RAY MATTER—The Rays have dropped two of their last 3 games to fall to 86-68, one game shy of matching their high-water mark of the season... they are 6-2 in their last 8 games and 15-5 in 20 games since the start of September, 2nd-best in the majors this month behind the Astros (15-4)... they are 24-7 (.774) since Aug 19, best in the majors over that stretch.

- + Since the All-Star break, the Rays are 37-21 (.638), 3rd-best in the majors behind the Athletics (39-19) and Red Sox (37-20).
- + The Rays are 8-0-1 in their last nine series and 11-1-1 in their last 13 series, with the only loss in the last 13 series coming at Boston.
- + The Rays would need a win today to avoid losing consecutive games for the first time in over a month, since Aug 17-18 at BOS.
- + The Rays would need to go 4-4 or better in the remaining 8 games for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays are 26-30 (.464) in 1-run games...the 56 1-run games are tied with 2010 and 2015 for the single-season club record, and the 30 1-run losses are tied with 2015 for the club record.

THE E-WORD—Any Rays loss or Athletics win will eliminate the club from postseason contention...it would be the fourth time the Rays are eliminated from postseason contention in the final week of the regular season...they were eliminated last season on Sep 26 with 5 games remaining, in 2015 with 6 games left and in 2012 with 2 games left...since becoming the Rays in 2008, the club has played only 48 games in which they were mathematically eliminated from postseason contention.

- + The Rays are on pace for 90 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + For the record, the largest postseason deficit for a 90-game winner in the Wild Card era (1994) is 6 GB, when the 2002 Red Sox and Mariners went 93-69 but the Angels won the Wild Card at 99-63.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be leading the NL West, tied for the AL Central and 0.5 GB in the NL East.

7-ELEVEN—The Rays have clinched a winning record for the first time since 2013 (92-71), and for the first time under fourth-year Manager **Kevin Cash**...this is the club's seventh winning season, all coming in a span of 11 seasons since becoming the Rays...they are one of only seven teams in the majors with seven winning seasons since 2008, along with the Yankees (11), Dodgers (10), Red Sox (8), Cardinals (8), Giants (7) and Rangers (7)... the Nationals (78-77) and Angels (75-80), each with six winning seasons since 2008, have a chance to join this group...since 2008, the Rays hold a 941-834 (.530) record, 6th-best in the majors behind the Yankees (.567), Dodgers (.556), Cardinals (.554), Red Sox (.549) and Angels (.531).

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—The Rays are 10-5 against the Blue Jays this season (5-1 at home, 5-4 on the road) and 195-172 (.531) all-time, their most wins against any opponent...they are 4-0-0 in series play this season, though can do no better than a split this series...the Rays have outscored them, 71-43, through 15 games this season—they have allowed 2 runs or fewer in nine of 15 games, and allowed 1 run or fewer in six of 15 games...this is the ninth time in the last 11 years they've won the season series.

- + This is the third of three straight trips to go through Toronto, and the Rays host the Blue Jays next weekend...this continues a stretch facing them 13 times in the club's final 47 games of the season.

PITCHING POINTS—The Rays rank 3rd in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.64 ERA—only three times in franchise history have they finished a season with a lower ERA: 2011 (3.58), 2012 (3.19) and 2014 (3.56)...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors with a 3.33 ERA, behind the Dodgers (3.20)—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays have a pitcher to a AL-best 3.33 ERA in the 1st inning—**Blake Snell** has a 0.93 ERA in the 1st, 2nd in the AL (min. 20 GS).
- + The Rays are 44-37 with traditional starters and 42-31 otherwise.
- + 24 different pitchers have recorded a win for the Rays, most in the majors and a single-season club record ahead of 2017 (20).

CY ZILLA—Today's starter **Blake Snell** leads the majors with 20 wins, and leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors with a 1.97 ERA to NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.77)...the last 10 pitchers to lead the AL in both ERA and victories (outright or shared) have won the AL Cy Young Award...since the Cy Young was awarded to both leagues in 1967, 13 of the 14 pitchers to lead

the AL in both wins and ERA won the Cy Young, with the exception of BAL **Mike Boddicker** in 1984, when DET **Willie Hernández** won it.

- + The last time both the AL and NL ERA leaders had sub-2.00 ERA's was in 1972: BOS **Luis Tiant** (1.91) and PHI **Steve Carlton** (1.97).

FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS—Since the start of August, the Rays are a majors-best 32-15 (.681), leading the majors since then with 54 SB, a .271 avg., .352 OBP, 2.98 ERA, 1.05 WHIP and .213 opp avg. ...they also rank 5th over this stretch with a .990 fielding pct. ...they Rays have scored at least 5 runs in 23 of 47 games (48.9 pct.) since the start of August, while they have recorded double-digit hits in 21 games (44.7 pct.), allowed 3 runs or fewer in 31 games (66.0 pct.) and played 32 errorless games (68.1 pct.).

PICK YOUR POISON—The Rays have two players batting at least .300 in **Mallex Smith** (.302, 9th in the AL) and **Joey Wendle** (.300, 10th in the AL and best among major league rookies) and a third player, **Matt Duffy** (.297, 12th in the AL), flirting with a .300 avg. ...the Rays, Red Sox, Braves and Brewers are the only teams in the majors with two qualifying players batting .300 or better...never in club history have three qualifiers finished at .300 or better—twice the Rays have had a pair of qualifiers do that.

- + Six different Rays (10 times) have finished a season batting .300 or better, but none since **Casey Kotchman** (.306) did it in 2011.

THE CONTACT THEORY—Since 1950, only two teams have had three players qualify for the batting title hit at least .300 with fewer than 10 HR, as the Rays have the potential to do...the 1971 Cardinals, managed by Hall of Famer **Red Schoendienst**, had **Lou Brock** (.313, 7 HR), **Ted Simmons** (.304, 7 HR) and **Matty Alou** (.315, 7 HR)...the 1950 Red Sox had four such players: **Dom DiMaggio** (.328, 7 HR), **Johnny Pesky** (.312, 1 HR), **Al Zarilla** (.325, 9 HR) and **Billy Goodman** (.354, 4 HR).

CUSTOM BUILT—All of the club's remaining games this season are against the Yankees and Blue Jays...while the Yankees have 12 players with double-digit homers and the Blue Jays have 11 players with 10+ HR, the Rays have only four, tied with the Tigers for fewest in the majors and tied with 2001 for their fewest in a single season in franchise history...the Rays have only one player with at least 15 HR—no other team has fewer than two, and the Yankees have seven and the Blue Jays have six.

- + The Rays have totaled 143 HR this season, 4th-fewest in the majors and 85 HR fewer than their club-record 228 HR last season...they have won 27 games this season without the benefit of a home run, tied with the Pirates for most in the majors, and most in the AL.

STAY THIRSTY, MY FRIENDS—The Rays have not thrown a complete game since **Matt Andriese** on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK...they have played 444 games since then, the longest drought in AL history and 2nd-longest in major league history, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, behind the Marlins (480) from June 4, 2014–June 2, 2017...since then:

- + the longest outing for a Rays starting pitcher is 8 IP (eight times)
- + a Rays starter has pitched into the 9th inning only once: **Alex Cobb** on July 21, 2017 vs. TEX (double, homer and was replaced)
- + the Rays have had 10 CG thrown against them
- + the Indians have recorded a majors-most 16 CG, while six pitchers have thrown at least 5 CG, led by CLE **Corey Kluber** (9)

LAST START—On Tues at TEX, his only hit allowed in 5 IP was a 2nd-inning, 2-out single by **Robinson Chirinos**...did allow at least one baserunner in every inning but the 3rd, on a E6 (1st inning), single (2nd), walk (4th) and walk (5th)...his pitch count by inning was 20-22-14-17-19, and his 5 IP were his fewest since Aug 16 at NYY, his third start back from the disabled list...handed a 3-0 lead to the bullpen, and the Rays went on to win, 4-0, for his 20th win...his line: W, 5 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 5 SO, 92/58.

CY ZILLA—Leads the majors with 20 wins, and leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors with a 1.97 ERA behind NYM **Jacob deGrom** (1.77)...the last 10 pitchers to lead the AL in both ERA and victories (outright or shared) have won the AL Cy Young Award...since the Cy Young was awarded to both leagues in 1967, 13 of the 14 pitchers to lead the AL in both wins and ERA won the Cy Young, with the exception of BAL **Mike Boddicker** in 1984, when Tigers closer **Willie Hernández** won it.

THE WIN COLUMN—Is the majors' first 20-game winner since 2016...is tied with **David Price** in 2012 for the single-season club record—Price won the AL Cy Young Award that season...with a win today, would become the majors' youngest 21-game winner since LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (21) in 2011 and the AL's youngest since OAK **Barry Zito** (23) in 2002...has won a club-record eight straight starts (without a no-decision in between), the only pitcher to do that in the majors this season...with a win today, would be the first to win nine straight within a single season since CWS **Chris Sale** in 2016...his streak of eight straight winning decisions is tied for the 2nd-longest in club history behind **Matt Moore** (9) from Sep 29, 2012–May 19, 2013.

ON THE LINE—The last two AL pitchers to record 20 wins and a sub-2.00 ERA are BOS **Roger Clemens** (21 wins, 1.93 ERA) in 1990—two years before Snell was born—and NYY **Ron Guidry** (25 wins, 1.74 ERA) in 1978...his 1.97 ERA is the lowest by any AL pitcher since BOS **Pedro Martínez** (1.74) in 2000 and ranks 4th since the adoption of the DH in 1973...at age 25, Snell has a chance to do something only six other pitchers have done in the live ball era (since 1920): finish with 20 wins and a sub-2.00 ERA at age 25 or younger...that group includes NYM **Dwight Gooden** in 1985, OAK **Vida Blue** in 1971, DET **Denny McLain** in 1968, BAL **Dave McNally** in 1968, LAA **Dean Chance** in 1964 and DET **Hal Newhouser** twice, in 1945 and 1946.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS—In 9 starts since Aug 4, is 8-0 with a 1.26 ERA (50-IP, 7-ER), including 8 starts of 1 ER or fewer...included over this span is a start on Aug 10 at TOR, his only start against the Blue Jays this season, where he retired all 15 BF in his second start since returning from the 10-day DL...was the fourth time since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) that a starting pitcher was pulled with a perfect game through at least 5 IP.

+ In 14 starts since June 19, is 12-1 with a 1.32 ERA (81.2-IP, 12-ER)...in 20 starts since May 18, is 16-2 with a 1.46 ERA (117-IP, 19-ER).

LEADERBOARDS—In addition to leading the AL in wins and ERA, ranks among AL leaders in opp avg. (.179, 1st), WHIP (0.97, 2nd) SO/9 IP ratio (10.65, 6th), HR/9 IP ratio (0.85, 3rd) and wild pitches (13, tied for 3rd)...min. 100 IP, leads the majors with a .091 opp avg. with RISP and a .061 opp avg. with RISP/2 outs...according to FanGraphs, is averaging 95.8 mph on his fastball, 3rd in the AL, and 14.6 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 2nd in the AL.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 1 run or fewer in 19 starts this season, 2nd-most in the majors behind teammate **Ryne Stanek** (22)—who has made 27 starts this season but none longer than 2 IP...excluding openers, they are the most by an AL pitcher since LAA **Jered Weaver** (19) in 2011...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 25 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind Stanek (26)...has allowed 2 runs or fewer in 18 of his last 20 starts dating back to May 18 at LAA.

+ Excluding openers, his 19 starts of 1 run or fewer and 25 starts of 2 runs or fewer are both single-season club records.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + On Sep 11 vs. CLE, was ejected by home plate umpire **Mark Carlson**, his eighth ejection as Rays manager, first since July 18, 2017 at OAK.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
