TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the final of 3 games vs. Kansas City (2-0)...will have an off day on Monday before facing Los Angeles-AL (3 G) and Colorado (3 G) on this homestand...went 5-5 on a recently-concluded 11-day, 10-game, 3-city road trip to New York-AL (0-3), Boston (1-2) and Baltimore (4-0)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won a season-high 6 straight games and are 7-6 over their last 13 contests...they have won 13 of their last 20 games, 20 of their last 29, 24 of their last 35, 29 of their last 41 and 31 of their last 45...Seattle is 39-20 in its last 59 games, 44-23 over its last 67 games and 49-27 in its last 76 games...Seattle is 15-14 during the day and 38-17 at night...Seattle is 27-14 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Close Calls** - the Mariners have played 50 games decided by 2 or fewer runs this season, tops in the Majors...they are 36-14 (.720) in those games, the top winning percentage in all of baseball...5 of the team's last 6 games has been decided by 2 or fewer runs, with the Mariners going 5-0...since June 14, 10 of the club's last 16 games have been decided by 2 or fewer runs, with the Mariners going 7-3 in those 10 games.
- **Electric Eddie** - Edwin Diaz's 31 saves are the most in club history prior to the All-Star Break (previous: Kazuhiro Sasaki, 29, 2001)...the Mariners are 39-0 when Diaz enters the game with a lead, including 21-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...he is 19-for-21 in 1-run save opportunities (90.5%) with a 0.84 ERA (2 ER, 21.1 IP) with 37 strikeouts and 5 walks.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - Jean Segura leads the Majors with 35 multi-hit games, ahead of Nick Markakis-ATL (34)...Segura also leads the Majors with 15 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12).
- **First Things First** - Dee Gordon is batting .333 (23x69) when leading off a game this season.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 39-10 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 14-21 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 23 of their first 28 series, posting a series record of 17-5-6.
- **Extra! Extra!** - The Mariners are 8-0 in extra inning games this season (the only undefeated team in the Majors)...dating back to July 16, 2017, the Mariners have won 14 consecutive extra-inning games, the longest such streak since the Orioles won 17 straight extra-inning contests, April 16, 2012 - April 18, 2013.
- **Comeback Wins** - the Mariners have recorded 24 come-from-behind victories this season, which lead the Majors, ranking ahead of Boston (23), Chicago-NL (23), New York-AL (23) and Philadelphia (23).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY...Nelson Cruz is celebrating his 38th birthday today...on his birthday, Cruz has hit safely in each of the 8 seasons he has played (2009-12, 2014-17), batting .379 (11x29) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs and 9 RBI in 8 games...he hit a home run on his birthday in 2015, 2014 and 2011.

TAKE A SWING AT CF...tomorrow, Monday, July 2, the Seattle Mariners will host the 33rd annual Cystic Fibrosis Mariners Care Golf Tournament at Broadmoor Golf Club to help find a cure for cystic fibrosis, a fatal disease afflicting children and young adults...the event, held annually since 1986, has raised over \$5.9 million for the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS...the Mariners are looking to sweep the Kansas City Royals for the 14th time in club history (series of 3 or more games) and first time June 20-22, 2014 at Kauffman Stadium...also looking for the first sweep of the Royals at home since a 4-game sweep, July 26-29, 2012.

HIGHWATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 22 games over .500 at 53-31...with a win today, Seattle would be at least 23 games over .500 for the first time since being 93-69 (.574) after game #162 of the 2003 season (24 games over .500).

LET'S GO STREAKING...the Mariners have won a season-high 6 consecutive games...the last time the Mariners won 6 straight games was June 18-23, 2017, but haven't won at least 7 consecutive games since an 8-game winning streak, Sept. 7-14, 2016.

WHAT A MONTH...the Mariners finished the month of June going 19-9...the 19 wins are a team high in a single month this season...marks the 18th time in club history to finish June with at least a .500 record or better...the 19 wins in June are currently T2nd-most in club history (also: 2000), trailing only 20 wins in 1997 (20-7-741).

CRUZ CONTROL...Nelson Cruz has hit safely in 25 of his last 34 games (5/24-c), batting .333 (42x126) with 23 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 33 RBI, 3 HBP, 14 walks, a .410 on-base percentage and a .714 slugging percentage (1.124 OPS)...Cruz leads the Major Leagues in home runs and slugging percentage since May 24, while also ranking 3rd in RBI, 4th in OPS, T9th in hits and T13th in on-base percentage.

AMONG THE BEST...since May 8, the Mariners have a .667 (34-17) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail only Houston (.688/33-15), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.630/29-17), Boston (.620/31-19) and Milwaukee (.596/28-19)...the Mariners 34 wins are the most in the Majors since May 8, ranking ahead of the Astros (33-15)...the Mariners join the Astros, Yankees and Red Sox as the only American League clubs with a .600 winning percentage since May 8.

OFF TO THE RACES...Dee Gordon enters today's game with 299 career stolen bases...he is 1 steal shy of becoming the 3rd active player (currently on a 25-man roster) with at least 300 career stolen bases...he would join Jose Reyes (516) and Rajai Davis (410) in that club...Gordon's 299 stolen bases are tops in the Majors since making his debut in 2011, ranking ahead of Davis (267) and Billy Hamilton (259)...Gordon, who currently leads the American League with 21 steals, has led his respective league in stolen bases in 3 previous seasons: 2014 with Los Angeles-NL (64), 2015 with Miami (58) and 2017 with Miami (60).

HOMER HAPPY...dating back to June 5 the Mariners have recorded 38 home runs in 25 games, including homering in 6 straight games...the team's 38 home runs during this stretch are 2nd-most in the Majors and trail Los Angeles-NL (46)...57 of the Mariners 117 runs scored (48.7%) during this 25-game stretch have come via the home run (22 solo HR, 13 2-R HR, 3 3-R HR)...the Mariners have had 7 players record at least 1 home run since June 5, including 11 home runs by Nelson Cruz, 7 home runs by Ryon Healy and 6 home runs by Kyle Seager.

AS YOU KNOW...Ryon Healy hit the Mariners 101st home run of the season last night, the 6,500th home runs in franchise history...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...the Mariners 101 home run through the end of June are T7th-most in club history (also: 2000) and trail only 1999 (134), 1998 (129), 1997 (125), 1996 (123), 2016 (114) and 1994 (110)...the team's 101 home runs are already T10th-most in club history prior to the All-Star break.

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 18th start of 2018, his 92nd career MLB start, and 6th career start vs. the Royals today.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game...named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.
- Is 8-2 with a 2.70 ERA (21 ER, 70.0 IP) in 11 career starts in July.

LAST OUTING...W#7 in his last start, a 3-2 Mariners win at Baltimore on June 26...allowed 2 runs on 6 hits and 1 walk while striking out 10 across 7.0 innings pitched...marked his team-leading 11th quality start of the season and the 6th time this season he has gone at least 7.0 innings and allowed 2 or fewer earned runs...struck out the side in the 7th inning; faced the minimum in 5 of his 7 innings pitched...surrendered a solo home run to Danny Valencia to lead off the 2nd inning...loaded the bases on 3 consecutive singles to lead off the 6th inning; run scored as Manny Machado grounded into a double play.

HEATING UP...since May 1, ranks 6th in the Majors with 0.97 WHIP and has held opponents to a .210 batting average against (55x262), the 16th-lowest mark in the Majors...has gone 6-1 with a 3.00 ERA (24 ER, 72.0 IP) with 90 strikeouts since May 1.

LEADERBOARD...ranks 6th in the Majors with an 11.63 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings ratio (134 K, 103.2 IP)...his 6 games with 10-or-more strikeouts are tied for 4th-most in the Majors, trailing only Max Scherzer-WAS (10), Trevor Bauer-CLE (7) and Chris Sale-BOS (7)...Paxton ranks 5th in the American League (T6th in the Majors) with 134 strikeouts, trailing Sale (164), Cole (151), Bauer (148) and Justin Verlander-HOU (144).

THE RIGHT STUFF...has held right-handed hitters to a .186 batting average (54x290), while lefties have batted .352 (25x71) against Paxton this season.

NO-NO...pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in Toronto on May 8...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout.

- Is the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.
- Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with the Texas Rangers...STATS, Inc.
- Marks the Mariners 4th no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for most during that span.
- Marks the 3rd no-hitter in the Majors this season (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS; four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).

KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK...recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts across 7.0 scoreless innings on May 2 vs. OAK...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single game in the Majors this season (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/4 at ARI)...marks the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson struck out 19 on 8/8/97 vs. CWS...became the first pitcher in Mariners history to record at least 2 strikeouts in each of the first 7 innings of a start.

WHIFF...recorded 49 strikeouts over his 5 starts from April 11 to May 2...is one of 5 Mariners pitchers in club history (done 65x) with at least 49 strikeouts over a span of 5 starts, the first since Félix Hernández also had 49 strikeouts over 5 starts, June 23 - July 14, 2012...Randy Johnson accomplished this feat 56 times while with the Mariners, followed by Mark Langston (4), Mike Moore (3), Hernández (1) and Paxton (1).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 45 walks in 24 starts... led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...spent two stints on the 10-day DL (5/3-30/17, 8/11-9/15/17)...went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks in 6 starts in July; named AL Pitcher of the Month...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 2 AL Player of the Week honors in a single season.

HAVE YOURSELF A MONTH...in 6 starts in the month of July, went 6-0 with a 1.37 ERA (6 ER, 39.1 IP) with 46 strikeouts and 6 walks...became the first pitcher in club history to earn 6 wins in a calendar month...his 1.37 ERA for July was the lowest in calendar month by a Mariners pitcher since Félix Hernández posted a 1.22 ERA (6 ER, 44.1 IP) in June of 2014...Paxton's 1.37 ERA in July was 7th-lowest in club history by a Mariners left-hander in a calendar month and the lowest since Jamie Moyer posted a 1.01 ERA (4 ER, 35.2 IP) in June of 2002...earned the win in 7 consecutive starts, July 2, 2017-Aug. 4, 2017...equaled the club record for wins in consecutive starts (also: Jamie Moyer, 5/6-6/8/03, and Scott Bankhead, 6/18-7/20/89).

CAREER...is 36-22 with a 3.37 ERA (194 ER, 518.2 IP) with 533 strikeouts in 90 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. TB.
