## NEW YORK METS (19-17) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (22-16)

Saturday, May 12, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 39; Home 22  
RHP Noah Syndergaard (2-1, 3.09) vs RHP Zach Eflin (1-0, 0.71)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Mets, 3-1 in a pitcher's duel to open up a three-game series at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta held New York scoreless for 7.1 innings, yielding only 5 hits and 2 walks while striking out 5 batters ... Odubel Herrera gave the Phillies the lead and extended his on-base streak to 40 straight games with a first-inning, solo home run, and that 1-0 score would hold until the ninth ... Hector Neris was touched up for two home runs as the Mets came from behind to win the opener.
- MAY DAY:** Almost halfway through the month, Philadelphia ranks near the top of the National League in a number of categories on both sides of the ball in May ... On the mound, they are 1<sup>st</sup> in OPP AVG (.206) and 2<sup>nd</sup> in ERA (2.65), strikeouts (96) & WHIP (1.12) ... **Philadelphia's starting pitchers specifically are T-1<sup>st</sup> in MLB in wins in May (6), 3<sup>rd</sup> in ERA (2.04) & OPP AVG (.188) and 5<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts (63) ... They have allowed one run or none in eight of 10 games during May, averaging 9.89 SO/9.0 IP ...** At the dish, Philadelphia has the highest OBP in the NL this month (.339), is T-3<sup>rd</sup> in extra-base hits (37), 4<sup>th</sup> in hits (91), runs (50), & SLG % (.456), T-4<sup>th</sup> in homers (15) and 5<sup>th</sup> in walks (35).
- PICK SIX:** With four pitcher-to-first-baseman pickoffs in the last 10 games (all to Carlos Santana), the Phillies now rank T-3<sup>rd</sup> in baseball with five pitcher pickoffs and T-2<sup>nd</sup> in all pickoffs including catcher pickoffs with six, trailing only SD (7) ... **All six of Philadelphia's pickoffs have come at a time when the game was a two-run game or closer.**
- RAGING BULL:** Odubel Herrera has now reached base safely in a career-best 40 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .362/.424/.559 slash line over 172 plate appearances during the streak ... Per *Elias*, he is tied for the 7<sup>th</sup>-longest on-base streak in Phillies history, and if he extends it tonight will move into a tie with Pete Rose (1982) and Don Hurst (1929) for 5<sup>th</sup>-longest ... Overall, Herrera's 40-game on-base streak is the longest of any major league player since 2016 when Freddie Freeman reached in 46 straight ... It is also one of just eight on-base streaks in MLB to reach 40 games over the last 5 seasons (since 2014)

- ATOP THE LEADERBOARD:** With two more hits last night, Odubel Herrera raised his average to .360 (49-136) on the season ... **It is the highest batting average among any qualifying player in MLB, six points higher than the next-closest (Manny Machado, .354) and 15 points higher than the next-best in the National League (Nick Markakis, .345) ...** With multiple hits in five of his last six games, Herrera now has 16 multi-hit efforts in 2018, T-2<sup>nd</sup> among all ML players behind only Markakis' 17 ... He is T-5<sup>th</sup> in MLB in hits (49) and 7<sup>th</sup> in OBP (.429) ... **This is the latest a qualifying Phillie has led MLB in batting average since 2012, when Carlos Ruiz led all of baseball with a .356 average on 5/12, per *Elias*.**
- EASY DRIVE HOME:** Philadelphia has three different players (Maikel Franco-28, Carlos Santana-26 and Rhys Hoskins-25) already with 25 or more RBI this season ... They are tied with ATL (Ozzie Albies, Freddie Freeman, Nick Markakis) and NYY (Didi Gregorius, Aaron Judge, Gary Sanchez) for most 25-plus RBI players among all teams, with Odubel Herrera one shy at 24 RBI ... They have been especially successful driving in runs at Citizens Bank Park, as Herrera (19, T-2<sup>nd</sup>), Santana (19, T-2<sup>nd</sup>) and Franco (16, T-6<sup>th</sup>) all rank in the top six in the National League in RBI at home this season.
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 26-11 in their last 37 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .703 win percentage over that stretch ranks 3<sup>rd</sup> in the majors behind the Yankees (.741) and Cubs (.730)
- SLAMTANA:** First baseman **Carlos Santana** collected 13 RBI in the four-game series against San Francisco, tying a Phillies franchise record for most RBI in a series of any length, per *Elias* (others: Mike Schmidt – 13 RBI, 7/6-9/79 vs SF and Cliff Lee – 13 RBI, 7/25-28/22 vs CIN) ... Santana has now recorded an extra-base hit in seven consecutive games which is the longest streak by a Phillies player since 2009 when **Ryan Howard** did so in seven straight (5/27-6/3) ... **Chase Utley** had an eight-game XBH streak from April 16-23, 2008 and a nine-game streak from May 25-June 3, 2008.
- FORTUNE .500:** The Phillies enter play tonight with an all-time record of 500-471 against the Mets ... Since the New York's inaugural season in 1962, Philadelphia's 500 wins are their most versus any club (next: WSH/MTL franchise, 431 wins) ... Conversely, New York's 500 losses against the Phils are their most versus any opponent (next: Braves franchise, 449 losses) ... However, since 2014, the Phillies have a 25-54 record against the Mets (.316 win %) and have been outscored, 428-302 (-126 run differential) ... From 2007-2013, the Phillies were 68-59 against the Mets (.535) with a +35 run differential (589-554) ... Philadelphia is in danger of losing four straight to the Mets for the first time since 5/29-8/31/15, when they lost 10 straight.

**LAST START:** 5/7 vs SF: W, 6.2 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 9 SO ... Eflin vs Samardzija ... Odubel Herrera extended his on-base streak in emphatic fashion as he blasted a 3-run home run in the 1st inning ... The Phils would keep adding to their lead as the night progressed with home runs from Cesar Hernandez and Carlos Santana ... Right-hander Seranthony Dominguez made his major league debut with a scoreless 8th inning.

**TONIGHT'S START:**

- Career High:** Struck out a career-high 9 batters in his last outing ... Had reached 6 strikeouts only twice prior in his career, both of which were in complete games ... It took him only 3.2 innings in his last start to set the new career high
- 6.0 IP, 4 H:** Has tossed at least 6.0 innings and allowed 4 or fewer hits in his 2 starts ... If he were to do so again tonight, he would be the first Phillie to do so in his first 3 starts of a season since 1972, when Steve Carlton did so ... Aaron Nola (4/22-5/3/16) is the only other Phillie to do so over any 3-start stretch since 2012
- Increased Velocity:** Per MLBAM Statcast data, has averaged **94.1 mph on his fastball in 2018, topping out at 96.9 mph ... From 2016-17, his fastball averaged 92.8 mph**
- Efficient Eflin:** Has averaged 14.3 pitches/inning over his first 2 starts, lowest among any Phillie to start a game in 2018
- 2018 Minors:** Began the season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) before being recalled on 4/30 by PHI ... Posted a 1.69 ERA (3 ER, 16.0 IP), in his first 3 starts of the season with LHV, allowing 1 ER in each ... Did not walk a batter in 2 of his 4 total starts
- vs NL East:** 2-3, 3.58 ERA (20 ER, 50.1 IP) in 8 starts ... Has a 6.45 ERA (64 ER, 90.0 IP) against all other opponents

**HOME:**

- 2018:** 1-0, 0.00 ERA (6.2 IP) in 1 start
- Career:** 2-5, 5.11 ERA (35 ER, 61.2 IP) in 10 starts
