1968 WORLD CHAMPIONS 50TH ANNIVERSARY WEEKEND

As a tribute to the storied history of the Detroit Tigers and its 1968 World Championship, the Tigers will honor the 50th anniversary of the 1968 World Champions this weekend vs. St. Louis, Detroit's opponent in the 1968 World Series. Today's festivities include:

Promotional Giveaway: The first 10,000 fans attending today's game will receive a **1968 World Champions commemorative pennant**, courtesy of Comerica Bank.

Ceremonial First Pitches: The ceremonial first pitches will be thrown by **Jon Hiller**, **Hal Naragon**, **Denny McLain**, and **Jim Price**, representing the 1968 team.

National Anthem & God Bless America: The national anthem and God Bless America will be performed by vocalist **Rachel Miltimore**.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers won their fourth straight game on Saturday as they defeated the Cardinals, 4-3, at Comerica Park. With the game tied 3-3 in the bottom of the ninth inning, Detroit loaded the bases with one out. The first pitch to Victor Martinez went to the backstop, allowing Victor Reyes to score on the wild pitch. Reyes had two hits and scored twice in the victory, while Jeimer Candelario went 1x3 with a RBI. Matthew Boyd started for the Tigers, tossing 7.0 strong innings and allowing one run on two hits with one walk and a career-high 11 strikeouts. Shane Greene was credited with the win after giving up two runs and striking out two in the ninth inning. The Tigers and Cardinals conclude their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, the homestand continues with three games vs. Houston (September 10-12).

ROSTER MOVES: The Tigers today announced the following roster moves:

- * Recalled RHP Zac Reinger from Triple A Toledo.
- * Selected C Jarrod Saltalamacchia and OF Christin Stewart from Triple A Toledo. Saltalamacchia will wear #12, while Stewart will wear #14.
- * To make room for Saltalamacchia on the 40-man roster, the Tigers have transferred RHP Artie Lewicki to the 60-day disabled list.

WALK-OFF WINNERS: The Tigers walked off the Cardinals for the second straight night as Victor Reyes scored from third on a bases loaded wild pitch by Bud Norris. It marked Detroit's seventh walk-off victory of the season, and the first time they've had back-to-back, walk-off wins since September 18-19, 2015 vs. Kansas City.

YEAH, BOYD: Matthew Boyd continued his strong second half of the season last night, throwing 7.0 innings and allowing one run on two hits with one walk and a career-high 11 strikeouts, which were tied with Jordan Zimmermann for the most strikeouts in a game by a Tigers pitcher this season. In 10 starts since the All-Star break, Boyd has posted a 3.06 ERA (61.2IP/21ER) with a 0.92 WHIP, a .204 (46x226) opponents batting average and 61 strikeouts. Boyd ranks second among American League pitchers in innings pitched and WHIP since the All-Star break, while he is third in opponents batting average and tied for fifth in strikeouts.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 43rd one-run game of the season last night, improving to 20-23 in those contests with a 4-3 win. Detroit's 43 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay and Seattle, 52). In addition to the 43 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 28 games that have been decided by two runs.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their American League leading 65th day game of the season (out of 143 games, 45.5%). Detroit has posted a 29-35 (.453) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 30-48 (.385) at night.

AT COMERICA PARK: Detroit is 2-0 on its current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (2-0) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12). The Tigers are currently in a stretch that will see them play 13-of-16 games at home. Detroit is 36-34 at Comerica Park this season, where the team is hitting .253/.311/.395 as a team, and the pitching staff has posted a 4.06 ERA (641.0IP/289ER).

TIGERS AND CARDINALS: The Tigers have a 2-0 lead in the season series against the Cardinals after winning the first two games of this weekend's series. Detroit has a 23-11 advantage in the all-time series vs. St. Louis, including a 14-3 edge at Comerica Park. The Tigers have won seven of the last nine games played in the series.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Tigers are 6-10 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 212-187 (.531) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 141-101 (.583) in IL play, which ranks third among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (164-79, .675) and New York (AL) (144-102, .585).

ON DECK: The Tigers continue their six-game homestand tomorrow night as they begin a three-game series vs. Houston. The Astros won two-of-three games over Detroit when the two teams played at Minute Maid Park earlier this season. Houston won the season series 4-3 last season, but the Tigers took two-of-three games at Comerica Park. Detroit has won the overall season series in three of the last five years.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 59-83 (.415) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,127-1,122 (.501) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history...is two victories away from tying Art Howe for 52nd.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYOFFS UPDATE: Triple A Toledo was eliminated from the International League playoffs with a 3-2 loss last night at Durham. The Mud Hens advanced to the postseason for the first time since 2007. Single A West Michigan lost Game 1 of the Midwest League semifinals to Bowling Green, 6-5, last night. The Whitecaps will look to stay alive in the postseason tonight at Bowling Green.

LESTER, HOUSTON EARN MINOR LEAGUE HONORS FOR AUGUST: INF Josh Lester and RHP Zac Houston have been named the Tigers Minor League Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for August. In 28 games for Double A Erie last month, Lester hit .279/.345/.587 with 23 runs scored, eight doubles, eight home runs and 23 RBI. Houston appeared in 12 games during August, posting four saves with a 0.61 ERA (14.2IP/1ER), a .133 (6x45) opponents batting average and 14 strikeouts.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his 23rd start of 2018 this afternoon in the series finale vs. St. Louis.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer did not factor into the decision in his last start on Monday at Chicago (AL), allowing one run on one hit with four walks and five strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Fulmer is making his first career appearance against the Cardinals this afternoon.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fulmer has made 34 career starts at Comerica Park, posting a 10-12 record with a 3.44 ERA (217.0IP/83ER) and 154 strikeouts. In 11 home starts this season, Fulmer is 1-6 with a 3.69 ERA (68.1IP/28ER) and 47 strikeouts.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Fulmer has made nine career starts in Interleague play, posting a 2-5 record with a 2.90 ERA (59.0IP/19ER) and 54 strikeouts. In four starts vs. National League teams this season, Fulmer is 0-2 with a 2.45 ERA (25.2IP/7ER) and 26 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Fulmer has started six games in his career during the month of September, compiling a 1-2 record with a 4.24 ERA (34.0IP/16ER) and 29 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .241 (201x834) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .242 (206x852) against him. In 22 starts this season, righties are hitting .267 (58x217), while lefthanded batters are hitting .240 (63x262).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 24th appearance overall and 23rd start of the season tomorrow night in the series opener vs. Houston.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano picked up his first win since April 28 on Tuesday at Chicago (AL), allowing three runs, two earned, on seven hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

VS. HOUSTON/AT COMERICA PARK: Liriano has made four career starts against the Astros, posting a 2-1 record with a 4.37 ERA (22.2IP/11ER) and 18 strikeouts. He faced Houston earlier this season on July 15 at Minute Maid Park, and received a no decision after giving up one run on one hit with three walks and three strikeouts in 3.0 innings. Liriano has appeared in 23 games, including 19 as a starter, in his career at Comerica Park, compiling a 6-10 record with a 5.63 ERA (102.1IP/64ER) and 102 strikeouts. In eight appearances, including seven starts, at home this season, Liriano is 2-3 with a 5.35 ERA (38.2IP/23ER) and 34 strikeouts.
