### PREGAME FESTIVITIES

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers suffered an 8-3 loss to the Indians in the series opener on Friday night at Comerica Park. Victor Martinez had a pair of hits, including a solo home run, while Leonys Martin also added two hits. Nicholas Castellanos and Niko Goodrum each had a hit and a RBI. Mike Fiers started for Detroit and received a no decision after giving up three runs on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Joe Jiménez took the loss after allowing three runs in a third of an inning. The Tigers and Indians play the second game of their three-game set tonight. Following the weekend series vs. Cleveland, the homestand continues with two games vs. Cincinnati (July 31-August 1).

#### SMOKER CLAIMED OFF WAIVERS FROM PITTSBURGH:

The Tigers today announced that they have claimed LHP Josh Smoker off waivers from the Pittsburgh Pirates and optioned him to Triple A Toledo. Smoker has spent most of the season with Triple A Indianapolis, posting a 3-1 record with a 2.83 ERA (35.0IP/11ER) and 39 strikeouts. He has also appeared in seven games with the Pirates, compiling a 0-0 record with an 11.12 ERA (5.2IP/7ER) and two strikeouts. To create room on the 40-man roster for Smoker, the Tigers have designated RHP Warwick Saupold for assignment.

#### V-MART STAYS HOT:

Victor Martinez reached base in all four plate appearances last night, going 2x2 with a solo home run, his sixth of the season, and two walks. Martinez enters tonight's game on a five-game hitting streak and has posted a slash line of .500/.571/.889 with a double, two home runs and six RBI during the streak.

#### GREAT BALLS OF FIERS:

Mike Fiers turned in his sixth consecutive quality start last night vs. Cleveland, allowing three runs on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Fiers has allowed three runs-or-less in 10 of his last 11 starts since May 30, and has posted a 2.65 ERA (68.0IP/20ER) and 54 strikeouts. During that stretch, Fiers ranks third in the American League in ERA and innings pitched.

#### THE CANDY MAN CAN:

Jeimer Candelario went 1x5 in last night's game and has now recorded at least one hit in seven of his last eight games. Over the eight-game stretch, Candelario has hit .300 (9x30) with five runs scored, two home runs and six RBI. Prior to his current stretch, Candelario had hit .065 (2x31) in nine games from July 3-14.

#### TIGERS AND INDIANS:

Detroit is 3-11 against the Indians this season, and have gone 3-4 in seven meetings at Comerica Park. Cleveland has won the season series over the Tigers in each of the last two seasons and has gone 38-13 against Detroit since the start of the 2016 season.

#### CENTRAL FOCUS:

The Tigers are 20-22 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 8-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 3-11 vs. Cleveland, 3-3 vs. Minnesota and 6-7 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

#### AT COMERICA PARK:

The Tigers are 0-1 on their current five-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (0-1) and two games vs. Cincinnati (July 31-August 1). Detroit is 26-26 at Comerica Park this season, but have lost nine of its last 12 home games. The Tigers are hitting .254 (448x1766) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.04 ERA (479.0IP/215ER).

#### MORRIS, TRAMMELL HALL OF FAME INDUCTION:

Jack Morris and Alan Trammell will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame tomorrow afternoon. The induction ceremony begins at 1:30 p.m. ET and will be televised live on MLB Network. Both Morris and Trammell were elected by the Modern Baseball Era Committee last December. Morris and Trammell will become the 26th and 27th players who wore a Detroit Tigers uniform to be inducted into the Hall of Fame.

#### NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:

Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 44-61 (.419) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,112-1,100 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**ABOUT BLAINE:** Hardy will make his 20th appearance and 10th start of the season tonight vs. Cleveland.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Hardy suffered his third loss of the season on Sunday vs. Boston, allowing four runs on five hits with three strikeouts in 3.0 innings.

**VS. CLEVELAND:** Hardy has faced the Indians 23 times in his career, all as a reliever, posting a 2-2 record with a 5.47 ERA (24.2IP/15ER) and 11 strikeouts. His last outing against Cleveland came on September 12, 2017, when he allowed a run on one hit in a third of an inning.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Hardy has made 94 career outings, including six starts, at Comerica Park, compiling an 8-2 record with a 3.38 ERA (119.2IP/45ER) and 92 strikeouts. In seven appearances, including six starts, at home this season, Hardy is 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA (32.1IP/14ER) and 27 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL:** Hardy has pitched in 87 games, including four as a starter, in his career against American League Central opponents, compiling a 6-2 record with a 4.30 ERA (102.2IP/49ER) and 70 strikeouts. In five outings, including four starts, vs. AL Central teams this season, Hardy is 2-0 with a 2.59 ERA (24.1IP/7ER) and 18 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN JULY:** Hardy has appeared in 33 games, including one start, during the month of July in his career, posting a 0-3 record with one save, a 3.67 ERA (34.1IP/14ER) and 32 strikeouts. In six July appearances, including one start, this season, Hardy is 0-2 with one save, a 4.66 ERA (9.2IP/5ER) and 10 strikeouts.

**FOR STARTERS:** Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in six of his nine starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 3-2 record with a 4.24 ERA (46.2IP/22ER) and 33 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Hardy has held lefthanded batters to a .225 (73x325) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .294 (150x511) against him. In 19 appearances, including nine starts this season, lefties are hitting .194 (12x62) vs. Hardy, while righthanded hitters are batting .285 (45x158).

**AT TOLEDO:** Hardy has appeared in seven games, including four starts, with the Mud Hens this season and has a 3-0 record with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP/2ER) and 30 strikeouts. At the time of his promotion, he led the International League with a 0.74 ERA, 0.62 WHIP, and .136 opponents batting average, while he was tied for the league lead with three wins.

**FIRST WIN AS A STARTER:** Hardy earned his first win as a starter on May 27 vs. Chicago (AL), throwing a career-high 7.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with one walk and a career-best six strikeouts. Hardy finished the outing by retiring the final 14 White Sox batters he faced.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Hardy was originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 22nd round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was signed by the Tigers as a Minor League free agent on April 2, 2013.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Zimmermann took the loss in his start on Tuesday at Kansas City, allowing four runs on seven hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

**VS. CLEVELAND/AT COMERICA PARK:** Zimmermann has faced the Indians six times in his career, posting a 0-4 record with a 10.57 ERA (23.0IP/27ER) and 18 strikeouts. His only start against Cleveland this season came on April 11 at Progressive Field, when his outing was cut short after a scoreless two thirds of an inning when he suffered a right jaw contusion after being hit by a line drive. Zimmermann has made 30 appearances, including 29 starts, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 12-12 record with a 5.99 ERA (162.1IP/108ER) and 113 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Zimmermann is 2-0 with a 2.59 ERA (31.1IP/9ER) and 34 strikeouts.
