WASHINGTON NATIONALS (42-38) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (43-37)

Saturday, June 30, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 6:05 EDT – Game 81; Home 43 RHP Jeremy Hellickson (2-0, 2.28) vs RHP Vince Velasquez (5-8, 4.69)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION: The Phillies fell to the Washington Nationals, 17-7, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Nick Pivetta (L, 4-7) went 1.2 innings and allowed 7 runs on 7 hits with 2 walks and 2 strikeouts ... The Phils had a good night at the plate as Rhys Hoskins (1-2, HR, BB), Carlos Santana (2-4, HR, BB) and Scott Kingery (3-4, HR) all went deep.
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS: Tonight marks the Phillies 81st game of the season and the official midway point of 2018 following tonight's game ... Thus far, the Phillies, through 80 games, have scored 351 runs and allowed 347 (+4) ... Last season, through 80 games, they had scored 312 and allowed 403 (-91) ... Philadelphia has improved their run differential by 95 runs at the 80-game mark from 2017 to 2018 ... In seven games (8.7% of their season thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 91-23 (-68) ... However, in their 73 other games this year (91.3% of their season), Philadelphia has a +72 run differential, outscoring the opposition 328-256.
- ON THE OFFENSIVE: Over the last 15 games (6/14-current), the Phillies are averaging 5.33 runs per game (80 R) while slashing a combined .271/.357/.478 ... They have clubbed 25 home runs in that span and tallied 64 walks, both of which lead the majors.
- ARMS RACE: As Vince Velasquez (104 SO) takes the hill for the Phillies tonight, he is one of three different starters on staff with 100 or more strikeouts this season, joining Aaron Nola (107 SO) and Nick Pivetta (103 SO) ... The only other starting staff in the majors this season with three-or-more hurlers, all with 100-plus strikeouts is the Houston Astros who have four: Gerrit Cole (151 SO), Justin Verlander (136 SO), Charlie Morton (122 SO) and Lance McCullers Jr. (106 SO) ... Philadelphia ranks third in the NL in both strikeouts by starters (452) and total strikeouts (735) ... With 13 games still to play before the All-Star break, the Phillies already have their third-highest pre-All-Star game strikeout total, and are on pace to shatter their record of 759 set in 2016 ... Only the Dodgers (3x), Diamondbacks, Cubs and Nationals have ever had 800 or more strikeouts as team before the break.
- WEATHERING THE STORM: The Phillies have two games remaining in a 42-game stretch that began on May 17 with a four-games series against the St. Louis Cardinals ... The Phillies will have faced 10 different teams over those 42 games (STL, ATL, TOR, LAD, SF, CHI, MIL, COL, WSH & NYY) and as of today, those 10 teams currently have a combined record of 440-367 (.545 win %) ... Through 40 games in their most grueling stretch of the season, the Phillies are 19-21 and have won 11 of their last 18 games (6/10-current) ... Eight of those 10 teams currently have a winning record and if the postseason began today, four of those teams would occupy playoff spots.
- RHYS BEING RHYS: With eight homers and 22 RBI in 19 June games, Rhys Hoskins is just the fourth Phillie since at least 1913 with eight home runs in 20 or fewer games in a month, joining Scott Rolen (11 HR in July 1999), Pete Incaviglia (8 HR in June 1994) and Mike Schmidt (11 HR in April 1976, 9 HR in August 1981) ... Only Schmidt in August 1981 (24) and Rolen in July 1999 (25) have had more RBI ... Hoskins is currently wearing a traditional switch-hitter's helmet, paired with a C-Flap guard on each side of his face, while recovering from a fractured jaw that occurred when he fouled a pitch from Kenley Jansen off his face on May 29 at Dodger Stadium ... Since his return on June 9, in 19 games Hoskins is slashing .324/.407/.716 with 17 runs, 13 extra-base hits (5 2B, 8 HR), 10 walks and 22 RBI in 86 plate appearances ... Five of his eight home runs since returning, and 11 of his 14 dingers this season, have given the Phillies the lead in the game ... His 11 go-ahead home runs are the second-most by a Phillies player before the end of June since data began to be tracked in 1974, trailing Ryan Howard's 12 in his MVP season of 2006 ... In 23 plate appearances with RISP since his return, Hoskins has posted a 1.535 OPS and has 16 RBI in such situations ... The Phillies are 41-30 (.577 win %) this season in the 71 games Hoskins has played and 2-7 without him (.222 win %).
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK: Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 37-21 in their last 58 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .638 win percentage over that stretch ranks 5th in the majors behind only the Yankees (.745), Indians (.692), Cubs (.667) and Red Sox (.640)
- SLAMTANA: Since May 1, over a two-month span and 200-plus plate appearances, Carlos Santana is hitting .264/.398/.528 with 22 extra-base hits (9 2B, 3B, 12 HR) and 41 walks to 25 strikeouts ... Santana, with 61 walks already this season, and 15 games remaining before the break, currently ranks T-15th in Phillies history for most walks before the All-Star break ... Santana's 27 walks in the month of June are his most during any month in his career and are the most by a Phillies player in June since Greg Luzinski had 28 in 1980.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE: The Phillies boast two players who rank inside the top 10 in walk rate in the majors: Carlos Santana (3rd, 17.8%) and Cesar Hernandez (10th, 15.0 %) (Rhys Hoskins ranks 12th at 14.6%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.3 %, next-closest, LAD, 9.9 %) and also rank 1st in pitches per plate appearance (4.05) and are T-1st in walks (312) ... Pitch tracking data dates back to 1988 and over the last 30 years, the previous high for a Phillies team was 3.93 pitches per plate appearance in 2017 ... Finally, Philadelphia has finished a season with a walk rate greater than 10.0% only eight times in franchise history (last: 2002-05, 4 straight seasons) ... Philadelphia's 10.3% walk rate this season would be the tied for the second-highest in club history (other: 2003), shy of only the 1955 club (11.1 % BB rate).

<u>LAST START:</u> 6/25 vs NYY: L, 6.0 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 4 BB, 7 SO, HR ... Velasquez vs Loaisiga ... Hector Neris (1.0 IP), Yacksel Rios (1.0 IP) and Austin Davis (1.0 IP) all made scoreless appearances in relief of Velasquez.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Punch Out: His 104 strikeouts are 7th among NL pitchers, and his 34 strikeouts in June are 9th ... Per Elias, Velasquez was the quickest Phillies starter to reach 100 strikeouts in a season (83.0 IP) since Curt Schilling did so in 71.2 IP in 1998 ... Averaging 10.84 SO/9.0 IP, he ranks 5th in the NL in the category and 10th in baseball
- 9 Out of 10: Has posted a 2.73 ERA (16 ER, 52.2 IP) in 9 of his last 10 starts (5/5-current) ... Allowed 10 ER in 3.2 IP in his other start, 6/8 vs MIL
- Going Deep: Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in consecutive starts for just the fourth time since joining the Phillies, and the second time this season (other: 4/7-18)
- Put Him Away: When ahead in the count 0-2, Velasquez has held opponents to a .051 AVG (2-39) with 27 SO, tied for the 2nd-lowest AVG among ML pitchers (min. 35 batters faced), behind only Jakob Junis (.025) ... Last season, had trouble putting batters away 0-2, as they hit .222 (8-36), the 11th-highest AVG among all NL pitchers (min. 30 BF)
- On the Brink: Twice this season has carried a no-hitter through at least 5.0 innings (5/28 at LAD and 6/14 vs COL) ... Per Elias, it's the first time Phillies starters have carried a no-hitter through 5.0 innings four separate times (Velasquez 2x, Nola, Eflin) in a season since 1982 ... Over the past five seasons combined (2013-17), Phillies starters had three such starts
- **Big Split**: His home ERA (6.23) is almost four runs more than his road ERA (2.79) ... Has allowed 11 HR at home and only 2 on the road
- vs NL East: 6-11, 4.20 ERA (63 ER, 135.0 IP) in 26 starts

- 2018: 3-5, 6.23 ERA (34 ER, 47.2 IP) in 9 starts
- Career: 9-3, 4.81 ERA (99 ER, 185.1 IP) in 38 games (33 starts)

- On 5/10 vs SF Became the first Phillies pitcher with 12 or more strikeouts and multiple hits at the plate since 9/16/13 (Cliff Lee, 14 SO, 3 H), per Elias ... His 12 strikeouts were his 2nd-most ever in a start
- On 5/5 at WSH made the first start of his career of at least 5.0 IP and 1 or 0 hits
- Made a career-best 7 straight starts (8/10/17-4/29/18) issuing 2 or fewer
- Had 282 SO through his first 50 career starts, which when achieved was the 7th-most by any ML starter through his first 50 career starts since 2015
- Did not allow a home run in his first 16.2 IP this season
- Made his 3rd consecutive Opening Day roster

2017 SEASON:

- Was on the 10-day DL, 5/31-7/17, with a right flexor strain; included rehab assignments to Lehigh Valley (AAA), Reading (AA) and Clearwater (A)
- Had a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP) in 6 starts from 5/25-8/4
- Stranded 74.4% of the runners he allowed on base
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/11 with a right middle finger injury ... Had surgery on right middle finger on 9/6 and missed the remainder of season
