HAPPY 4TH OF JULY: The Mets are 30-36 all-time on Independence Day...New York is 14-19 on the road on July 4.

IN CANADA ON THE 4TH: This marks the fourth time in franchise history the Mets have played in Canada on the 4th of the July... The other three occasions were all in Montreal...The Mets are 2-1 on Independence Day in Canada...New York won 4-0 in 1996 in Montreal, won 5-1 in 1991 in Montreal and lost 7-5 in 1973 in Montreal.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 1-3 on their five-game road trip which concludes tonight...The Mets are 2-8 in their last 10 games, 6-23 in their last 29 games and 8-28 in their last 36 contests...New York has now gone 13 straight series without a series win since sweeping Arizona from May 18-20...The Mets are 16-39 since May 1...New York is 2-6 in Interleague action this year.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 19-23 on the road this season... New York is 6-15 in its last 21 road games.

LEADING AFTER SIX: New York has nine losses this year when leading a game after six innings, the most in the majors.

VS. TORONTO: The Mets were 12-0 vs. the Blue Jays in New York before losing on May 16...New York went 1-1 vs. Toronto this year at Citi Field, May 15-16...The 12-game home winning streak vs. the Blue Jays is the longest such streak in interleague history... The Mets are now 6-9 in Toronto all-time, including losing three straight dating to 2015.

HEADING HOME: The Mets will begin an 11-game homestand on Friday to close out the first half of the year...The Rays, Phillies and Nationals all visit Citi Field, including a doubleheader on Monday, July 9 vs. Philadelphia...The first 25,000 fans will receive a Jacob deGrom bobblehead prior to the 4:10 p.m. game on Saturday, July 7.

BACK IN THE SIX: José Bautista was 1-2 with three walks last night in his first game in Toronto as a visitor since June 24, 2004 as a member of the Rays...From 2008-2017, Bautista hit 288 homers, the second-most in franchise history...He ranks third in team history with 766 RBI, second in walks (803), had a .372 OBP and appeared in the fifth-most games in team history (1,235).

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Has a .435 OBP since joining the Mets on May 22...Has reached base safely in 16 of his last 17 games...Bautista he has three homers and six RBI over his last 10 contests...He is hitting .310 (13-42) with five doubles, three homers, 10 RBI and 12 runs scored over his last 15 games...He has drawn 18 base-on-balls in his last 17 games and 27 walks in 37 games with the Mets since May 22.

HOME RUN NOTES: The Mets have hit 29 home runs in their last 23 games, including three last night and 43 homers in their last 37 games, but, 30 of those have been solo blasts...New York's pitching staff has surrendered 27 homers in its last 12 games and 41 home runs in its last 22 contests.

METS-BLUE JAYS NOTES: New York's winning percentage .643 (18-10) vs. Toronto is its best all-time vs. any club.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



FRIENDLY FACE: Curtis Granderson hit 95 home runs, 106 doubles and drove in 247 runs in 573 games with the Mets from 2014 until he was traded to the Dodgers on August 19, 2017 for RHP Jacob Rhamer...He is tied for the franchise record with 21 leadoff homers...Granderson signed with the Blue Jays on January 23, 2018.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Has homered in back-to-back games... Cabrera has belted a homer in three straight games once in his career (September 19-22, 2011 with Cleveland)...Last night was Cabrera's 15th homer of the year, surpassing last year's total of 14 (in 166 fewer at-bats)...Cabrera has 47 RBI, his second-highest total prior to the All-Star break during his career...He had 51 RBI in 2011 for Cleveland in the first half...He is hitting .345 (20-58) with two doubles, four homers, 11 RBI, eight runs scored and a .433 OBP in his last 14 games.

FLORES FLOURISHING: Wilmer Flores has driven in 10 runs in his last nine games and has 13 RBI in his last 14 games...Flores has hit in career high 10 straight games, going 11-38 (.289)...Asdrúbal Cabrera hit a team season-high 11 consecutive games from March 31-April 13...Flores has reached base in a career-best 17 straight games with a plate appearance...Over his last 36 games, Flores is batting .292 (33-113) with nine doubles, five home runs, 21 RBI, 12 runs scored, 10 walks and a .344 OBP (dating back to May 4).

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Has a 14.9% walk rate for the year, ranking 11th in the majors...Conforto has 45 walks this year, his second-most behind the 57 he had last year in 373 at-bats...He has five doubles, three homers, 13 walks and nine RBI in his last 19 games...Conforto has a .373 on-base percentage during that span.

BULLPEN: The pen suffered its major league-leading 22nd loss last night...New York's bullpen is 3-14 with a 6.53 ERA (89 earned runs/122.2 innings) in their last 36 games (dating to May 25).

IN THE MINORS: RHP Justin Dunn struck out nine over a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed one run on two hits for Binghamton (AA) last night at Portland...Dunn, the Mets first-round pick in 2016, has posted a 2.41 ERA (9 ER/33.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts in five starts at Double-A...He has a 2.38 ERA (21 ER/79.1 IP) with 89 strikeouts in 14 combined starts this season.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his first-career start (second appearance) and took the first loss of his major league career as the Mets fell to the Marlins, 8-2, at Marlins Park on June 29...Gave up six runs, earned, in 2.2 innings while allowing six hits and two walks with one strikeout.

IN THE MAJORS: Oswalt tonight will make his third-career major league appearance (second start)...Made his major league debut out of the bullpen on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings and allowing two runs, earned, with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his MLB debut in team history...Is one of two Mets hurlers in franchise history to record four or more strikeouts in a relief outing for his major league debut (also, Buzz Capra in game one of a doubleheader on September 15, 1971).

2018 SEASON: Oswalt has appeared in two games (one start) over four stints with the Mets...Has made 10 starts for Triple-A Las Vegas this season, going 4-4 with a 5.32 ERA (28 earned runs/47.1 innings)...Has 49 strikeouts and 18 walks for the Las Vegas 51s...Allowed one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings on April 13 at El Paso...Tossed 6.0 shutout innings on June 11 vs. Round Rock...Has four quality starts in 10 outings at Triple-A.

SPRING RECAP: Posted a 2.84 ERA (two earned runs/6.1 innings) this spring in four Grapefruit League games, striking out five and walking none...Did not allow a run in three of his four Grapefruit League outings, all of which came in relief.

IN THE MINORS: In 96 games (90 starts) in the Mets minor league system, Oswalt is 41-22 with a 3.55 ERA (195 earned runs/495.0 innings)...Went 12-5 with a 2.28 ERA (34 earned runs/134.1 innings) in 24 starts with Double-A Binghamton in 2017 en route to being named a Mid-Season and Post-Season Eastern League All-Star as well as the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year.

OSWALT'S CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » Graduated from Madison (CA) High School in 2012...Was committed to UC Santa Barbara as a position player (third base/shortstop).
- » Selected by the New York Mets as a pitcher in the seventh round of 2012 First-Year Player Draft.
- » In 2014, his first season at the A-level, was named to the Mid-Season New York-Penn League All-Star Team representing the Brooklyn Cyclones.
- » In 2016, he pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League, going 4-1 with a 3.33 ERA (10 earned runs/27.0 innings) in seven starts for the Scorpions.
- » Was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year in 2017 after going 12-5 with a league-leading 2.28 ERA with Binghamton...His 2.28 ERA led all Double-A pitchers.
- » Was tabbed as the Mets' Sterling Organizational Pitcher of the Year for his 2017 campaign at Binghamton.
- » In 2017, finished second in the Eastern League in victories (12), third in WHIP (1.18) and fifth in opponents average against (.236) and also in 2017 was named to the Eastern League's mid-season and post-season All-Star teams.
- » Made his major league debut on April 25 at St. Louis, pitching 4.2 innings out of the bullpen with four strikeouts...Was the longest outing by a Mets reliever making his major league debut.

LAST START: Was defeated by the Marlins on June 30...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs, earned, for the second-straight start...Surrendered six hits while striking out eight and walking one...Suffered his fourth loss of the season despite registering his ninth-straight quality start in the Mets' 5-2 setback at Marlins Park.

- Is 22-86 (.256) with 10 doubles, three home runs, 27 walks, 16 runs scored, a .435 OBP, a .912 OPS and 13 RBI since joining the Mets (37 games)...His 27 walks since May 24 are the fourth-most in the National League in that time and sixth-most in the majors...His .441 OBP in that time is seventh-best in the majors (min. 100 PA)...Over his last 16 games, Bautista is hitting .295 (13-44) with five doubles, three homers, 10 RBI, 12 runs scored and 15 walks (1.105 OPS).
- Reached base safely in 15 consecutive games from June 15-30 (.500 OBP in that time).
- Owns a .492 OBP since June 16, the fourth-highest in the majors in that time (min. 50 PA)...His 1.105 OPS in that span ranks ninth in the NL.
- Returns to Toronto for the first time since playing for the Blue Jays from 2008-2017...In 1,235 games in a Jays' uniform, Bautista hit .253 with 219 doubles, 288 home runs, 766 RBI, 790 runs scored and had 1,103 hits...His 288 home runs are second-most in Jays history behind Carlos Delgado (336) while he also ranks among the franchise-leaders in hits (1,103, sixth), doubles (219, seventh), RBI (766, third), walks (803, second) and games played (1,235, fifth)...His 37.0 career WAR as a Jays position player is second-most in team history only to Tony Fernandez (37.5 WAR).
- Saw action at second base on June 13 in Atlanta...Was his sixth career appearance at second base and first since September 18, 2008 with Toronto.

- Has homered in consecutive games for the first time since September 21-22, 2016...Marks the 15th time in his career he's gone deep in back-to-back games.
- Ranks among the NL league leaders in extra-base hits (34, T-14th)...14 of his 15 home runs this season have come as a second baseman, tied for third-most by a second baseman this season...Trails Ozzie Albies (18) and Gleyber Torres (15)...His 15 home runs (in 313 at-bats) lead the team and surpass his total of 14 from all of last season (in 479 at-bats).
- Has hit in 13 of his last 15 games (.333, 21-63) entering play today dating to June 16 with four homers, 11 RBI, nine walks and a .972 OPS in that stretch.

- Is batting .292 (33-113) with nine doubles, five home runs, 21 RBI, 12 runs scored and 10 walks in his last 36 MLB games dating to May 4...Has an .848 OPS in that span...Has reached base safely in each of his last 17 games dating to June 15, the longest on-base streak of his career...Has four homers and 13 RBI in his last 14 games.
- Is currently on a career-best 10-game hitting streak...Is the second hitting streak of at least 10 games by a Mets hitter this season (also, Asdrúbal Cabrera, 11 games from March 31-April 13).
- Drove in a run in five straight games (nine RBI total) from June 23-27, tied for the longest streak of his career (third time, also - August 7-11, 2013 and August 19-24, 2015).

- Slugged his fourth career pinch-hit home run with his three-run homer on June 25 vs. Pittsburgh...Batting .357 (5-14) as a pinch-hitter this season (one double, one home run, five RBI).
- Dating to the beginning of last season, 17 of Flores' 25 home runs have come off righthanders.
