in the International League behind teammate **Brent Honeywell** (14.3).
- + Led the IL in strikeouts, the second consecutive year and fifth time in seven seasons a Bulls pitcher was the league leader...tied for the IL lead in starts, ranked 2nd in wins, 3rd in innings, 4th in SO/9 IP, 5th in BB/9 IP and 8th in ERA.
- + Won both of his IL postseason starts...was the Game 1 starter in the IL Semifinals vs. Indianapolis (Pirates) and the Governors' Cup vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barres (Yankees)...was 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (13-IP, 2-ER)...also started the Triple-A National Championship Game against Memphis (Cardinals)...yielded 2 runs in 1.1 IP but got no-decision as the Bulls came back to win, 5-3.

LOCAL PRODUCT—Ryan grew up a Rays fan and kept some 2008 World Series gear in his bedroom of his Lakeland home, which he found after he was acquired in a four-player trade from the Mariners...he would often watch games in his bedroom, and his dad followed along as he worked in the garage...the two would sometimes meet in the middle of the house after the game's most pivotal moments.

- + His high school baseball coach encouraged him to find professionals to look up to...he admired **David Price**, **James Shields** and **Scott Kazmir** and still has a Kazmir jersey he received as a 15-year-old hanging in his closet.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (1-1, 3.60 ERA)

LAST START—On Tues at CWS, his only hit allowed in 6 IP was a ground-rule double off the bat of **Tyler Saladino** in the 5th inning, and his only run allowed was an RBI groundout to his next batter faced...recorded 10 SO, the second time in his career reaching double digits (13, Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL)...threw a career-high 114 pitches, and his pitch count by inning was 16-13-18-20-23-24...his line: W, 6 IP, 1 H, 1 R, 5 BB, 10 SO, 114/62...became:

- + the fifth pitcher (sixth occurrence) in Rays history to yield 1 hit or fewer while recording at least 10 SO...the last to do so before Snell was **Drew Smyly** on April 19, 2016 at BOS (8-IP, 1-H, 11-SO).

- + the first Ray to earn the win despite at least 5 BB since **Chris Archer** did it on May 16, 2014 at LAA (5-BB, won 3-0).
- + the fourth pitcher in Rays history to issue 5 BB or more while reaching double-digit strikeouts...also **Matt Moore** (June 25, 2013 vs. TOR; 6-BB, 11-SO), **James Shields** (July 26, 2012 at BAL; 5-BB, 10-SO) and **Matt Garza** (Sep 19, 2009 vs. TOR; 6-BB, 10-SO).

vs. MINNESOTA—Is 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (9.1-IP, 7-ER) and 14 SO in 2 starts against the Twins, both at home (Aug 5, 2016 and Sep 6, 2017).

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
