PREGAME FESTIVITIES

Passing of the Bat Ceremony: The Tigers will hold a pre-game "Passing of the Bat Ceremony", as a tribute to the past, present and future contributions of African-American ballplayers to the game of baseball. Participants in the pre-game ceremony include: Detroit native and former Negro Leagues player for the New York Cubans **Eugene Scroggs**, Tigers alumni **Rod Allen**, **Willie Horton**, **Torii Hunter** and **Jake Wood**, Tigers infielder **Niko Goodrum** and Detroit Country Day baseball player **John Malcom**, who is a top African-American high school prospect from Michigan.

Ceremonial First Pitches: The ceremonial first pitch will be thrown by Detroit Lions linebacker **Jarrad Davis** and sports columnist **Joe LaPointe**, who is also an advocate for the Friends of Historic Hamtramck Stadium.

National Anthem: The national anthem will be performed by **Joyce Stearnes Thompson** and **Rosilyn Stearnes Brown**, daughters of Negro Leagues great and National Baseball Hall of Fame member, **Norman "Turkey" Stearnes**.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers salvaged the series finale against the Red Sox with a 7-2 win on Thursday night at Fenway Park. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and evened his record at 4-4, allowing two runs on four hits with four walks and six strikeouts in 6.1 innings. Offensively, Leonys Martin went 2x4 with a triple, a home run and two RBI, while John Hicks and José Iglesias each added two hits and two RBI in the win. The Tigers begin a six-game homestand tonight as they open a three-game series against the Cleveland Indians. Following this weekend's series vs. the Indians, the homestand continues with three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14).

CHEF BOYD-ARDEE: Matthew Boyd earned his fourth win of the season last night, allowing two runs on four hits with four walks and six strikeouts in 6.1 innings. The outing was Boyd's seventh quality start of 2018 and lowered his season ERA to 3.20 (70.1IP/25ER), which ranks 10th in the American League. Over his last 16 starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 5-6 record with a 3.00 ERA (96.0IP/32ER) and 75 strikeouts.

NICK AT NITE: Nicholas Castellanos hit a double in last night's game and has now hit safely in 16 of his last 19 games. Over the 19-game stretch, Castellanos is batting .373 (31x83) with 10 runs scored, 10 doubles, two home runs and nine RBI. Castellanos enters tonight's game ranked second in the American League with 26 multi-hit games, while he is third with 82 hits, tied for third with 21 doubles, fourth with a .331 (82x248) batting average and ninth with 127 total bases.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE: Joe Jiménez threw a scoreless inning last night, pitching out of a bases loaded, one out jam by striking out back-to-back batters to end the inning. Jiménez has not allowed an earned run in 13 of his last 14 appearances, posting a 0.68 ERA (13.1IP/1ER) and 19 strikeouts during the span. For the season, Jiménez leads the American League with 33 appearances, while he ranks third among American League relievers (min. 30.0 innings pitched) with a 2.37 ERA (30.1IP/8ER).

TIGERS TIDBITS: Leonys Martin hit his eighth home run of the season last night at Boston. Martin's eight homers this season are tied for the second most in a season in his career, trailing only the 2016 season, when he hit 15 with Seattle...José Iglesias has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games with at least one at-bat, and is hitting .333 (12x36) with four runs scored, four doubles and seven RBI over the stretch.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers tonight begin a six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (June 8-10) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14). Detroit is in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 20-14 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 19 of their last 28 home games. The Tigers are hitting .268 (311x1159) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.13 ERA (314.0IP/144ER).

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers and Indians continue their 19-game season series tonight. Detroit is 2-5 vs. Cleveland this season, but took two-of-three games in the first series this season at Comerica Park, which was Detroit's first series win over Cleveland since May 1-3, 2017. The Indians have won the season series over the Tigers in each of the last two seasons.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 12-14 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 5-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 2-5 vs. Cleveland, 1-2 vs. Minnesota and 4-6 vs. Kansas City. The Tigers went 31-45 against intra-divisional opponents last season. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 30-34 (.469) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,098-1,073 (.506) career

record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MICHAEL: In his third Major League season, Fulmer will make his 13th start of 2018 tonight in the series opener vs. Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Fulmer took the loss in his last start on Sunday vs. Toronto, allowing four runs on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND: Fulmer has faced the Indians six times in his career, posting a 2-3 record with a 7.31 ERA (28.1IP/23ER) and 17 strikeouts. He started against Cleveland earlier this season on April 12 and suffered the loss, allowing nine runs, six earned, on eight hits with two strikeouts in 3.0 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fulmer has made 29 career starts at Comerica Park, posting a 9-10 record with a 3.68 ERA (183.1IP/75ER) and 128 strikeouts. In six home starts this season, Fulmer is 0-4 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2IP/20ER) and 21 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Fulmer has started 24 games in his career against teams from the American League Central and has a 10-8 record with a 4.15 ERA (143.0IP/66ER) and 106 strikeouts. In four starts vs. divisional opponents this season, Fulmer is 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA (21.0IP/9ER) and 15 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JUNE: Fulmer has made 11 career starts during the month of June, compiling a 5-5 record with a 2.86 ERA (69.1IP/22ER) and 51 strikeouts. In five June starts last season, Fulmer was 2-3 with a 4.28 ERA (33.2IP/16ER) and 24 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fulmer has limited righthanded hitters to a .237 (175x737) batting average in his career, while lefties have hit .243 (175x721) against him. In 12 starts this season, righties are hitting .267 (32x120), while lefthanded batters are hitting .244 (32x131).

AMONG THE BEST SINCE HIS DEBUT: Fulmer has been among the best pitchers in the American League since making his debut on April 29, 2016. Among active American League pitchers with at least 350.0 innings pitched since April 29, 2016, Fulmer ranks seventh with a 3.67 ERA, trailing only Corey Kluber (2.46 ERA), Justin Verlander (2.71 ERA), Chris Sale (3.22 ERA), Ervin Santana (3.33 ERA), J.A. Happ (3.53 ERA) and Carlos Carrasco (3.54 ERA).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Fulmer was selected to the American League All-Star Team for the first time in his career last season. He was one of four pitchers selected to the roster by MLB. Fulmer was not on the active roster for the American League since he pitched on the Sunday prior to the All-Star break.

2016 AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Fulmer earned American League Rookie of the Year honors from the BBWAA in 2016, becoming the fifth player in franchise history to earn the honor and the first since Justin Verlander in 2006. Among AL pitchers with at least 150.0 innings pitched, Fulmer ranked third with a 3.06 ERA, while he was seventh with a .231 (136x590) opponents batting average and a 1.12 WHIP. Fulmer also posted 132 strikeouts, which were the second most by a rookie pitcher in Tigers history, trailing only Les Cain, who struck out 156 batters as a rookie in 1970. Along with being named AL Rookie of the Year by the BBWAA, Fulmer was named the American League Rookie of the Year by *The Sporting News* and the American League Outstanding Rookie in the Players Choice Award balloting.

SCORELESS STREAK ENDS AT 33.1 INNINGS: Fulmer posted an impressive scoreless innings streak of 33.1 innings during his rookie season in 2016. The streak, which was the longest by a Tigers pitcher since at least 1913, was snapped on June 17, 2016 at Kansas City when Salvador Perez hit a two-out solo home run in the sixth inning. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the streak was the second longest by a rookie starting pitcher since 1971, trailing only a streak of 35.0 scoreless innings by Fernando Valenzuela during the 1981 season.

COMPLETE GAME SHUTOUT: Fulmer threw the first complete game and shutout of his career on August 14, 2016 at Texas, scattering four hits and striking out nine. Fulmer became the first Tigers rookie pitcher to throw a shutout since Justin Verlander on May 22, 2006 at Kansas City.

ONE RUN-OR-FEWER IN EIGHT STRAIGHT STARTS: Fulmer allowed one run-or-fewer in eight straight starts from May 21-July 1, 2016, becoming one of only six pitchers since 1913 to have eight straight starts with one-or-fewer runs allowed, joining Bob Gibson (11 straight starts, June 6-July 30, 1968), Josh Johnson (8 straight starts, May 13-June 20, 2010), Derek Lowe (8 straight starts, August 31, 2008-April 10, 2009), Johan Santana (8 straight starts, August 23-September 29, 2004) and J.R. Richard (8 straight starts, August 3-September 6, 1979). Fulmer threw at least 6.0 shutout innings and allowed three-or-fewer hits in four straight starts from May 27-June 12, 2016. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since 1893, when the mound was moved to 60 feet, 6 inches away from the plate, Fulmer and Jake Arrieta are the only two pitchers to record four consecutive starts of 6.0-or-more shutout innings and three-or-fewer hits allowed. Arrieta's streak occurred from September 22, 2015 to April 4, 2016.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fulmer was acquired by the Tigers along with Luis Cessa from the New York Mets in exchange for Yoenis Céspedes on July 31, 2015. Fulmer was originally selected by the Mets in the first round (44th overall) of the June 2011 MLB draft.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his 12th start of the season tomorrow afternoon vs. Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers picked up his fifth win of the season in the second game of the doubleheader on Monday vs. New York (AL), allowing two runs on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has faced the Indians five times in his career, posting a 3-1 record with a 2.22 ERA (28.1IP/7ER) and 19 strikeouts. He started against the Indians earlier this season on May 14 and earned the win, giving up just one run on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Fiers has made eight career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 3-1 record with a 3.33 ERA (46.0IP/17ER) and 32 strikeouts. In six home starts this season, Fiers is 3-1 with a 3.97 ERA (34.0IP/15ER) and 23 strikeouts.
