WELCOME: As the Mets and Major League Baseball celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month, the Mets are proud to honor Ozzie Virgil, Sr. tonight...Oswaldo Jose Virgil, Sr., 86, has worked in the Mets organization for the last 11 years, overseeing the catching instruction for the Mets Dominican Summer League teams...He was the very first Dominican-born player to appear in the major leagues when he broke through on September 23, 1956 with the New York Giants...Ozzie would go on to play parts of nine seasons in the majors with four other teams...Virgil was born in Monte Cristi, Dominican Republic and his family moved to the US when he was just 13...He graduated from DeWitt Clinton High School in the Bronx...Virgil served in the United States Marines prior to beginning his professional baseball career...He is a member of the Latin Baseball Hall of Fame and the Dominican Baseball Hall of Fame, and has spent over 70 years working in professional baseball, including coaching in the majors for 19 years...His son, Ozzie, Jr. played 11 years in the majors.

THE CAPTAIN: David Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (761) and go-ahead homers (87)...Wright hit .171 (7-41) with one double, two RBI, two walks and four runs scored in 12 rehabilitation games between St. Lucie (A) of the Florida State League and Las Vegas (AAA) of the Pacific Coast League...He last played on August 29 for the 51s vs. Tacoma...Wright's last major league game was May 27, 2016 vs. the Dodgers, going 1-4 with a solo homer.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 4-6 in their last 10 games...The Mets are 29-21 in their last 50 games and 41-36 since July 1...New York is 36-35 vs. the NL East...The Mets are 20-18 in their last 38 home games and 33-43 overall at home.

ATLANTA: The Mets are 4-13 vs. Atlanta with three games remaining...The last time the Mets lost 13 or more games in one year to the Braves was in 2009 (5-13)...The last time they had more than 13 losses was in 1966 (a franchise-record 14 losses)...Also lost 14 times to the Braves in 1964.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has 16 homers (the eighth most in the majors) and 51 RBI (third in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is second in the majors with 42 RBI since August 1 and tied for sixth in homers (13) during that span...Conforto has 81 RBI, extending career-high...He also has a career high-tying 27 homers (matching last year's total).

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto is tied for the major league lead with 28 RBI and eight homers this month...He is second in the majors with 16 extra-base hits in September...The last Mets player with 28 or more RBI in any calendar month was David Wright, who drove in 29 runs in June 2010.

BRANDON NIMMO: Has walked six times in his last two games...He has at least one walk in 11 of his last 12 games (16 total)...Has 25 walks this month, the second-most in the majors...Overall, ranks third in the NL with a .399 OBP...Nimmo has reached base safely in 30 of his last 31 games...He is tied for third in the NL with eight triples...Leads the majors with 22 HBP (a single-season franchise record)...Nimmo has a career-high 17 homers.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets have one home win vs. the Braves...The last time they finished with one or fewer wins at home vs. Atlanta was 1993 (1-5).

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 8-4 with a 2.90 ERA (43 earned runs/133.2 innings), the second-lowest ERA in the majors this month.

MLB RECORDS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 28 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 23 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

LEADERBOARD: DeGrom leads the majors in ERA (1.77), FanGraphs WAR (8.3), RA-9 WAR (8.7), FIP (2.03), HR/9 (0.43), Opponent's Slugging (.284), Opponent's OPS (.533) and Road ERA (1.87)...He leads the NL in DRA (2.15), ERA+ (209), Home ERA (1.66) and xwOBA (expected weighted on-base - .255).

SOME SEASON: DeGrom has a 1.77 ERA and 259 strikeouts and 46 walks this season...Since 1908, only two pitchers have had an ERA of less than 2.00, at least 250 strikeouts and 50 or fewer walks (Christy Mathewson 1908, Pedro Martinez 2000).

STRIKEOUTS: DeGrom has 259 strikeouts to become the third pitcher in franchise history to reach 250 or more strikeouts...Tom Seaver did it three times (1970, 1971, 1973) and Dwight Gooden did it twice (1984, 1985)...DeGrom is 10 strikeouts shy of 1,000 for his career...He has 10 double-digit strikeout games this year.

CLOSE GAMES: DeGrom has faced 609 batters with the score tied or the Mets up or down by one run, the most by any pitcher in the majors this year.

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has a .337 (69-205) batting average since his debut on July 24, which is the seventh-highest in the majors (min. 190 PA)...He is tied for eighth in the majors in hits since his debut...Is tied for third in the majors with 31 hits this month...Has the sixth-highest batting average (.360) in the majors this month (min. 60 PA)...McNeil has 69 hits through his first 58 career games with the Mets...Only José Reyes (72) had more...McNeil's .337 average in his first 58 career major league games with the Mets, is the highest average in franchise history (min. 180 PA)...McNeil is tied for the major league lead with six triples since the All-Star break...Only Mookie Wilson (8 triples in 1981) and Darryl Strawberry (7 triples in 1983) had more as a rookie in team history.

AMED ROSARIO: Has 69 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the 10th-most in the NL...Rosario is fifth in the NL with 29 hits in September...Ranks 10th in the NL with 22 stolen bases.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Mets third base coach Glenn Sherlock turns 58 today.

LAST START: DeGrom tonight makes his career-high 32nd start of the season...In his last start, September 21 at Washington, tossed 7.0 innings and allowed one run, earned, on three hits while walking one and striking out eight...Registered his 30th start this season allowing three runs or fewer, the most in the majors.

HISTORIC STREAKS: Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 28 starts, the longest single-season streak in MLB history and aims to tie the overall MLB record today (29, Jake Arrieta, 2015-2016)...His 23-straight quality starts are the most in a single-season in MLB history...Research courtesy of Elias.

BETTER THAN MOST: Leads the majors with a 1.77 ERA (41 earned runs/209.0 innings), a .533 opponent OPS, and a 0.43 HR/9 rate...His 259 strikeouts this season are second-most in the NL and fourth-most in the majors...According to Fangraphs, has a 8.3 WAR, highest among qualified pitchers...Leads the NL with a 1.66 home ERA (19 earned runs/103.0 innings) this season.

RISE TO THE OCCASION: DeGrom has a 1.90 ERA (29 earned runs/137.2 innings) against teams currently with a .500 record or better this season, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 100.0 innings)...No other pitcher with at least 100.0 innings against .500 or better teams has a sub-2.00 ERA in those games...The next-closest pitcher in ERA (min. 100.0 innings) vs. those teams is Max Scherzer with a 2.58 ERA against those clubs...Has faced seven (BOS, NYY, ATL, CHC, STL, COL, LAD) of the 11 teams that have either clinched a postseason berth or are not yet eliminated from postseason contention, making 14 starts against those teams...In those starts, owns a 1.79 ERA (19 earned runs/95.1 innings) with 121 strikeouts.

A SEASON FOR THE AGES: DeGrom's 1.77 ERA would be the third-lowest single-season mark since 1996...The last Mets pitcher with a lower ERA in a season was Dwight Gooden, whose 1.53 ERA in 1985 stands as the lowest in franchise history...Has fanned 32.0 percent of the hitters he's faced this season, on pace to be the highest rate in Mets history (Gooden, 31.4 percent, 1984)...His 30 starts allowing three or fewer runs this season are tied for the most by any pitcher in the last 30 seasons (Houston's Mike Scott was the last with more, 33 starts in 1986).

PUNCH EM' OUT: With 10 strikeouts today, would reach 1,000 for his career...DeGrom has a career-high 259 strikeouts this season (previously 239 last season)...Joined Tom Seaver (three times) and Dwight Gooden (twice) as the only Mets pitchers to register at least 250 strikeouts in a season...His 10 double-digit strikeout games this season are tied for fourth-most in the majors (second-most in NL)...Since his MLB debut on May 15, 2014, his 31 double-digit strikeout games are the fifth-most in the majors...Only Max Scherzer (62), Chris Sale (53), Corey Kluber (42) and Clayton Kershaw (37) have more.

deGROMETRICS: According to FanGraphs, deGrom's 27.0 percent hard-hit rate is the third-lowest in the majors this season...DeGrom pitches to the most soft contact in the majors (24.8 percent) among qualifying pitchers...Leads all qualifying pitchers in the majors with a 2.03 FIP...His 81.8 percent left-on-base rate is the third-best among qualifying NL pitchers.

ESCAPE ARTIST: Has held opponents to a .145 (19-131) batting average with RISP this season, second-lowest in the majors...Opponents are 0-13 this season vs. deGrom with the bases loaded...DeGrom is the only starting pitcher in the majors this season to not allow a bases-loaded hit (min. 13 batters faced).

ONE (OR NONE) AND DONE: DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in 17 of his 31 starts this season, the most such starts in the NL...In his 138-career starts, deGrom has allowed one or no runs 63 times (46 percent)...That is the most such starts since at least 1908 within a pitcher's first 138-career games...Has 19-career scoreless outings of at least 7.0 innings, tied for the fourth-most in the majors since his debut.

VS. ATLANTA: DeGrom tonight makes his sixth start vs. Atlanta this season, marking the second time he's faced the same opponent six times in one year (also made six starts vs. Washington in 2015)...Is winless in five starts against the Braves in 2018 despite a 1.09 ERA (four earned runs/33.0 innings) in those outings...In his last start against the Braves, was a tough-luck loser after tossing 8.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned...Has tossed a quality start in 12 of his 16 career starts against the club.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JASON VARGAS (6-9, 6.25 ERA)

LAST START: Threw 5.2 innings on September 20 in the Mets' 5-4, extra-inning victory at Washington...Allowed two runs, earned, on three hits with eight strikeouts and two walks...Pitched more than 5.0 innings for the sixth time in his last seven starts.

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 4-1 with a 3.11 ERA (13 earned runs/37.2 innings) in his last seven trips to the mound, a stretch that includes his first three quality starts of the season...Prior to this stretch, was 2-8 with an 8.75 ERA (46 earned runs/47.1 innings).

- Is 23-68 (.338) with seven doubles, a triple, six homers, 23 RBI, 12 runs scored and a 1.166 OPS over his last 17 games since September 8.
- Is third in the majors with 51 second-half RBI and his 16 second-half home runs are eighth in the majors...Ranks eighth in the NL with a career-high 81 walks.
- His 80 RBI this season are a career-high, surpassing his 68 runs driven in last year...His 24 doubles are also a career-high surpassing his 21 in 2016...Matched his career-high with 27 home runs, set last season.
- Drew multiple walks in three-straight games (September 20-22) for the first time in his career...Was the longest streak by a Mets hitter since David Wright's three-game skein from September 26-30, 2015.
