LEADING OFF: Angels play the fifth game (4-0) of their second road trip of 2018 to **Texas** (April 9-11; 3-0) and **Kansas City** (April 12-15; 1-0)...Halos have won eight of nine contests (Club has won seven straight road affairs)...**LAA is 11-3 thru 14 games to match best 14-game start in Club annals (1979)... Best mark after 15 games is 12-3 in 1979...Angels 7-1 start on the road matches best start through first eight road games (1970); A win today would mark best road start in club history through nine game (STATS LLC)...Following the trip, Angels return home to face **Boston** (April 17-19) & **San Francisco** (April 20-22).**

MLB's TOP OFFENSE: Halos lead MLB with +45 run differential (93-48)...**Angels' offense leads the Majors with 93 runs scored, 152 hits, 51 extra base hits, 22 HR and 252 total bases...**Angels have scored 7+ runs in four straight games for first time since franchise record eight game streak in 2014.

HOT HALOS: Kole Calhoun has hits in six straight games (.346; 9/26) games with an RBI in four straight affairs (6 RBI total)...**Mike Trout** has homered in all five series this season...Last night **Nick Tropeano** (6.2 IP, 6 H, 2 BB, 6 SO) made his first MLB appearance since July 18, 2016 – span of 633 days.

BARRIA'S DAY: Jaime Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**...At 21 years, 267 days, Barria is the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 185 days) on June 19, 2011.

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Shohei Ohtani has 11 RBI this season, tied for team-lead in only 7 G with an AB...**Only Dale Alexander (14 RBI for 1929 Tigers) and Mitchell Page (13 RBI for 1977 A's) drove in more RBI in the A.L. during first seven career games...**Has a hit in all six starts as a batter this season (0-for-1 as a pinch hitter)...On Monday he was named the American League Player of the Week...Set Angels' records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Just fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, **Chris Davis, Tom Murphy** and **Matt Kemp**)...Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since **Jim Shaw** for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's 3 HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).

SHOHEI'S SUNDAY: Last Sunday Shohei Ohtani (W; 7 IP, 1 H, 1 BB, 12 SO, 91 pitches/59 strikes) retired the first 19 batters faced... Third player all-time to pitch 7+ innings with one-or-fewer hits and 12+ strikeouts in one of first two career pitching appearances (**Steve Woodard**, MIL in 1997 and **Juan Marichal**, SF in 1960)...**Third player all-time to homer in three consecutive games and have a double-digit strikeout game in the same season (Ken Brett in 1973 and Babe Ruth in 1916).**

SHOKKKKKKKKK OHTANI: 18 total strikeouts this year tie Angels record in first two career pitching appearances (also, **Tim Lincecum**)...**12 strikeouts Sunday tied the American League record for a player in one of their first two games as a pitcher (Fortugno in 1992 and Elmer Myers (Philadelphia A's) in 1915...**Third Angels rookie with 12+ strikeouts in a game (**Fortugno** in 1992 and **Jorge Rubio** (15 SO) in 1966)...**Ohtani logged 25 swinging strikes among the 91 pitches he threw on Sunday -- the most by any pitcher in a game this season. Sixteen of those came on his splitter (MATT OLSON – STATCAST).**

LEADING MAN: Ian Kinsler connected for his 47th career leadoff home run last night, breaking a tie with **Jimmy Rollins** for sole possession of fourth all-time and tops among actives.

FISH FACTS: Last Sunday **Mike Trout** scored his 700th career run; fifth Angel all-time to do so...Only eight players have hit 200 home runs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season all-time: **Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx.**

SHOHEI'S NEXT START: Shohei Ohtani will make his third start as a pitcher on Sunday...With a win, he'd be the first Angels rookie to win each of his first three career starts since **Jered Weaver** won his first seven games in 2006...Ohtani would need two strikeouts on Sunday to break **Tim Fortugno's** club record with 19 strikeouts through his first three career games.

THIS N' THAT: Sunday's home attendance of 44,742 marked the largest day game total (regular season) since the renovation in 1998...Halo relievers rank second in A.L. with a 2.48 ERA (61.2 IP – 17 ER) and .202 BAA...**LAA has committed just three errors thru 14 games...**Halos hurlers have issued 63 free passes, most in **Majors.**

PLAYER POINTS: With two RBI Tuesday, **Albert Pujols** (1,924 RBI) passed **Jimmie Foxx** (1,922 RBI) for sole possession of 9th in MLB career RBI (*baseball-reference.com*)...**Andrelton Simmons leads Majors with 21 hits...**In March/April-May across last two seasons, **Zack Cozart** is batting .323 (73/226)...**Shohei Ohtani** is the first Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games with an AB and the second Angel to hit a HR in each of his first three home games of a season (**Bobby Bonds** in 1977).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani is the first A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since **Babe Ruth** (five times; 1918-1921, 1930 - **STATS LLC**)...First player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since **Babe Ruth** on June 13-14, 1921...**Ohtani** became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since **Ruth** (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: **Mike Trout** has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4).

3000/600: **Albert Pujols** is 15 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HR joining **Hank Aaron, Willie Mays** and **Alex Rodriguez.**

@ ROYALS: Royals claimed 2017 season series 6-1 and have won seven of last nine games vs. Halos...LAA is 8-13 in last 21 matchups spanning back to 2015...**Halos were swept in a three-game series in last visit to KC (April 14-16, 2017)...Angels are 3-7 in last 10 meetings at Kauffman Stadium...LAA leads all-time series 291-286...Pujols** is a career .311 (112/360) hitter with 23 HR and 77 RBI in 93 career games vs. Kansas City...**Mike Trout** is batting .349 (45/129) with 10 HR and 25 RBI (.628 SLG) vs. KC...His .628 SLG pct. is highest by any opponent with 100 at bats.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

April 13

(2014) Angels became the first big-league club to have a 20-year-old (**Mike Trout**), a 30-year-old (**Albert Pujols**) and a 40-year-old (**Raul Ibanez**) hit back-to-back-to-back homers in ascending order by age; (2001) Angels' pitcher **Shigetoshi Hasegawa** faces Seattle's **Ichiro Suzuki** in the first ever Japanese pitcher-batter matchup in Major League history...**Suzuki** would hit an infield single to shortstop but **Hasegawa** would earn the victory over fellow countryman **Kazuhiro Sasaki**; (1991) **Dave Winfield** hit three home runs at Minnesota and finished the day with 15 total bases, establishing a club record for total bases in a game.

April 14

(1982) In a continuation from the night before, the Angels finished the longest game in club history, winning 4-3 in 20 innings vs. Seattle (6:06).

- **WELCOME BACK!**: Tonight marks first regular season start of the year...Opened the year on the disabled list with left elbow inflammation (missed Angels first 14 games).
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING**: Made four starts for Angels this Spring, going 1-0 with a 4.63 ERA (11.2 IP – 6 ER) and 14 strikeouts...Last Spring start came on March 15 at Salt River Fields vs. Rockies (3.1 IP, 8 H, 6 R, 5 ER, 1 BB, 2 SO, 1 HBP).
- **REHAB ASSIGNMENT**: Made one start for Adv.-A Inland Empire on April 6 vs. San Jose and earned the win after working 6.1 innings and allowing one earned run on two hits with one walk and six strikeouts.
- **STARTING NINE**: With today's start, becomes ninth different starting pitcher used by Angels this season...**Nine different starting pitchers through the first 15 games of a season is a new Angels record and are the most by any team since the 1960 Orioles. (STATS LLC)**
- **VS. KANSAS CITY**: Tonight marks first career start vs. Royals...Kansas City is one of four A.L. teams he has not yet faced (also, Tigers, Rays and Angels) .
- **AT KAUFFMAN STADIUM**: Tonight marks first career start at Kauffman Stadium...Is seeking first road win since Sept. 2, 2015 at Oakland.
- **2017 RECAP**: Missed majority of season on disabled list recovering from Tommy John surgery (July 1, 2016)...Following six rehab starts, made return to Angels on Aug. 18 at Baltimore...Made five total starts for Angels, going 1-2 with a 7.06 ERA (21.2 IP – 17 ER).
- **OFFSEASON TRIPS**: Participates in offseason humanitarian mission trip to Honduras each offseason along with several other Major League and Minor League players to help build a new learning center, distribute new backpacksand shoes and teach kids the basics of baseball.
- **CAREER NOTES**: Originally selected by Miami in first round (ninth overall) of 2012 First-Year Player Draft...On Dec. 10, 2014, was traded twice in one day; Was first sent by Miami to Dodgers along with C/INF Austin Barnes, RHP Chris Hatcher and OF Enrique Hernandez in exchange for INF Dee Gordon, RHP Dan Haren, INF Miguel Rojas and cash considerations...Later that day was dealt by Dodgers to Angels for INF Howie Kendrick.

- Hits in 10 of first 13 games as an Angel.
- Collected for second triple of the season Wednesday...Nine triples over the last two season are tied for fifth in the Majors and tied for third by an infielder.
- Connected for first career walk off hit April 3 with a 13th inning solo home run...Was the first walk off home run by an Angel since Albert Pujols Aug. 3, 2016 vs. Oakland.
- On Opening Day, became the 28th Angel all time to homer in first game with the Club and first since Carlos Perez in 2015.
- In eighth big league season (seventh full) and first as an Angel...Spent first seven big league seasons with the Cincinnati Reds...Signed as a free agent Dec. 15, 2017.
- Opening Day start at second marked first career game defensively at any position other than shortstop (744 career games at shortstop)...Made first career start at third base last Friday (March 30).
