WASHINGTON NATIONALS (42-39) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (44-37)

Sunday, July 1, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 1:35 EDT – Game 82; Home 44

RHP Gio Gonzalez (6-5, 3.68) vs RHP Jake Arrieta (5-6, 3.54)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies won a tight 3-2 game against the Nationals at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Vince Velasquez tossed 2.0 innings and allowed 1 run in 3 hits, walking 1 and striking out 3 before being struck in the arm with a line drive and leaving the game ... The bullpen picked him up, allowing a lone run in 7.0 innings of work ... Odubel Herrera clubbed his 14th home run of the season.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Today, the Phillies placed RHP Vince Velasquez on the 10-day DL with a right forearm contusion and optioned LHP Zac Curtis to Lehigh Valley (AAA) ... To take their spots on the 25-man roster, RHP Pat Neshek was reinstated from the 10-day DL and RHP Jake Thompson was recalled from Lehigh Valley.
- MONTH OF FEATS:** With June coming to an end last night, a number of Phillies players had exceptional performances in the month ... Center fielder **Odubel Herrera** clubbed his seventh and final home run of the month last night, his career-high for any month ... He tied Willie Montanez (14 in 1971) for the 2nd-most homers ever by a Phillies center fielder before July 1, trailing Cy Williams' 21 in 1923 ... His 14 homers already tie his total from 2017 and are one shy of his career high (15 in 2016) ... First baseman **Carlos Santana** walked 28 times in June, tied with Joey Votto for the most in the majors in the month and with Greg Luzinski (1980) for the most ever by a Phillie in June .. His 28 walks were most by any Phillie in any month since Ryan Howard walked 35 times in Sept. 2006 ... He ranks 4th in MLB with 62 walks this season ... Outfielder **Rhys Hoskins** led all MLB players who played in 20 or fewer games in June in homers (8, next-closest 5) and RBI (22, next-closest 14) ... Hoskins is just the fourth Phillie since at least 1913 with eight home runs in 20 or fewer games in a month, joining Scott Rolen (11 HR in July 1999), Pete Incaviglia (8 HR in June 1994) and Mike Schmidt (11 HR in April 1976, 9 HR in August 1981) ... Only Schmidt in August 1981 (24) and Rolen in July 1999 (25) have had more RBI ... The trio of **Aaron Nola**, **Vince Velasquez** and **Nick Pivetta** all reached their 100th strikeout of the season, marking the first time three Phillies had at least 100 before July since 2011, when Roy Halladay, Cliff Lee and Cole Hamels did so, per Elias ... **RHP Zach Eflin** joined Jon Lester as the only pitchers to go 5-0 or better in June, and he ranked 7th in MLB ERA (1.76).
- MEET ME HALFWAY:** With yesterday marking the halfway point in the season (81 games), the Phillies sit at 44-37, their best record through 81 games since 2011 (50-31) ... Their run differential of +5 (354-349) is a 102-point improvement over their mark through 81 games in 2017 (-87, 316-403) ... Their 94 home runs are the most through June since they clubbed 107 in the first three months of 2009, before going on to hit a club-record 224 homers.
- WRITTEN IN 'PEN:** Yesterday, the Phillies bullpen fired 7.0 innings of one-run ball en route to the victory, marking the first time since Sept. 30, 2015 the Phillies bullpen has pitched at least 7.0 innings and allowed one or no runs in a 9.0-inning win ... The relief corps has pitched 7.0 innings in consecutive games for the first time since May 30-31, 2014 vs NYM.
- WEATHERING THE STORM:** The Phillies have one game remaining in a 42-game stretch that began on May 17 with a four-games series against the St. Louis Cardinals ... **The Phillies have faced 10 different teams over those 42 games (STL, ATL, TOR, LAD, SF, CHI, MIL, COL, WSH & NYY) and as of today, those 10 teams currently have a combined record of 445-372 (.545 win %) ...** Through 41 games in their most grueling stretch of the season, the Phillies are 20-21 and have won 12 of their last 19 games (6/10-current) ... Following this showdown with the Nationals, the Phillies will host the Orioles (23-59) for two games before heading out on an 11-game road trip and face the Pirates (39-43) for three , Mets (32-48) for four, Orioles again for one and Marlins (34-50) for three ... **The combined record of Philadelphia's final four opponents before the break is 128-200 (.390 win %).**
- ON THE OFFENSIVE:** Over the last 16 games (6/14-current), the Phillies are averaging 5.19 runs per game (83 R) while slashing a combined .268/.353/.479 ... **They have clubbed 26 home runs in that span and tallied 68 walks, both of which are second in the majors.**
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 38-21 in their last 59 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .644 win percentage over that stretch ranks 4th in the majors behind only the Yankees (.732), Indians (.692) and Cubs (.674).
- SERIESLY SPEAKING:** With a win today, the Phillies will have won five of their last six series dating back to 6/12 vs COL ... **It would also mark two straight series wins over Washington for the first time since they won three straight, 8/25/14-4/12/15.**
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 12 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3rd, 17.9%) and **Cesar Hernandez** (11th, 14.8 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (12th, 14.7%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.3 %, next-closest, CIN and LAD, 9.8 %) and also rank 1st in pitches per plate appearance (4.05) and are 2nd in walks (315) ... Pitch tracking data dates back to 1988 and over the last 30 years, the previous high for a Phillies team was 3.93 pitches per plate appearance in 2017 ... Philadelphia has finished a season with a walk rate greater than 10.0% only eight times in franchise history (last: 2002-05, 4 straight seasons).

LAST START: 6/26 vs NYY: L, 5.0 IP, 9 H, 6 R, 3 ER, BB, 5 SO, 2 HR ... Arrieta vs Severino ... The Phillies went 0-for-4 with RISP and left six men on base ... It marked Philadelphia's first series loss in almost three weeks as their four-series win streak was snapped.

TODAY'S START:

- **He Didn't Earn It:** Has allowed 14 unearned runs this season, most in baseball and more than twice as many as the next-closest NL pitcher (6) ... It has been 20 years since a Phillies pitcher allowed that many unearned runs in an entire season (1999, Paul Byrd, 17)
- **Double or Nothing:** Has induced 15 ground ball double plays this season, most among NL starters and tied for second-most among all starters with SEA's Marco Gonzales, trailing SEA's Mike Leake... There was only 1 other season in his career he induced more than 10 in an entire year (17 in 2016)
- **June Swoon:** Has allowed 27 runs (19 ER) in 25.2 innings in June ... Has allowed a home run in each of his 4 June starts (7 total) after allowing 2 in his first 10 starts of the season
- **Hard to Hit:** Has held opponents to a .225 AG in his career, which is the 5th-lowest among active starters (min. 1,000.0 IP), behind only Clayton Kershaw (.207), Chris Sale (.223), Max Scherzer (.223) and Stephen Strasburg (.223)
- **vs NL East:** 14-8, 3.32 ERA (80 ER, 217.0 IP) in 36 starts ... **Has an active 18.0-inning scoreless streak against NL East clubs**

- **2018:** 3-2, 2.42 ERA (13 ER, 48.1 IP) in 8 starts
- **Career:** 43-28, 3.35 (229 ER, 614.1 IP) in 102 games (100 starts)
- **CBP:** 5-2, 1.99 ERA (14 ER, 63.1 IP) in 10 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Posted a 0.90 ERA (3 ER, 30.0 IP) in his 5 starts during May, becoming 1 of just 7 Phillies ever to make 5+ starts in a month with a sub-1.00 ERA (last: Cliff Lee, Aug. 2011)
- Per Elias, was the first Phillies pitcher to allow 1 or 0 home runs in consecutive months in which he made 5 or more starts since 2001 (Brandon Duckworth, Aug.-Sep.)
- Had a 13.1-inning scoreless streak, 5/6-5/18
- Did not allow a homer in 28.1 straight IP in parts of 6 starts, 4/8-5/6
- Had a stretch of 18 straight starts allowing 3 ER or fewer from 7/2/17-4/25/18, the second-longest such streak of his career
- Struck out 10 batters on 4/19 vs PIT, his 14th career double-digit strikeout game and first start of 10+ SO, 1 H or fewer by a Phillie starter since Cole Hamels' no-hitter in his final start as a Phillie, 7/25/15 at CHI
- Pitched in his 200th career game on 4/19 vs PIT and made his 200th start on 5/23 vs ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Led the team in wins (14) and totaled at least 30 starts for the third consecutive season
- In 12 starts following the All-Star break, posted a 2.28 ERA (17 ER, 67.0 IP), which ranked 6th among qualifying NL pitchers (3rd among starters) in that span
- Named NL Pitcher of the Month for August (4-1, 1.21 ERA), when he led all NL starters in ERA and T-1st in wins
- Had a stretch of 72 consecutive starts (9/2/14-4/22/17) of at least 5.0 innings snapped, 4/28 at BOS (4.1 IP); that was the longest stretch by a CHI pitcher since 1908
- Went 1-1 with a 0.84 ERA (1 ER, 10.2 IP) in two postseason starts: Game 4 of the NLDS, 10/11 vs WSH and Game 4 of the NLCS, 10/18 vs LAD

CAREER:

- Was the 2015 National League Cy Young Award Winner (5th in CHI history), and in 2016 earned his first career All-Star selection and Silver Slugger Award
- Has tossed two career no-hitters: 8/30/15 at LAD and 4/21/16 at CIN
 - Became the 8th pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter in consecutive seasons ... His second came in his 10th start after tossing his first, the third-shortest time between no-hitters in MLB history
- Recorded a career and CHI franchise-best 20 consecutive wins from 8/4/15-5/25/16, which tied for the third-longest streak in MLB history (since 1913)
- In 9 career postseason starts, is 5-3, 3.08 ERA (18 ER, 52.2 IP), 66 SO (most in CHI postseason history), .189 OPP AVG and hit a HR as a batter ... Allowed just 3 ER in 11.1 IP (2.38 ERA) in two starts during the 2016 World Series
- Signed by PHI as a free agent on 3/12/18 ... Originally selected by BAL in the 5th round of the June 2007 draft
