HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ **Zack Godley** has set career highs with 14 wins, 30 starts, 167.1 innings and 175 strikeouts...in 6 career starts vs. Rockies, is 4-1 with a 3.53 ERA (14 ER in 35.2 IP), .227 opp. average and 40 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has reached base via hit or walk in 18 of his last 21 home games, hitting .299 (23-for-77)/.991 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers, 11 RBI, 1 HBP and 13 walks.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** is hitting .280 (7-for-25)/.960 OPS with 5 extra-base hits (2 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs) and 8 RBI.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost, 5-1, vs. Rockies.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** took the loss (4 ER in 3.0 IP).
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** hit a solo homer in the fifth inning.
- ♦ **Randall Delgado** (2.0 IP), **Jimmie Sherfy** (1.0), **Silvino Bracho** (1.2) and **Brad Boxberger** (1.0) each had scoreless outings.

A RECORD-SETTING STRETCH

- ♦ The D-backs tied the Major League record with 14 straight games, from Sept. 6-19, against teams in first place at the time of the series (Braves, Rockies, Astros and Cubs), along with the 1993 Orioles and 1996 Tigers, per Elias Sports Bureau.

EXTRA! EXTRA!

- ♦ Arizona has recorded an extra-base hit in 56 consecutive games, its longest streak within a single season since a 79-game stretch from April 20-July 14, 2013 [record is 91 straight from April 14-July 26, 1998].
- ♦ The D-backs' 56-gamer is the seventh longest in the Majors this season...next up is the Rockies' 57-gamer from May 25-Aug. 1.

DAY GAME RANKINGS IN NL

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is third with a .590 slugging pct. and 1.009 OPS, fourth with a .311 average, sixth with a .419 on-base pct. and tied for 11th with 29 walks.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is 11th with a .556 slugging pct.
- ♦ Pitchers of note: **T.J. McFarland's** 1.52 ERA is first, **Clay Buchholz'** .248 opp. OBP is sixth, 2.11 ERA is seventh and .196 opp. AVG is 16th, **Patrick Corbin's** .234 opp. OBP is third and .191 opp. AVG is 12th, **Zack Greinke's** 70 strikeouts are seventh.

VS. LEFTIES

- ♦ **Ketel Marte** is hitting .311 (55-for-177) with 15 doubles, 3 triples, 7 homers, 25 RBI and 19 walks...his 15 doubles are tied for third most in the NL.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .302 (49-for-162) with 8 doubles, 3 triples, 11 homers, 26 RBI and 31 walks...his 31 walks are second most in the NL and his 11 homers are tied for fourth most.

VS. ROCKIES

- ♦ This season vs. Rockies: **David Peralta** is hitting .386 (22-for-57) with 5 doubles, 4 homers and 13 RBI...**Nick Ahmed** has 7 doubles, 3 homers and 18 RBI...**Chris Owings** is batting .409 (9-for-22) in 12 games.

PERALTA'S POWER SURGE

- ♦ **David Peralta's** 29 homers are 1 shy of becoming the sixth D-backs outfielder to reach 30+ homers [stats as OF only], joining Luis Gonzalez (2x; 2000-01), Steve Finley (2x; 1999-2000), Reggie Sanders (2001), Justin Upton (2011), Chris Young (2007).
- ♦ Should Peralta reach 30 homers, it would mark the first time Arizona boasted multiple 30-homer hitters in back-to-back seasons since 1999-2001...Paul Goldschmidt (36) and Jake Lamb (30) each reached the milestone last year.

HIRANO AMONG JAPANESE & ARIZONA ROOKIE RELIEVERS

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 73 relief appearances are tied for the most by a Japanese rookie reliever with Akinori Otsuka/SD/2004 ahead of Takashi Saito/LAD/2006 (72), Hideki Okajima/BOS/2007 (66) and Kazuhiro Sasaki/SEA/2000 (63).
- ♦ Hirano's 2.09 ERA is the lowest by a D-backs rookie reliever in club history, ahead of José Valverde (2.15 in 2003) and Oscar Villarreal (2.46 in 2003), while his 73 appearances are second to Oscar Villarreal (85 in 2003).

CHAFIN SETS D-BACKS LEFTY RECORD FOR OUTINGS

- ♦ **Andrew Chafin's** career-high 75 appearances are the most by a D-backs lefty all-time, surpassing Randy Choate (74 in 2004)...Chafin also ranks third with 71 in 2017 and sixth with 66 in 2015.
- ♦ Chafin's 247 career appearances are fourth by a D-back pitcher all-time [next: José Valverde (253), David Hernandez (274), Brad Ziegler (373)].

GODLEY AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Acquired from the Cubs on Dec. 9, 2014, with RHP Jeferson Mejia, for C Miguel Montero.
- ◆ Cubs 10th-round pick in the 2013 draft.

THINGS TO KNOW...

- ◆ His career-high 14 wins this season are tied for sixth most in the NL (also: Jhoulys Chacin/MIL and Zach Greinke/ARI).
- ◆ Is 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA (19 ER in 91.2 IP) in 14 starts this season when lasting 6.0+ innings.
- ◆ Aiming to avoid his first 4-game losing streak.
- ◆ Looking for his first win at home since July 31 vs. Rangers.

LAST START

- ◆ Suffered his third consecutive loss on Sept. 15 @ Astros, allowing 5 runs on 7 hits in 3.2 innings.

VS. ROCKIES

- ◆ Is 4-1 with a 3.99 ERA (17 ER in 38.1 IP) in 8 career appearances (6 starts) vs. Rockies.
- ◆ Has gone 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER in 13.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts in 2 career home starts vs. Rockies.
- ◆ Is 1-1 with a 6.12 ERA (10 ER in 14.2 IP) in 2 starts this season.

KEEPING IT IN THE YARD

- ◆ Is averaging 0.86 home runs per 9.0 innings this season (16 home runs), the tenth-lowest average in the NL behind Mike Foltynewicz/ATL (0.86), Jhoulys Chacin/MIL (0.76), Trevor Williams/PIT (0.81), Kyle Freeland/COL (0.81), Miles Mikolas/STL (0.73), Aaron Nola/PHI (0.72), Patrick Corbin/ARI (0.69), Zack Wheeler/NYM (0.69) and Jacob deGrom/NYM (0.43).

18+ OUTS

- ◆ Is 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA (19 ER in 91.2 IP) in 14 starts this season when lasting 6.0+ innings.
- ◆ Is 23-6 with a 2.43 ERA (65 ER in 241.0 IP) in 37 career starts of 6.0+ innings (Arizona is 28-9).

GODLEY'S PLAN

- ◆ Is 13-5 when issuing 3 or fewer walks (21 starts), posting a 3.65 ERA (51 ER in 125.2 IP).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ As a senior at University of Tennessee, in 2013, he led the SEC in complete games (6) and innings (108.1) and has second in strikeouts (98).
- ◆ Nickname is the "Bull" because his teammates at Tennessee called him that due to his demeanor on the mound and his sprints on and off the field.
- ◆ Is an avid bass fisherman...has accidentally sunk 2 boats.
- ◆ Roomed the majority of the 2017 with Andrew Chafin in his 42-foot RV.
- ◆ Was an alternate on the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, appearing in 4 games.
- ◆ Married to Autumn.

GOOD 'OLE UNCLE CHARLIE

- ◆ Leads all Major League starters by throwing a curveball 40.3 pct. of the time, ahead of Aaron Nola/PHI (30.4 pct.).
- ◆ His 40.19 percent swing-and-miss rate on his curveball, the sixth-best mark among all starters [min. 500 pitches] behind Blake Snell/TB (51.72), Charlie Morton/HOU (46.18), German Marquez/COL (44.83), Andrew Heaney/LAA (41.99), and Aaron Nola/PHI (40.78).
- ◆ Leads all starters [min. 200 pitches] with 122 strikeouts on his curveball, ahead of Morton (114).

COOL UNDER PRESSURE

- ◆ Owns a .214 opponent average (15-for-70) with runners in scoring position in his last 14 outings.

6+ Ks

- ◆ Recorded 6+ strikeouts in 10 straight games from July 13-Sept. 3, tied for the third longest streak by a NL pitcher this season with Max Scherzer (March 30-May 19) and behind Jacob deGrom (12; May 18-July 23) and Patrick Corbin (11; July 23-Sept. 17).
