LEADING OFF: LAA plays the fourth contest of a five-game road trip (2-1) to **Seattle** (May 4-6; 2-1) and **Colorado** (May 8-9)...
LAA has won five of last six games to move into first place, a half-game ahead of Houston...Halos are 8-10 since a club-record 13-3 start...**LAA owns an MLB-best 13-3 road record** (LAA won 11 consecutive on road, March 30-April 24)...Halos are 8-3-0 in 11 series played...Following this series, the club heads home for an 11-game home stand vs. **Minnesota** (May 10-13), **Houston** (May 14-16) and **Tampa Bay** (May 17-20).

DID YOU KNOW? With six strikeouts Sunday, **Shohei Ohtani** (32 Ks) became just the third Angel pitcher to reach 30+ Ks thru five outings joining **Bo Belinsky** (35) and **Jered Weaver** (31). With the win, he is the 8th Angels' pitcher with a winning decision in three of his first five career starts (first since **Sean O'Sullivan** in 2009).

3,000!!! With a fifth inning single to right field Friday (off **Mike Leake**), **Albert Pujols**...

- Became 32nd player all-time to reach 3,000 hits - second in as many seasons (**Adrián Beltré**; July 30, 2017 vs. Baltimore).
- Fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HRs (**Hank Aaron**, **Willie Mays** & **Alex Rodriguez**).
- 6th foreign-born player to reach 3K (2nd Dominican – **Beltre**).
- Is one of four players with 3,000 hits, 450 HRs and 600 doubles (**Aaron**, **Carl Yastrzemski**, **Beltre** & **Musial**) - *STATS LLC*.
- Joins **Rod Carew** (Aug. 4, 1985 vs. Minnesota) as only players to log 3,000th hit in an Angels' uniform.

3x3x3: **Pujols** has matched **Stan Musial** and **Alex Rodriguez** as only players with 3+ MVP Awards and 3,000 hits.

SIMBA SIZZLIN': **Andrelton Simmons** boasts an 11-game hit streak batting .444 (20/45) with eight runs, six doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI in the span...**Hit streak is second of 8+ games this season (March 29-April 6)**...His **.350** season ranks second in A.L. to **Mookie Betts**.

VIRGIN ISLAND TEAMMATES: If **Jabari Blash** and **Akeel Morris** both appear in a game for Angels, it would be first time two natives of the U.S. Virgin Islands play as teammates since **RHP Al McBean** and **C Elmo Plaskett** both played for Pittsburgh from 1961-63.

A.L. ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: **Shohei Ohtani** was named American League Rookie of the Month for April...As a DH, he batted .359 (14/39) with four HR, 12 RBI and a 1.148 OPS...In four starts, went 2-1 with 26 strikeouts in 20.1 IP.

DOUBLE VISION: With a two-bagger Wednesday night, **Albert Pujols** surpassed **Hank Aaron** for 11th place on MLB all-time doubles list with 625 (**David Ortiz** is 10th with 632)...**Pujols** currently sits at 626 career doubles.

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Ohtani** is just fourth player in modern era with 25+ pitching strikeouts and four+ batting home runs in a month – first since **Fergie Jenkins** in Sept., 1971...**Ohtani** tied the club record for most XBH (7) through first 13 career games with a plate appearance (**Jackie Warner** in 1966)...**Ohtani** has a hit in 12 of 14 starts at DH this season.

K's ALL DAY: Angels' pitching staff has recorded 10+ strikeouts 16 times this season – a new franchise record for most double-digit strikeout games through the team's first 34 games of the season (previous was 12; three times).

(2011) **Mike Scioscia** gets the 1,000th win of his career in the Angels' 6-5 win over Cleveland...He becomes the 56th manager in MLB history to reach the milestone; (2004) **Shane Halter** connects for the 5th pinch-hit grand slam in club history (also his first HR with Angels) as the club defeats the Devil Rays 7-2 at Angel Stadium.

May 9

(1961) **Jerry Casale** hit the first home run by an Angels' pitcher as the club defeats Boston, 8-7, at Wrigley Field in LA.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP ANDREW HEANEY

1-1, 5.31 ERA

Pitched career high 7.1 innings in last start at Coors Field on July 7, 2015

- **WELCOME BACK!** Making fifth start of the season and second on the road...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Wednesday vs. Baltimore after tossing a season-high six innings and allowing one earned run on five hits with one walk and two strikeouts...The victory was his first since Aug. 28, 2017 vs. Oakland...Has yielded exactly one earned run in each of last two starts.
- **9 K's vs. NYY:** Recorded season-high nine strikeouts in five innings of work on April 27 vs. New York (A.L.)...The nine strikeouts were second-highest total of career (had 10 strikeouts on 8/28/17 vs. OAK)...Was first Angels pitcher with 9+ strikeouts in five-or-fewer innings since **Hector Santiago** on July 20, 2015 (Game 1) vs. Boston.
- **LINEUP FAMILIARITY:** Is holding opponents to a .212 (7/33) batting average this season the first time through the order, but opponents are batting .340 (16/47) the second and third time through the order.
- **INTERLEAGUE:** Second interleague start of season...In six career starts in interleague play is 1-5 with a 6.35 ERA (34 IP – 24 ER)...**Only interleague victory came on July 7, 2015 at Colorado...**Took loss in first interleague start of the year on April 20 vs. San Francisco...On April 5, 2016 vs. Cubs, suffered left flexor muscle strain which would ultimately lead to Tommy John surgery...In 11 career games (nine starts) against National League opponents is 1-6 with a 6.14 ERA (51.1 IP – 35 ER).
- **AT THE PLATE:** Is batting .077 (1/13) in career as a hitter with two sacrifices and five strikeouts...Recorded lone hit of Major League career for Marlins on Sept. 26, 2014 (Game 2) at Washington...**Has not had a plate appearance since Aug 1, 2015 at Dodger Stadium.**
- **VS. COLORADO:** Is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (7.1 IP – 2 ER)...Earned win in only previous start vs. Rockies on July 7, 2015 at Coors Field after pitching 7.1 innings (career-high) and allowing two earned runs on eight hits with no walks and five strikeouts...Only start of career pitching into the 8th inning.
- **AT COORS FIELD:** Tonight marks second career start at Coors Field...Only previous outing at Coors Field came on July 7, 2015 (W; 7.1 IP, 8 H, 2 ER, 0 BB, 5 SO).
- **STARTING NINE:** With first start of year on April 13, became ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season set a new Angels record and were the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT:** Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **2017 RECAP:** Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS:** Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacks and shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF **Austin Barnes**, RHP **Chris Hatcher** and OF **Enrique Hernandez** in exchange for INF **Dee Gordon**, RHP **Dan Haren**, INF **Miguel Rojas** and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF **Howie Kendrick**.

TOMORROW'S STARTER AT COLORADO

RHP JAIME BARRIA (2-1, 3.46 ERA)

Making fourth start of the season and second on the road...First career start vs. Rockies...Earned the win in last start on Thursday vs. Baltimore after tossing six innings and allowing two earned runs on four hits with two walks and two strikeouts; Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings before allowing a single to Trey Mancini... Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history; The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer Rod Carew... At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since Mike Trout (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011

#32 CAM BEDROSIAN (RHP) AGE: 26

- Pitched one scoreless inning across two outings in last series at Seattle.
- Credited with win on May 1 vs. BAL, but had second blown save of year after allowing two runs in the 9th inning...Fourth career blown save in 9th inning or later.
- Had six straight scoreless appearances from April 18-29.
- Earned first save of the season on April 24 at HOU with 1.1 scoreless innings... Third career 4+ out save.
- Pitched season-high 1.2 scoreless on April 20 vs. Giants.
- Nine of 13 outings this season have been scoreless.
- Appeared in 48 games last season, going 6-5 with a 4.43 ERA (44.2 IP – 22 ER) and six saves...Set career highs in wins, saves, games, innings pitched & strikeouts (53).
- **Last Outing:** 5/6 @ SEA (0.1 IP, 3 BB) **Holds:** 2 **Saves/Opps:** 1/3

#33 JIM JOHNSON (RHP) AGE: 34

- Charged with loss Saturday night after allowing a season-high three runs.
- Earned the win on April 24 at Houston...Retired two of four batters faced.
- Matched season high with 1.2 scoreless innings on April 19 vs. Boston.
- Has recorded four-or-more outs in six times this year...Recorded four-or-more outs in just three of 61 outings last season for Atlanta.
- Earned first win of the season on April 6 vs. Oakland.
- Appeared in 61 games for Atlanta last season, going 6-2 and ranked 9th in N.L. with 22 saves...Fourth career 20+ save season.

#58 AKEEL MORRIS (RHP) AGE: 25

- Did not pitch during last series at Seattle.
- Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on April 29 for second stint of season with Angels.
- Made Angels debut on April 7 vs. Oakland and allowed one run in 2.1 innings pitched (**Jed Lowrie** solo HR) in only appearance of first stint with Angels.
- In eight games with Salt Lake, is 0-0 with two saves and a 1.80 ERA (10 IP – 2 ER) and 10 strikeouts.
- Acquired by Angels from Atlanta on April 3 in exchange for cash considerations or a player to be named later.
- Spent majority of 2017 in minors (30 games with Triple-A Gwinnet & 6 games with Double-A Mississippi)...In eight games with Atlanta, allowed one run in 7.1 innings.
- **Last Outing:** 5/3 vs. BAL (2 IP, 4 H, 1 ER) **Holds:** - **Saves/Opps:** -

#53 BLAKE PARKER (RHP) AGE: 32

- Pitched 1.2 scoreless innings Saturday night in first outing of road trip, matching longest outing of the season.
- Holding right-handers to a .184 (7/38) batting average this season.
- Charged with loss April 27 after allowing 10th inning HR to Didi Gregorius.
- Earned first save of season on March 30 at Oakland.
- Led Angels staff and ranked sixth in A.L. in appearances (71) last season.
- In 2017, posted a 3-3 record and eight saves with a 2.54 ERA (67.1 IP – 19 ER)...Led all Halos pitchers with an 11.5 SO/9 inning rate...His 86 strikeouts were second among Angels relievers (Yusmeiro Petit – 96).

#25 NOÉ RAMIREZ (RHP) AGE: 28

- Induced double-play against Dee Gordon (only batter faced) to end the game on Sunday at Seattle after inherited a bases loaded situation with one out in 9th.
- Worked season-high 2.2 innings on April 28 vs. Yankees and allowed one run.
- Retired two of three batters faced April 24 at Houston in only outing of last trip.
- Earned first Major League win on April 4 vs. Cleveland.
- Charged with loss March 29 after allowing walk-off hit to Marcus Semien in 11th.
