### HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

- The Rockies are 5-3 in this season-long 10-game homestand ... with 18 games remaining in the regular season, Colorado has a 1.5-game edge over the Los Angeles Dodgers and lead Arizona by 2.5 in the NL West Division.

  The Rockies will begin a nine-game, 10-day trip on Friday ... play three in San Francisco, three at Los Angeles-NL and three at Arizona before finishing the regular season at home with four against Philadelphia and three vs. Washington.

  This is the latest the Rockies have been alone in first place in the division since the 1995 Rockies held first place as late as Sept. 26 (139th game) ... by games, it is the latest in franchise history that the Rockies have held first place, as the strike-shortened 1995 season consisted of only 144 games.

## GO WEST YOUNG MAN

With 11 divisional games remaining, the Rockies are 35-30 vs. the National League West ... last year the Rockies were 42-34 against their division rivals ... the 2007 team was the best in franchise history vs. the NL West, going 43-30.

### WHO'S THE TORTOISE?

- The Rockies' .549 winning percentage through 144 games (79-65) is tied with the 2010 and 2017
- teams for the second-highest mark in franchise history, behind the 2009 club (.569, 82-62). The Rockies were eight games back after play on June 27 at 38-42 ... since June 28, are 41-23 (.641), the highest winning percentage in the National League and the third-best clip in the Majors.

## **BETTER HOMES AND ROOFTOPS**

Since an eight-game home losing streak ended June 19, the Rockies are 28-13 at Coors Field (.683), the secondest home winning percentage in the NL.

## LEAVE THE SNAKES ON THE PLANE

- Colorado is 6-8 vs. Arizona this year, 3-5 in Denver and 3-3 at Chase Field ... the Rockies are 5-2 the past seven games after going 1-6 the first seven. The Rockies have won three of the past four games

- at home vs Arizona after losing nine straight in Denver from June 21, 2017 to July 10, 2018.
- The Rockies have not won a season series vs. Arizona since going 10-9 in 2014. Charlie Blackmon has hit safely in 12 of 14 games vs. Arizona this year (.345, 19-for-55), including five
- straight. lan Desmond has slashed .354/.415/.645 while hitting safely in 11 of 14 games vs. Arizona this year. DJ LeMahieu is batting .333 (16-for-48) vs. Arizona, (hitting in nine of 12 games).

### PITCHING MATTERS

The Rockies' 3.80 ERA since June 28 ranks fourth in the National League ... the starters 3.74 clip (380.0 IP, 158 ER) ranks sixth ... the team's overall 3.42 home ERA (316.0, 120 ER) since June 28 is second.

The 827.1 innings by Colorado's starters rank third in the NL and fifth in MLB ... the Rockies' 458.2 relief innings are last in the NL and 28th in MLB.

### **TUFF ENUFF**

Colorado is 48-38 against clubs with winning records, ranking third in the Majors in wins against .500 or better clubs.

### AT THE TOP

- Since 2015, Nolan Arenado leads the Majors with 490 RBI and tops the NL with 152 home runs.
  Among NL leaders this year, he is third in multi-hit games (50), tied for third in homers (32), tied for fourth in RBI (97), is fifth in runs (93) and extrabase hits (65), and is tied for 10th in average (.296).

### **IT'S A LONELY CLUB**

- Trevor Story tallied his 40th double in the first inning Tuesday to became the first shortstop in Major League history to record at least 40 doubles, at least 30 home runs and at least 25 stolen bases in a single season ... he is the 16th player all-time (19th time) to reach those numbers, the third Rockies player to do so (Larry Walker, 1997 and Ellis Burks, 1996).
- Additionally, Story is the second shortstop since 1920 (when RBI became an official statistic) to have a season with 30 home runs, 100 RBI, 25 stolen bases and 100 or games at shortstop (also: Alex Rodriguez, 1998).

THE STORY CONTINUES
 Trevor Story leads the Majors this month with six homers and 15 RBI ... hitting .325 (13-for-40) in 10 games in September.

## NO CLICHÉ

Trevor Story ranks first in the NL in total bases (307) and extra-base hits (77), tied for first in doubles (40), tied for second in RBI (100), tied for third in home runs (32), tied for sixth in hits (161), and tied for fifth in stolen bases (25).

## **BABY COME BACK**

The Rockies' 42 come-from-behind wins are second in the NL (third in the Majors) and the fourth-most in franchise history.

## **MID-SUMMER MAGIC**

- MID-SUMMER MAGIC

  Since June 28, the Rockies have gone a combined 31-6 when Kyle Freeland (12-1), Jon Gray (9-2) and German Márquez (10-3) start on the mound.

  Freeland (2.42) and Márquez (2.45) rank sixth and seventh, respectively, in ERA in the NL over that span ... Márquez's 111 strikeouts since June 28 are second in the National League.

## BACK IN BLACK

Charlie Blackmon has hit safely in 15 of his past 19 games (.363; 29-for-80) ... since Aug. 31, he is batting .413 (19-for-46) ... Blackmon's .405 average (17-for-42) this month is first among National League players with 30 or more plate appearances.

## **MINOR FEATS**

Taking two of three from Ogden to win the South Division title, Grand Junction advanced to the Pioneer League Championship against Great Falls ... GJ lost the first game Tuesday, 12-9 ... the best-of-three series resumes in Great Falls on Thursday.

Colorado's 2013 first-round pick (third overall) out of the University of Oklahoma will make his 28th start of the season, his 14th at home and his 11th since his July 14 recall from Triple-A Albuquerque.

- Earned no decision against the Dodgers on Sept. 7 after allowing two runs on four hits with five walks and four strikeouts over his four innings of work ... the five walks tied his career high (second time, also: June 22, 2016 at New York-AL). His four innings pitched were his fewest since June 28 at San Francisco.

### HOOOOWL

- In 10 starts since his July 14 recall from Triple-A Albuquerque, is 4-0 with a 3.17 ERA (65.1 IP, 23 ER), 16 walks and 49 strikeouts ... has pitched seven or more innings in five of those 10 starts, including at least 7.1 innings three times ... prior to the recall, had only pitched 7.1 innings or more twice in his career. Optioned in-season for the first time in his career on June 29. Pitched seven or more innings while allowing two or fewer earned runs in four consecutive starts July 14-Aug. 5 ... was the longest such streak since Ubaldo Jimenez pitched a franchise record seven such games in succession, May 3-June 6.2010.

- Will be making his second start against the Diamondbacks this season ... his other was Opening Day, when he took the loss after allowing three runs on six hits with three walks and four strikeouts over four innings of work.
  Has made six career starts against Arizona, going 2-3 with a 4.98 ERA (34.1 IP, 19 ER), 10 walks and 34 strikeouts ... has made two quality starts against the Diamondbacks in his career, striking out 10 in each one (June 30 and Sept. 12 of last season, both in Arizona) last season, both in Arizona).

- Prior to his start vs. Los Angeles-NL on Aug. 10, had pitched at least seven innings and allowed one earned run in three consecutive starts at Coors Field ... that is tied with four other pitchers for the second-longest such streak at Coors Field (longest: five, Jason Jennings, June 20-Aug. 15, 2006) ... was the first pitcher with three such games since Juan Nicasio in 2011.

  This season, is 6-3 with a 4.56 ERA (75.0 IP, 38 ER), 23 walks and 86 strikeouts in 13 starts at Coors Field
- in 13 starts at Coors Field. In 40 career starts in Denver, he is 18-7 with a 4.51 ERA (225.1 IP, 113 ER) ...
- his .720 winning percentage at home is the third-best mark in franchise history (min. 20 starts) ... the Rockies are 24-16.

  In 33 starts at Coors Field since May 13, 2016, is 18-6 with a 3.81 ERA (196.0 IP, 83 ER), 51 walks and 209 strikeouts ... the Rockies are 22-11 over that span ... in his first seven career starts at home, was 0-1 with a 9.20 ERA (29.1 IP, 30 ER).

- SO
  His 505 career strikeouts are eighth in franchise history ... needs 10 more strikeouts to pass Jhoulys Chacin (514) for seventh.
  His 9.54 strikeouts per nine innings and 3.41 strikeout-to-walk ratio are the best in franchise history among pitchers with at least 20 starts.

- His strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.73 ranks ninth in the National League ... has struck out 168 while walking 45 ... ranks tied for 10th in the NL with 168 strikeouts and seventh with 9.61 strikeouts per nine innings.

  Struck out his 100th batter of the season June 17, his 15th start of the season ... it was the quickest, by starts, a Rockies starter reached 100 strikeouts in
- franchise history.

## **FAN MAN**

Is the only pitcher in franchise history to have three games of 12 or more strikeouts ... has three games in his career with double-digit strikeouts and no walks, tied for the most such games in team history (also: Jorge De La Rosa, Pedro Astacio) ... in club history, only Pedro Astacio (15) has more games with 10-plus strikeouts.

OPEN A CAN

• Started for the Rockies on Opening Day in Arizona on March 29, and joined Kevin Ritz (1996-97), Darryl Kile (1998-99), Mike Hampton (2001-02) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010-11) as the only Rockies starting pitchers to make consecutive Opening Day starts ... also started Opening Day at Milwaukee in 2017 ... Jason Jennings (2003, 2006), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jorge De La Rosa (2014, 2016) all made two Opening Day starts but not in consecutive years.

## **RADIOACTIVE**

- Made two starts with Triple-A Albuquerque after being optioned on June 29, going I-0 with a 3.38 ERA (10.2 IP, 4 ER), four walks and I3 strikeouts ... allowed four hits and one home run.

  Won his first start, July 3 at El Paso, after pitching six innings and allowing two runs on two hits with no walks and six strikeouts ... held the Chihuahuas hitless in five innings before allowing a leadoff single in the sixth ... also surrendered a two-run home run in the sixth inning.

  Last start came on July 8 vs. Tacoma ... pitched 4.2 innings and allowed three runs (two earned) on five hits with four walks and seven strikeouts in the Isotopes 8-6 loss.

The 25-year-old left-handed Denver native will make his 30th start of the season, his 14th at home ... recorded his 20th quality start of the season his last time out, Sept. 8 vs. Los Angeles-NL (6.0,4,1,1,2,8), his seventh in a row ... became the fourth Rockies starter (fifth time) to record 20 or more quality starts in a single season ... will be making his fourth start of the season against Arizona, his third at home ... is 0-1 with a 4.96 ERA (16.1 IP, 9 ER) with eight walks and 15 strikeouts against the Diamondbacks this season, I-2 with a 4.60 ERA (29.1 IP, 15 ER), 17 walks and 22 strikeouts in his career against Arizona ... has gone 8-2 with a 2.21 ERA (81.1 IP, 20 ER), 29 walks and 75 strikeouts over his 13 starts in Denver this season.
