1968 WORLD CHAMPIONS 50TH ANNIVERSARY WEEKEND

As a tribute to the storied history of the Detroit Tigers and its 1968 World Championship, the Tigers will honor the 50th anniversary of the 1968 World Champions this weekend vs. St. Louis, Detroit's opponent in the 1968 World Series. Tonight's festivities include:

Promotional Giveaway: The first 20,000 fans attending tonight's game will receive a **1968 commemorative road jersey**, courtesy of Comerica Bank.

Throwback uniforms: The Tigers and Cardinals will each wear 1968 throwback uniforms for tonight's game.

1968 World Champions Pregame Ceremony: Members of the Tigers 1968 World Championship Team will be honored during a special pregame on-field ceremony. **Fans are encouraged to be in their seats at 5:15 p.m.** The ceremony will commence with the Comerica Bank Parade of Champions that will take place on field, featuring 15 Corvettes and one Camaro, courtesy of the Metro Detroit Chevy Dealers.

Ceremonial First Pitches: The ceremonial first pitches will be thrown by **Al Kaline, Willie Horton, Mickey Lolich, and Mickey Stanley**, representing the 1968 team.

National Anthem: The national anthem will be performed by **José Feliciano**, who performed the national anthem at Tiger Stadium for Game 5 of the 1968 World Series.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers opened their series against the Cardinals with a 5-3 walk-off victory on Friday night at Comerica Park. With the game tied 3-3 in the bottom of the ninth, Victor Reyes hit a one-out single and then came around to score on Jeimer Candelario's walk-off, two-run blast. Candelario had three hits in last night's game, while Reyes added two hits and scored twice. Nicholas Castellanos drove in two runs and went 1x3 in the victory. Shane Greene picked up the win after pitching a scoreless ninth inning with one strikeout. Daniel Norris started for Detroit and allowed three runs on four hits with one walk and seven strikeouts in 5.0 innings. The Tigers and Cardinals continue their three-game series tonight. Following the weekend series vs. St. Louis, the homestand continues with three games vs. Houston (September 10-12).

CANDY CRUSH: Jeimer Candelario hit a walk-off, two-run home run in the ninth inning of last night's game. According to MLB Statcast, the pitch that Candelario hit was 102.1 MPH, making it the fastest pitch hit for a home run in the Majors this season. It marked Candelario's second game-ending homer of the season (last, June 9 vs. Cleveland) and was the Tigers' sixth walk-off win of the season. Candelario's homer was one of three hits for him last night, giving him his second consecutive three-hit performance and his sixth of the season. Candelario has back-to-back, three-hit games for the first time in his big league career.

STREAKING: Niko Goodrum singled in the first inning of last night's game to extend his hitting streak to seven games. Over his last seven games, Goodrum is batting .407/.484/.741 with seven runs scored, three home runs and four RBI. With a hit in tonight's game, Goodrum would equal the longest hitting streak of his Major League career, set earlier this season from May 8-19.

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nicholas Castellanos drove in two runs and went 1x3 in last night's game. Castellanos has hit safely in 10 of his last 15 games, batting .328/.388/.475 with eight runs scored, three doubles, two home runs and eight RBI during that stretch.

THE DEUCE IS LOOSE: Jim Adduci posted his third three-hit game of the season on Wednesday, going 3x5 with a double and a RBI. Dating back to August 1, Adduci is hitting .341/.363/.489 with eight runs scored, six doubles, two triples, one home run and 11 RBI in 25 games.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: Detroit's offense has heated up in recent games, scoring five-or-more runs in six of their last eight contests, and hitting .306/.350/.535 over that stretch. The Tigers lead the Majors with a .306 batting average and .535 slugging percentage since August 30, while they are tied for the lead with 16 home runs and second with a .350 on-base percentage.

TIGERS TIDBITS: Daniel Stumpf pitched a scoreless inning with one strikeout in last night's game. Since being recalled from Triple A Toledo on August 19, Stumpf has not allowed an earned run in eight appearances, throwing 8.1 scoreless innings with a 0.60 WHIP and nine strikeouts...Victor Reyes had a pair of hits and scored two runs last night. Reyes is hitting .583/.583/1.167 with four runs scored, two doubles, one triple, one home run and three RBI over his last four games with at least one at-bat.

AT COMERICA PARK: Detroit is 1-0 on its current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (1-0) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12). The Tigers are currently in a stretch that will see them play 13-of-16 games at home. Detroit is 35-34 at Comerica Park this season, where the team is hitting .253/.310/.398 as a team, and the pitching staff has posted a 4.07 ERA (632.0IP/286ER).

TIGERS AND CARDINALS: The Tigers have a 1-0 lead in the season series against the Cardinals after winning last night's series opener. Detroit has a 22-11

advantage in the all-time series vs. St. Louis, including a 13-3 edge at Comerica Park. The two teams last played in 2015, when the Tigers won two-of-three games at Busch Stadium.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Tigers are 5-10 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 211-187 (.530) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 140-101 (.581) in IL play, which ranks third among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (164-79, .675) and New York (AL) (144-102, .585).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 58-83 (.411) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,126-1,122 (.501) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history...is three victories away from tying Art Howe for 52nd.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS UPDATE: Triple A Toledo lost Game 3 of their best-of-five series vs. Durham, 4-2, last night. Christin Stewart homered for the Mud Hens and drove in two. Spencer Turnbull started for Toledo and took the loss, allowing four runs, three earned, on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 5.2 innings. The Mud Hens look to avoid elimination tonight as they play Game 4 of the series.

ABOUT MATTHEW: Boyd will make his 28th start of the season tonight vs. St. Louis.

LAST TIME OUT: Boyd earned his ninth win of the season on Sunday at New York (AL), tossing 6.0 innings and allowing three runs on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Boyd has been one of the best pitchers in the American League since the All-Star break, posting a 5-4 record with a 3.29 ERA (54.2IP/20ER) and 50 strikeouts in nine starts. Among all AL pitchers in that span, Boyd ranks third in WHIP (0.99), while he is tied for third in wins, and sixth in opponents batting average (.217, 44x203).

VS. ST. LOUIS: Boyd will be making his first career appearance against the Cardinals tonight.

AT COMERICA PARK: Boyd has made 40 career appearances, including 38 starts, at Comerica Park, compiling a 13-11 record with a 3.80 ERA (218.0IP/92ER) and 167 strikeouts. In 12 home starts this season, he is 6-3 with a 2.56 ERA (70.1IP/20ER) and 57 strikeouts. Boyd ranks fourth in the American League with a 2.56 home ERA.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Boyd has made eight appearances, including six starts, in his career during Interleague play, posting a 2-4 record with a 6.06 ERA (32.2IP/22ER) and 33 strikeouts. In three Interleague starts this season, Boyd has a 1-2 record with a 5.17 ERA (15.2IP/9ER) and 15 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Boyd has made 16 starts in his career in the month of September, compiling a 3-7 record with a 5.27 ERA (82.0IP/48ER) and 68 strikeouts. In six September starts last season, Boyd went 1-3 with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER) and 30 strikeouts.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Boyd currently ranks ninth in the American League with a .224 (127x568) opponents batting average.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Lefthanded hitters have posted a .254 (88x346) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .267 (364x1365) clip. In 27 starts this season, lefties are hitting .217 (28x129) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .226 (99x439).

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

NEAR NO-NO: Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

STRONG FINISH TO 2017: Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN: Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

In 11 home starts this season, Fulmer is 1-6 with a 3.69 ERA (68.1IP/28ER) and 47 strikeouts.
