**TODAY'S GAME:** The Cardinals host the Miami Marlins today at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium at 1:05 p.m....today's game will be streamed on cardinals.com....Redbird pitchers and catchers reported on Feb. 13 with the first full-squad workout on Feb. 19.

**LAST GAME:** Francisco Peña hit a two-out hit-and-run single to left field scoring Randy Arozarena as the Cardinals rallied to defeat the Nationals 4-3 at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium yesterday afternoon...Matt Bowman closed out the final four outs for the win in relief...Adam Wainwright threw 3.2 innings allowing one run and struck out four in his second start of the Spring...Greg Garcia homered off Max Scherzer and was 2-for-2 in the game.

**COMING UP:** The Cardinals make their first road trip to West Palm Beach tomorrow night to play the Houston Astros at 6:05 p.m., in the lone night game on their Grapefruit League schedule...the game will be the sixth of 10 straight games in Palm Beach County for the Cardinals...tomorrow's game will be televised on Fox Sports Midwest and streamed on cardinals.com.

**ON THE AIR:** The Cardinals will broadcast 18 Spring Training games on their radio flagship station KMOX 1120 AM...Mike Shannon, John Rooney, Mike Claiborne and Ricky Horton will be on the call...the 50,000-watt station can sometimes be heard as far south as Jupiter on a clear day.

**ON THE INTERNET:** The 11 games not broadcast on KMOX can be heard on cardinals.com with Tom Ackerman, Mike Claiborne, Chris Hrabec and Kyle McClellan calling the action.

**ON THE TUBE:** FOX Sports Midwest will televise 15 Spring Training games in 2018 with Dan McLaughlin, Jim Edmonds, Ricky Horton, Al Hrabosky, Tim McCarver, Rick Ankiel and Brad Thompson calling the action. Every telecast will be streamed live on the FOX Sports GO app and at FOXSportsGO.com. Games include 2/23 at MIA, 2/24 at NYM, 2/25 vs. HOU, 3/1 vs. MIN, 3/2 vs. BOS+, 3/4 vs. HOU, 3/5 vs. WSH, 3/9 at HOU, 3/10 vs/ MIA+, 3/11 at WSH, 3/16 vs. MIA, 3/17 at ATL, 3/18 at WSH, 3/24 vs. NYM, and 3/25 at WSH.

**LAST SEASON:** The Cardinals concluded their 126th season of play in the National League by finishing 3rd in the National League Central Division and 7th overall in the Senior Circuit with an 83-79 record, their 9th straight season with a winning record...Manager Mike Matheny has led the Cardinals to his 6th straight winning season since taking over the post in 2012.

**LAST SPRING:** The 2017 Cardinals posted a 20-8-4 spring record (12-2-2 at home, 8-6-2 at RDS), finishing leading all Grapefruit League and National League teams...they drew 90,318 fans to Roger Dean Stadium during 16 home games.

**March 5:** Signed INF Paul DeJong to a six-year contract with club option years in 2024 and 2025. Renewed OF Tommy Pham and signed 24 players to one-year contracts for 2018.

**March 4:** Reassigned RHP Hector Mendoza, RHP Daniel Ponce de Leon, LHP Jordan Schafer, RHP Jake Woodford, C Jeremy Martinez, C Dennis Ortega and INF Max Schrock to minor league camp.

**March 1:** Reassigned RHP Jordan Hicks to minor league camp.

**February 19:** Signed RHP Jason Motte as a minor league free agent with an invitation to Major League Spring Training.

**February 14:** Signed RHP Bud Norris as a free agent and designated RHP Rowan Wick for assignment.

• **GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE:** The St. Louis Cardinals are in their 127th season of play in the National League in 2018 and in the midst of their 21st Spring Training in Jupiter...today, the Cardinals celebrate the birthdays of outfielder Tommy Pham and Spring Training intern Meghan Boschert with a game featuring the two co-tenants at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium as the Cardinals host the Miami Marlins at 1:05 p.m.

• **CARDINALS VS. MARLINS:** The Cardinals play the third of seven Spring Training matchups against the Miami Marlins in the stadium both teams call home during Spring Training...St. Louis will be the home team in three of the seven games (today, Mar. 10 & 16)...Miami won the first game on Feb. 23 (6-4) and the two squads tied on Tuesday (3-3)...the Cardinals and Marlins will face-off in six games during their 2018 regular season series...June 5-7, the Cardinals host the Marlins for a three-game series in St. Louis, while the Marlins host at Marlins Park in a three-game series Aug. 6-8...last season, the Cardinals won the regular season series against the Marlins, 5-2 including a three-game sweep in Miami.

• **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER:** RHP Carlos Martínez makes his second start of Spring Training today...the Cardinals' right-hander pitched in a simulated game last Friday afternoon with Bud Norris making the start against the Red Sox in the Major League game...in his first start of the Spring, Martínez pitched 1.1 innings against the Mets on Feb. 24 allowing one run.

• **TOMORROW'S STARTING PITCHER:** RHP Miles Mikolas is scheduled to make his third start tomorrow night against the Houston Astros at FITTEAM Ballpark of the Palm Beaches at 6:05 p.m.

• **RUNNIN' REDBIRDS:** Through 13 Spring Training games, the Cardinals lead MLB with 20 steals in 25 attempts (80.0%) including back-to-back games with a steal of home plate...the Rockies rank second with 16 and the next closest Grapefruit League team is the Pirates with 13...Kolten Wong leads the majors with six steals and teammate Oscar Mercado ranks second with five.

• **SIGN, SIGN, EVERYWHERE THEY'RE SIGNED:** The Cardinals announced Monday they signed 24 players to one-year contracts for the 2018 season and renewed OF Tommy Pham for the 2018 season.

• **FOREVER DEJONG:** Infielder Paul DeJong was signed to a six-year (2018-2023) contract with two club option years in 2024 and 2025 on Monday...the 24-year old infielder finished second in the National League Rookie of the Year voting in 2017.

• **CARDINALS REASSIGN SEVEN:** The Cardinals reassigned seven players to minor league camp following Sunday's game (RHP Hector Mendoza, RHP Daniel Ponce de Leon, LHP Jordan Schafer, RHP Jake Woodford, C Jeremy Martinez, C Dennis Ortega, INF Max Schrock)...six Cardinals first round picks are on the roster: INF Kolten Wong (2011), RHP Michael Wacha (2012), RHP Luke Weaver (2014), RHP Jack Flaherty (2014), RHP Jake Woodford (2015) and RHP Dakota Hudson (2016)...the roster currently lists 56 players with 16 non-roster invites.

• **IT'S A GIRL!** Cardinals MLB.com writer Jen Langosch and her husband, Matt Segal, yesterday (March 7) welcomed newborn daughter Audrey Rose...Mom, Dad and baby are doing great, and rumor has it, the Cardinals have a baby contract ready to be presented to Audrey when the team gets back home to St. Louis. • **MIKE AND THE MAD DOG:** Cardinals manager Mike Matheny has a few new faces on his coaching staff including veteran pitching coach Mike Maddux, who spent last season with the Washington Nationals and previous years with the Texas Rangers and Milwaukee Brewers after a 15-year playing career in the majors...Jose Oquendo returns to the Major League staff as the third base coach, Bryan Eversgerd was named bullpen coach, Willie McGee as coach and Mike Shildt moves from third base coach to bench coach.

# TODAY'S PITCHERS

## #18 CARLOS MARTÍNEZ • RHP • 26 yrs

- Established career-bests in 2017 in starts (32), innings pitched (205.0), strikeouts (217) and opponent batting average (.232) in the first year of a five-year contract extension signed before the season.
- Selected to the 2017 National League All-Star team by player vote, the second of his career (2015, Final Fan Vote). Joined Dizzy Dean (1934) as the only two Cardinals with 4 strikeouts in an All-Star Game.
- Ranked among National League leaders in shutouts (2, 1st), batters faced (858, T1st), innings (2nd), strikeouts (4th), quality starts (20, T4th), starts (T5th), opponent batting average (8th), SO/9 IP (9.53, 9th), H/9 IP (7.86, 9th), WHIP (1.22, T10th), and ERA (3.64, 14th).
- Became the 7th Cardinal to reach the 200 strikeout plateau, joining Bob Gibson (9x), Adam Wainwright (3x) Jose DeLeon (2x), Chris Carpenter (1x), Steve Carlton (1x) and Sam Jones (1x).
- Spotted five double-digit strikeout games (7th, N.L.) and has 8 in his career, T6th most among Cardinals pitchers since Division Play began.
- His 52.0 ground ball percentage ranked 3rd in the NL. Induced team-leading 21 GIDP (T8th) and was 10th in the NL in GIDP/9.0 (0.92).

## #59 MIKE MAYERS • RHP • 26 yrs

- Converted into a relief pitcher 15 starts into 2017 after making 88 consecutive minor league starts from 2013-17.
- Spent the majority of the season with Memphis (AAA) but was recalled to St. Louis on three separate occasions (6/25-7/2, 7/26, 8/18-19).
- Made three MLB relief appearances (4.2 IP) striking out at least one batter in all three. Threw a season-high 3.0 IP 7/2 vs. WSH.
- Was 5-6 with a 3.71 ERA in 15 starts at Memphis covering 80.0 innings, while posting a 2.12 ERA in 16 relief appearances over 29.2 innings.
- Was converted from a starting pitcher to a reliever following the Triple-A All-Star Break after 15 starts.
- Posted career-highs with 109.2 innings and 97 strikeouts.
- Pitched a season-high 3.0 innings in relief twice: 7/27 vs. Salt Lake & 8/5 at Tacoma.
- Struck out a season-high 10 batters over 7.0 innings in a win vs. Omaha (6/3).
- Made five relief appearances during the Pacific Coast League playoffs. Recorded a win and two Holds in 10.0 scoreless innings, allowing six hits, three walks and striking out nine.

## #88 RYAN HELSLEY • RHP • 23 yrs

- 2017 Florida State League Most Valuable Pitcher.
- Has posted a .786 career winning percentage (22-6) in the minor leagues striking out an average of 9.4 batters per nine innings pitched.
- Combined to post an 11-3 record with a 2.72 ERA over 23 starts (24 app.) in 2017 between Palm Beach (A), Springfield (AA) and Memphis (AAA).
- Ranked among Cardinals minor league leaders in wins (11, 4th), ERA (2.72, 6th), innings pitched (132.1, 7th), strikeouts (137, 3rd), opponent BA (.215, 2nd) and games started (23, T6th).
- Threw a four-hit shutout over 7.0 innings with a season-high 11 strikeouts at Lakeland (5/25) in the second game of a doubleheader. Was one of eight pitchers in the Florida State League to record a shutout.
- Won his final six decisions in the Florida State League (5/19-7/16).
- Made two starts in the Pacific Coast League playoffs and was 0-2 with a 6.30 ERA over 10.0 innings.
- Rated as the No. 10 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*. Also rated by the same publication as the No. 10 prospect in the Florida State League following the season.

## #55 DOMINIC LEONE • RHP • 26 yrs

- Was acquired in a trade from Toronto with RHP Conner Greene for OF Randal Grichuk.
- Has been involved in multi-player trades twice in his career, once in a six-player trade between the Mariners and Diamondbacks on June 3, 2015 and a three-player trade between the Cardinals and Blue Jays on January 19, 2018.
- Posted Major League career highs with 65 appearances, 70.1 innings pitched and 81 strikeouts in 2017.
- Was one of four Blue Jays pitchers to appear in 65 or more games (Tepera 73, Loup 70, Osuna 66).
- Ranked T3rd among American League relievers in Inherited Runners with a career-high 54 and T13th in Inherited Runners Scored percentage (22.2%).
- Held opposing batters to a .202 BA, 2nd-lowest among Blue Jays relievers behind Roberto Osuna (.197).
- His 81 strikeouts in relief ranked T17th among American League relief pitchers. Averaged 10.36 strikeouts/9 IP, 2nd on the club behind Roberto Osuna (11.67).
- Pitched on consecutive days 13 times during the season.
- Recorded his first Major League save vs. BAL (9/11/17) tossing a scoreless inning with two strikeouts.

## #65 RYAN SHERRIFF • LHP • 27 yrs

- Purchased from Memphis (AAA) on 8/23/17 and made his MLB debut 8/25 vs. TB with 3.0 scoreless innings, striking out a season-high four batters on 43 pitches.
- Held opposing Major League left-handed batters to a .080 average (2-25) with two singles, zero walks, a hit batsman and seven strikeouts in 2017.
- Selected to the Triple-A Mid-Season All-Star Game with Memphis (AAA) the past two seasons (2016-17).
- Pitched for Team Israel in the 2017 World Baseball Classic qualifying games.
- Became a full-time relief pitcher in 2014 and has posted a 2.95 ERA over 228.2 innings and 168 relief appearances since then.
- Of his 172 career minor league relief appearances, 84 have been four outs or more and 37 of them 2.0 innings or more.
- Picked up first Major League win 9/6 at SD with 2.0 scoreless innings as Cardinals rallied for three runs in a 3-1 win.
