LEADING OFF: Halos play the final contest of a 10-game (5-4) home stand against Houston (1-2), White Sox (2-2) & Seattle (2-0)...Halos look to secure fifth sweep of season with win today...LAA has won four straight & five of seven...Club is 5-4 since the break, 11-11 this month, 13-12 last 25 games & 24-25 since June 1...Since ASB, LAA has outscored opponents 52-24 in their five victories (11+ runs in four of five wins)...Club is in fourth place, -13.0 in A.L. West (-8.0 for 2nd wild card)...LAA is 10-20 when a lefty starts (44-32 vs. RHS)... Following on off-day, LAA travels to Tampa Bay (7/31-8/2) &

FAST FACT: With his next HR, Mike Trout will join Willie Mays as only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign or younger (Trout would be first in A.L. history).

KNOW THIS: Since the break, Halos lead MLB with 42 extra-base hits, 26 doubles & 56 RBI while ranking second in MLB (PIT) with 58 runs and a .520 slugging pct.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: In 11-5 win, LAA tallied a season-best nine extra-base hits (2nd time in three games...Seven doubles are most since 8/12/10 at BAL...Francisco Arcia posted six RBI – 1st LAA rookie with 6+ RBI game since Adam Kennedy (8; 4/18/00 at TOR)... Arcia set an MLB record totaling 10 RBI in first two MLB games & tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games... First Angel with a HR in each of first two career contests...Mike Trout hit eighth career HR off F. Hernandez, most against any pitcher...lan Kinsler scored three runs for third time in six games.

WORTH THE WAIT: After toiling for 12 years in the minors, catcher Francisco Arcia made his MLB debut Thursday (2-4, R, HR, 4 RBI), first Angel with four RBI in big league debut (13th in A.L. history)... Last night, he posted two doubles, HR & six RBI...His 10 RBI thru first two career games are a Major League record, passing Joe Cunningham (9 in 1954 with St. Louis); previous fastest to 10 RBI was Trevor Story (11 RBI thru first 4 games)....Arcia is just second MLB player with 4+ RBI in each of first two career games (also Cunningham)...Story (HR in each of first 4 G) is only player with a HR streak longer than first two games.

LOOKING AHEAD: 17 of Angels' 28 games in August are on road... LAA will play seven interleague games next month (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI and 8/27-28 vs. COL)...Against divisional foes, LAA has 13 remaining games vs. Texas (6 at home, 7 on road), 10 against Houston (3 at home, 7 on road), nine against Oakland (6 at home, 3 on road) and four vs. Seattle (all at home).

BATS ARE HAPPENING: Since being held to one run across first two games of home stand, Angels have 57 runs in seven games since (8.1 per)...In the seven contests, LAA batting .313 (76/243) with 40 XBH (24 2B, 3B, 15 HR), including a .343 (23/67) clip with RISP.

HALL PASS: Today Vladimir Guerrero will become the first player inducted into the Hall of Fame as an Angel...He played six seasons with LAA (2004-09) batting .319 (1034/3237) with 194 doubles, 173 HRs & 616 RBI in 846 games...His .319 avg. is tops in franchise history...2004 A.L. MVP; .337, with 39 HRs, 126 RBI, league-leading 124 runs & a franchise-record 366 total bases.

THE NEW ME: In 33 games since returning from D.L., Kole Calhoun is batting .284 (33/116) with 25 runs, nine doubles, 11 HR & 26 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .201...In his last 14 games, hitting .333 (18/54) with 15 runs, six doubles, seven HR & 17 RBI.

FRUIT AND FISH: Mike Trout & Darryl Strawberry are only players with five seasons of 25 HR/ 20 SB by age 26 season-or-younger (no other A.L. player has ever recorded more than two such seasons before age 27)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB it will be his third campaign doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other by age 26-or-earlier).

NOT A FAN: Andrelton Simmons has struck out just 11 times since May 1 (288 PA; 1 K/26.18 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning, May 18-June 22...He leads MLB in PA per SO at 20.74 (394 PA/19 K)... Simmons also leads MLB batting .309 (38/123) with two strikes.

<u>Vs. MARINERS:</u> 2018 series is tied 7-7...Angels are 10-4 in last 14 home games vs. Seattle (three remaining matchups at Big A)...LAA is 105-80 vs. M's since 2009...Trout has hit safely in 13 of 14 meetings against Seattle this season, batting .453 (24/53) with 13 runs, six doubles, one triple, six HRS & 10 RBI (11 BB/7 IBB).

SHELVED: 22 players were placed on the disabled list in the first half (most in MLB)...Angels have 11 players currently on DL...Average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 33 games...On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)...52 players have appeared for LAA this season, most in MLB (franchise record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played for LAA (12 starters), most in team history thru 106 games (club-record 31 pitchers last season).

<u>MVP x 3?</u> Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in *Top 5 in MLB* in several offensive categories, including HR (3rd; 29), runs (3rd; 78), runs created (1st; 116), total bases (T4th; 225), times on base (1st; 215), walks (1st; 96), IBB (1st; 20), OBP (1st; .462), SLG (4th; .619), OPS (2rd; 1.084), OPS+ (1st; 197.0) and offensive WAR (7.1; 1st).

WALK TALK: Trout's 96 walks are most in club history through 106 games (club record for a season is 116 by Trout in 2016)...He is the first MLB player with at least 96 walks thru 106 games since Barry Bonds (145) in 2004...Trout is the first Angel with three 4+ walk games in a season...Just fourth player in A.L. history to have 20+ SB and 20+ IBB in a season, joining Ichiro Suzuki (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) and Reggie Jackson (1974).

GLOVE STORY: LAA's 54 errors are fourth-fewest in A.L. while Club ranks tied for third in circuit with .986 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB having turned 114 double plays...Catchers own a 45.2% caught stealing pct. (19 of 42), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...A. Simmons leads A.L. shortstops with 144 putouts and is tied for second-fewest errors (7; min. 90 GS)...Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.

<u>PITCHING POINTS:</u> Despite a 3.74 team ERA (644.2 IP – 268 ER) since May 6th (5th in A.L.), LAA has gone 34-39 in the span...3.85 team ERA on season ranks 5th in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.4% to score (37 of 181)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 106 affairs (4th in A.L. with 941 K)...Bullpen has logged 391.0 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...Halos have allowed 141 HRs, tied with KC for most in A.L.

THIS N' THAT: LAA has scored 57 runs over last seven games after recording 56 runs over previous 16 games...Angels' 145 HRs hit are second-most in MLB...Trout's 7.8 WAR leads all of baseball...Justin Upton is the only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...Mike Scioscia (1,624 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Shohei Ohtani is first Angel whose first nine career HRs came at home (all against RHP)...Just second rookie in A.L. history with each of first nine HR at home (1930 Bill Akers, Det.)...Eight of Ohtani's 12 hits in return from D.L. have gone for extra bases (5 2B, 3 HR)...Since his call-up in 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...Only two players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez (Pujols is 29 RBI shy).

HOT HALOS: lan Kinsler has hit in 10 of 12 games batting .422 (19/45) with 13 runs, two HR, five doubles & nine RBI...Tyler Skaggs has allowed one earned run or less in seven of his last eight starts (1.44 ERA; 50 IP - 8 ER) & has not allowed a HR in the eight-game span...His 1.44 ERA since June 3rd ranks second among all MLB starters (Chris Sale; 0.75 ERA)...Albert Pujols has eight extra-base hits (5 HR, 3 2B) & seven RBI his last 10 games...Andrew Heaney is 6-1 with a 1.60 ERA (62 IP - 11 ER) across last nine home starts...1.60 ERA at home since April 27 leads A.L...Has limited opponents to a .186 clip (41/220) during the stretch (14 BB/50 K)...Justin Upton has hit in 10 of 13 games batting .348 (16/46; 7 R, 2 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI)... Rookie David Fletcher has hit in seven of eight (four multi-hit games) batting .433(13/30) with seven runs, two doubles & four RBI.

<u>ALBERT ALERT:</u> Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,062 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...On Wednesday, he passed Ken Griffey Jr. (630 HR) for sole possession of sixth all-time in HRs (631)...He is one of four players all-time with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (H. Aaron, W. Mays & A. Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,971 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,283 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (W. Mays is 5th with 1,323 XBH)...11 hits shy of becoming 1 of 9 players all-time with 1,000 hit is each league.

<u>TAMPA BAY ON DECK:</u> Rays lead 2018 season series 3-1...Halos are just 2-10 in last 12 home games vs. Tampa Bay but 10-5 in last 15 games at Tropicana Field...Rays claimed 2017 season series 4-3... Angels haven't won a season series since 2014.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

July 29

(2008) Angels acquire Mark Teixeira from Atlanta in exchange for Casey Kotchman and Steven Marek...In 54 games LAA, Teixeira hits .358 (69/193) with 13 HR & 43 RBI; (1998) Garret Anderson breaks Rod Carew's club record for longest hit streak by hitting in his 26th consecutive game... Anderson's mark reached 28 games and remains the club record.

July 30

(2012) Kendrys Morales became the third player in MLB history to homer from both sides of the plate in same inning (6th inn at TEX; 2-run & slam). Morales also became the first Angel with six RBI in a single frame and second Halo ever with two HRS in one inning (Rick Reichardt, 4/30/66); (1988) Switch-hitter Chili Davis became the second Angel (Devon White) to homer from each side of the plate (at White Sox)...Davis would accomplish the feat five times as an Angel, the only player in team history to do it more than twice.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER - RHP FELIX PEÑA

1-1, 3.34 ERA

Has pitched to a 2.73 ERA (29.2 IP – 9 ER) since joining Angels rotation

- **IN THE ROTATION:** Making ninth appearance (seventh start) of the season for Angels; seventh outing (fifth start) of the season at home...First 38 big league outings came in relief before making first start on June 19 vs. Arizona...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on June 15 for third stint of season with Angels.
- WIN ANNIVERSARY: Earned first win as a starter on June 29 at Baltimore after working 5.1 scoreless innings...His only other Major League win came exactly one year earlier on June 29, 2017 in relief for Cubs at Washington.
- AS A STARTER: Since joining Angels rotation, has pitched to a 2.73 ERA (29.2 IP 9 ER) and has allowed threeor-fewer runs in all six starts...If he allows three-or-fewer runs today, would become seventh pitcher in Angels history to do so in each of first seven career starts.
- RISP: With runners in scoring position this season, opponents are batting .167 (4/24).
- RUN SUPPORT: Angels have scored just two total runs of support (while he is in the game) across his last three starts...Is averaging two runs of support per start this season, with half of that total coming on June 29 at
- FIRST HALF RECAP: Finished the first with a 1-0 record and 3.42 ERA (26.1 IP 10 ER) in seven games (five starts) for Angels.
- LAST TIME OUT: Charged with first loss of career in last start on Tuesday vs. White Sox after tossing six innings and allowing two earned runs on four hits with three walks and two strikeouts.
- WITH THE BEES: In 10 games (nine starts) this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-2 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP -13 ER)...Recorded 38 strikeouts with 16 walks...Did not allow a run in last 10.2 innings pitched for Salt Lake before being called up by Angels on June 15...The first batter he has faced of each inning with Salt Lake batted .091 (3/33).
- PREVIOUS HALOS STINTS: Made Angels debut on April 8 vs. A's (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Made one appearance for LAA during second stint with team on May 17 vs. Tampa bay (1.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 SO).
- DOMINICAN NATIVE: Is a native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...Is one of five Dominican pitcher to start a game for the Angels and the first since Ervin Santana in 2012; the other three are Bartolo Colon, Ramon Ortiz and Hector Carrasco.
- STARTER #11: With his first start on June 19, became 11th different starting pitcher for Angels this season...LAA has now used 12 different starters, which is tied for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 14).
- VS. MARINERS: Today marks first career appearance vs. Seattle.
- AT ANGEL STADIUM: In six games (four starts) at Angel Stadium, is 0-1 with a 4.30 ERA (23 IP 11 ER)...As a starter, is 0-0 with a 3.54 ERA (20.1 IP - 8 ER).
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Made 11 appearances for Angels in Spring Training and went 1-0 with one save, a 4.09 ERA (11 IP - 5 ER) and 17 strikeouts.
- $\underline{\textbf{2017 WITH THE CUBS:}}$ Appeared in 25 games for Cubs last season and went 1-0 with a 5.24 ERA (34.1 IP 20
- MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE: Pitched parts of last two seasons with Cubs, appearing in 36 total games and going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) and 52 strikeouts...Made Major League debut on Aug. 19, 2016 vs. Colorado.
- MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2013 (Southern League), 2014 (Florida State League) and 2015 (Midwest League).
- CAREER NOTES: Originally signed by Cubs as an international free agent...Acquired by Angels from Cubs for cash considerations or a player to be named later on Oct. 9, 2017.

LHP TYLER SKAGGS (8-6, 2.62 ERA)

Making 20th start of the season and 11th on the road... Second start of 2018 vs. Rays... Earned the win in last start on Wednesday vs. White Sox after tossing six innings and allowing two runs (one earned) on four hits with no walks and a season-high nine strikeouts...In his last eight starts, is 5-2 with a 1.44 ERA (50 IP – 8 ER)...In two career games vs. Tampa Bay, is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (12 IP – 6 ER)...Charged with loss in first start of the year vs. Rays on May 17 at Angel Stadium after tossing six earned runs and allowing one earned run (solo HR by C.J. Cron) on six hits with three walks and seven strikeouts.

IN THE 'PEN

#48 JOSÉ ÁLVAREZ (LHP)

AGE: 29

- Has pitched in five of nine games on the homestand...53 appearances lead the Majors this season.
- Has stranded 36 of 42 inherited runners this season...42 IR are the most in the Majors...85.7% stranded rate is sixth best in Majors.
- Retired first batter faced in 40 of 53 outings the year.
- Has allowed seven ER against the Astros this year (1 IP) and eight ER against all other opponents (41 IP).
