BALTIMORE ORIOLES (19-47) vs. BOSTON RED SOX (46-22)

RHP Yefry Ramirez (MLB Debut) vs. LHP Chris Sale (5-4, 2.83)

ZACH IS BACK: LHP Zach Britton made his 2018 debut on Tuesday night against the Red Sox...He tossed 1.0 scoreless inning while walking three and striking out one...Tuesday night marked his first appearance in a Major League game since September 18, 2017 vs. Boston...Britton had been on the disabled list since suffering an offseason injury to his right Achilles tendon.

THE OLD COLLEGE TRY: The 2018 NCAA Division I Baseball Championship began on June 1 with 64 teams...The final eight teams have advanced to the College World Series and will play from June 16-27 at TD Ameritrade Park in Omaha...The Orioles are represented in the 2018 College World Series by alma maters of current O's players and coaches and recent 2018 First-Year Player Draft selections... Seven of the eight teams are represented by the Orioles...The Arkansas Razorbacks are represented by **OF Craig Gentry** and **RHP Blaine Knight** (Round 3)...The Florida Gators are represented by **RHP Darren O'Day** and **OF Nick Horvath** (Round 25)...The Mississippi State Bulldogs are represented by manager **Buck Showalter**...The North Carolina Tar Heels are represented by **C Cody Roberts** (Round 11)...The Oregon State Beavers are represented by **INF Cadyn Grenier** (No. 37 overall)...The Texas Longhorns are represented by hitting coach **Scott Coolbaugh**...The Texas Tech Red Raiders are represented by **RHP Caleb Kilian** (Round 20)...One current Oriole has won a national championship at the College World Series...**Joey Rickard** was a junior outfielder for the 2012 National Champion Arizona Wildcats.

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: **SS Manny Machado** has hit safely in 50-of-65 games played this season...He currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...Additionally, his .380 on-base percentage ranks 10th in the AL and 20th in the majors...His .586 slugging percentage ranks fifth in the majors...His 21 multi-hit games are tied for 12th in the AL and are tied for 20th in the majors...His 147 total bases rank fourth in the majors...His nine intentional walks rank first in the majors.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: **RHP Dylan Bundy** tossed the Orioles 32nd Quality Start of the season on Monday...The O's 32 Quality Starts this season rank fourth in the AL and seventh in the majors...Bundy is tied for eighth in the AL with nine Quality Starts...Orioles starters have received 140 runs of support this season, which ranks fewest in the majors...Overall, Orioles pitchers have received 233 runs of support this season, which ranks fewest in the majors.

A WYNNING STRATEGY: On Tuesday night at Citi Field in New York, **C Austin Wynns** notched a single to left field in the first at-bat of his first Major League game...Wynns was recalled from Triple-A Norfolk, where he hit .257 (28-for-109) in 32 games this season with four doubles, four home runs, and 16 RBI...According to STATS, LLC., Wynns became the 77th Orioles player (since 1954) to collect a hit in his Major League debut and the first since **Anthony Santander** on August 18, 2017 vs. Los Angeles-AL...He became the first to do so in his first plate appearance since **Hyun Soo Kim** on April 10, 2016 vs. Tampa Bay...Wynns is the fifth Oriole to make his Major League debut this season, joining **LHP Nestor Cortes, Jr.**, **RHP Pedro Araujo**, **INF Engelb Vielma**, and **RHP David Hess**.

OUT OF LEFT FIELD: **LF Trey Mancini** recorded his team-leading seventh outfield assist on June 1 against the Yankees when he threw out **Gleyber Torres** at third base...Mancini's seven outfield assists are tied for the Major League lead (with **Lorenzo Cain** and **Kole Calhoun**)...Mancini notched two outfield assists in the bottom of the fifth inning on May 21 at Chicago-AL...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Mancini is one of just two players in Orioles history (since 1954) with two outfield assists in the same inning (also **LF Don Buford** on June 25, 1970 at Boston in the first inning)...According to STATS, LLC., the last player in the majors with two outfield assists in the same inning was **LF José Osuna** of the Pittsburgh Pirates, who did so on July 6, 2017 at Philadelphia in the second inning.

CATCH THIS: On April 21, **C Chance Sisco** threw out three Cleveland base runners attempting to steal (**LF Michael Brantley** at second base in the sixth inning, **SS Francisco Lindor** at second base in the seventh inning, and **PR Rajai Davis** at third in the ninth inning)...It marked the first time an O's catcher had three caught stealing in a game since **C Matt Wieters** caught three runners on August 25, 2012 vs. Toronto...Sisco has caught 10-of-35 would-be base stealers this season and is tied for second in the majors with 10 catcher caught stealing.

VS. BOSTON: The Orioles and Red Sox play the 10th game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Red Sox lead the season series, 8-1...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 490-571, with the Orioles trailing 249-282 at home and trailing 241-289 at Boston.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1999, **3B Cal Ripken, Jr.** set club records by going 6-for-6 and scoring five runs, as the Orioles crushed Atlanta, 22-1, at Turner Field...Ripken had a double and two home runs and drove in six runs...**1B Will Clark** also notched four hits and five RBI the O's 25-hit attack...Ripken became the first player in Orioles history (since 1954) to notch six hits or score five runs in a game...**RHP Mike Mussina** defeated **RHP John Smoltz** in the rout.

GENUINE DRAFT: The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft was held from June 4-6 at MLB Network's Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...The Orioles selected **RHP Grayson Rodriguez** from Central Heights (TX) High School with their first selection as the 11th overall pick and **INF Cadyn Grenier** at No. 37 overall out of Oregon State University...The Orioles selected 40 players overall: 22 pitchers and 18 position players, with 28 of the selections being college athletes...The Orioles chose 16 right-handed pitchers, six left-handed pitchers, seven infielders, seven outfielders, and four catchers.

ORIOLES HALL OF FAME: Former **2B Brian Roberts** has been elected to the Orioles Hall of Fame...Additionally, long-time Orioles Radio broadcaster **Fred Manfra** will be inducted as this year's Herb Armstrong Award winner...Roberts and Manfra will be honored at a luncheon at Oriole Park on August 10, as well as during an on-field ceremony prior to the August 11 game...Roberts played 13 seasons with the Orioles from 2001-13, compiling a .278 batting average and 1,452 hits...He ranks first in O's history among second basemen in all major offensive categories...Drafted by Baltimore in the first round of the 1999 First-Year Player Draft (No. 50 overall), Roberts was a two-time All-Star (2005 and 2007)...Roberts will provide analysis for select games on the Orioles Radio Network this season...Before retiring in 2017, Manfra spent 24 years with the Orioles Radio Network...The East Baltimore native and Patterson High School graduate joined Orioles Radio broadcasts in 1993...In his 47-year broadcasting career, Manfra covered numerous O's highlights and other marquee sporting events.

OPACY GOES GOLD: After a multi-year effort of research and enhancements, Oriole Park at Camden Yards has been awarded with Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold certification for an existing building...At 26 years, Oriole Park is the oldest ballpark to receive LEED Gold certification from the U.S. Green Building Council, and joins three other MLB ballparks to achieve this status: AT&T Park in San Francisco, Marlins Park in Miami, and Target Field in Minnesota.

DISABLED LIST: Six Orioles are currently on the disabled list...**INF Luis Sardiñas** (lower back strain, retroactive to 4/29), **RHP Chris Tillman** (lower back strain, since 5/11), and **RHP Andrew Cashner** (lower back strain, retroactive to 6/9) are on the 10-day disabled list...**RHP Gabriel Ynoa** (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), **OF Colby Rasmus** (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), and **INF Tim Beckham** (left groin strain, retroactive to 4/24) are on the 60-day DL.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), **Buck Showalter** is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (641-616, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,523 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind **Bruce Bochy** and **Mike Scioscia**...His 641 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only **Earl Weaver** (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Making his Major League debut after being recalled from Triple-A Norfolk prior to the game on June 13...Entered the 2018 season ranked as the #19 prospect in the Orioles system according to *MLB.com*...Was acquired by the Orioles from the New York Yankees in exchange for International Signing Bonus Slots on July 31, 2017...Was originally signed by the Arizona Diamondbacks as a minor league free agent on May 28, 2011 and began his professional career as an infielder...Pronounced jeffrey.

LAST START: Earned the win his last time out on June 8 at Toledo when he tossed 5.0-scoreless innings, allowing three hits with one walk and five strikeouts...Was his second start of the season holding the opponent scoreless...Third time allowing three-or-fewer hits...His second-straight win on the road; holds a 3-1 record in road starts this season...Threw 84 pitches, 57 strikes.

NOTES FROM NORFOLK: Has made 12 starts for Triple-A Norfolk so far this season, going 3-4 with a 4.33 ERA (29 ER/60.1 IP) with 20 walks and 63 strikeouts...At the time of his promotion to Baltimore, he ranked fourth among Orioles minor leaguers in strikeouts, and 15th among all Triple-A pitchers; has struck out seven-or-more batters in five of his 12 starts, including four of his last eight starts...Has held right-handers to a .155 (15-for-97) average with four extra-base hits and 10 RBI; left-handed batters have gone 38-for-133 (.286) with 16 extra-base hits and 19 RBI.

MINORS HOME VS. ROAD: Six of his starts have been at home; is 0-3 with a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) in the previous six games...Made nine starts at home last season, going 5-1 with a 3.00 ERA (15 ER/45.0 IP), with 18 walks and 41 strikeouts...Is 3-1 with a 5.02 ERA (16 ER/28.2 IP) in six road games this season...Went 10-2 with a 4.08 ERA (36 ER/79.1 IP), 31 walks and 76 strikeouts in 15 road starts in 2017.

MINORS DAY AND NIGHT: Two of his starts have been during the day this season; is 0-0 with a 6.75 ERA (6 ER/8.0 IP) in two day games with the Tides...Made four day starts last season, going 2-1 with a 3.43 ERA (8 ER/21.0 IP), eight walks and 28 strikeouts...Has made 10 night starts so far this season, going 3-4 with a 3.96 ERA (23 ER/52.1 IP)...Made 20 night starts in 2017, going 13-2 with a 3.48 ERA (40 ER/103.1 IP), 41 walks, and 89 strikeouts.

SPRING NOTES: Made one appearance for the Orioles in Grapefruit League play this spring...Tossed 2.0 innings of relief on February 28 vs. St. Louis, allowing one run on three hits with one walk and two strikeouts; finished with a 4.50 ERA.

2017 RECAP: Prior to being acquired by the Orioles, he spent time with New York-AL's Double-A Trenton; was named an Eastern League Mid-Season All-Star while with Trenton, and led the Thunder in wins (10) and strikeouts (91) at the time of his trade...Went a combined 15-3 with a 3.47 ERA (48 ER/124.1 IP) in 24 starts between the two clubs; his 15 wins marked a single-season career-best and were the most in the EL...Named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for 5/15-5/21 after going 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER/13.0 IP) in two starts; allowed six hits with four walks against 15 strikeouts.

CAREER NOTES: In 2016, combined to go 7-9 with a 2.82 ERA (39 ER/124.1 IP) in 22 starts with Class-A Charleston and Class A-Advanced Tampa; ranked third among all Yankees farmhands in strikeouts and seventh in ERA...Promoted to Tampa on 6/30, going 3-7 with a 2.84 ERA (20 ER/63.1 IP) in 11 starts...Allowed one earned run in 7.0 IP with a career-high 11 strikeouts in his first start with Tampa on 6/30 vs. Lakeland en route to being named FSL Pitcher of the Week for the period from 6/27-7/3...Again named the league's Pitcher of the Week from 8/22-28, after holding Dunedin to one hit over 8.0 scoreless innings on 8/24 (8 K)...Added to the Yankees 40-man roster on 11/18...In 2015, he appeared in 14 games (13 starts) for Rookie-level Missoula, going 5-5 with a 5.35 ERA (41 ER/69.0 IP)...Limited right-handed batters to a .218 (36-for-165) batting average...Split the 2014 season between the AZL Diamondbacks and Rookie-level Missoula, combining to go 6-3 with a 3.06 ERA (23 ER/67.2 IP) in 13 games (10 starts)...In 2013, he appeared in 13 games (11 starts) with the DSL Diamondbacks, and posted an 0-6 record and 3.00 ERA (20 ER/60.0 IP)...Recorded a 9.30 K/9.0 IP ratio...Had a 2.29 ERA prior to his final start before allowing six earned runs over 5.0 IP on 8/23 vs. the DSL Giants...Made his pitching debut in 2012 with the DSL Diamondbacks, going 2-0 with a 3.28 ERA (9 ER/24.2 IP) in 18 relief appearances...In 2011, he made his professional debut as an infielder with the DSL Diamondbacks, hitting .169 (23-for-136) with six doubles, and four RBI in 44 games.
