### PREGAME FESTIVITIES

**Ceremonial First Pitch:** A ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by 1968 World Series Champion, **Jon Warden**.

**National Anthem:** The national anthem will be performed by vocalist **Caitlin LaBo**, and the colors will be presented by the **Ancient Order of Hibernians Rifles**.

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers snapped a three-game losing streak with an 11-8 victory over the Royals on Thursday night at Comerica Park. Christin Stewart belted a pair of home runs and drove in six, while Nicholas Castellanos also added a home run. Ronny Rodriguez contributed three hits, including a double, while Pete Kozma and Victor Martinez each had two hits and a RBI. Zac Reininger picked up the first win of his Major League career in relief, allowing two runs on three hits with two strikeouts in 2.1 innings. The Tigers and Royals play the second game of their four-game series tonight. Following the weekend series vs. Kansas City and an off day on Monday, Detroit wraps up the 2018 season next week with a six-game road trip, which includes three games at Minnesota (September 25-27) and three games at Milwaukee (September 28-30).

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Tigers today made the following roster moves:

\* Selected the contract of INF Harold Castro from Triple A Toledo. Castro will wear #70.

\* To create room for Castro on the 40-man roster, RHP Michael Fulmer has been placed on the 60-day disabled list with a right lateral meniscus tear.

**SUPER STEW:** Christin Stewart hit the first two home runs of his Major League career, belting a two-run shot in the first inning and a three-run blast in the second inning. Stewart became the first Tigers player to hit his first two big league home runs in the same game since Brent Clevlen on August 1, 2006 at Tampa Bay. Stewart finished the game with six RBI, which were the most by a Tigers player this season and the most by a Tigers rookie since Ryan Raburn had seven RBI on July 25, 2007 at Chicago (AL). Stewart also became the first Detroit player since at least 1908 to have a six-RBI performance within the first 11 games of his Major League career.

**IN THE NICK OF TIME:** Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of hits in last night's game, including a solo home run in the first inning and a triple in the second inning. Castellanos' two hits marked his 53rd multi-hit game of the season, which is the third-most in the American League. In 18 games in September, Castellanos is hitting .379/.455/.636 with nine runs scored, six doubles, one triple, three home runs and 10 RBI. He leads the AL with 25 hits this month, while he is second in batting average, third in on-base percentage and tied for eighth in doubles.

**NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE:** Joe Jiménez struck out the side in the eighth inning of last night's game. After posting a 12.46 ERA (8.2IP/12ER) in 10 appearances during August, Jiménez has retired 18 consecutive batters over his six appearances in September, while striking out 11.

**V-MART VS. IAN KENNEDY:** Victor Martinez has had success against tonight's Royals starter, Ian Kennedy. Entering tonight's game, Martinez is hitting .333/.360/.458 with a home run and three RBI against Kennedy. Among active players with at least 20 at-bats vs. Kennedy, Martinez ranks tied for 10th in batting average.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Detroit is 1-3 on its current seven-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Minnesota (0-3) and four games vs. Kansas City (1-0). The Tigers are currently in a stretch that will see them play 13-of-16 games at home. Detroit is 37-41 (.474) at Comerica Park this season. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .248/.308/.391 as a team, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.10 ERA (713.0IP/325ER).

**TIGERS AND ROYALS:** Detroit trails the season series against Kansas City 9-7, but the Tigers have won four-of-seven games played at Comerica Park. The Royals have claimed the season series against the Tigers in three consecutive seasons.

**CENTRAL FOCUS:** The Tigers are 31-39 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 12-7 vs. Chicago (AL), 6-13 vs. Cleveland, 6-10 vs. Minnesota and 7-9 vs. Kansas City. This season marks the second straight year that the Tigers have finished with a below .500 record vs. divisional opponents.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 62-91 (.405) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,130-1,130 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 52nd in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

**THIS DATE IN TIGERS HISTORY: 1935** - The Tigers clinched the American League pennant by sweeping a doubleheader vs. St. Louis, winning 6-2 and 2-0. Tommy Bridges won the opener, while Elden Auker threw a shutout in the nightcap...**1972** - Joe Coleman earned his 18th win of the season in a 10-3 victory over Boston. Coleman struck out 10 and drove in three runs.

**ABOUT FRANCISCO:** Liriano will make his 26th appearance overall and 25th start of the season tonight vs. Kansas City.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Liriano earned the win on Sunday at Cleveland, throwing 7.0 innings and allowing three runs on five hits with two walks and seven strikeouts. Liriano's 7.0 innings pitched were his most since he tossed 8.0 innings on May 20 at Seattle.

**VS. KANSAS CITY:** Liriano has appeared in 23 games, including 20 starts, in his career vs. the Royals and has an 8-5 record with a 3.94 ERA (118.2IP/52ER) and 99 strikeouts. He has allowed three runs-or-less in each of his last seven starts vs. Kansas City, posting a 2.85 ERA (41.0IP/13ER) during the streak. Liriano has faced the Royals three times this season and is 1-0 with a 2.28 ERA (23.2IP/6ER) and 20 strikeouts.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Liriano is making his 25th career appearance and 21st career start at Comerica Park tonight. In his previous 24 outings in Detroit, Liriano has a 6-11 record with a 5.32 ERA (108.1IP/64ER) and 109 strikeouts. In nine outings, including eight starts, at home this season, Liriano is 2-4 with a 4.63 ERA (44.2IP/23ER) and 41 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL:** Liriano has made 103 appearances, including 81 starts, in his career against teams from the American League Central, compiling a 30-32 record with a 4.71 ERA (472.0IP/247ER) and 463 strikeouts. In 13 appearances, including 12 starts, vs. AL Central foes this season, Liriano has a 3-5 record with a 4.38 ERA (63.2IP/31ER) and 55 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN SEPTEMBER:** Liriano has made 65 appearances, including 44 starts, in his career during the month of September, posting a 17-15 record with a 4.07 ERA (261.0IP/118ER) and 285 strikeouts. In three September starts this season, Liriano is 2-1 with a 2.00 ERA (18.0IP/4ER) and 19 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Liriano has limited lefthanded hitters to a .217 (314x1444) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .250 (1266x5072). In 25 appearances, including 24 starts, this season, lefties are hitting .146 (12x82), which is the fourth-lowest batting average against lefthanded hitters among American League pitchers (min. 80 at-bats). Righthanded batters are hitting .275 (106x386) against Liriano.

**PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS:** Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano enters tonight's game with 1,743 strikeouts in his Major League career, which are the fifth-most by a Dominican-born pitcher in MLB history.

**IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018:** Liriano began the season by allowing three runs-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts. The streak was his second longest to start a season in his career, trailing only a streak of 10 straight starts from May 19-July 8, 2006.

**TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MARCH/APRIL:** Liriano was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for March/April after posting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (29.1IP/11ER) and 21 strikeouts in five starts. He ranked 10th in the American League with a .196 (20x102) opponents batting average.

**DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK:** Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

**TOSSING A NO-NO:** Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).

**ABOUT JORDAN:** Zimmermann will make his 24th start of the season tomorrow night vs. Kansas City.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Zimmermann took the loss in his start on Monday vs. Minnesota, allowing five runs on seven hits with two walks and two strikeouts in 3.2 innings.

**VS. KANSAS CITY/AT COMERICA PARK:** Zimmermann has made eight career appearances, including seven starts, against the Royals, posting a 4-1 record with a 2.08 ERA (47.2IP/11ER) and 43 strikeouts. Zimmermann ranks third among active pitchers (min. 40.0 innings pitched) with a 2.08 ERA and 1.05 WHIP vs. Kansas City. Zimmermann has made 37 appearances, including 36 starts, at Comerica Park in his career, compiling a 14-17 record with a 6.11 ERA (197.1IP/134ER) and 135 strikeouts. In 12 home starts this season, Zimmermann is 4-5 with a 4.75 ERA (66.1IP/35ER) and 56 strikeouts.
