YESTERDAY'S RECAP

» The Indians began their 2018 Postseason journey with a 7-2 defeat yesterday afternoon at Minute Maid Park...marked their first loss in Game 1 of a full Postseason series since the 2007 ALCS against Boston

Game 1 of a full Postseason series since the 2007 ALCS against Boston (had won four consecutive Game 1s in the ALDS, ALCS & World Series).
» Cleveland was held to just three hits on the afternoon...after being held hitless through the first 5.0 innings, YAN GOMES (1-3) led off the top of the 6th with a single and scored the Tribe's first run on a wild pitch...JOSÉ RAMÍREZ (0-3) drove in Cleveland's second run on an RBI-groundout...FRANCISCO LINDOR (1-4) and MICHAEL BRANT-LEY (1-3) each singled to record the Indians' remaining base hits.
» COREY KLUBER was handed the loss, allowing four runs on six hits over 4.2 innings of work (2BB, 2K), including three solo homers...ADAM CIMBER made his Postseason debut with 1.0 scoreless inning, while TREVOR BAUER also tossed a scoreless frame in relief (2H, 1K).

THE ONLY WAY IS UP

"The ONLY WAY IS OP"

"The Indians' loss yesterday afternoon puts them 0-1 in the ALDS for the fourth time in 10 appearances...on two of those occasions (1997 vs. New York-AL, 1998 vs. Boston), the Tribe rallied to win those series.

"Including the 2013 Wild Card Game, the Indians hold a 9-13 record in the opening contests of Postseason series...Cleveland has gone on

to win five Postseason series after facing an 0-1 deficit, most recently in

w Cleveland holds an all-time franchise record of 14-6 (.700) in Game 2 of a Postseason series...the Tribe has won 10 of its last 11 Game 2s against American League opponents, including each of its last five such contests (dating back to the 2007 ALDS vs. New York-AL).

COOKIE'S TURN

» CARLOS CARRASCO enjoyed another strong season in the front of Cleveland's rotation, finishing the 2018 regular season 17-10 with a 3.38 ERA (8th in A.L.) and a career-high 231 strikeouts (4th in A.L.).

» This afternoon will mark Carrasco's second career Postseason start and appearance...after missing the 2016 playoffs with a broken right hand, the Tribe right-hander made his October debut in Game 3 of the 2017 ALDS at Yankee Stadium...took a no-decision, allowing just three hits (3BB, 7K) across 5.2 shutout innings in Cleveland's eventual 1-0 loss to the Yankees...matched COREY KLUBER (2016 ALDS Game 2) for the most strikeouts by an Indians pitcher in their Postseason debut.

» Carrasco went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (8ER/13.1IP) in two starts vs. Houston this season, and owns a career mark of 4-2 with a 3.45 ERA

(18ER/47.0IP) in seven career starts (eight appearances)...Carrasco is 2-1 with a 1.17 ERA (3ER/23.0IP) in three career starts at Minute Maid Park, including a two-hit shutout on September 17, 2014 (12K).

THE STORY OF OCTOBER | CLEVELAND POSTSEASON HISTORY Scleveland has gone 56-51 (.523) all-time in Postseason games, the 5th-highest winning pct. of any A.L. team since 1901 and 8th-highest by any team in the Majors...Cleveland's 107 Postseason games are 5th-most played by any A.L. team since 1901, 10th-most in the Majors. Cleveland's longest Postseason winning streak is 6 games (started 2016 PS 6-0, Oct. 6-17), while longest Postseason losing streak is 4 games, done three times (Sept. 29-Oct. 2, 1954 - 4G WS sweep; Oct. 18, 2007-Oct. 2, 2013; October 8, 2017-October 5, 2018 - active). Cleveland has appeared in the World Series on six separate occasions, winning titles in 1920 (5-2 over Brooklyn Robins) & 1948 (4-2 over Boston Braves)... Tribe came up on the losing end in Fall Classics played

Boston Braves)...Tribe came up on the losing end in Fall Classics played in 1954 (4-0 to NY Giants), 1995 (4-2 to Atlanta), 1997 (4-3 to Florida) & 2016 (4-3 to Chicago-NL)...the 1903 World Series is considered to be Major League Baseball's first modern installment of the event.

THAT FIRST STEP | INDIANS ALDS HISTORY

» Cleveland is making its 10th appearance in the ALDS, 3rd-most all-time among A.L. teams behind only New York-AL (21) & Boston (13)...only N.L. teams with more Division Series appearances than the Indians are Atlanta (14), Los Angeles-NL (13) and St. Louis (13)...Houston has 10 combined DS appearances between the N.L. (7) & A.L. (3)... these numbers include 2018 match-ups...the Division Series was first implemented as a solution to the 1981 mid-season strike, but did not resurface again until 1995.

» Combining all ALDS & NLDS, Cleveland's 39 Division Series games played are 6th-most by any MLB team behind the Yankees (82). Braves

» Combining all ALDS & NCDS, Cleveland's 39 Division Series games played are 6th-most by any MLB team behind the Yankees (82), Braves (52), Cardinals (51), Dodgers (47) and Red Sox (45), 3rd-most by any A.L. team...the Indians have gone 22-17 (.564) all-time in those 39 ALDS games...Tribe's 22 DS wins are 2nd-most in the A.L. & 5th-most in MLB behind the Yankees (47), Cardinals (33), Braves (27) & Dodgers (24).

behind the Yankees (47), Cardinals (33), Braves (27) & Dodgers (24). » The Indians have won 5 of the 9 ALDS they have played all-time ('95, '97, '98, '07, '16)...Cleveland has had home field advantage in the ALDS six times ('95, '98, '99, '07, '16, '17), going 4-2 in those series; club is 1-2 when opponent has home field in ALDS. » Four of the Tribe's ALDS appearances have gone 5 games ('97, '99, '01, '17), with Cleveland winning just one of those...three have gone 4 games (2-1: '96, '98, '07), while two were three-game sweeps ('95, '16, both wins).

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK DIVISION CHAMPS

» The Cleveland Indians won their third consecutive A.L. Central title in 2018, marking their 10th overall since the 1994 realignment... Indians won the first ever A.L. Central crown in '95, adding the others in '96, '97, '98, '99, '01, '07, '16 & '17...marks the fourth time in six seasons that Cleveland has earned a Postseason berth (also 2013 A.L. WC Game, 2016 World Series, 2017 ALDS).

» Cleveland's 10 A.L. Central titles are most by any of the five current members, followed by Minnesota (6), Detroit (4), Chicago-AL (3) and Kansas City (1)...their active run of three straight division titles is the

Parliass City (1)...their active full of united straight division titles is the 2nd-longest in franchise history, behind their streak of five consecutive A.L. Central crowns from 1995-1999.

Tribe finished with a 13.0-game lead over 2nd-place Minnesota, holding the division lead for each of the final 163 days of the season (from April 21 onward)...overall, the Tribe spent 168 total days in 1st place, their most in a single season since logging 180 days at the top in 1999.

FIRST-TIME FOES

» Cleveland & Houston are contesting their first-ever Postseason matchup, in a battle between the last two winners of the A.L. pennant.

"This ALDS matchup represents just the fourth Postseason series in American League history featuring the two most recent pennant winners...the 1973 ALCS featured Baltimore (1971 A.L. champions) and Oakland (1972), while Cleveland (1995, 1997) and New York-AL (1996) faced each other in the same manner in both the 1997 ALDS and 1998 ALCS...the rare feat has also occurred five times on the National League side, most recently in the 2016 Wild Card Game between San Francisco (2014) and and New York-NL (2015).

» Houston is the 12th different franchise that Cleveland has played in

the Postseason...the Indians hold a 6-5 record in their first-ever playoff series against an opponent.

HOUSTON, WE HAVE A MATCHUP

» Cleveland went 3-4 in their regular-season series vs. Houston, going
1-2 in a series at Minute Maid Park (May 18-20) and 2-2 in a four-game
set at Progressive Field (May 24-27)...despite being outscored 45-29
across the seven contests, Cleveland was victorious in the final two
games, punctuated on May 27 by a GREG ALLEN walk-off homer in
the bottom of the 14th inning that gave the Tribe a dramatic 10-9 win.

» Since Terry Francona became Tribe manager in 2013, the Indians

have gone 27-14 (.659) in the regular season vs. the Astros.

**BDWIN ENCARNACION paced Tribe hitters, batting .346 (9-26) in seven games vs. Houston with two homers, two doubles, five RBI and five runs scored...TREVOR BAUER is 7-0 with a 3.18 ERA (18ER/51.0IP) in eight career regular-season starts vs. the Astros.

HEADING WEST ON I-90

The Indians posted their sixth consecutive winning season (longest since 8 straight, 1994-2001), finishing the 2018 campaign 91-71 (.562).
 Marks the club's third consecutive season with 90+ wins, just the third

 w Marks the club's third consecutive season with 90+ wins, just the third such streak in franchsie history (1950-55, 1999-2001).
 » Cleveland joins New York-AL as one of only two A.L. teams to finish above .500 in each of the last six seasons (2013-18), and one of just five teams in the Majors to do so along with Los Angeles-NL, St. Louis & Washington...Tribe's combined 545-425 (.562) record over the last six seasons is tops in the American League and 2nd-highest in MLB (Los Angeles-NL: 565-408, .581).

**TITO'S BUILT FOR OCTOBER

** TERRY FRANCONA* has led teams to the MLB Postseason on nine separate occasions - including four of his six campaigns with Cleveland, joining 2013 (lost A.L. WC), 2016 (lost WS in 7G) & 2017 (lost ALDS in 5G)...Francona owns an all-time winning pct. of .597 (40-27) in the playoffs, entering the 2018 Postseason with the 3rd-best mark in MLB biotony (inc. 402) being less McCarthy et .698 (2013) and Sparket.

playoffs, entering the 2018 Postseason with the 3rd-best mark in MLB history (min 40G) behind **Joe McCarthy** at .698 (30-13) and **Sparky Anderson** at .618 (34-21)...Francona is one of just 17 managers in MLB history who have managed two or more teams in a World Series. » Francona owns 14 consecutive winning seasons, the longest streak by any active MLB manager and longest by any skipper since **Joe Torre**'s 14-year streak (1996-2009)...in 6 seasons with Cleveland, has posted the A.L.'s best record (2nd-best in MLB) from 2013-18 at 545-425 (.562) with four Postseason berths...owns the 2nd-most wins of any manager in Cleveland history thru his first six seasons behind only **Al López** (570 wins from 1951-56).

ROTATION DOMINATION

» The Indians' most consistent force throughout the 2018 regular season was dominant starting pitching...the rotation posted a 76-42 (.644) record with a 3.39 ERA, leading the Majors in starter wins and finishing third in starter ERA (Houston - 3.16; Los Angeles-NL - 3.19)...Cleveland was one of just two teams in MLB (with Houston) claiming five pitchers with at least 10 wins.

» The Indians became the first team in Major League history to feature four pitchers with at least 200 strikeouts, with CARLOS

feature four pitchers with at least 200 strikeouts, with CARLOS CARRASCO (231, 4th in A.L.), COREY KLUBER (222, 5th), TREVOR BAUER (221, T6th) and MIKE CLEVINGER (207, 10th) achieving the feat...only four other teams in MLB history have had three such pitchers, including the 2018 Astros (Verlander, Cole, Morton).

» Cleveland starters combined to fan 1,066 batters over the course of the season, equaling their single-season franchise record set in 2017... all 162 games were started by right-handers, marking the second season in club history with no starts by LHP (also 1932).

RIBE TIDBITS

JOSÉ RAMÍREZ (39 HR) and FRANCISCO LINDOR (38 HR) each » JOSE RAMIREZ (39 HR) and FRANCISCO LINDOR (38 HR) each broke the single-season franchise record for home runs by a switch-hitter (Carlos Santana - 34 in 2016), becoming the first pair of switch-hitting teammates in MLB history to each hit 30 homers...Ramirez became the third 30HR/30SB player in franchise history, joining Grady Sizemore (2008) and Joe Carter (1987)...both Ramirez and Lindor have collected 80+ extra-base hits in each of the last two seasons, becoming the first pair of teammates to do so since New York-AL's Joe DiMaggio and Lou Gehrig in 1936-37 (ESPN Stats & Info)...they also became the third-ever pair of MLB teammates to record 35 HR & 25 SB each (1998 Riue Jays: Canseco/Green & 1987 Mets: Johnson/Strawberry)

» Cleveland finished the 2018 season with 135 stolen bases, leading the Majors in steals for the first time in franchise history...four different Indians players (Ramírez, Lindor, Davis, Allen) stole at least 20 bags, the first such Cleveland quartet since the 1911 season.

Tribe hitters slugged 216 home runs this year, 4th-most in the American League and 6th-most in MLB...marked the team's most longballs in a season since belting 221 in 2000...the club finished with three 30-homer hitters (J. Ramírez, Lindor, Encarnacion) for just the fifth time in franchise history (first since 1999; M. Ramírez, Sexson, Thome).

» For a third straight season, Cleveland's A.L. Central title was facilitated by success within the division...the Tribe finished their 76-game divisional slate with a 49-27 (.645) record, matching the 2016 club for their 2nd-most A.L. Central wins since the division's inception in 1994 (went 50-26 in 2017)...the Indians posted a 2.92 intradivisional ERA, the lowest mark by any MLB team against their own division this season

TODAY'S START

» Today will mark Carrasco's second career start and appearance in the Postseason... made his October debut in Game 3 of the 2017 ALDS at Yankee Stadium...held New York-AL to just three hits over 5.2 shutout innings (3BB, 7K), but took a no-decision in Cleveland's eventual 1-0 loss.

» The 31-year-old right-hander is pitching on extended five days' rest after making his final regular-season start on September 30 at Kansas City...earned his 17th win of the

season after holding the Royals to one run on three hits over 5.0 innings (2BB, 6K).

» Carrasco finished a strong 2018 campaign with a 17-10 record and a 3.38 ERA (8th-lowest in the A.L.)...fanned a career-high 231 batters, 4th-most in the American League.

» Went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (8ER/13.1IP) in two regular-season starts this season vs. Houston...owns a lifetime record of 4-2 with 3.45 ERA (18ER/47.0IP) in seven career starts (eight appearances) against the Astros.

» Has gone 2-1 with a 1.17 ERA (3ER/23.0IP) in three career starts at Minute Maid

Park...has worked two scoreless starts in this ballpark, including a two-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts on September 17, 2014.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

» Carrasco enjoyed another stellar campaign in the front end of Cleveland's rotation, finishing the 2018 season 17-10 with a 3.38 ERA (8th-lowest in American League)...

the 2016 season with a career-high 231 strikeouts (4th-most in A.L.), reaching the 200-strikeout mark for the third time in his career.

» Finished the season T1st in the American League with two complete games...tossed his 9th career complete game on April 11 vs. Detroit, holding the Tigers to just one run on three hits over 9.0 innings with two walks and six strikeouts...threw his 10th career complete game and his second of 2018 on May 9 at Milwaukee, holding the Brewers to two runs on five hits in the Tribe's 6.2 win Carrasco struck out a season high 14 bat two runs on five hits in the Tribe's 6-2 win...Carrasco struck out a season-high 14 batters, a total he matched on September 7 at Toronto.

» Spent three weeks on the Disabled List after being struck on the right elbow with a

line drive on June 16 vs. Minnesota...<u>after returning from the Disabled List on July 5, Carrasco went 9-5 with a 2.59 ERA (29ER/100.2IP) in 15 starts (17 appearances).</u>

» Carrasco enjoyed the bulk of his success after the All-Star break, posting a 6-5 record with a 2.52 ERA (25ER/89.1IP) in 14 second-half appearances (13 starts).. Carrasco finished with the 4th-lowest second-half ERA (min. 60.0IP) in the A.L., behind TB's Blake Snell (1.17), BOS's David Price (2.25) and teammate MIKE CLEVINGER (2.31)...his 119 second-half strikeouts were tops in the American League and 3rd-most in MLB behind COL's German Márquez (124) and NYM's Jacob deGrom (120).

- » After a broken right hand kept him out of the 2016 playoffs, Carrasco made his Postseason debut in the 2017 ALDS vs. New York-AL.

 » Carrasco started Game 3 at Yankee Stadium, taking a no-decision despite toss-
- ing 5.2 shutout innings...held the Yankees to just three hits with three walks and seven strikeouts in the Tribe's eventual 1-0 loss.

 » Matched Corey Kluber (7K, 2016 ALDS Game 1) for the most strikeouts by an Indians pitcher in their Postseason debut.

 » Carrasco fanned a career-high 231 batters in 2018, leading the Indians and finishing 4th in the American League...marked Carrasco's 3rd career season with 200-plus strikeouts, after previously doing so in 2015 and 2017...he is just the fifth player in Indians franchise history to reach the milestone in three-or-more seasons (with Sam McDowell, Bob Feller, Corey Kluber and Gaylord Perry).

 » Fanned his 1,000th career batter on July 11 vs. Cincinnati, making him the 12th participar with 1,000 strikeouts in an Indians uniform and the 44th active MLB pitcher.
- pitcher with 1,000 strikeouts in an Indians uniform and the 44th active MLB pitcher to reach 1,000.
- » Carrasco also surpassed several Indians pitchers this season to claim 9th place on the Indians all-time franchise leaderboard with 1,127 career punchouts...he sits 34 shy
- of matching Mel Harder for 8th place (1,161).

 » Fanned least six batters in each of his last 15 starts, the 2nd-longest streak of his career (21 straight from 6/13/2015 4/19/2016)...Carrasco struck out 10-or-more batters in seven starts this season, tied with **Corey Kluber** and TB's **Blake Snell** for the 6th-most such outings in the American League.

 » Carrasco made a pair of starts vs. Houston in the 2018 regular season, going 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (8ER/13.1IP)...owns a career mark of 4-2 with a 3.45 ERA (18ER/47.0IP) in

 » First faced Houston at Minute Maid Park on May 20...took the loss in a quality start, allowing three runs on eight hits over 7.2 innings of work (1BB, 6K), as the Tribe fell 3-1 on Sunday Night Baseball...in his very next start on May 26 at Progressive Field, Carrasco bested the Astros despite allowing five runs on seven hits over 5.2 innings (2BB, 8K), as Cleveland won 8-6.

 » Carrasco has excelled in his career at Minute Maid Park, posting a 2-1 record with a 1.17 ERA (3ER/23.0IP) in three lifetime starts...in addition to the aforementioned loss on May 20 this season, Carrasco owns a pair of scoreless appearances in this ballpark, including a two-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts on September 17, 2014.

THE ROAD WARRIOR

- » Carrasco continued his career dominance on the road in 2018, posting an 8-6 record with a 2.96 ERA (36ER/109.1IP) in 16 starts (17 appearances)...marked the 7th-lowest road ERA in the American League.
- Narked Carrasco's fourth consecutive season with 75.0+ road innings and a sub-3.00 ERA, matching the longest streak in club history (ERA became an official stat in 1913)... Hall of Famer Stan Coveleski recorded four straight campaigns from 1917-1920. In his most recent road start (September 30 at Kansas City), Carrasco earned the win, holding the Royals to one run on three hits over 5.0 innings of work (2BB, 6K).

 No Carrasco owns a 2.65 ERA on the road since the start of 2015, maring the 3rd-lowest ERA in MI B. over that span behind Clayton Kershaw (2.47) and May Scherzer (2.49).
