RAY MATTER—The Rays have won seven of their last 8 games to improve to a season-high 14 games over .500, their most since finishing the 2013 season at 92-71...they have outscored opponents, 57-28, over this 8-game stretch and 111-57 over their last 19 games since Aug 19, going 16-3 over that span for their best 19-game stretch since since July 7-30, 2013 (16-3).

- + The Rays are three shy of 81 wins, which would be their most under Manager **Kevin Cash**...they are four wins shy of clinching their first winning record since 2013 and would need to go 12-8 or better for their sixth 90-win campaign in 11 seasons as the Rays.
- + The Rays are 29-17 (.630) since the All-Star break, 4th-best in the majors behind the Athletics, Red Sox and Cardinals...they are 24-11 (.686) since the beginning of August, tied with the A's for best in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Cardinals.
- + 13 of the club's remaining 20 games this season are at home.
- + With a Red Sox win or Rays loss, the Rays would officially be eliminated from AL East contention.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays have won 11 consecutive home games since Aug 9, tied with April 22-May 13, 2008 for the longest home winning streak in franchise history...they have outscored opponents, 76-26, in these 11 games...it matches the Yankees from April 21-May 9 for the longest home winning streak in the majors this season—a win tonight would be the longest in the majors since the Indians from June 1-July 5, 2016 (13).

- + This current run marks the fourth time this season the Rays have gone on a home winning streak of at least 6 games (11, 8, 6, 6).
- + Since June 11, the Rays are 32-8 (.800) at home, best home winning pct. in the majors over that span ahead of the Red Sox (26-9, .743)...four of these 8 losses came over a 5-game stretch from Aug 3-8 vs. CWS/BAL...through June 10, the Rays were 12-16 at home.
- + The Rays have 44 wins at home, their most since 2013 (51)...they have clinched a winning record at home for a second consecutive season after going .500 or worse in 2014, 2015 and 2016.
- + The Rays have won in walk-off fashion eight times this season, tied for most in the AL and their most since 2013 (13)...they have hit four walk-off home runs, tied for most in the AL.
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 46 games at home: 35 wins, 10 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

HOME COOKING—This is the second series of a 3-series, 9-game homestand against the Orioles (3-0), Indians and Athletics...the Rays are coming off a 3-game sweep of the Orioles, outscoring them, 32-10...the 32 runs were 2nd-most in club history for a 3-game series, behind Aug 29-31, 2008 vs. BAL (34)...the 3 games this homestand marks the fifth time in club history the Rays have won three straight games, all by 5+ runs (last Aug 14-16, 2016 at NYY, vs. SD)—they have never done this in four straight.

- + So far this homestand, the Rays have scored in 13 of a possible 24 innings (54.2 pct.) and hit safely in 16 of 24 innings (66.7 pct.)
- + The sweep of the Orioles was the 11th sweep by the Rays this season, 4th-most in the majors and one shy of a club record (2013)...it was their ninth sweep at home, most in a season in club history.

WHERE WE STAND—The Rays remain 8.0 GB of the A's for the AL's second Wild Card...the Rays entered August only one game over .500 and 9 GB of the Mariners for the second Wild Card, and despite improving to 14 games over they have gained only one game on the Wild Card leader over that span...the Rays have a 1.0 pct. chance of making the postseason according to Baseball Prospectus, a 0.1 pct. chance according to FanGraphs and 0.1 pct. chance per ESPN.com.

- + Through games of June 16, the Rays were 13.5 GB of the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card, a season-high deficit to Seattle...they have gained 13 games on them since then, and are a half-game from having no other teams separating them from the Athletics.
- + The Rays have gone 25-23 this season against the five AL teams

currently positioned to make the playoffs, incl. 16-6 since June 22.

- + The Rays are on pace for 89 wins, and since the second Wild Card was introduced in 2012 the only teams to win that many and miss the postseason are the 2013 Rangers (91, lost "Game 163" tiebreaker against the Rays), 2012 Angels (89) and 2012 Rays (90).
- + With 20 games remaining in 2011, the Rays were 7.0 GB of the Red Sox for the AL Wild Card, and they passed them in Game 162.
- + A team with the same record as the Rays would be 0.5 GB in the NL East, tied for the NL West lead and 2.5 GB in the AL Central.

OFFENSE EN FUEGO—The Rays have scored 8 runs or more in three straight games, tied for the 2nd-longest streak in club history...their only longer streak came earlier this season, April 20-26 vs. MIN, at BAL (5).

- + Over their last 17 games, the Rays have scored 108 runs (6.35 R/G), including 5 runs or more 12 times and 8 runs or more six times...they have recorded double-digit hits in three consecutive games and in 13 of their last 17 games...the 108 runs are their most over a 17-game span since April 19-May 7, 2010 (110), and the +51 run differential is their highest over 17 games since Aug 8-24, 2012 (+52).
- + Only once over this 17-game stretch have the Rays failed to score at least 3 runs: a 3-0 loss against **Corey Kluber** on Aug 31 at CLE.
- + The Rays rank 2nd in the AL with a .259 avg. and 2nd in the AL with a .331 OBP...both their avg. and on-base pct. has increased 14 points over last season, both the best improvement in the majors.
- + The Rays have hit 6 HR in their last 3 games, including 4 HR with 2 runners (or more) on base...they have also won 26 games this season with the benefit of a home run, most in the majors.

RAYS vs. INDIANS—This series wraps up a stretch of 6 games between the clubs in a 13-day span...the Rays are 60-94 (.390) all-time against the Indians (33-43 at home, 27-51 on the road), their worst mark against any AL opponent...the Rays went 2-1 at Progressive Field, Aug 31-Sep 2, to win a second consecutive series there for the third time in franchise history...they have lost the last four season series to the Indians (2014-17).

- + The Rays are 19-10 (.655) against the AL Central this season.
- + Last season, the Rays went 1-3 against the Indians at home, scoring 7 runs in the 4-game series...they were shut out twice.

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by **Diego Castillo**, the 45th time the Rays will use an opener and sixth time using Castillo in that role...the Rays opened the season with bullpen days as needed in place of a traditional starter, and since May 19, they have used openers to start games—generally facing 3-9 batters, depending on matchups.

- + In March, the Rays announced a season-opening rotation of **Chris Archer**, **Blake Snell**, **Nathan Eovaldi** and **Jake Faria**...all four pitchers spent time on the disabled list and two were traded in July...the Rays have used other starters in 77 of 142 games (54.2 pct.).
- + Since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA, Rays pitching ranks 2nd in the majors and 1st in the AL with a 3.34 ERA—before that, their 4.43 ERA was 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.
- + The Rays are 41-35 with traditional starters and 37-29 otherwise.
- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 59 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 50 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).

REDEFINING RELIEF—56.0 pct. of the team's innings have been covered by the bullpen...the starters have thrown 558.1 IP, fewest in the majors, and the relievers have thrown 710.1 IP, most in major league history, passing the 2012 Rockies (657.0)...they have thrown 149 IP more than any other bullpen (Padres), and 82 pct. more than the Indians bullpen, which has combined for 389.2 IP, fewest in the majors...the Rays bullpen is one of five in major league history to reach 600 IP, and the previous four all finished with losing records...this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 53 apps of at least 50 pitches and 26 apps of at least 70 pitches, both the most since Baseball Reference data is available (1908);
- + 79 decisions, most since Baseball Reference data is available;
- + 128 apps of at least 2 IP, most since the 1992 Royals (137);
- + 63 apps of at least 3 IP, most since the 1987 Angels (73);
- + 41 apps of at least 4 IP, most since the 1924 Cardinals (41);
- + 29 apps of at least 5 IP, most since the 1924 Phillies (30)

TONIGHT'S START

- + Last pitched on Sat vs. BAL, starting and pitching a scoreless 1st inning...retired his first 2 BF, then went walk, single and inning-ending caught stealing.
- + Has pitched to a 3.68 ERA (7.1-IP, 3-ER) in 5 starts, with all of the runs scoring on a 3-run homer by **Johan Camargo** in the 1st inn. on Aug 29 at ATL...has gone 1.2, 1.2, 2.0, 1.0 and 1.0 IP in his first 5 starts, with 6, 7, 9, 4 and 4 BF in those starts.
- + The Rays are 5-0 in his 5 starts, the third time they've won the first 5 starts of a pitcher's career, following **Tanyon Sturtz** (7-0) in 2000-01 and **Bobby Witt** (5-0) in 1999.
- + Is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (20-IP, 5-ER) in his last 14 apps (5 starts), including 12 scoreless outings, after allowing 9 runs in his previous 5 apps from July 15-29.
- + Has gone 1.1 IP or longer 14 times this season, and 2 IP or longer nine times...has thrown as many as 36 pitches, 2x-last Aug 29 at ATL (2 IP).
- + In his last 7 apps (5 starts) since Aug 19 at BOS, has thrown 13 pitches clocked at 100 mph or more...did this once in his first 29 apps this season.
- + His avg. fastball velocity this season is 97.2 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 101.3 mph in his start on Sep 2 at CLE.
- + Recalled from Triple-A Durham on June 5...went 0-1 with a 1.03 ERA (26.1-IP, 3-ER), 4 saves, 32 SO and .167 opp avg. in 19 apps for the Bulls.
- + Is one of a club-record 16 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels (15) and Twins (15)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 16 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17).

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- + On July 1 vs. HOU, inherited the bases loaded with 1 out in the 8th inning...struck out **José Altuve** in a 10-pitch at-bat and got a groundout for the third out.
- + Recorded multiple strikeouts in the first 5 apps of his career, all as a reliever, the first reliever to do that since LAD **Grant Dayton** in 2016, and first AL reliever to do it since TEX **Nefalí Feliz** in 2009, according to Baseball Reference...was the only Rays reliever to begin his career in this fashion.
- + On June 13 vs. TOR, recorded his first career win in his fourth career app...his only baserunner allowed in 2 IP was a 8th-inning, 2-out single.
- + On June 6 at WAS, made his major league debut and pitched a perfect 7th inning, including strikeouts of **Brian Goodwin** and **Trea Turner**.

2017 SEASON

- + Split the season between Double-A Montgomery and Triple-A Durham, earning a June 3 promotion...marked the third straight year he received an in-season promotion...combined to go 4-5 with a 2.76 ERA (71.2-IP, 22-ER) and 15 saves in 51 apps (1 start) between the two levels.
- + Named Minor League Reliever of the Year by the Rays Baseball Operations dept...led the Rays system in saves (15) for a second consecutive year.
- + Recorded the save in the Governors' Cup clinching win over Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (Yankees) and the Triple-A National Championship Game over Memphis (Cardinals)...did not allow a run in 4 apps in the IL postseason spanning 5 IP (1-H, 0-BB, 8-SO).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH TYLER GLASNOW (1-5, 4.64 ERA)

LAST START—On Wed at TOR, lasted 0.2 IP, the shortest start of his career, and the shortest by a Ray, excluding openers, since **Chris Archer** (0.0 IP, 2 BF) on Sep 2, 2017 at CWS (injury)...excluding openers and injury-shortened starts, it was the shortest by a Ray since **J.P. Howell** on July 5, 2007 at BOS (0.2 IP)...yielded 7 runs, tying his career high (3rd time), and allowed eight of his 10 BF to reach base...actually recorded the potential third out of the inning, but the batter reached on a third-strike wild pitch...his line: L, 0.2 IP, 5 H, 7 R/ER, 2 BB, 2 SO, 1 HR, 2 WP, 39 pit, 23 str.

- + Is 0-3 with a 5.17 ERA (31.1-IP, 18-ER) in 7 starts with the Rays...has yielded 3 hits or fewer in five of his 7 starts and 2 hits or fewer in 4 starts...has allowed 1 run or fewer in four of his 7 starts.

vs. CLEVELAND—Has faced the Indians once in his career, less than two weeks ago on Aug 31 at CLE, and his only run allowed in a career-high 7 IP was a solo homer by **Edwin Encarnacion** in the 7th inning...faced the minimum through 4 IP and did not allow a hit until a 2-out, 5th-inning single...averaged 11.3 pitches per inning, and never threw more than 13 pitches in a frame...became the fifth Rays pitcher (6th time) to lose a start of 7 IP (or more) and 2 hits or fewer, first since **Jake Odorizzi** on May 29, 2016 vs. NYY (7-IP, 1-H, 2-R/ER)...he was the first Rays starter to do this when allowing 1 run or fewer since **James Shields** on Oct 2, 2012 vs. BAL (9-IP, 2-H, 1-R/ER)...his line: L, 7 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 BB, 6 SO, 1 HR, 79 pit, 56 str.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Batting .385/.467/.423 (10-for-26) in 7 games (all starts) since the start of September...has recorded multiple hits in four of his last 6 games.
- + His avg. was below .200 as late as July 29 (.196)...since then, is batting .333/.406/.496 (39-for-117) with 4 2B, 5 HR and 15 RBI in 34 games (33 starts).
- + Min. 75 PA, since the start of August, ranks among AL rookie leaders in avg. (.333, 3rd) and on-base pct. (.403, 3rd)...also is tied for 2nd with 38 hits.
- + On Aug 7 vs. BAL, became the fifth in club history to hit a walk-off homer before his 23rd birthday and second this season, joining Jake Bauers.
- + Has appeared in 67 games and made 65 starts (57-SS, 8-2B)...his 12 errors are one shy of tying Matt Duffy (13) for most on the team.
- + Entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 19 prospect in the minors...homered in his major league debut on May 22 vs. BOS.

- + Is 1-for-his-last-17, 2-for-his-last-34 and 4-for-his-last-53...on Sat vs. BAL, snapped a 0-for-15 skid with a RBI single in the 1st inning.
- + Only has 1 XBH in his last 91 AB starting with the 2nd inning on Aug 2 vs. LAA...hasn't homered since Aug 1 vs. LAA (8th inning, 2-run).
- + Batting .139/.265/.255 (19-for-137) with 4 HR and 19 RBI in 43 games (39 starts) since the All-Star break, after .252/.368/.496 in the first half.
- + Since his June 7 recall, ranks among ML rookies in doubles (17, tied for 2nd), RBI (37, tied for 5th), extra-base hits (28, tied for 4th) and walks (47, 2nd).
- + 28 of his 52 hits (53.8 pct.) this season have gone for extra bases (17-2B, 2-3B, 9-HR), 7th-highest rate in the majors among players with 150 PA.
- + Has appeared in 79 games and made 73 starts (56-1B, 11-LF, 4-DH, 2-RF)...entered the season ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 45 prospect.
