AT A GLANCE: The Yankees play the second game of their final regular season series of the season today at Boston...are 4-1 on their final road trip of the season after winning on Friday and going 3-1 at Tampa Bay.

- ▶ **With their win on Friday at Boston, have clinched home field in Wednesday's AL Wild Card Game vs. Oakland.**
- ▶ Are 8-3 in their last 11G after going 1-4 in their previous 5G...are 24-15 in their last 39G and 31-19 in 50G since 8/6.
- ▶ At 99-61 (.619), have the Majors' third-best record and third-most wins behind Boston (107-53, .669) and Houston (101-58, .635)...marks their highest win total since going 103-59 in 2009...need to win one of their last two games to record their 20th 100-win season in franchise history.
- ▶ Are a season-high 38G over .500...prior to 2018, had not been 38G over .500 since finishing the 2009 season with a 103-59 record (44G over .500).
- ▶ Have clinched the 54th postseason berth in franchise history (116 seasons, 46.6%)...have qualified in 20-of-24 seasons since 1995 (missed in 2008, '13-14, '16)...are going to consecutive postseasons for the first time since 2009-12.
- ▶ Play 16 of their final 25 games on the road...are 13-10 so far (8-6 on the road, 5-4 at home).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees clinched home field advantage for the AL Wild Card game with a 11-6 win on Friday at Boston...**Yankees batters hit four home runs (Sánchez/Hicks/Voit/Judge) giving them 264 on the season to tie the 1997 Mariners for the most by a team in a single season in Major League history...LHP J.A. Happ** started and earned the win (6.0IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 7K, 1HR) to improve to 17-6 this season, including 7-0 in 11 starts as a Yankee...**C Gary Sánchez** (2-for-4, 1BB) opened the scoring with a solo-HR to lead off the third...in a six-run fourth inning, **2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-5) had a two-run double and **CF Aaron Hicks** (2-for-5) hit a three-run HR...**1B Luke Voit** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the seventh and **RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1BB) hit a solo HR in the eighth, his first homer since 7/21 vs. the Mets...**3B Miguel Andújar** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit his 44th double of the season in the fourth, tying Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936) for the most in a single season by a Yankees rookie...**LF Andrew McCutchen** (1-for-5) played in his 1,500th career game.

RECORD RIVALRY RECORD: This year marks the second season in MLB history that the Yankees and Red Sox have each totaled at least 99 wins (also 1978: NYY 100-63; BOS 99-64).

WILD THINGS: The Yankees have clinched their seventh AL Wild Card berth (1995, '97, 2007, '10, '15, '17-18)...is their third appearance in the AL Wild Card Game (lost in 2015 vs. Houston, won in 2017 vs. Minnesota), **matching Pittsburgh** (1-2 in NLWCG from 2013-15) for the most appearances by a team in the Wild Card Game.

- ▶ Will join the Pirates as the only teams to play in consecutive Wild Card Games (Colorado can also join this group).
- ▶ The Yankees (2x) and Pirates (3x: 2013-15) are the only teams to host multiple Wild Card Games...home teams are 5-7 all-time in the Wild Card Game (AL 3-3, NL 2-4).
- ▶ Have won all three of their prior all time postseason series against Oakland, going 9-4 overall in postseason games against them (3-2 in the 2001 ALDS, 3-2 in the 2000 ALDS, and 3-0 in the 1981 ALCS).

COURT IS BACK IN SESSION: **RF Aaron Judge** hit a solo HR in the eighth inning of Friday's win at Boston, marking his first homer since 7/21 vs. the Mets and snapping a 49AB/62PA stretch without a homer...marked the 264th HR by the Yankees this season, tying the all-time, single-season MLB mark (also 264HR by the 1997 Mariners)...is batting .237 (9-for-38) with 7R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 6RBI, 8BB and a .354 OBP in 12G since returning from the DL on 9/14.

- ▶ For the second straight year, had the most popular jersey in MLB...the ranking is based on sales of Majestic jerseys from MLBShop.com since Opening Day 2018).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers** have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 16 of their last 20 starts, going 9-4 with a 2.85 ERA (101.0IP, 92H, 36R/32ER, 26BB, 98K, 8HR) over the span...is the Majors' second-lowest rotation ERA since 9/7, trailing only the Mets (2.54).

BRONX BOMBERS, INDEED: Yankees batters hit four home runs on Friday at Boston (Sánchez/Hicks/Voit/Judge) giving them 264 on the season to tie the 1997 Mariners for the most by a team in a single season in Major League history...their averages of 1HR/20.62AB and 1.65HR/G this season are the best in MLB history.

- ▶ Also hit four HRs in their previous game on Thursday at Tampa Bay...with another game of at least 4HR on Saturday, would tie the all-time Major League mark of three straight such games done 10 previous times, including twice this year (when the Yankees did for the first time in franchise history on 5/19-20 at K.C. and 5/21 at Texas — and by Oakland from 7/22-24).
- ▶ Have homered in 30-of-34G since 8/24 (62HR total).
- ▶ Have scored 39R in the last 4G, their highest-scoring four-game span of the season.

MULTI-TASKING: With Giancarlo Stanton's 2HR game on Thursday, the Yankees **tyed a Major League record with their 24th player multi-HR game of 2018**...are the third team to do it, joining the 1961 Yankees and 1966 Braves.

TO BE THE BEST, YOU'VE GOT TO BEAT THE BEST: Among the five AL playoff teams, the Yankees have the best record against the other AL postseason qualifiers, having gone 21-16 this season (5-2 vs. Cleveland, 5-2 vs. Houston, 3-3 vs. Oakland, 8-9 vs. Boston)...see chart at right.

HOT HAND LUKE: In his last 10G (since 9/19), **1B Luke Voit** has hit safely nine times and driven at least one run eight times...is batting .410/.465/.949/1.414 (16-for-39) with 11R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 14RBI and 4BB over that stretch.

ROOKIE MOVES: **3B Miguel Andújar** hit his 44th double of the season in the seventh inning of Friday's win at Boston, tying Joe DiMaggio (44 in 1936) for the most by a rookie in a single season in franchise history...also ties for the ninth-highest total by any rookie in MLB history, marking the most since **Ryan Zimmerman** (47) and **Hanley Ramirez** (46) in 2006.

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his 36th and 37th HRs of the season on Thurs. at Tampa Bay, his fourth multi-HR game of the season...his 37HR are fifth-most by a player in his first season as a Yankee, trailing Babe Ruth (54HR in 1920), Jason Giambi (41HR in 2002), Mark Teixeira (39HR in 2009) and Roger Maris (39HR in 1960).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 29, 1987: Don Mattingly hits his sixth grand slam of the season in a 6-0 win vs. Boston (off Bruce Hurst), setting a Major League record (since tied in 2006 by Travis Hafner).

Sept. 29, 1975: Former Yankees manager Casey Stengel passes away. Stengel managed the club for 12 seasons (1949-60), winning seven World Series titles.

Sept. 29, 1928: The Yankees and Tigers combine for a then-record 45 hits, with Detroit earning a 19-10 victory at Navin Field. Each of the nine Tigers batters finished with at least two hits.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 30, 2004: Bernie Williams launches a two-run, "walk-off" homer against Minnesota (W, 6-4), as the Yankees clinch their seventh consecutive AL East crown, 10th straight postseason appearance and third consecutive 100-win season.

Sept. 30, 1984: Don Mattingly goes 4-for-5 in a 9-2 win vs. the Tigers, as he finishes the season with a .343 batting average and wins the American League batting title.

Sept. 30, 1973: The Yankees play their final game in Yankee Stadium before it gets remodeled, losing 8-5 vs. Detroit. Tigers pitcher John Hiller gets Yankees first baseman Mike Hegan to fly out to centerfield for the game's final out.

Sept. 30, 1927: Babe Ruth hits his 60th HR of the season in a 4-2 win over Washington at the original Yankee Stadium.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 8-9 vs. the Red Sox in 2018...will play the 18th of 19 games today (9G in the Bronx, 10G at Boston)...are 22-17 in 39G vs. Boston since 9/27/16...**SEASON SERIES:** Have won four of the last six season series (2012-17)...have lost just four of 18 season series between the clubs since 2000, going 11-4-3 over the span...**AT FENWAY PARK:** Are 2-6 at Fenway Park in 2018...went 5-4 at Fenway Park in 2017...are just 9-18 at Fenway Park since the start of 2016, but are 32-31 there since the start of 2012...have won 8-of-14 series at Fenway Park since the start of 2014 (8-5-1)...are 499-482-4 (.509) all-time at Fenway Park, the only visiting AL team with a winning record there.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP DOMINGO GERMÁN (2-6, 5.55 ERA)

RHP Domingo Germán will make his 14th start of the season (and 21st appearance) today at Boston...marks his first *start* since taking the loss on 7/20 vs. the Mets (3.2IP, 5H, 4ER, 2BB, 3K, 1HR, 71 pit. / 46 str.)...has made one Major League appearance since that start, coming on in relief on 9/25 at Tampa Bay and tossing 2.0 scoreless IP to close out the game (1H, 4K)...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 9/19...is his second stint with the Yankees this season (also 4/7-7/20)...took the loss on 7/13 at Cleveland, allowing a career-high-tying 6ER in 4.0IP (5H, 4BB, 6K, 1WP)...is the first Yankees rookie to record two starts of 9K and OBB and just the seventh ever to record one such start...earned his first career win on 6/14 vs. Tampa Bay, setting a career high with 10K over 6.0IP (5H, 3ER, 2BB, 1HR, 1WP)...did not allow a hit or run in his first career start on 5/6 vs. Cleveland (6.0IP, 2BB, 9K)...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 4/7...made his Major League debut with the Yankees in 2017, going 0-1 with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP, 5ER) in seven relief appearances...was re-signed by the Yankees as minor league free agent on 12/11/15...was originally acquired by the Yankees, along with RHP Nathan Eovaldi and INF Garrett Jones, from the Miami Marlins in exchange for RHP David Phelps, INF/OF Martín Prado and cash considerations on 12/19/14...was originally signed by the Marlins as a non-drafted free agent on 8/8/09.

LAST START: Took the loss on 7/20 vs. the Mets (3.2IP, 5H, 4ER, 2BB, 3K, 1HR, 71 pit. / 46 str.) and was optioned to Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre following the game.

2018: Has appeared in 20 games (13 starts) this season, going 2-6 with a 5.55 ERA (84.1IP, 52ER)...opponents are hitting .238 (78-for-328); LH .247 (39-for-158), RH .229 (39-for-170)...is third in the AL and 10th among all MLB rookies with 99K.

- ✦ **Is just the fourth Yankees rookie since at least 1913 to record four games with 9K-or-more** (also Masahiro Tanaka-6 in 2014, Orlando Hernandez-4 in 1998 and Al Downing-11 in 1963).

VS. BOSTON: Has made one prior career appearance against the Red Sox, tossing 3.0 scoreless IP (1H, 3K) in relief in a 6-3 loss on 4/12 at Fenway Park...his only hit allowed was a single to Andrew Benintendi.

AS A STARTER: Is 2-5 with a 6.18 ERA (67.0IP, 46ER) in 13 career starts (all this season)...has a 10.21 K/9.0IP ratio (76K/67.0IP) as a starter...has thrown at least 6.0IP in five of his last nine starts.

ON THE ROAD: Is 0-3 with a 5.95 ERA (39.1IP, 26ER, .253 opp BA) in 10G on the road this season, including 0-3 with a 7.98 ERA (29.1IP, 26ER) in his six road starts.

WALKING...BACK TO THE DUGOUT: Is one of four rookies to record a start of at least 9K and OBB this season (also Pittsburgh's Nick Kingham, San Diego's Joey Lucchesi and Miami's Caleb Smith), and one of two rookies to accomplish the feat twice (also Lucchesi)...was the first AL rookie since Detroit's Michael Fulmer in 2016 to record two such starts in the same season.

- ✦ Is one of seven Yankees rookies in franchise history to record a start of at least 9K and OBB and the first to have two such starts in a single season (see chart at right).

SPEAKING (OF) GERMÁN: Earned his **first career win** on 6/14 vs. Tampa Bay, setting a career high with 10 strikeouts over 6.0IP (5H, 3ER, 2BB, 1HR, 1WP) in his first career game vs. Tampa Bay.

- ✦ **Set a career high with 10K**...was the first double-digit-strikeout game by a Yankee other than Luis Severino (four) this season (since joined by Sabathia-10K on 6/17 vs. Tampa Bay)...recorded all three outs via strikeout in the first, fourth and sixth.
- ✦ **Recorded 26 swinging strikes**...according to MLB Statcast, was the sixth Major League pitcher to reach that mark in a game this season...are the most by a Yankee this season by seven (previously Germán, Severino, Tanaka, 19 each)...is tied for the second-most swinging strikes in a single game by any Yankee since the start of 2016 (Tanaka: 27 on 9/14/17 vs. Baltimore, 26 on 5/26/17 vs. Oakland).
- ✦ Was winless in his first six career starts...was the longest winless streak to start a career by a Yankees starter since Brian Boehringer (6GS from 6/15/95-6/25/96).

RHP Lance Lynn will make his 11th appearance as a Yankee (and second in relief) today at Boston...made a relief appearance in his first game as a Yankee on 8/1 vs. Baltimore (4.1IP, 5H, 0R, 0BB, 5K), followed by nine starts prior to today...prior to this season, had only made appearances in relief in his first two seasons in the Majors (six in 2012 and 16 in 2011)...will be his 31st overall appearance this season and second in relief...will pitch on extended six days' rest...has allowed 1ER in 5.0IP in each of his last two starts – both no-decisions – including on 9/22 vs. Baltimore (7H, 2R, 2BB, 4K)...has a 2.25 ERA (16.0IP, 5R/4ER) over his last three starts...the Yankees are 6-3 in his starts...earned the win in his first Yankees start on 8/6 at Chicago-AL, tossing 7.1 shutout innings (2H, 1BB, 9K) in his longest start of the season...was acquired by the Yankees along with cash considerations from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for INF Tyler Austin and RHP Luis Rijo on 7/30...went 7-8 with a 5.10 ERA (102.1IP, 58ER) in 20 starts with the Twins before the trade...signed a one-year contract with Minnesota on 3/12/18...was a 2012 NL All-Star with St. Louis...was originally selected by St. Louis in the first round (39th overall) of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Mississippi.

LAST START: Started last Saturday vs. Baltimore and took a no-decision (5.0IP, 7H, 2R/1ER, 2BB, 4K) in a 3-2, 11-inning win.

IN RELIEF: In 23 career relief apps. (one in 2018, six in 2012 and 16 in his rookie season of 2011), is 1-2 with a 2.78 ERA (35.2IP, 31H, 12R, 11ER, 10BB, 43K, 3HR, .233 opp. BA).

IN PINSTRIPES: In 10 appearances (nine starts) for the Yankees, has a 2-2 record and 4.21 ERA (51.1IP, 24ER)...started his Yankees career with a 13.2-inning scoreless streak...was the longest scoreless streak to begin a Yankees tenure since Andrew Miller was scoreless for 17.2IP to begin the 2015 season.

- ✦ His 0.35 HR/9.0IP ratio (2HR/51.1IP) since joining the Yankees on 8/1 is the lowest in the AL and the second-lowest in the Majors (min. 50.0IP) to Jacob deGrom (0.34)...did not allow a HR in his first 25.2IP with the Yankees, and went 26.2IP without allowing a HR from the fifth inning on 7/27 at Boston with Minnesota until the sixth inning on 8/22 at Miami.
- ✦ Earned the win in his first start as a Yankee on 8/6 at Chicago-AL, allowing just 2H and 1BB over 7.1 scoreless innings and tying his season high with 9K...was his ninth career start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings and 3H-or-fewer, the fourth such start by a Yankee in 2018.
- ✦ Tossed 4.1 scoreless frames in relief (5H, 5K) in his Yankees debut on 8/1 vs. Baltimore...was the longest scoreless relief outing by a Yankee since Luis Cessa's 4.2IP on 7/4/17 vs. Toronto...was his first relief outing since 9/9/12 vs. Milwaukee w/ St. Louis, ending a string of 154 consecutive appearances as a starter...in 20 starts with Minnesota, had just two scoreless starts and only one walkless start.
- ✦ Was the second pitcher since 1908 to produce scoreless outings of at least 4.0IP in each of his first two appearances as a Yankee, joining Allie Reynolds, who threw back-to-back complete game shutouts in 1947.
- ✦ Since joining the Yankees, has a 9.99 K/9.0IP ratio (57K/51.1IP).
- ✦ Has issued 1BB-or-fewer in 6-of-9 starts as a Yankee after doing so in just 5-of-20 starts as a Twin...has walked 5.9% of batters as a Yankee after walking 13.2% as a Twin.

2018: Has allowed a .266 opponents' BA (161-for-605); LH .300 (77-for-257), RH .241 (84-for-348).

- ✦ Is 5-3 with a 3.59 ERA (80.1IP, 32ER) in 16 home appearances (15 starts).
- ✦ Has a 5.97 ERA (34.2IP, 23ER) over his last seven starts after allowing just 1ER in 16.2IP (0.54 ERA) over his first three games (two starts) with the Yankees.
- ✦ Went 7-8 with a 5.10 ERA (102.1IP, 58ER) in 20 starts with the Twins before the trade.

VS. BOSTON: Is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (30.0IP, 6ER) in five starts in his career vs. Boston, his lowest ERA vs. any opponent he has faced at least three times...marks his first start vs. Boston with the Yankees and third this year (1-0, 1.64 ERA, 11.0IP, 3R/2ER).

- ✦ Has started twice at Fenway Park in his career: on 8/16/17 with St. Louis, allowed 2R/1ER in 6.0IP in a no-decision...took a no-decision earlier this year with Minnesota on 7/27/18 (6.0IP, 2ER).
