RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers series finale against the Royals yesterday was postponed due to inclement weather conditions. Detroit begins their first road trip of 2018 this afternoon as they open a three-game series at Chicago (AL). Following an off day tomorrow and games on Saturday and Sunday vs. the White Sox, the seven-game road trip continues with four games at Cleveland (April 9-12).

ROSTER MOVE: The Tigers today announced that they have reinstated RHP Johnny Barbato from the 10-day disabled list and optioned him to Triple A Toledo.

NOT AGAIN: For the third time in the first week of the season, the Tigers had a game postponed due to inclement weather. Yesterday's game will be made up as part of a split doubleheader on Friday, April 20, with the April 4th makeup beginning at 1:10 p.m., and the originally scheduled game starting at 7:10 p.m. Both games will be televised on FOX Sports Detroit. All paid tickets from yesterday's game are valid for entry for the first game of the split doubleheader on April 20. No ticket exchange is necessary.

YEAH, BOYD: Matthew Boyd turned in a quality start in his season debut on Tuesday, allowing one run on four hits with one strikeout in 6.0 innings. Over his last five starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 2.27 ERA (31.2IP/8ER) and 22 strikeouts.

START ME UP: Matthew Boyd's start Tuesday continued a run of solid starts by the Tigers pitching staff to start the 2018 season. In five starts this season, Tigers starting pitchers have compiled a 3.03 ERA (29.2IP/10ER) with 18 strikeouts. Detroit enters today's game ranked fifth in the American League with a 3.03 starters ERA.

MIGGY HAS BIG GAMES AGAINST JAMES: Miguel Cabrera has fared well against today's White Sox starter, James Shields. Cabrera enters today's game with a .371 (26x70) batting average with 10 doubles, four home runs and 12 RBI vs. Shields. Among active players with at least 30 at-bats vs. Shields, Cabrera ranks third with a .423 on-base percentage, while he is tied for third with a .371 batting average and fourth with a .686 slugging percentage.

V-MART ON THE MARK VS. THE SOX: Victor Martinez has put up impressive numbers in his career against the White Sox. Entering today's game, Martinez is hitting .324 (238x734) with 39 doubles, 31 home runs and 119 RBI in 207 games vs. Chicago (AL). He leads all active players with 238 hits and 119 RBI vs. the White Sox, while he is second with 31 home runs and a .324 batting average, fourth with a .401 on-base percentage and ninth with a .504 slugging percentage. In 105 career games at Guaranteed Rate Field, Martinez is batting .340 (129x379) with 16 doubles, 20 home runs and 67 RBI.

- 6 are on an Opening Day roster at the Major League level for the first time (Candelario, Goodrum, Hicks, Jiménez, Reyes, Saupold)
- 4 were not active with the team in 2017 (Liriano, Goodrum, Martin, Reyes)
- 15 have less than three years in the Major Leagues (Boyd, Candelario, Farmer, Fulmer, Goodrum, Hicks, Jiménez, Jones, Machado, Mahtook, Norris, Reyes, Saupold, Stumpf, VerHagen), compared to 10 in 2017

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: The Tigers and White Sox begin their 19-game season series this afternoon at Guaranteed Rate Field. Chicago (AL) won the season series last year, going 10-9 against Detroit. It marked the first time the Tigers have lost the season series to the White Sox since 2008. Detroit went 3-6 against the White Sox last season at Guaranteed Rate Field.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are currently in a stretch that will see them play nine consecutive games against teams from the American League Central Division. Following the three-game series against the White Sox, the Tigers play four games at Cleveland (April 9-12). Detroit went 31-45 against divisional foes last season.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with an 1-4 (.200) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,069-1,043 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the ninth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT JORDAN: In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his second start of the season this afternoon in the series opener at Chicago (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann made his first career Opening Day start on Friday vs. Pittsburgh and received a no decision, allowing four runs on six hits with one walk and eight strikeouts in 6.0 innings. The eight strikeouts were the most he's had in a game since May 16, 2016 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out nine batters.

VS. CHICAGO (AL): Zimmermann has made eight career starts against the White Sox and has compiled a 5-2 record with a 5.08 ERA (44.1IP/25ER) and 27 strikeouts. He faced Chicago (AL) three times last season and went 2-1 with a 6.19 ERA (16.0IP/11ER) and 13 strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Zimmermann has started 107 career games on the road and has posted a 38-36 record with a 3.73 ERA (648.1IP/269ER) and 548 strikeouts. In 15 road starts last season, Zimmermann was 3-6 with a 5.53 ERA (83.0IP/51ER) and 55 strikeouts.

AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Zimmermann will be making his fourth career start at Guaranteed Rate Field this afternoon. In his previous three starts, Zimmermann has a 1-1 record with a 5.21 ERA (19.0IP/11ER) and 10 strikeouts.

RECORD IN APRIL: Zimmermann has had success in his career during the month of April, compiling a 20-10 record with a 3.12 ERA (225.1IP/78ER) and 149 strikeouts. Among active pitchers with at least 30 career starts during the month, Zimmermann's 3.12 ERA ranks ninth. He had five April starts last season and was 3-1 with a 6.18 ERA (27.2IP/19ER) and 16 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .255 (664x2605) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .269 (711x2647) against him. In 29 starts last season, righties hit .304 (98x322) vs. Zimmermann, while lefties had a .322 (106x329) batting average.

KEEPIN' IT 1,000: Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 50 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

STREAK SNAPPED: Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13, 2017 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann leads all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.92 walks per nine innings.

SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016: Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

ABOUT MICHAEL: Fulmer will make his second start of the season on Saturday afternoon at Chicago (AL).

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer was the tough luck loser in Game 1 of the doubleheader on Sunday vs. Pittsburgh, throwing 8.0 innings and allowing only one run on four hits with two walks and three strikeouts.

VS. CHICAGO (AL)/AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Fulmer has made five career starts against the White Sox and has a 1-1 record with a 4.41 ERA (32.2IP/16ER) and 20 strikeouts. He faced Chicago (AL) three times last season and was 1-1 with a 4.71 ERA (21.0IP/11ER) and 12 strikeouts. In two career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, Fulmer has posted a 0-1 record with a 4.85 ERA (13.0IP/7ER) and eight strikeouts.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Fulmer allowed just 13 home runs in 164.2 innings pitched last season, leading the American League with 0.71 home runs allowed per nine innings. Fulmer posted a homerless streak of 73.2 innings during the season.
