LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the second game of a nine-game (1-0) road trip to **Minnesota** (June 8-10; 1-0), **Seattle** (June 11-13) and **Oakland** (June 15-17)...Club has on off day June 14...18 of next 24 games are on the road...**Halos have won five straight and six of last seven games...LAA has outscored opponents 29-15 in their last seven games...Angels are 23-25 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 11-7-2 in 20 series.**

OHTANI TO D.L. Shohei Ohtani has been placed on the 10-day disabled list (retro to 6/7) with a grade 2 sprain of the UCL. He underwent a PRP and stem cell injection Thursday with **Dr. Steve Yoon** in Los Angeles. He will be re-evaluated in 3 weeks and his plan of care will be updated at that time.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 31 of last 36 games...**LAA starting pitchers have fashioned an A.L. best 2.63 ERA (209 IP – 61 ER) since May 1... Angels are only team in MLB to boast five starters with 3.50 ERAs or lower (min. 7 starts)...**Angels' team ERA of 2.86 ERA for May was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

YOU READ THAT RIGHT: **Mike Trout** is on pace for a 14.1 WAR season...Since 1900, the only player to finish with a 14+ WAR campaign was **Babe Ruth** in 1923...**Trout** had 54.2 career wins above replacement entering 2018 - only player with more WAR through his age-25 season was **Ty Cobb** (56.0). *ESPN STATS*

MVP x 3? **Mike Trout** ranks second in MLB with 19 HRs...**With his next HR he will become the first player in franchise history with 20+ HR's in 7 straight seasons...**On pace for a career-best 48 homers...Ranks second in MLB with 147 total bases and leads MLB with 52 runs and a .438 OBP.

HOT HALOS: Over his last 10 games, **Ian Kinsler** is batting .366 (15/41) with nine runs, four doubles, five home runs and 10 RBI...Since a 6-for-44 (.136) slide to end May (5/16-31), **Justin Upton** has opened June 11-for-26 (.423) with four home runs and five RBI...He is the first Angel with 15 home runs as a left fielder (min. 100 G in LF) in a season since **Vernon Wells** (25 home runs) in 2011...**Martin Maldonado** has hits in 12 of last 15 games...**12 RBI his last 15 games...**Hitting .319 (30/94) with seven doubles and three home runs since May 1.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ME! On his 27th birthday Tuesday, **Andrew Heaney** tossed his first career complete game and shutout...First complete game one-hitter for Angels since **Ervin Santana** on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since **Chuck Finley** on May 26, 1989 at Boston...First player to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' **Vicente Palacios** on July 19, 1994 at Houston... First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since **Andy Messersmith** on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.

YOUNG BLOODS: Angels selected outfielder **Jordyn Adams** (1st round, 17th overall) out of Green Hope HS (Cary, NC) and INF **Jeremiah Jackson** (2nd round, 57th overall) from St. Luke's Episcopal School (Mobile, AL) on the first day of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...LAA chose high school players with their first two picks for the first time since 2010 when **Kaleb Cowart** (18th overall) and **Cam Bedrosian** (29th overall) were selected.

JUNE BUG: **Mike Trout's** .348 (184-for-528) career batting average in the month of June is the highest average amongst active players (min. 400 PA) in any month of the season.

SHO-ING OFF: **Shohei Ohtani** is the fourth Japanese-born pitcher with 60+ strikeouts through his first nine MLB games, joining **Hideo Nomo** (75), **Masahiro Tanaka** (73) and **Yu Darvish** (63)...His 61 strikeouts are a club record through a pitchers' first nine career starts and leads 2018 A.L. rookies... Ranks second among A.L. rookies in ERA with 3.10 (behind teammate **Jaime Barria's** 2.48 ERA)...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs over each of his last five starts with a 2.17 ERA (29.0 IP – 7 ER)...Halos are 7-2 overall in his starts.

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? **Andrelton Simmons** (10-day DL) has hits in 11 of 12 with an AB and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...**He has struck out just twice since May 1 (139 PA)...**Has reached base safely in 39 of last 41 games...**Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.2 (242 PA/10 K) and ranks fourth in A.L. batting .330...** Leads LAA with 19 multi-hit games.

MIKE'S MILESTONE: **Mike Scioscia** posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons **Tommy Lasorda** (1,599).

PJOLLS POINTS: **Albert Pujols** has 3,025 career hits – good for 27th all-time...**Rod Carew** is next on the all-time hit list at 3,053...**Pujols** collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just 4th player to log 600 HR and 3,000 hits (**Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez**)...**Pujols** sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (**David Ortiz**, 632)...Ranks seventh all-time in RBI with 1,950...**Stan Musial** is next on the list with 1,951 RBI (*Baseball-Reference.com*).

June 9
(1961) Angels' pitcher **Ryne Duran**, in the second game of a doubleheader at Boston, set an A.L. record by striking out seven consecutive batters in the Angels' 5-1 win.

June 10
(1997) **Jim Edmonds** makes one of the most spectacular catches in Angels' history at Kansas City as he dives toward the fence in straight away center field with his back to home plate...“The Catch”, as it became known, is named as baseball play of the year by several sport television stations and publications; **(1992)** **Luis Polonia** tied a club record by stealing four bases in a game at Chicago...Polonia was the second Angels' player to accomplish the feat (now done three times, also by **Devon White** and **Chad Curtis**).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – LHP TYLER SKAGGS

4-4, 3.27 ERA

First career appearance at Target Field

- Making 13th start of the season and seventh on the road...Second start of 2018 vs. Minnesota...Is in sixth Major League season (fourth with Angels)...Made Opening Day roster for third time in career (also, 2014 & 2017).
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in nine of 11 starts this season...His nine starts with two-or-fewer runs are tied for third most in the Majors this season among left-handers.
- **INSIDE THE PARK:** Has yielded six home runs across last five starts after allowing two homers through first seven starts.
- **LEFT OUT:** Is holding lefties to a .160 (12/75) batting average this season, which ranks as seventh best in the A.L.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in last start on Sunday vs. Texas after working six scoreless innings and allowing four hits and three walks with strikeouts...13th scoreless start of career (11th of at least six innings pitched).
- **STRIKEOUT STREAK:** Has recorded 5+ strikeouts in a career high seven straight games...Last Angels lefty with 5+ strikeouts in eight consecutive contests was **C.J. Wilson** in 2013.
- **THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD:** Has pitched to a 3-1 record and 2.94 ERA (33.2 IP – 11 ER) on the road this season, compared with a 1-3 record and 3.62 ERA (32.1 IP – 13 ER) at home.
- **EARLY SUCCESS:** In 27 career regular season starts from March-May, is 9-8 with a 3.77 ERA (167 IP – 70 ER) and 156 strikeouts...From June-October in 41 starts, is 8-17 with a 4.82 ERA (214.2 IP – 115 ER) and 183 strikeouts.
- **GETTING FAMILIAR:** Since start of 2017, has allowed two home runs the first time through the batting order in a game (252 PA), but has yielded 16 HR in 249 PA the second time through the order in a game in that span.
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** Today marks second career start vs. Twins...Is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (6 IP – 2 ER)...Did not factor in decision in only previous start vs. Minnesota earlier this season on May 11 at Angel Stadium after tossing six innings and allowing two earned runs on six hits with two walks and seven strikeouts
- **AGAINST THE A.L. CENTRAL:** In 11 career starts, is 2-3 with a 3.26 ERA (66.1 IP – 24 ER)...The ERA is his best mark against any of baseball's six divisions.
- **AT TARGET FIELD:** Today marks first career appearance at Target Field.
- **300 K's:** Recorded 300th career strikeout against **Aaron Hicks** in 4th inning on April 29 vs. New York (A.L.)
- **NEW CAREER HIGH:** Set career high with 114 pitches thrown on April 10 at Texas (previous was 105 pitches for Arizona on Aug. 27, 2012 vs. Cincinnati).
- **SEASON DEBUT:** Earned the win in first start of year on March 30 at Oakland after working 6.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with no walks and five strikeouts...With win this year, is now 5-1 with a 1.60 ERA (39.1 IP – 7 ER) in his six career season debuts.
- **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:** During the offseason, represented Angels at the annual Kids Holiday Party event for the Angels Baseball Foundation at the ESPN Zone in Downtown Disney.
- **2017 RECAP:** Made 16 starts for Angels last year and pitched to a 2-6 record and 4.55 ERA (85 IP – 43 ER) with 76 strikeouts...Missed 85 games on disabled list with a right oblique muscle strain suffered on Apr. 28 at Texas...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in seven of 11 contests following return from disabled list.

- Owns a 17-25 career record with a 4.36 ERA (381.2 IP – 185 ER) and 339 strikeouts in 69 career games (all starts).
- Underwent Tommy John surgery on August 13, 2014 by **Dr. Neal Elattrache** after suffering left forearm strain during start on July 31, 2014 at Baltimore
- Originally drafted by Angels in 1st round (40th overall) of the 2009 amateur draft...Was traded by Angels to D-backs on August 7, 2010 in the deal which brought **Dan Haren** to the Halos...Acquired back by Angels on December 10, 2013 along with LHP **Hector Santiago** in trade which sent OF **Mark Trumbo** and RHP **A.J. Schugel** to Arizona.
