TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs **Abby Sanders' Rockies** and Game 1 of a 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming weekend series vs the **NL Central** rival **Cardinals** (3g)...the Redlegs are coming off a **3-6 road trip** to Col's **Coors Field** (1-2), Ari's **Chase Field** (1-2) and SD's **Petco Park** (1-2)...following this homestand and Mon's off day, the Reds return to the road for a **5-game trip** to **KC** (2g) and **Pit** (3g).

TRANSACTIONS: Today the Reds returned from a rehabilitation assignment and reinstated from the 60-day disabled list **RHP Anthony DeSclafani** (left oblique strain) and optioned to Class AAA Louisville **RHP Jackson Stephens**...to make room on the 40-man roster for **DeSclafani**, **RHP Kevin Shackelford** was released.

SERIES NOTES: Beginning tonight the Reds and Rockies will finish their season series with 3 games at **Great American Ball Park**...last weekend, the Rockies earned a **2-1 series win** at **Coors Field**...**Reds vs Rockies** information is on media guide **Page 321**.

DRAFTING: In the first 2 rounds of yesterday's **first-year player draft** the Reds selected University of Florida **3B Jonathan India** with the **fifth overall pick** of the first round, Jensen Beach (FL) High School **RHP Lyon Richardson** in the second round with the **47th pick** and Le Moyne College **RHP Josiah Gray** with the **72nd overall pick** in Competitive Balance Round B...**Rounds 3-10** were held today...**Rounds 11-40** will begin at **noon tomorrow**...the lists of Cin's **2017 draft picks** and **No. 1 draft picks** are on media guide pages **216-217**.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH: **Scooter Gennett** in **May** (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the **National League Player of the Month Award** since **Jay Bruce** in **May 2011**...is **Gennett's** first career monthly award...twice in a 3-week span that month he was named **Player of the Week** (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since **Bruce** in **2012** and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since **Dave Parker** in **May 1985**...**Gennett** finished **May** ranked first in the NL in **slugging** (.720), second in **hitting** (.398), third in **RBI** (24), T3rd in **HR** (8), fourth in **hits** (37) and **on-base percentage** (.418) and T7th in **extra-base hits** (14).

DYNAMIC DUO: In May, **Scooter Gennett** (8hr, 24rbi) and **Eugenio Suárez** (8hr, 29rbi) became the first Reds teammates to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in the same month since **Adam Dunn** (12hr, 27rbi) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (11hr, 29rbi) did it in **August 2001**...**Dunn** and **Griffey** was the first Reds duo to do it since **Johnny Bench** (9hr, 32rbi) and **George Foster** (9hr, 38rbi) in **June 1977**...since **RBI** became an official statistic in **1920**, **Gennett** is the only **Reds second baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **24 RBI** in a calendar month (June 2017, May 2018) and **Suárez** is the only **Reds third baseman** to produce at least **8 HR** and **29 RBI** in a calendar month (May 2018).

APRIL 19: The Reds are **18-24** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387** (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15** this year.

7-YEAR ITCH: The **10-4 Reds victory** on **4/23 vs Atl** was the first for **Jim Riggleman** as his team's full-time manager since a **1-0 Nationals** win vs the **Mariners** on **6/23/11**...the Reds' **4-1 win** on **5/4 vs Mia** was his **1,500th game** as a Major League manager...since 1900, **Riggleman** is **1 of 14 managers** to work for at **least 5 Major League teams** (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...**Jimmy Dykes**, **John McNamara** and **Dick Williams** each managed **6 teams**...the others who managed **5 teams** are **Chuck Dressen**, **Bucky Harris**, **Rogers Hornsby**, **Davey Johnson**, **Billy Martin**, **Bill McKechnie**, **Jack McKeon**, **Lou Piniella**, **Jeff Torborg** and **Joe Torre**.

ABOUT THE NEW GUYS: Interim manager **Jim Riggleman** managed in all or parts of **12 Major League seasons** with the **Padres**, **Cubs**, **Mariners** and **Nationals**, leading the **1998 Cubs** to the **NL Wild Card** game...interim bench coach **Pat Kelly** was in his first season as manager at Class AAA **Louisville** after spending the previous 3 years at Class AA **Pensacola**...he also managed in the Reds' system at Class A **Bakersfield** in 2014 and from 2011-2013 at **Rookie Billings**...interim pitching coach **Danny Darwin** was in his third season as **Pensacola's** pitching coach.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT: With promotions to the Major League staff of **Pat Kelly** and **Danny Darwin**, **Dick Schofield** moved from bench coach to manager at Class AAA Louisville, roving outfield/quality control coach **Darren Bragg** joined the Louisville staff as bench coach, and minor league rehabilitation coach **James Baldwin** became Pensacola's pitching coach.

FRONT OFFICE NEWS: Reds President of Baseball Operations **Dick Williams** on 5/10 announced the promotion of **Nick Krall** to **General Manager**...**Krall** had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...**Williams** will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee that entire department.

YOUNGSTERS: The Reds' **34 Major League debuts** over the last 3 seasons are the most of any team in either league and include **5 this season** (**3B Alex Blandino** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Tanner Rainey** on 4/10 at Phi, **RHP Zack Weiss** on 4/12 vs StL, **IF/OF Rosell Herrera** on 4/26 vs Atl, **IF/OF Brandon Dixon** on 5/22 vs Pit)...**RHP Jesus Reyes** was on the roster for 1 day, on **5/29 at Ari**, but did not pitch...Cin has **5 rookies** on the current roster (**Blandino**, **Dixon**, **OF Jesse Winker**, **RHP Tyler Mahle**, **Rainey**) and another rookie on the disabled list (**RHP Rookie Davis**)...the Reds' **Opening Day roster** included **5 rookies** (**Mahle**, **Stephens**, **Weiss**, **Ervin**, **Winker**), **21 players age 30 & under**, **17 players age 27 & under** and **11 players age 25 & under**...the average age for the Reds' 25-man **Opening Day roster** (**27 years**, **196 days**) was the second-youngest in the Major Leagues behind the **Phillies** (**26.334**)...in **2017**, the Reds' **Opening Day Reds roster** was the youngest in the Major Leagues (**26.355**).

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...today came off the 60-day disabled list for his first appearance for the Reds since a 2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL...since his most recent appearance, **17 different pitchers** have made starts for the Reds...had spent the **2018 season** on the DL while recovering from a **left oblique strain** suffered in his third spring training appearance...from 5/14-5/30 made **4 rehab starts** for Class AA Pensacola and Class AAA Louisville (**0-3, 4.66**)...spent the entire **2017 season** on the disabled list with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his **right elbow**...from 7/23-8/3, 2017 made 3 rehab apps for the **AZL Reds** and Class A **Dayton**...didn't pitch for the Reds in 2017 spring training.

- Made each of his last 9 starts batting second, his first career starts at that position in the order (11-41, .268, 1 2b, 2rbi)...his 9 starts batting second are the most by a Reds catcher in that spot in the order since Smoky Burgess made 56 starts there in 1955.

- On 5/22 was promoted from Louisville to fill the roster spot vacated by IF/OF Rosell Herrera, who was optioned to Louisville...that night vs Pit pinch hit in his Major League debut (P9 off Jameson Taillon).
- Was the fifth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Tanner Rainey, RHP Zack Weiss, IF/OF Rosell Herrera).
- In the 5-4 win on 5/24 vs Pit made his first start, played 1B and produced the first 3 hits of his Major League career (2 singles, 1 double)...made his only other start in the 6-5 win on 5/26 at Col (0-2, 1bb, 1r).
- Began the season at Louisville (37g, .326, 12 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 14tbi, 8st)...played 1B (11g), 2B (6g), 3B (4g), LF (10g) and RF (2g).
- When promoted on 5/22, among the International League leaders ranked fifth in both hitting and slugging percentage (.527) and T5th in stolen bases.

- Has 19 extra-base hits...is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 extra-base hits in 3 straight seasons.
- Has made 5 apps this season and 38 apps in his career at 1B...has made 24 career starts at that position, including 2 starts at 1B this season (4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF).
- In the ninth inning of the 10-inning, 2-1 win on 5/9 vs NYM entered the game as a defensive replacement in LF, then led off the bottom of the 10th with his first career walkoff HR (off AJ Ramos).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b Road Trip: 16-35 (.457), 2 2b, 3hr, 7rbi

- In 199 apps for the Reds is hitting .309 with an .898 OPS (36 2b, 3 3b, 39hr, 138rbi).
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.
- In May produced 8 HR and 24 RBI and in June 2017 produced 9 HR and 24 RBI...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month.
- Ranks second in the National League in hitting, just .002 behind LAD's Matt Kemp...no Reds batter has led the NL in batting average since Pete Rose hit .338 in 1973...the list of Reds batters who led the league in hitting is on media guide page 397.
- Ranks among the National League leaders in hitting (2nd), total bases (2nd), hits (T2nd), slugging percentage (3rd), RBI (T3rd), multi-hit games (22, T5th), extra-base hits (T7th) and on-base percentage (10th).
- In his last 24 apps beginning 5/7 is hitting .421, including 13 multi-hit games and raising BA from .282 (40-95, 6 2b, 10hr, 27rbi, .800slg, .440obp).
- Beginning 5/7 leads the Major Leagues in hits (tied w/ KC's Jon Jay), RBI, batting average and slugging percentage while leading the National League in RBI and ranking third in the majors in on-base percentage.
- Played in 58 of the Reds' 60 games, off only on 5/9 vs NYM and 5/13 at LA and including 52 starts...from 4/30-5/4 missed 4 starts with inflammation in his right shoulder but pinch hit in each game.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Road Trip: 7-32, 1 3b, 1rbi, 2sb

- In his last 4 apps is 1-for-14 following a 5-game hitting streak during which he hit .333 to raise his BA from .199 to .213 (6-18, 1 3b, 1rbi).
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and a team-high 41 starts batting ninth...has made 30 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 253, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- If he reaches 60 stolen bases in 2018 will become the first player in Major League history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first 6 seasons while establishing a career high in each of those 6 years...is tied with Jose Reyes, Cesar Cedeno and Bert Campaneris as the only players to do it in 5 straight years.
- On 5/26 at Coors Field was timed at 10.39 seconds from home plate to third base, the quickest triple since Statcast started tracking in 2015.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss Road Trip: 12-33 (.364), 2 2b, 4rbi, 1sb, 4r

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Among National League shortstop ranks T2nd in hits (61; SF's Brandon Crawford 65, Wsh's Trea Turner 61).
- Has a 7-game hitting streak (12-29, .414, 2 2b, 4rbi, 1sb), tying his season high and including 4 multi-hit games...is the longest active hitting streak on the team.
- Twice this season has gone at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa).
- Started at SS in 56 of the Reds' 60 games and has appeared in 58 games.
- In the batting order hit first (13gs), second (29gs), seventh (12gs) and eighth (2gs, 4/1 vs Wsh, 4/7 at Pit).
- Received consideration for the National League Player of the Week Award for 4/23-4/29, won by teammate Joey Votto...in 7g that week hit .441 with 2 HR and 5 RBI (.618slg, .457obp).

- Has a 4-game hitting streak, extended by a pinch-hit single Sun at SD (6-12, .500, 2hr, 3rbi, 3r 1.000slg, .571obp).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi) and .500 so far in June (4-8, 1hr, 1rbi, .875slg, .556obp).
- Has made a team-high 28 starts in RF, 8 starts in CF and 1 start at DH...last started in CF on 5/24 vs Pit.
- On 4/23 vs Atl made his sixth career start batting leadoff, just his second the last 2 seasons in that spot in the order...in 2017, made his only start batting leadoff on 9/21/17 vs StL.
- On 5/14 at SF fell a triple shy of becoming the sixth Reds batter to hit for the cycle...Eric Davis was the last Reds batter to do it (6/2/89 vs SD).
- Made his third straight Opening Day roster.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Road Trip: 12-33 (.364), 1 2b, 3hr, 6rbi, 8r

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- In his last 12 apps is hitting .356, raising BA from .274 (16-45, 3 2b, 4hr, 12rbi).
- In May led the Major Leagues in RBI (29) while ranking T3rd in both extra-base hits (15) and HR (8)...since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds third baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 29 RBI in a calendar month.
- Missed 16 games in April but still ranks second in the National League in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the league in RBI is on media guide page 397.
- Tied the franchise record for most RBI by a Reds player in his first 20 games of a season (25)...played in his 20th game on 5/8 vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of those respective seasons.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 15-36 (.417), 2 2b, 1 3b, 0rbi

- Leads the National League in batting average vs RHP (.357).
- Sun at SD, produced hits in each of his first 3 plate apps to reach a .300 batting average (.301) for the first time since he was 3-for-10 in the third game of the season...in his last 2 plate apps Sun struck out and grounded out to finish at .299.
- On the 9-game road trip hit .417 to raise his season BA from .274 to .299.
- Produced his last RBI on 5/16 at SF.
- Reached base safely in 51 of his 59 apps, including each of his last 13 apps beginning 5/20 (18-49, .367, 3 2b, 1 3b, 7bb, .446obp).
- In the Reds' 60 games has made 59 apps and 57 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- On 5/18 vs Cubs made his 29th career start batting cleanup (0-3, 1bb), his first appearance there since he hit fourth in both games of a DH on 5/15/14 vs SD.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history.
- Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,489)...if he plays every day will reach that milestone on Sun, 6/17 at Pit.

33 JESSE WINKER, of Road Trip: 3gs in LF, 1gs in RF, 2g as PH, 2-16, 5bb

- Leads National League rookies in walks and outfield assists (3, tied) while ranking among the rookie leaders in OBP (3rd), multi-hit games (11, 3rd) and hits (4th).
- Sun at SD singled in his third plate appearance to snap a career-high 0-for-14 skid.
- Has made 24 starts in RF, second on the team to Scott Schebler's 28 starts, 15 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 33 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
- His career-high 9-game hitting streak from 4/18-4/27 ranks as the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
