The Brewers are 44-14 when hitting a home run....the team's .759 winning percentage leads the National League and trails only Boston (.762) for the Major League lead.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 24-18 on the road, going 8-4-2 in series play....had a season-high 5-game road winning streak from 4/30-5/11....the team went 40-38 on the road last season, going 13-11-2 in series play.

MANAGER: **Craig Counsell** is in his fourth season as manager of the Brewers (270-277) and third full season....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing **Ron Roenicke**....bio is on p. 44 of the media guide.

COACHES: Hitting coach **Darnell Coles** (4th season), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (3rd season), coach **Jason Lane** (3rd season), bench coach **Pat Murphy** (3rd season), third base coach **Ed Sedar** (12th season, 8th as 3B coach), first base/infield coach **Carlos Subero** (3rd season) and bullpen coach **Lee Tunnell** (6th season) all returned from the 2017 staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 12 replay challenges, going 4-8....their last challenge (lost) came on 7/4 vs. Minnesota as an out call at second base involving Eric Thames stood....team went 17-27 in 44 replay challenges last season.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #45 - RHP JHOULYS CHACÍN (18gs, 6-3, 3.71)

CHACÍN AT A GLANCE: Jhoulys Chacin, 30, is making his 19th start of the season....Chacin last started last Saturday at Cincinnati and received no decision in the Brewers' 12-3 defeat (5ip, 4r, 1r, 1er, 3bb, 5k)....he left the game with a 3-1 lead....the team is 12-6 in his starts.... he has 5 quality starts....opponents are batting .243 (87-for-358, 7hr)....Chacin signed as a free agent on 12/21/17....he is signed through the 2019 season....his name is pronounced "yo-LEASE sha-SEEN"....bio is on p. 81 of the media guide.

LAST SEASON: Chacin went 13-10 with a 3.89 ERA in a career-high 32 starts with San Diego....his 13 wins and career-high 153 strikeouts led the team....he held opponents to a .235 batting average (157-for-667, 19hr), which ranked in the NL....the Padres went 18-14 in his starts....he had 16 quality starts, tying Luis Perdomo for the team lead, going 10-3 with a 2.05 ERA in those starts (105.1ip, 24er)....Chacin went 9-5 with a 2.93 ERA over his last 20 starts (116.2ip, 38er).

CAREER: Is 65-70 with a 3.91 ERA in 213 games / 185 starts (1120ip, 487er)....is in his 10th Major League season....has pitched for Colorado (2009-14), Arizona (2015), Atlanta (2016), LA of Anaheim (2016), San Diego (2017) and Milwaukee (2018).

CAREER AT MILLER PARK: Is 2-3 with a 4.30 ERA in 10 starts (58.2ip, 28er)....prior to this season had not pitched at Miller Park since 2014....is 2-2 with a 3.89 ERA in 7 starts this season (39.1ip, 17er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 27-39 with a 4.19 ERA in 106 games / 89 starts (523.2ip, 244er)....is 4-1 with a 3.59 ERA in 11 starts this season (57.2ip, 23er).

CAREER vs. BRAVES: Is 1-4 with a 3.94 ERA in 6 starts (32ip, 14er), including 0-2 with a 3.75 ERA in 2 starts last season (12ip, 5er).

CAREER AT THE PLATE: Is a .195 (59-for-303) hitter with 1 HR....homered on 9/20/13 vs. Arizona (2-run off Randall Delgado)....has 9 walks and 67 strikeouts.

THIS SEASON: Is batting .214 (6-for-28)....has 2 walks and 8 strikeouts....has 3 sacrifice bunts.
